Changes coming in “Firestone” traffic

The traffic pattern around what once was the Firestone Plant, at that time some of the heaviest traffic in Noblesville, is changing. The same traffic pattern as used back in the 1950's and 1960's when Firestone was the largest employer in Hamilton County is no longer needed. The plant is gone and nothing remains except a large slab of cement. Not many motorists have a need to visit a large slab of cement.

So, here is what will soon happen in the old Firestone area:

- *Cherry Street and 17th Street will become a four-way stop.
 - *At Cherry & 18th, 18th will now stop instead of Cherry.
 - *At Maple & 17th, 17th will now stop instead of Maple.
 - *At Hannibal & 17, 17th will now stop instead of Hannibal.
- There will be other changes, too:
- *At Mercantile Blvd. and Cumberland Road, near the Bob Evans Restaurant on the east side of Noblesville, the intersection will become a 3-way stop.

All of these changes were improved in the Noblesville Common Council meeting earlier this week. The City will make the changes soon, but before doing so will give motorist warning signs of what will happen.

Another change will be made involving traffic which lines up on South Harbour Drive to turn left into Hinkle Creek School during student drop off and pick up times. No parking signs will be posted on the east side of South Harbour Drive near the intersection of South Harbour Drive and Elmwood Circle.

Indiana home sales continue to grow quickly

The housing market in Indiana continues to grow, the state's realtors concluded in a report released on Wednesday.

The report said that home sales in the month of May increased 24 percent from those in April. That is the fourth consecutive month that the amount of closed home sales in Indiana grew from the month before.

Annie Cook, a local realtor, has several reasons as to the increase. One of them is that there is a shortage of listings - the number of new homes listed fell to 12,377 in May 2014, down 1.4 percent from last May. Cook said prospective homebuyers are "buying, buying, buying quickly."

"There's not as many to choose from," said Cook. "People are wanting to get out there and get something. The interest rates are at a record low now, and the market's just on fire."

Cook also has an interesting theory as to why home buying is so hot: The cold winter. People were kept inside, so they that changed their perspective on their homes.

"I think people have felt like, 'Oh, our house isn't big enough, we have to get a bigger house,'" said Cook.

In addition, Cook also said some prospective buyers are feeling like their jobs are "a little more stable now," which makes them more confident to buy a home.

Other numbers reported said that the median sale price of homes edged up 0.4 percent from last May, to \$128,000. The average sale price jumped even more, up 2.3 percent to \$154,016. A big stat, the percent of original list price received, rose by 1.6 percent to 94.2 percent.

There were a couple of declines, though. The number of homes sold actually dropped 3.7 percent from last May's number to 7,552. The amount of pending home sales fell 2.3 percent, totaling 7,448.

Cook said that anyone looking to sell their homes should keep two things in mind. First, make sure your house is clean - on both the inside and outside. That means making sure your yard is well-maintained.

"Clean houses go a long way," said Cook.

Also, sellers must be realistic about what they list their home for. Cook said sellers must listen to their real estate agent - don't try to list it \$20 to \$30,000 higher than what it's worth.

Crash on SR 32 injures two

Two people were injured in a car crash on the east side of the county Wednesday evening.

WISH-TV reported that the crash occurred at the intersection of State Road 32 and Prairie Baptist Road. The report said that traffic was blocked at that intersection as of 10 p.m. One of the injured people was taken to Riverview Health, the other to IU Methodist Hospital.

The coach also said that Haydn Braun, who played junior varsity as a freshman last year, "is starting to grow." Anna Murhling, a junior to be, "has done a nice job so far this summer," said Huppenthal. The coach also has been impressed with Chelsea Maxey, a soon to be junior that he said "has really been a nice surprise for us."

"As a post player she's a little bit under-sized, but she's been working her butt off and done a lot of good things when she's gotten into games," said Huppenthal.

