## Commissioner brings "proof"

Hamilton County Commissioner Steve Dillinger brought along plenty of proof when last week he delivered his State of the County address at a luncheon sponsored by the Noblesville Chamber of Commerce. The theme to Dillinger's address was, "Government Working Together to Accomplish Great Things." Unlike at the federal or the state level, government in Hamilton County is working together, and great things are happening. "The approval rating for Congress and the US Senate is 13 percent," said the commissioner. "Actually, that is up from a previous survey showing only 9 percent approve what our government is doing. "It's different here in Hamilton County. We have good public servants who are doing their best to represent the public.

"Maybe," Dillinger joked, "that is because all of us here are Republicans." Dillinger used two examples to prove his point: \*County-wide cooperation during the recent snow storm. \*County and city government, the schools and the state working together to bring an Ivy Tech regional campus to Noblesville. "Tom Sivak (Emergency Management Executive Director) did a great job of directing the efforts during the storm," Dillinger told The Reporter in an exclusive interview. "He did a great job of coordinating the effort, bringing together the county, cities, towns, fire and police departments, the Sheriff Department, EMS and Red Cross. It was a tireless effort on the part of Tom Sivak," Dillinger said. "He coordinated opening of shelters for those who needed relief.

"The storm was unique" Dillinger continued. "We had multiple layers of snow, totaling 16 inches, 40 mph winds, heavy drifting, 15 below temperatures, 30 below wind chill. "We closed the courthouse a couple of days and we had to restrict traffic on some roads." Dillinger said the cooperation of different individuals and groups in bringing Ivy Tech to Hamilton County was a "shining example of government working together. "It was like a puzzle, putting all the pieces together," said the Commissioner. "If one piece came up missing, this would not have happened." Dillinger said that the Commissioners, the Council City, the City Council, Noblesville Schools and state government all were pieces to the puzzle. "Luke (Senator Luke Kenley) went to bat for us at the state level, and that was very important," Dillinger said.

"Libbie (Noblesville Superintendent of Schools Dr. Libbie Conner) and her school board worked to get the referendum passed which gave the school system the funds to begin new construction and move from Noblesville East Middle School. The city and state chipped in their monies and then the County Council providing the funding for the purchase of the middle school and then lease it for \$1 to Ivy Tech. "One missing piece to that puzzle and this would not have happened," Dillinger stressed. "Ivy Tech coming here with a regional campus is one of the greatest things ever to happen for Hamilton County and Noblesville. Think of it this way. If you're a parent of a teenage daughter would you rather see her attend a community college here or in downtown Indianapolis," Dillinger concluded.

## Brooks files for 5th district re-election

Congresswoman Susan Brooks has filed her candidacy for re-election in the Republican primary set for May 6. Her bid for re-election was expected. She was first elected in the Fifth District in 2012 after winning in a crowded GOP primary following retirement of Rep. Dan Burton. Challenging Rep. Brooks is David Stockdale who is expected to claim to be more conservative than the incumbent. Brooks has stressed fiscal conservatism over social issues. Several Republican members of the state legislature are finding themselves challenged by Democrats this week as Bob Ashley filed against incumbent Republican Eric Turner, J.D. Ford, Democrat declared against incumbent Mike Delph, and David Russ, also a Democrat, has filed against longtime incumbent Jerry Torr. At the county level, however, no new Democratic filings have been received by

the local clerk's office. Winners in the local GOP primary will get a free ride in the November election if no Democrats run which is often the case in county elections. A third candidate for mayor of Fishers has joined the race. Maurice Heitzman has entered the field where Marvin Scott and Walt Kelly have already filed intentions to run. Republican voters in Wayne Township will now face a primary choice between Otto Berlin and incumbent Diane Crim for township trustee. And in White River Township, Donna Gentry will seek a seat on the township board. And, Rick Smith has joined the field of candidates seeking an at-large seat on the Cicero Town Council. Candidates have until noon on Friday, Feb. 7 to file intentions to run with the Hamilton County Elections Office, a division of the clerk's office.

## Paramedic performs CPR, uses AED, saves life

On Jan. 26, Fishers Fire and Emergency Service new recruit, Paramedic Jordan McClellan was at the YMCA working out when someone shouted for help. McClellan saw a man on the ground and realized he was in cardiac arrest. The YMCA of Fishers is equipped with an AED (Automatic External Defibrillator) which was used in conjunction with CPR prior to arrival of the Fire Department. Paramedics were able to regain a heart beat and transported to Community Heart Hospital.

# County schools get multiple top sectional seeds

The pairings were announced for Saturday's wrestling sectionals early this week. On Monday, the coaches met to decide the seeds for the Zionsville sectional, at which Carmel, Fishers, Hamilton Southeastern, Sheridan and Westfield will compete. The Greyhounds got three top seeds, one of three schools to earn that honor. Karl Wilhelm, a rare senior at 106 pounds, is first in that weight class. He holds a 25-4 record. Also top-seeded for

Carmel are 152-pound senior Eli Carlson, who is 25-3, and 160-pound sophomore Ben Kregge, who holds a 23-3 mark. Lebanon and the host Eagles also have three No. 1 seeds. Westfield has two top seeds. First is 132-pound sophomore Evan Eldred, who has a 24-2 record. The other Shamrock top seed went to 138-pound senior Dillon Eldred. He is 31-1 for the season.

Defending champion Hamilton Southeastern has one top seed: Junior Jack Chastain at 126 pounds. Chastain is 29-1 so far this year. Western Boone and Clinton Central have the other top seeds. Hamilton Heights had its sectional meeting Tuesday. Guerin Catholic and Noblesville will also wrestle at the Husky Dome; and the defending champion Millers received four No. 1 seeds. Heights has three.

Top-seeded Millers are 126-pound senior Niko Barrantes, 152-pound junior Derek Noon, 160-pound senior Jacob Wormuth and 182-pound senior Ben Elliott. The Huskies' top seeds are all seniors: Sam Staebler at 138 pounds, Cole Leininger at 220 pounds and Andre Porter at 285 pounds. Pendleton Heights and Anderson both have two top seeds, with Frankton, Tri-Central and Elwood each having one.
