## Important news for the voters

If you haven't already, be sure to register to vote for the May 6 primary elections. Polls are open from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. that day at the Government and Judicial Center, located on Eighth Street between Conner and Logan streets.

Voter registration ends next Monday, April 7. There are four ways to register:

- Register online if you have an Indiana Drivers License at [www.indianavoters.com](http://www.indianavoters.com)
- Download a voter registration form to send in with a copy of your ID at [www.hamiltoncounty.in.gov](http://www.hamiltoncounty.in.gov)
- Go to any license branch and register
- Come to the Voter Registration Office at the Government and Judicial Center.

Absentee and early voting will be available at the Government and Judicial Center starting Tuesday, April 8. Hours will be from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. from April 8 to May 2 (Monday through Friday). Anyone who lives in Hamilton County is eligible to use early voting at the Government and Judicial Center. People should use the east entrance to access the center; signs will be posted directing voters

where to go. Remember that the intersection of Eighth and Conner streets is closed due to construction works, so plan accordingly.

Saturday voting is available from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. on April 26 and May 3. On May 5, the day before Primary Day, voting will be available from 8 a.m. to noon. Those who use absentee voting have until April 28 to apply for a ballot to be mailed.

Confined voting is available for those who are homebound, in a hospital or living in a facility such as a nursing home or assisted-living center. The travel board, which oversees the confined voting, will visit each facility on May 1, 2 and 5. The board will deliver the ballots to the facilities, ensure each person will be able to vote, then return the ballots to the Government and Judicial Center. All voters will be able to cast their vote in private.

Inspector training will take place on three days. New inspector training is set for 7 p.m. Tuesday, April 29. Training times for returning inspectors are 7 p.m. Thursday, May 1, and on Saturday, May 3 at 10 a.m. and 1 p.m.

Both the Republican and Democratic parties are in need of poll workers on election day. Those interested should contact the Republican headquarters at 849-9600 and the Democratic party at 317-674-3158.

You can also visit [www.hamiltoncounty.in.gov](http://www.hamiltoncounty.in.gov), go to "Voting & Elections," access the menu and click on "Current Election Information." Scroll down to the lower right hand corner, fill out the poll worker request form and mail or fax it to the election office.

Each precinct needs a Republican inspector, a Republican or Democratic judge, and a Republican and Democratic clerk.

Inspectors are required by state law to attend a training session before Election Day and to pick up Election Day supplies on the Saturday before the election. Inspectors, along with the Democratic judges, will also return the election results to the Judicial Center. Inspectors receive \$150 plus \$20 for meals.

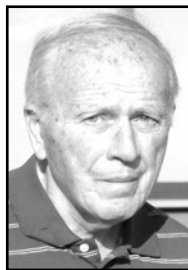

## Westfield selects lead design group for Grand Junction

The city of Westfield announced today that it has selected Land Collective as the lead design group for its historic Grand Junction Plaza project.

"After seven years of community dialogue and planning, the city has found what we believe is the perfect fit for the design of this important project," Mayor Andy Cook said. "Their work on Eskenazi Hospital in Indianapolis brought them to our attention, and their emphasis on collaborative, community driven design work left no doubt in our minds that this was the right group of people to take our community's vision to the next level," Cook said.

The Philadelphia-based landscape architecture and urban design group has a diverse client list, including universities, state parks and historic landscapes. Notable projects include Washington D.C.'s Canal Park, California Me-

morial Stadium at the University of California Berkeley, and Eskenazi Hospital, which opened in Indianapolis last year. David A. Rubin, Land Collective's principal, credits the success of the group's projects with empathy-driven design and a synthesis of art, technology and social sciences to create human-centered works.

"A successful space is one that's well-attended," said Rubin. "Land Collective aspires to render Grand Junction as an extraordinary venue filled with art, architecture, community and life. We have worked with the City to gather some of the most extraordinary talent across design disciplines, in the hope that the future park will continuously heighten one's experience, no matter when one engages in it - any time of day and through all seasons," Rubin said.

Land Collective has commissioned Hollwich Kushner

(HWKN) to be the building architects for the project. "We are excited to participate in a project that is born from a community initiative," said Matthias Hollwich, co-founder of HWKN. "Connecting buildings, trails, nature, and people will create a potent mix for an iconic and unique place."

