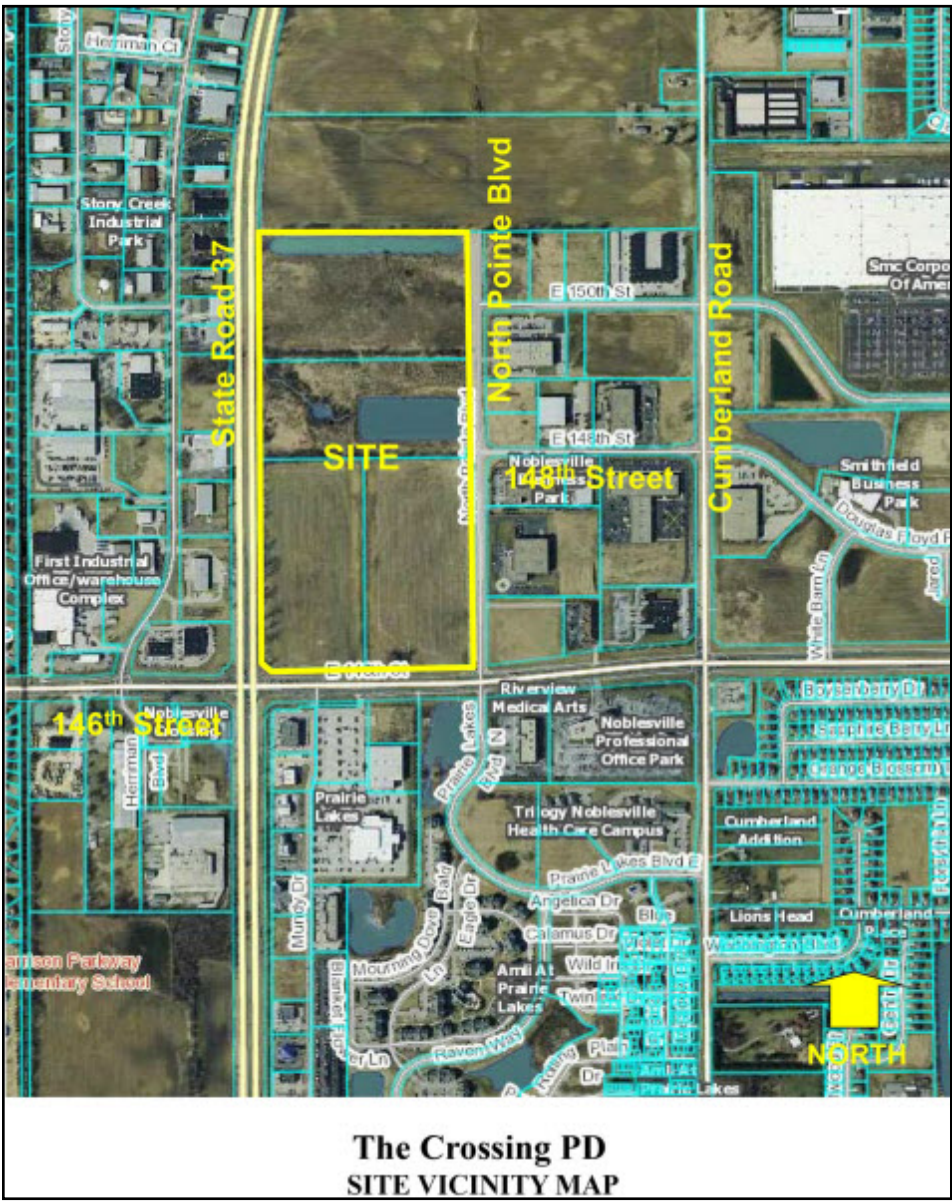

New housing developments are on their way to Noblesville

The Noblesville Common Council has passed the first readings of, if later adopted, will add three huge housing developments in the city. The developments are: The Crossing; Flats at 146 Street, and Templeton Ridge. Starting with The Crossing today, the Hamilton County Reporter will provide a series of articles giving our readers a better and closer look at the three developments. The Crossings, a TM Crowley development, LLC, will have 352 units. First readings on such ordinances are to introduce or gain additional details. The approval or disapproval by the Common Council will come at the second reading when the Council next meets on July 15. Big fun in Noblesville this month...

July 4th Parade and Festival is days away, Street Dance soon after

There's only six days left until Noblesville hosts its July 4th Parade and Fireworks Festival. The celebration begins at 5 p.m. with the parade. This year's theme is "It's a Grand Old Flag," and Grand Marshal Chuck Layton will lead the parade. Chuck is a veteran of the Korean War and former POW. He also currently serves as a Board Member and driver for Meals on Wheels of Hamilton County. The parade will begin at the corner of 16th and Harrison streets. The parade route will be 16th Street to Logan Street; Logan to 9th Street; 9th to Monument Street; and Monument to 16th Street. New this year, courtesy of The Wafford Theater, will be a live broadcast of the parade on www.HamiltonCountyTelevision.com. After July 4th, the parade broadcast will be available for viewing on demand from the website. Immediately after the parade, the free Fireworks Festival, presented by Industrial Dielectrics, Inc., will take place from 6 to 10 p.m. on the grounds of Noblesville High School, 18111 Cumberland Road. There will be several activities for people of all ages. New this year will be "Pinny"—the mobile tourism vehicle from Hamilton County Tourism. The Kids Zone will fea-

ture balloon artists, face painters, carnival games, a giant slide, and an obstacle course. Festival goers of all ages will enjoy the music of Ripple Effect; Animalia animal shows (scheduled from 6 to 9:30 p.m.); a mini race car simulator; rock climbing wall; extreme air jumper; an instant photo booth, and more. Please note that all activities and entertainment are free to attendees, thanks to the generous support of the event's sponsors. Food vendors will be at the festival or people may bring picnic dinners. Please note that sparklers, fireworks, alcohol, and smoking are not allowed on school grounds. The grand finale of the day will be the fireworks display. The fireworks will begin at approximately 10 p.m. and will be the exciting end to a fun celebration. A week after the July 4th celebration, one of Noblesville's favorite summer events will take place. Noblesville Main Street, Inc. will hold the 23rd annual Noblesville Street Dance on the historic courthouse square from 5 to

