Over 40 licenses issued by county for...

Same-sex marriages

It didn't take long following a ruling by U.S. District Judge Richard Young saying that Indiana's law on same-sex marriages was unconstitutional for Hamilton County to issue its first license. Young's ruling began to leak out shortly after noon on Wednesday.

"We issued a first license somewhere between 2 and 2:30 p.m.," said Hamilton County Clerk Peggy Beaver. Eleven couples received licenses on Wednesday.

The office had more traffic on Thursday. As of mid-afternoon, more than 30 couples had been granted marriage licenses.

"We opened at 8 a.m. (Thursday) and the lobby was full at that time," said Beaver. "Earlier, we had developed a plan. It took about 10 minutes to process each couple."

Of the more than 41 couples who received licenses Wednesday and Thursday, Beaver said she wasn't sure how many immediately followed with wedding vows.

"I do know on Wednesday 8 of the 11 couples were married by Magistrate David Najjar," Beaver said.

In Young's ruling the judge wrote, "In less than a year, every federal district court to consider the issue has reached the same conclusion in thoughtful and thorough opinions – laws prohibiting the celebration and recognition of same-sex marriages are unconstitutional."

Indiana Attorney General Greg Zoeller was quick to file a notice of appeal and an emergency request for a stay of Young's order.

"We have nothing to do with that," Beaver said. "We have been ordered to issue same-sex marriage licenses. That is what we will continue to do unless ordered otherwise."

"Until the United States Supreme Court determines that traditional marriage laws such as Indiana's are unconstitutional, it is premature to require Indiana to change its definition of marriage and abide by this court's conception of marriage," Zoeller said. "Nonetheless, marriages in violation of Indiana's existing law have taken place, are taking place, and will continue to take place pursuant to this court's order."

Hamilton was one of five counties in which clerks were a part to a lawsuit and, therefore, was instructed by the attorney general that they must comply with Young's order. Other counties are not under the direct jurisdiction of the federal court order, but the attorney general said "must encourage everyone to show respect for the judge and the orders that are issued."

Noblesville Schools announced today that Noble Crossing Elementary is the recipient of a grant from Vectren Foundation that will support the purchase of 35 Apple iPads and related accessories. The iPads will be utilized by fourth graders and will supplement iPads already in use so that children can get more hands-on learning with the tools.

"We are so appreciative of Vectren's generosity," said Pat Haney, principal of Noble Crossing. "Vectren has been a wonderful partner and supporter of our efforts to integrate educational technology in meaningful ways. These funds will allow our fourth graders more access to tools that enable deeper inquiry-based and collaborative learning, which are critical 21st Century skills. With these tools, our students can be more active and engaged learners by using the iPads to select, plan, research and communicate about real-world projects."

The grant award of \$11,720 marks the second year in a row that Vectren has recognized Noble Crossing's educational efforts. In 2013, the foundation awarded \$11,100 earmarked for third grade iPads.

"We are thankful to be able to award a grant like this for two consecutive years and to award it for such a large amount," said division manager of the Vectren Foundation, Jeff Guinn. "Noble Crossing has been able to effectively demonstrate that they are raising the bar in enhancing student performance and innovation with the goal of developing future leaders."

Approximately 200 students will benefit this year from the funding, including third graders who will be able to utilize some of the accessories purchased with this year's grant for their iPads.

One injured in Wednesday crash

A two-vehicle crash Wednesday evening at State Road 32 and Prairie Baptist Road left one passenger seriously injured.

Hamilton County deputies were dispatched to the location at approximately 8:19pm on a report of a crash with possible injuries. Deputies found a white Town and Country van driven by Heather Morris of Lapel, IN and cream Honda Accord driven by a 17 year-old juvenile involved in the crash. The initial investigation of the crash scene indicated the juvenile driver was northbound on Prairie Baptist Road and disregarded the stop sign causing the Accord to strike the van.

A juvenile passenger in the Honda Accord was transported to the hospital with a possible neck fracture and Ms. Morris was treated for minor injuries. The juvenile driver was taken to the Hamilton County Juvenile Services Center and preliminarily charged with Operating While Intoxicated Causing Serious Injury, Possession of Marijuana, and Possession of Paraphernalia. The Hamilton County Sheriff's Office Crash Investigation Team is investigating the incident.