The rest of the design team includes lighting designers Tillet Lighting, signage designers Studio Lin, fountain and ice rink designers Stantec, ecological engineers Flat Land Resources, and operations and maintenance planners ETM Associates.

The Grand Junction Plaza project began as a citizen-driven effort to revitalize Westfield through downtown development. Ken Kingshill, chairman of the Grand Junction Task Group, sees the selection of Land Collective as the culmination of a seven-year-long process.

"The Grand Junction Task Group participants have devoted thousands of volunteer hours over the past seven years to dream up the Grand Junction concept," Kingshill said. "We are thrilled that the city has hired David Rubin of Land Collective to prepare the final design of the Grand Junction Park and Plaza. We look forward to the day that downtown Westfield will indeed be the place where connections are made, both for our residents and for our sports visitors."

For his part, Rubin sees Grand Junction as an important piece of design work that will not only enhance Westfield's downtown, but contribute to valuable community dialogue.

"When dialogue between individuals happens, culture thrives," said Rubin.

# U.S. 31 construction update

## Traffic shift in Westfield on or after Monday, April 7

On or after Monday, April 7, crews expect to begin shifting all lanes of US 31 to the east side of the roadway between 169th Street and SR 38. Once this traffic shift is complete, crews will begin construction on the west side of US 31 through the remainder of 2014, and the following restrictions will be in place:

- Southbound US 31 reduced to one lane between SR 38 and SR 32
- Northbound US 31 reduced to one lane between 181st Street and SR 38
- Access to/from 203rd Street at US 31 permanently removed

Once the traffic shift between 169th Street and SR 38 begins, left turns to/from US 31 will only be permitted at the following cross-streets:

- 181st Street/Hoover Street
- 196th Street
- SR 32
- 169th Street

Barrier wall, tubular markers and signage will be in place to deter motorists from

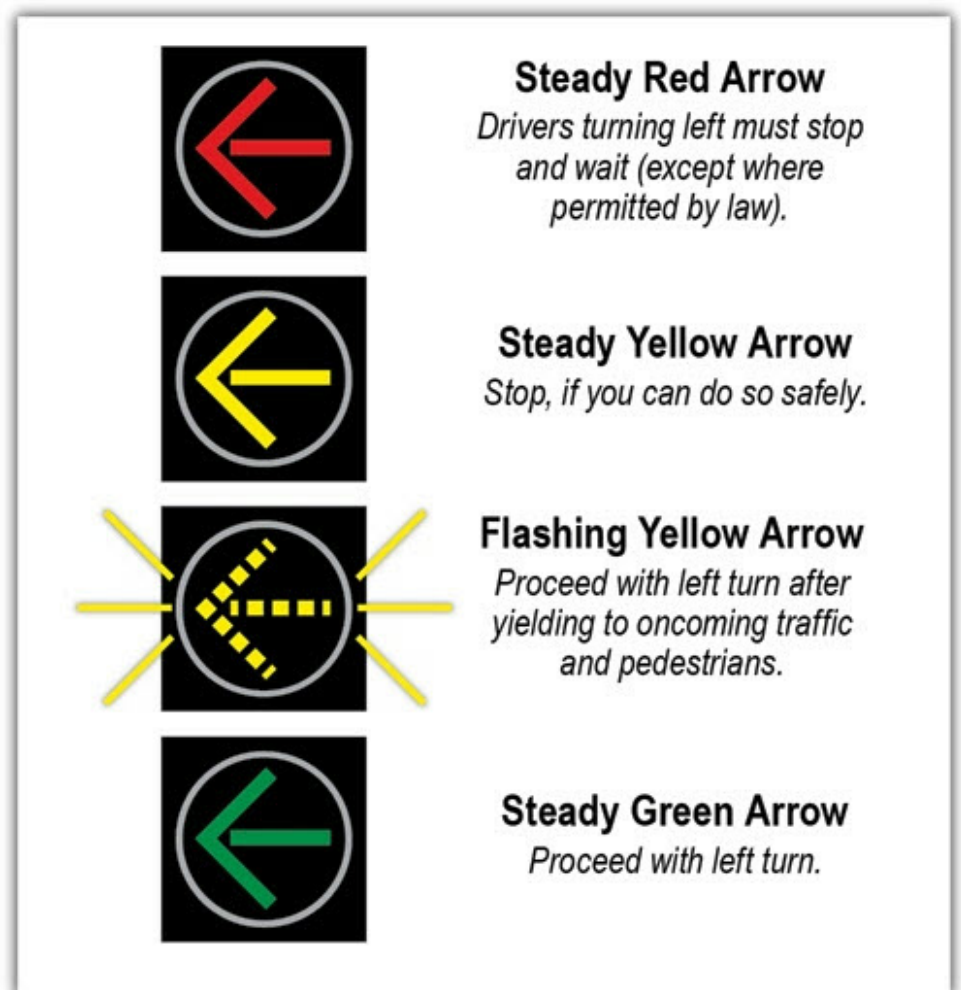
making left turns at other locations between 169th Street and SR 38.

