Judge Hughes files for County under Travel Superior 3 re-election Advisory on Tuesday

After lengthy consideration Judge William Hughes has filed his candidacy for re-election to the bench in Hamilton Superior Court #3. He is the first and only judge to serve Superior 3 since it was established in the late 1980s.
In what may become the headliner of the local primary election, Hughes will face opposition from Carmel City Judge Brian Poindexter who filed earlier in the Republican primary set for May 6.
Political observers look for Hughes to do well in the Noblesville area where he has lived for nearly 30 years. Poindexter will expect to do well in the Carmel area where

he has been involved in several community activities. The election may therefore be determined in the remaining portion of the county.
The only other countywide primary races thus far are for the GOP nomination for county clerk where former clerk Tammy Baitz is challenged by clerk's office employee Rhonda Gary, and for coroner where former Carmel Police Chief Roger Conn is competing with John Chalfin.
Filing has now slowed to a snail's pace, but, candidates have until noon on Feb. 7 to file. Winners of the primary can expect a easy victory in November where Democrats usually have few if any county-wide candidates.

Keep Noblesville Beautiful receives 2013 Sustain Noblesville recycle bin

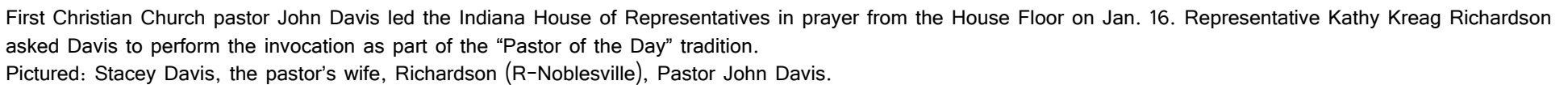

John Davis, the pastor of the First Christian Church in Noblesville, led the Indiana House of Representatives in prayer from the House floor on Thursday, Jan. 16. He was asked to lead the House's invocation by State Representative Kathy Kreag Richardson (R-Noblesville) as a part of the "Pastor of the Day" tradition.

"I am honored to have had my pastor, John Davis, lead the House chamber in prayer last week," said Rep. Richardson. "He shared some wise words for all of us to reflect upon and set a great tone to start the day. It was truly a pleasure to have Pastor Davis and his wife spend time with us here at the Statehouse."

Members of the House of Representatives invite religious leaders from their communities to start the legislative proceedings with a prayer before the opening of session each day. The practice offers spiritual leaders from around the state the opportunity to offer guidance to the representatives, meet elected officials and view a day of session in person.

Pastor Davis began his ministry as Senior Pastor Dec. 1, 2009 and delivered his first sermon a few days later. He was ordained in First Christian Church in 2004 and has served churches in Markleville and Greenfield.

The City of Noblesville has received notice that its bond rating has been upgraded to AA by Standard and Poor's (S&P) Ratings Services. S&P is an independent financial services company that assigns credit ratings for the debt of public and private corporations. Noblesville's AA rating is an indication of the city's fiscal stability.

S&P evaluated a variety of factors in order to determine the City of Noblesville's rating. The higher the rating, the lower the interest rate becomes on city debt. Factors cited by S&P in supporting the City of Noblesville's high rating were the city's "very strong economy" and "good financial practices" as well as the city's strong budgetary performance.

Big changes in 4A girls basketball

A lot changed last week in the world of Hamilton County Class 4A girls basketball. All coming as the teams head down the home stretch of the 2013-14 season. The sectional draw is on Feb. 2

Last week three games made the already wide-open North Central Sectional even more wide-open.

Noblesville went into Fishers and knocked off the Lady Tigers. Three days later Fishers handed Westfield its first loss of the season. Toss in Carmel's victory over a Top 10 Logansport team....well, you get the picture.

Also, those of us in Hamilton County might tend to forget the host team of the sectional, North Central. The Lady Panthers are 8-7 overall and against sectional teams North Central has defeated Carmel and Hamilton Southeastern and has lost only to Fishers.

Westfield still is the leader with an overall mark of 11-1. Against sectional foes, the Lady Shamrocks have defeated Noblesville, Zionsville and Hamilton Southeastern, while losing only to Fishers.

Fishers has defeated North Central, Carmel, Zionsville and Westfield, but stumbled against Noblesville and Southeastern. The Tigers are 13-4 overall.

Noblesville is 11-3 overall and within the sectional area the Lady Millers have beaten Carmel and Fishers and lost to Westfield and Southeastern.

Southeastern is 9-6 against all opponents and within the sectional area the Lady Royals have knocked off Fishers, Noblesville and Zionsville and have lost to Westfield, Carmel and North Central.

Carmel is just 7-8 and 1-3 within the sectional, but don't forget the Lady Greyhounds' win over Logansport last weekend. Carmel's only victory within the sectional was a win over Southeastern.

Fishers has won nine of its last 10 games. Southeastern has won three straight and four of five. Noblesville has won three straight and four of five. Westfield had won 11 straight before falling to Fishers.

It should be quite a February show at North Central. Hamilton Heights will play in a 3A sectional at Blackford and Guerin Catholic in a 3A sectional at Brebeuf. Heights hasn't faced any of the teams which will play at Blackford. Guerin is 1-1 against the Brebeuf Sectional field, with a win over Herron and a loss to Chatard.

Sheridan will play in the 2A sectional at Elwood. The Lady Blackhawks have beaten Eastern and Elwood and lost to Tipton.

University will play at the Bethesda Christian Sectional. The Trailblazers have knocked off International and Metropolitan and lost to Bethesda Christian and Indiana Deaf.

Girls’ comeback, Coldren’s record highlight a...

Dramatic Senior Night at HSE’s pool

The Hamilton Southeastern swim team's 2014 Senior Night meet can be described in one word: Unforgettable.

The Royal girls came from behind to win their dual meet with Zionsville, 94-92. HSE's boys had an easier time, as they were victorious 111-74 over the Eagles. Southeastern was led by outstanding diver Cody Coldren, who set a new six-dive record.

"They've had a huge impact and they've definitely left a mark on this program," said HSE coach Andy Pedersen about his 17 seniors.

The old diving record, set by 2001 HSE graduate Phil Jones was 392.10, a seemingly unbreakable mark. But Coldren topped it,

with a Tuesday total of 393.60 points. To put this in perspective, Coldren's six-dive total would have placed him 11th at last year's 11-dive state meet.

The second-ranked Royals split the 12 events with No. 14 Zionsville. In addition to Coldren's blue ribbon in diving, Jackson Russell was a double winner in the butterfly and breaststroke, while Luke Johnson was first in the 200 freestyle. Southeastern also took the medley and 200 free relays.

"This boys team is going to leave a legacy here at Hamilton Southeastern," said Pedersen. "It's one of our best teams we've ever had."

The fifth-ranked HSE girls trailed No. 10 Zionsville 65-45 at one point during the meet. After a pep talk during the diving

break, the Royals got themselves going again.

Allie Barnes picked up Southeastern's first win of the night in the 500 free, and then a huge turning point came in the 200 free relay: The Royals took the top two spots. Gabi Mazero and Abigail Brunory then got a 1-2 breaststroke finish.

"Pretty amazing," said Pedersen of the Lady Royals' comeback. He later said that this was "as big a miraculous comeback win as I have ever witnessed in my 20+ years of coaching."

Southeastern next swims at North Central on Thursday, a re-scheduled meet that begins at 6 p.m.