Stabbing on 8th Street...

"Victim" changes story

A gruesome injury to a Noblesville man turned out to be a self-inflicted one.

Officers from the Noblesville Police Department were dispatched to the area of 8th and Logan streets at approximately 7:34 p.m. Wednesday in reference to a complaint of an injured person. Officers arrived on the scene and assisted emergency responders from the Noblesville Fire Department.

The victim, Patrick R. Brown, 43, Noblesville, had suffered an apparent knife wound to the side of the neck and was in need of medical attention. Brown provided limited information but indicated that he had been assaulted several hours ago while walking down the street.

The alleged crime scene was secured and investigators began the process of collecting evidence and identifying potential witnesses.

Brown was transported to IU Health Methodist Hospital in Indianapolis by ground ambulance. While at the hospital, Brown indicated that the story that he had earlier provided to police was not true and that he had inflicted the wound on himself.

Brown's medical status is unknown at this time. The Noblesville Police Department is not actively seeking any other person believed to be involved in this incident.

NAP awards tax credits to Janus for distribution to donors

The Neighborhood Assistance Program (NAP) has awarded Janus Developmental Services with \$14,136.26 in tax credits for distribution to donors making contributions to Janus. Janus can accept donations for tax credits beginning on July 1, 2014.

NAP offers \$2.5 million in tax credits annually for distribution by not-for-profit corporations. Donors who donate a minimum of \$100 can claim 50% (\$50) of their donation as a tax credit. For example, a \$500 donation qualifies for a \$250 tax credit. A \$1,000 donation qualifies for a \$500 tax credit and so on.

The donor files the NAP tax credit with their Indiana State income taxes. Since the NAP credits are distributed on a first come, first serve basis, once \$14,136.26 has been disbursed, we will not be able to provide any more tax credits to our donors. The NAP program provides donors with a wonderful program to support Janus and receive a tax credit incentive at the same time!

Hedgehog Music Showcase is a dream come true

I'm often asked how I came to name my music venue in the northern Hamilton County town of Arcadia the Hedgehog Music Showcase. Well, there are actually two reasons.

What's in a name?

When I was a teenager and first became interested in guitar, I was listening to Chet Atkins, Homer & Jethro, and Les Paul recordings that my parents and grandparents had in their record collections. Years later, I learned that each of these musicians were greatly influenced by a gypsy guitarist named Django Reinhardt. While reading a biography on Django, I learned that the gypsies considered the roasted hedgehogs as a food delicacy. The idea for a venue that would be a musical delicacy came to mind.

At about this same time, I learned of a business principle called the Hedgehog Concept. Since our music venue would focus on doing just one thing, which was pro-level music performances, the concept seemed to fit. We were not a restaurant or bar where music was secondary. Our purpose was to provide a unique up-close and personal listening experience like no other venue in central Indiana. We would offer a genre ranging from old-time and bluegrass, country and folk, to jazz, big band and swing.

A stage stars love

To date, we have hosted nine Grammy Award winners, several internationally acclaimed artists, as well as the best of the best local pro musicians. The audience and the artists love the setup. The audience feels as if they are close friends to the performers, and the artists feel that they have a special connection to the audience that they cannot get in larger venues.

Artists such as Leon Redbone, IBMA Female Vocalist of the Year Claire Lynch, John Jorgenson, Frank Vignola, and others have found the Hedgehog Music Showcase to be a gem, and although they don't make the big bucks that they are accustomed to in

other venues, they keep coming back for the addictive ambiance and intimacy that the historic brick building and the Hedgehog has to offer them.

Bob's slice of musical heaven

For me personally, the Hedgehog Music Showcase is like living my dream. When I was in my early 20s, I played lead guitar in a western style square dance band. It gave me an opportunity to be on stage and hone my musical skills in front of a large number of people. Later on, I played in a big band/Dixieland group for 19 years at another

small venue. This group played for a captive audience every week. Most other local musicians I knew were playing in places where the music was only background or for events where folks weren't really listening to the music. Our band was lucky to have an audience actually listening to every note.