**Flashing yellow left-turn arrow to be added to the 196th Street signal on or after April 7**

As part of the traffic shift on or after April 7, INDOT plans to install a new flashing yellow left-turn signal on US 31 at the temporary traffic signal at 196th Street. An illustration of the stages of a flashing yellow left-turn arrow is below.

This type of turn signal allows left-turning traffic to yield the right-of-way to oncoming traffic and pedestrians and turn when a suitable gap is available.

National research has shown that the flashing yellow signal is more intuitive for drivers, resulting in fewer crashes and the more efficient movement of traffic at an intersection. The signals are being introduced nationwide and have been adopted by most states.



## Westbound 465 ramp permanently closed

## Highway closure between Old Meridian, 136th begins Friday

**Westbound I-465 off-ramp lane closure at US 31 begins tonight, March 31**

Crews were to permanently close the southernmost left-turn lane at the bottom of the westbound I-465 off-ramp to southbound US 31 Monday evening. Once this closure begins, crews will begin constructing a new I-465 bridge pier in the median of US 31.

**US 31 closure between Old Meridian Street and 136th Street to begin on or after April 4, 2014**

INDOT plans to close US 31 between Old Meridian Street and 136th Street to accelerate the construction of an overpass at

126th Street/Carmel Drive and roundabout interchanges at 131st Street/Main Street and 136th Street.

Early utility relocations and cleared right of way will allow the previously planned closure of US 31 between Old Meridian Street and 136th Street in Carmel to begin on or after Friday, April 4, 2014. The road is expected to reopen before Thanksgiving.

The signed detour route will be Keystone Parkway. Pennsylvania and Illinois streets will serve as alternate routes for local access.

# NHS opens big week with big win

It has to be great being a Noblesville High baseball player. Especially so at this time of the year.

Coach Justin Keever’s Millers Monday opened their season at The Dunk with a 13-3 licking of New Castle.

Thursday, the Millers will play St. Xavier in Louisville, which at the start of the season was the No. 1 ranked team in Kentucky.

Saturday, Noblesville will be back at Dunker Field to host the Miller Invitational. The Millers will take on Brebeuf in the opener at 11 a.m., followed by a matchup between Crown Point and Homestead. The consolation game will be played at 4 p.m.

and the championship game at approximately 6:30 p.m.

Next week, Noblesville will head to Tennessee for a series of games during spring break.

In the opener, it was all-Noblesville after New Castle scored a run in the top on the first on a single, a hit-batter and two walks. Starting pitcher Trevor Salmon settled down after that, striking out six batters and allowing just one more hit. Reliever Garrett Christman became the victim of some sloppy infield play in the fifth as New Castle added two runs

The game ended after the fifth on the 10-run rule.

“We’ve got to get off to better starts than we did tonight,” Keever said.

Keever said he thought a couple of big plate appearances by sophomore Connor Christman turned the game around. Christman had a two-out double to start a three-run Miller rally in the second and he banged out a key RB single in the fourth, an inning in which Noblesville blew open the game by scoring 10 runs. Dax McLochlin had a three-run double in the inning. The Millers collected five hits while putting the 10 runs on the board, three of which were doubles. Andrew Wilson and Easton Brock also drilled two-baggers.

## Bowen steps down as CHS girls basketball coach

Scott Bowen, the veteran coach that led the Carmel girls basketball team to the 2008 Class 4A state championship, resigned his head coaching position on Tuesday.

