Date yourself for Valentine's Day

Whether you're married, single or divorced, Valentine's Day's emphasis on romance and the expectations it sparks can create more stress than joy for many people, says Dr. Jaime Kulaga, a practicing therapist and life coach.

"There can be pressure on Feb. 14 for anyone," says Dr. Kulaga, author of "Type 'S'uperWoman – Finding the Work-Life Balance: A Self-Searching Book for Women," (www.mindfulrehab.com).

"The 'happily single' may begin to have doubts; spouses may question the quality of their marital relationship; and for someone who recently experienced a break-up, the holiday can bring nothing but heartache."

Kulaga says she prefers to view Valentine's Day as an opportunity for personal growth.

She suggests planning a date with yourself on Valentine's Day, no matter your current relationship status.

• **If you're single ...** The holiday is not just for couples; it's for anyone who wants to strengthen a relationship, including the one with yourself. This is, after all, the most important and truly lifelong relationship we all have. Being comfortable in your own skin and in silence and with your own thoughts is a sign of self accep-

tance and emotional maturity. So, what kind of date would you take *you* on?

Meditation can be like confronting yourself for the first time, mentally naked. Can you literally do nothing but keep quiet and still for five, 10 or 20 minutes? Maybe you want to take yourself on an adventure -- consider spending a day or evening visiting places you'd never otherwise go. Or, you may simply cook yourself your favorite meal -- or go out. Dinner for one is much cheaper!

• **If you have a spouse ...** Even though you likely won't be alone on Valentine's Day, there's no reason you shouldn't spend some time working on the relationship you have with yourself. Some couples participate in "girls' (or boys') night out" to gently establish a measure of independence in their relationship, but that's not the same as spending quality time alone. Try a peaceful walk in the park, fishing or spending a few hours with a great novel. If you have plans on Feb. 14, make some time for yourself Feb. 13. It can make date night on the next day all the more rewarding.

Probably like many of you, I do lots of driving on Conner Street in Noblesville. Also, on Highway 32 while traveling from Noblesville to Westfield, or, I could say, from Westfield to Noblesville.

I was surprised when on Tuesday of this week I saw an Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) truck traveling that route, from Westfield to Noblesville.

Surely, the driver was lost. I haven't often seen INDOT in Hamilton County this winter.

While snow removal in our cities and towns was excellent during the recent snow storms, the state highways here in Hamilton County were in terrible conditions.

The Hamilton County Highway Department did its job. So did the cities and towns in the county.

INDOT didn't. Sometimes folks don't understand which highway departments are responsible for streets and roads. For example, one would think, Conner is a city street. It isn't. It is Highway 37 running through the heart of Noblesville. The state is responsible.

Conner Street was in terrible shape even before the storms hit. Using a tank to drive from 10th Street to 16th Street would have been better

Erskine, a teammate of Jackie Robinson, was a pitching mainstay on Dodger teams which won five National League pennants. Erskine won 20 games and set a World Series record with 14 strikeouts in a single game.

Erskine presented an autographed copy of his book "The Parallel" to Sheridan High School. Erskine's book outlines the similarities of the journeys of Jackie Robinson, who broke Major League Baseball's color barrier in 1947, and Erskine's son Jimmy, an individual with special needs.

Registration for children who will attend kindergarten at Hamilton Heights Primary School in the 2014 – 2015 school year will be held from 4 to 6:30 p.m. Thursday, March 20, at Hamilton Heights Primary School. Since there are no specific meeting times, parents may come any time from 4:00 – 6:30 PM. Please bring your child for screening activities at this time. Kindergarten is now a full day program for all kindergarten students, at no additional charge. Parents are still responsible for the usual textbook/supply fees that will be set this summer. Staff will also be available for preschool registration at kindergarten round-up; please call Mrs. Andrea Griswold, 317-984-1530, ext. 4144 for more preschool information. Parents will begin the first part of the registration process on-line (www.hhsc.k12.in.us) starting March 10, 2014. Those needing on-line access or a computer to complete the registration process may do so at our school at Round Up or at our school, 8:00 a. m. – 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. Parents/legal guardians need to bring the following to registration if not submitted when they register on-line. Original birth certificate from the county health department (hospital or Xerox copies are not acceptable) Children must be 5 years old on or before August 1, 2014. Immunization records – required by state law DTP/DTAP – 5 doses (4 doses are acceptable if the 4th dose was given on or after the 4th birthday) IPV/OPV – 4 doses (if the 4 doses are administered prior to age 4, a fifth dose must be given) MMR – 2 doses HEPATITIS B – 3 doses HEPATITIS A – 2 doses CHICKEN POX - 2 doses that are given on or after the first birthday OR written documentation of history of chickenpox disease (including month and year of the disease) from a PHYSICIAN Any pertinent or safety information regarding your child (Change of guardianship papers, restraining orders, etc.) Proof of Residency Your help in circulating this information to everyone in our school community who might have kindergarten-age children would be most appreciated. The Noblesville School Board will conduct three meetings on Tuesday at the Educational Services Building, 18025 River Road. First at 4:30 p.m. is a work session. The items for reports and discussion are the Three-Tiered Bus Schedule, intersession summaries, the 1:1 Technology Initiative and the ISBA Leadership Conference. The board's regular meeting will take place at 7 p.m. The action items to be discussed will begin with the superintendent's contract, followed by the transfer of appropriations, the 1:1 initiative agreement and the Indiana Secured School Safety Grant. Construction and the school corporation's anti-bullying policy are also listed. The board will hear a construction update during the reports portion of the meeting. At 9 p.m., the school board will conduct an executive session. The session will be held to discuss the purchase or lease of real property by the governing body up to the time a contract or option to purchase or lease is executed by the parties.

