Unlike at the federal or the state level, government in Hamilton County is working together, and great things are happening.

"The approval rating for Congress and the US Senate is 13 percent," said the commissioner. "Actually, that is up from a previous survey showing only 9 percent approve what our government is doing.

'It's different here in Hamilton County. We have good public servants who are doing their best to represent the public.

"Maybe," Dillinger joked, "that is because all of us here are Republicans."



## **County remains under Travel Advisory**

Hamilton County remains under a yel- county but none have been of a prolonged low Travel Advisory until further notice due to the extreme temperatures. While the vast majority of roads are in fair to good condition, motorists are encouraged to limit travel in the inclement weather. The subzero temperatures are threatening to anyone outside as hypothermia and frostbite are a concern. Conditions are regularly monitored and as the temperature rises the Travel Advisory will be re-evaluated. A Wind Chill Advisory remains in effect for Hamilton County until noon on Wednesday.

The extreme cold experienced throughout the month has served to exacerbate the propane shortage creating additional problems. Emergency Management, the Good Samaritan Network, and other agencies have received requests from county residents in need of assistance with heat, especially propane supplied heat. Emergency Management leaders are facilitating efforts between propane suppliers, the Good Samaritan Network, and homeowners to ensure that adequate supplies of propane are being delivered to those in need. Propane users are urged to conserve use whenever and wherever possible in order to stretch tight supplies.

Another challenge reported to officials by many area residents is that of frozen water pipes. The intense and prolonged cold has caused pipes to freeze and as the temperatures begin to warm over the next days, water leaks will become even more of an issue. If water is frozen and the pipe is split, turn the water supply off immediately before the water thaws and creates a flood with additional damage. To attempt to thaw pipes, use a hair dryer, space heater, or towels soaked in hot water wrapped around the pipe. Never use a blow torch or open flame to thaw a pipe. Open a faucet and apply heat until water begins to flow. If the frozen section of pipe is out of reach or it will not thaw, contact a plumber.

Hamilton County has not had to open an emergency shelter during the current weather crisis but stands ready to open one if necessary. Plans are in place to activate a shelter at the 4H Fairgrounds should the need arise. In the event a shelter opens, information would be distributed through media, the Emergency Management and Sheriff's Office Facebook pages, and through Nixle messaging.