Carmel High School athletic director made the announcement on Twitter Tuesday afternoon. Bowen, himself a CHS graduate, compiled a 160-72 record as a 10-year coach of the Greyhounds.

In the 2007-08 season, Carmel earned a 23-4 mark on its way to the state trophy. Along the way, the 'Hounds upended top-ranked Ben Davis 56-54 in a memorable regional championship game. Carmel beat South Bend Washington (a team which included eventual Notre Dame star and current WNBA player Skylar Diggins) 84-72 to win state; that was the Greyhounds' 100th state championship.

Under Bowen, Carmel also won sectional titles in 2009 and 2011, and beat Ben Davis for the regional again in 2011. Ironically, that had been the Giants' first loss since the 2008 regional defeat - Ben Davis won 81 straight games and two state championships in between.

## Indy Eleven continue pre-season campaign...

## Kleberon conversion from penalty spot in debut not enough to overcome MLS side

A lone second half goal from Indy Eleven midfielder Kleberon in his unofficial debut was not enough to overcome the Chicago Fire’s strong first half form, as the NASL expansion side fell 1-3 to the MLS squad in a preseason matchup at the Boilermaker Soccer Complex. Kleberon’s tally came during a better second half of play for the home side, but could not erase a three-goal deficit built by Chicago in the first half.

“Chicago was a great opponent, and we want to play quality competition like that because it shows us where our strengths and weaknesses are tactically and what we need to continue to work on as the season approaches,” said Indy Eleven Head Coach Juergen Sommer. “That’s why we played this game, to continue to do what we need to get sharp and prepare for Friday and then, more importantly the opener the following week.”

Chicago came out of the gates firing on all cylinders and showed no sign of slowing down in the first 45 minutes of play. The Fire enjoyed the bulk of possession and the majority of attacking opportunities in the opening stanza and opened the scoring just six minutes in when defender Lovel Palmer nodded home a corner kick from 10 yards out. In the 24<sup>th</sup> minute it was forward Luis Anangono’s turn to head in a cross from the right flank, doubling the Chicago advantage.

Although Indy Eleven’s front line was able to get into a few dangerous attacking positions, Fire goalkeeper Kyle Reynish went largely untested in the first half. Indy Eleven

almost got into the locker room down just two goals, but Fire forward Chris Rolfe’s far right post finish past Eleven netminder Kristian Nicht in the 45<sup>th</sup> minute brought the Fire lead to 3-0 heading into the break.

The second half saw the introduction of Indy Eleven’s newest signing, as the World Cup champion Kleberon replaced Pedro Mendes at the interval. The midfield combination of Corby Moore, Kleberon, Brad Ring and A.J. Corrado saw Indy Eleven start to control more possession in the center of the park. One of Indy’s better scoring opportunities on the night came in the 69<sup>th</sup> minute when Don Smart broke free and looked to get in on goal but was clipped from behind about 30 yards from goal. On the ensuing free kick Kleberon put the ball into the mixer but was unable to find the head of an Eleven teammate.

Indy Eleven was finally rewarded for their improved second half form when Fire defender Chris Ritter armed down the ball in the box while attempting to make a clearance. The referee awarded the penalty, which Kleberon stepped up to take without hesitation before slotting low past the correct-guessing Alec Mann in goal to give the Brazilian his first unofficial tally in Indy Eleven checkers and bring the match to its eventual 1-3 scoreline.

“It was great to see Kleberon get out there. You can see the qualities he brings to the game,” said Sommer. “For us it was important to give him a good 45 minutes to get his fitness up and watch the first 45 minutes to get a gauge of

what his teammates’ tendencies are and learn about the group a little more.”

Indy Eleven won’t have much time to dwell on the loss, as the squad will close out its spring exhibition schedule this Friday, April 4, when it welcomes the Indiana University Hoosiers to its home of Michael A. Carroll Stadium at IUPUI for a 7:30 p.m. ET. Fans should note that Friday night’s match will be limited to Indy Eleven season ticket holders in order to give Carroll Stadium a “test drive” before the team’s Inaugural Game against the Carolina RailHawks in just 11 days on Saturday, April 12.