White Dragons win Hamilton County Rookie Baseball League Tournament

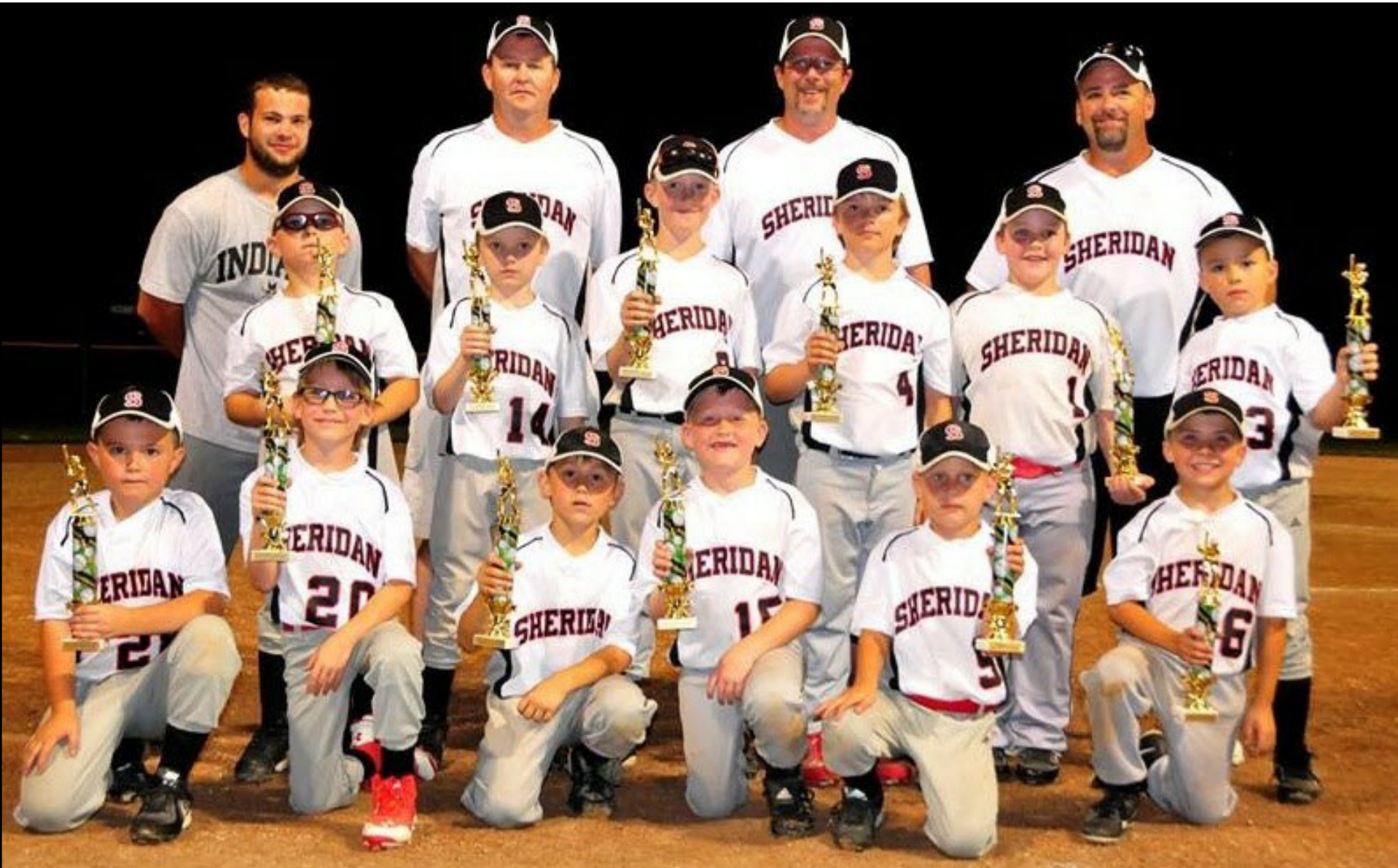