Cline does double duty

In a backyard war between the state's top two teams, No. 1 Carmel slipped away from No. 2 Hamilton Southeastern, 55-54, at HSE Thursday evening.

So, with the post-season tourney just a couple of weeks away, who is No. 1.

How about Ryan Cline?

The 6-4 Carmel junior guard was sensational, at both ends of the court. Cline drew the defensive job on Southeastern's scoring ace Eric Davidson and limited him to 12 points, eight of which came in the fourth quarter. At the other end of the court, after scoring only four points in the first three quarters on two free throws and one bucket, Cline exploded for 14 points in the fourth period, hitting 4-of-5 shots from 3-point range.

At the end of the game, with 15 seconds left, Cline was involved in the most controversial play of the game. His team up by the one-point game-winning margin, Cline was called for a foul as Carmel tried to get the ball inbound. But, after a lengthy discussion among the three officials, Ryan's foul was ruled an offensive foul. Although HSE still got the basketball, Davidson wasn't sent to the line. He is a 92 percent free throw shooter.

Both coaches, Carmel's Scott Heady and Southeastern's Brian Satterfield, agreed with the offensive call on Cline, but Heady was still steaming after the game that the foul was called at all.

"They (Southeastern) pulled Cline into Davidson," Heady said. "It was the worst call of the game, and I told him (the referee) so."

The Royals got the basketball out-of-bounds and had two pops to win the game, but missed both.

"On the first shot, we should have attacked the basket," Satterfield said. "I have no problem on the second shot (taken by Davidson). I have no problem with any shot taken by Eric."

This contest was nip and tuck from start to finish. Carmel led 11-8 after one quarter and 19-18 at halftime.

In the first half of the third quarter, Southeastern built a 28-23 lead, but then didn't score another point in the period as Carmel gained a 32-28 entering the fourth quarter.

The game in the fourth quarter suddenly turned from a great defensive battle to an offensive sizzler. After scoring just 28 points in three periods, the Royals added 26 in the fourth frame. Carmel scored 23 of its 55 points in the fourth quarter.

Down the stretch, the stars took charge. Cline led the show with his 14 points for Carmel. Davidson and outstanding freshman Zach Gunn each notched eight points for HSE.

Gunn hit a shot with 40.9 seconds left to pull Southeastern

within two, 53-51. Zach McRoberts, the super star senior, made two free throws to give the Greyhounds a 55-51 margin. With 15.4 seconds left, Davidson gunned in a 3-pointer and Southeastern was down by one.

That led to the controversial play. “We had a chance to put away the game with free throws, and we didn’t,” Heady said.

“We played a good defensive game, even though Southeastern hit 50 percent of their shots. Our offense wasn’t good. We didn’t execute well and we didn’t move the ball well. And, we didn’t hit those free throws at the end.”

Carmel favored (again) as girls state swimming begins

As it has been for the past few decades, the Carmel girls swim team is favored to win the state meet, which begins at 6 p.m. tonight with the preliminaries at the IUPUI Natatorium.

The Greyhounds will go for their 28th consecutive state championship, the longest active high school streak in the nation. With all 27 of their swims competing (plus one diver), Carmel's depth will once again be a major factor in the meet.

If the 'Hounds have any competition, it will come from right here in Hamilton County. Fishers and Hamilton Southeastern each had strong sectional meets, with the Tigers qualifying 16 swims and the Royals 13. Fishers also has two divers advancing to state, which will help it in the point standings.

Greyhounds' junior Amy Bilquist is seeded first in the 50 and 100 freestyles. Bilquist's sectional-winning time of 22.80 seconds is below the state record of

22.90 seconds, set by Noblesville's Lacey Boutwell. State records can only be broken at the state meet, so Bilquist will make a run for it, along with Boutwell's 100 free record of 49.77.

Carmel will be seeded first in the 200 free relay, which was won at the sectional by Emma Nordin, Katie Lemen, Shelby Spitz and Kendall Smith.

Fishers holds the top two seeds in the 500 free, with Abbey Schneider and Emily Moser finishing within 0.19 seconds of each other at the sectional championship. The Tigers are also seeded second in the medley and 400 free relays, behind Crown Point in each one. Crown Point has the most top seeds with five: Freshman Hannah Kukurugya is first in the 200 free, and Aly Tetzloff is first in the individual medley and the butterfly.

The Royals' highest seed is Robyn Clevenger, who comes into prelims rated sixth in the butterfly and seventh in the 50 free. South-