The enjoyment that I received, and the enjoyment I saw it giving others, sparked an idea that would be even better for all involved. I asked myself, "Why not create a venue where the pro musician is really appreciated, and the audience can comfortably

hear the music without competing with people talking or the clanking of silverware and dishes?" The Hedgehog is the result of that idea. It's a place where the audience feels at home, can enjoy the music while having light concessions at small tables; sort of like a pleasant night club type setting. The Hedgehog became a place where musical artists can create and display their talents. I design all of our promotional posters which I love to do. I get to play guitar in a creative way, be with good friends, and provide top quality entertainment to the community.

Carmel’s Wernert named Indiana FSSA Secretary

Governor Mike Pence named Dr. John. J. Wernert as Secretary of Indiana’s Family & Social Services Administration (FSSA), the first medical doctor in the history of FSSA to serve in this role. In addition, Governor Pence named former FSSA Secretary Michael Gargano as Deputy Secretary for Operations and the Healthy Indiana Plan (HIP) 2.0.

“With more than two decades in the medical field serving some of our most vulnerable Hoosiers, Dr. John J. Wernert has the expertise, character, and history of service to lead Indiana’s Family & Social Services Administration,” said Governor Pence. “With his extensive background in medical practice and administration, Dr. Wernert is uniquely qualified to lead the Family & Social Services Administration during this time of opportunity and transition.”

A practicing psychiatrist in central Indiana since 1989, Dr. John J. Wernert, of Carmel, currently serves as the Medical Director of Medical Management at Eskenazi Health in Indianapolis as well as the Medical Director for Behavioral Health Integration for the Franciscan Alliance system in Indiana. He is also the incoming President of the Indiana State Medical Association, a member of the Wisconsin Physician Services Federal Medicare Advisory Committee, and a member of the Drug Utilization Review Board for the Indiana Medicaid program. Dr. Wernert will resign from each of these positions before beginning his new role as Secretary of FSSA.

Dr. Wernert, who serves as the Clinical Associate Professor of Psychiatry at the Indiana University School of Medicine, has held various leadership roles in medical professional organizations including the American Medical Association, the American Psychiatric Association, and the Indianapolis Medical Society. He is also a consultant for the Catholic Archdioceses of Indianapolis, as well as a member of a number of charitable boards. Most recently, he worked as the Chief Medical Officer and Vice President of Medical Affairs for MDwise, Inc. Previously, Dr. Wernert held positions at various hospitals managing geriatric Inpatient units and Behavioral Health consulting services including St. Francis Hospital and Health System, Winona Hospital Senior Adult Unit, ADVANTAGE Health Plan, Clarian Health, Indianapolis Psychiatric Associates, and Methodist Medical Group. He is a partner in Professional Development Associates, a consulting group that provides continuing medical education programs and telehealth services. Dr. Wernert has also worked in various long-term care facilities, community health centers and federally qualified health centers (FQHC's) throughout Indiana. His clinical work has focused on providing comprehensive services for the uninsured and Medicaid populations in high need areas of the state.

Dr. Wernert, who earned his undergraduate degree from Bellarmine University and his M.D. from the University of Louisville School of Medicine, also obtained postgraduate degrees in the fields of public management and health administration from the School of Public and Environmental Affairs at Indiana University Purdue University Indianapolis.

Meyer Najem to construct new Kokomo baseball stadium

Meyer Najem, a Fishers based construction company, has been awarded the construction management of a significant new \$11.5 million redevelopment effort in downtown Kokomo.

The new downtown development will address the flood prone area along the Wildcat Creek by directing \$2.5 million in flood mitigation efforts to repurpose the site for the stadium. The \$9 million stadium will be enjoyed by generations, and begin to alleviate long standing flooding concerns in central Kokomo.

This facility will accommodate over 4,000 people for baseball, soccer, and other sporting and special events and will have the ability to expand seating for concerts and other community activities. Initially the stadium will be used by local high school and college baseball teams. Efforts are underway to attract larger tournaments and semi-professional teams as well. Eventually, the stadium will merge into one of the largest new developments in downtown’s history and will make significant contributions to the economic resurgence of the downtown area. It will be the first new baseball stadium in Kokomo since Highland Park Stadium was built in 1955. That stadium was once home field for the Kokomo Dodgers, who were a Minor League affiliate of the Brooklyn Dodgers.

Stadium construction is expected to begin soon and open in April 2015 in time for next year’s high school baseball season.

Meyer Najem was established in 1987 by Karl Meyer and Anthony Najem. Schrank likes what he sees

Chris Schrank has gotten his first good look at his new basketball team and the Sheridan coach likes what he has seen.

Schrank, formerly the assistant coach at Chatard High School, signed as Sheridan’s new boss man just a couple of weeks ago. The evening of the day on which he signed Schrank took the Blackhawks to a summer league game in Kokomo.

“After that we played in a team camp at Rose-Hulman,” said the coach. “There were lots of good teams playing there. I like the way we competed.”

Playing in a camp-ending tournament, Sheridan lost to North Knox in the first game. But, the Blackhawks battled their way through the consolation bracket and finished runner-up in the bracket, losing to Crawford County in the final game.

“That was a good Crawford County team,” Schrank said. “We looked them up. They were 18-4 last season.”

Schrank said all of the Blackhawks played well at Rose-Hulman.

“Brock Kitchel and Jake Chesney looked good,” he said.

Kitchel averaged 10.1 points a game as a junior last season. Chesney was fourth in Hamilton County with 3.7 assists a game.

“It wasn’t just one guy,” Schrank continued.

“Chris Roberts played well and so did Patrick Weitzel.”

Both Roberts and Weitzel will enter their junior season. Roberts was a double digit scorer as a sophomore with a 10.3 scoring average.

“It’s going to take some time for the kids to adjust to a new coach,” said the new coach. “I’ve changed the way, a little, from how they were playing last season.

“We’re talking about getting back quick on defense. We want to get after people,” said Schrank. “This team has time to grow.”

Schrank was asked his opinion of coming to a “football school.”

“I’ve given it some thought,” he answered. “Sheridan is known as a football school. I know that. I know that most of our basketball players will be playing another sport or two. That’s fine with me. I think it is good for kids to play more than one sport. You can kind of get bored playing just one sport year-around.

“I’m coming from a school (Chatard) which is known for football. Chatard had to start basketball late lots of time because of success in football. I can work with that.

“We’ve got time to grow as a team. We’ll take off the remainder of July and then after school starts for those kids not playing another sport, we’ll work out in the gym. I think our first game is Nov. 16. We’ve got some time to get ready before then,” Schrank concluded.

Sheridan’s season opener, barring any rescheduling for football, will be against Rossville, which is coached by Cory Dunn, Sheridan’s coach last year.

HSE’s Gary Harris picked 19th in NBA Draft

It was an interesting NBA Draft night for Gary Harris. The Hamilton Southeastern and Michigan State superstar was the 19th pick in the draft, which took place Thursday night in New York City. Harris was drafted by the Chicago Bulls - but he won't be packing his bags for the Windy City.

Instead, Harris will be going to the Denver Nuggets. A little earlier in the evening, Denver drafted Creighton star Doug McDermott as the 11th pick. However, the Bulls and the Nuggets worked out a trade that would send McDer-

mott to Chicago in exchange for the Bulls' upcoming two picks (16th and 19th). Chicago chose Bosnian player Jusuf Nurkic as its 16th pick, then Harris was selected a few minutes later.

The bottom line is that Harris, the 2012 Indiana Mr. Basketball, will be playing in the NBA. He spent his last two seasons up at Michigan State, where he started 67 of the 69 games he played. Despite just two years as a Spartan, Harris scored 1025 points, a career average of 14.9 points per game. This past year, Michigan State reached the Elite Eight before falling to eventual NCAA champion Connecticut.

As a Royal, Harris was part of history: He was a freshman player on the team when HSE won its first ever sectional championship in 2009. Southeastern won another sectional in 2011, when Harris was a junior. Harris was also a star on the Royals' football team.

With Harris' drafting, Hamilton County now has two active players in the NBA. Josh McRoberts, a 2005 Carmel graduate, just completed his seventh season in the league, spending this past season with the Charlotte Bobcats. McRoberts played for his hometown Indiana Pacers for three years, from 2008-11.

Like most other girls basketball teams, Guerin Catholic is in a period of transition this summer.