11 p.m. on Saturday, July 12. Admission is free and the event is open to the public. Riverview Health and the City of Noblesville will serve as the title sponsors of this year's event. In addition to all of the fun activities that attendees have come to expect, a marketplace of retail vendors will be returning. Also returning this year will be the beer garden area which will feature a wide variety of beer selections from downtown Noblesville's Copper Still. This year's Street Dance will feature an exciting new addition—a zipline located at the intersection of 8th and Logan. One popular feature that was new last year will be returning, courtesy of The Wafford Theater. At dusk, bring your blankets and chairs to the lawn behind the Judicial Center and enjoy a FREE showing of the movie "Frozen." Same-sex marriages halted after emergency stay

After 48 hours and hundreds of licenses granted, same-sex marriages have been halted in Indiana. The United States Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit granted an emergency motion for a stay of the Wednesday ruling by District Court Judge Richard Young that threw out Indiana's ban on same-sex marriage. The stay was granted around 6 p.m. Friday evening. Indiana Attorney General Greg Zoeller filed the motion late Friday afternoon after no decision had been made on his earlier appeal to the District Court. Zoeller had filed that appeal on Wednesday afternoon, immediately after Young's ruling. Zoeller plans to appeal Young's ruling. On Friday, Hamilton County issued 16 same-sex marriage licenses out of 30 overall. This followed 41 couples receiving licenses the previous two days. Marion County issued 586 licenses during the two-day period.

Take caution this summer with small children and hot cars

With summer in full swing and people traveling to summer destinations, citizens are reminded to take extra caution as it relates to small children and hot cars. Tragically each year, particularly during the summer months, there are reports of child deaths as a result of being left in hot cars. According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), cars parked in direct sunlight can reach internal temperatures of 131 to 170 degrees Fahrenheit when outside temperatures are 80 to 100 degrees. Even outside temperatures in the 60's can cause internal car temperatures

to rise well above 110. Even with the window rolled down two inches, the interior temperature of the car can rise to well over 100 degrees in as little as 15 minutes. According to a report by Jan Null, CCM of the Department of Earth & Climate Sciences, San Francisco State University, as of June 25, 2014, 13 children in the U.S. have died this year as a result of heatstroke after being left in a hot car and a total of 44 children died in 2013. From 1998 to the present, 619 children have died as a result of heatstroke after being left in cars or an average of 38 per year.

These unfortunate tragedies can be easily avoided by following these tips:

- NEVER LEAVE A CHILD UNATTENDED IN A VEHICLE. NOT EVEN FOR A MINUTE!
- IF YOU SEE A CHILD UNATTENDED IN A HOT VEHICLE CALL 9-1-1.
- Be sure that all occupants leave the vehicle when unloading. Don't overlook sleeping babies.
- Always lock your car and ensure children do not have access to keys or remote entry devices. IF A CHILD IS MISSING, ALWAYS CHECK THE POOL FIRST, AND

THEN THE CAR, INCLUDING THE TRUNK. Teach your children that vehicles are never to be used as a play area.

- Keep a stuffed animal in the car seat and when the child is put in the seat place the animal in the front with the driver.
- Or place your purse or briefcase in the back seat as a reminder that you have your child in the car.
- Make "look before you leave" a routine whenever you get out of the car.
- Have a plan that your childcare provider will call you if your child does not show up for school.

Academy’s 125 kids learn about...

Faith, Community and Law Enforcement

On Friday 125 kids from all across the county attended the 8th annual Chaplain Tom Burton Hamilton County Junior Law Enforcement Academy at the Hamilton County 4H fairgrounds. The academy was renamed this year in honor of the recently passed head chaplain, Tom Burton, of the sheriff’s office who started this program 8 years ago.
60 law enforcement officers, chaplains and volunteers from Noblesville Police, Fishers Police, Westfield Police, Indianap-

olis Metropolitan Police and the Hamilton County Sheriff’s Office gave their time to the kids of Hamilton County to combine a day of faith, community and law enforcement.
The youth of Hamilton County got to hear from two champion athletes. Retired WWF wrestler “Blast” and 1985 junior middle weight boxing champ “Jersey” Alphonso Bailey. They learned how both overcame poor decisions and bad luck in their lives and how they got beyond these obstacles to become a better person. Both are now world traveling evangelist and Bailey is a chaplain with the Hamilton County Sheriff’s Office.
A demonstration was done by the Indianapolis Metro Police bomb squad including a live detonation showing how the team might dispose of a bomb threat with the use of a robot. A demonstration of a Korean War era helicopter now designated for law enforcement use was also put on for the attendees.
Sheriff’s office Head Chaplain, Mark Fidler, said “we are all here for the same

reason, to teach”. The kids get to learn a lot from the officers and also from the faith based structure of the program. It helps them learn to make good life decisions. Many of the officers and volunteers that help out with the day-long camp have done it since the camp began back in 1996. The day runs from 8:30am until just after the closing ceremonies at 5:00pm and changes each year because many of the kids return year after year. The camp also included lunch, craft time, a ride in a squad car and even root beer floats.

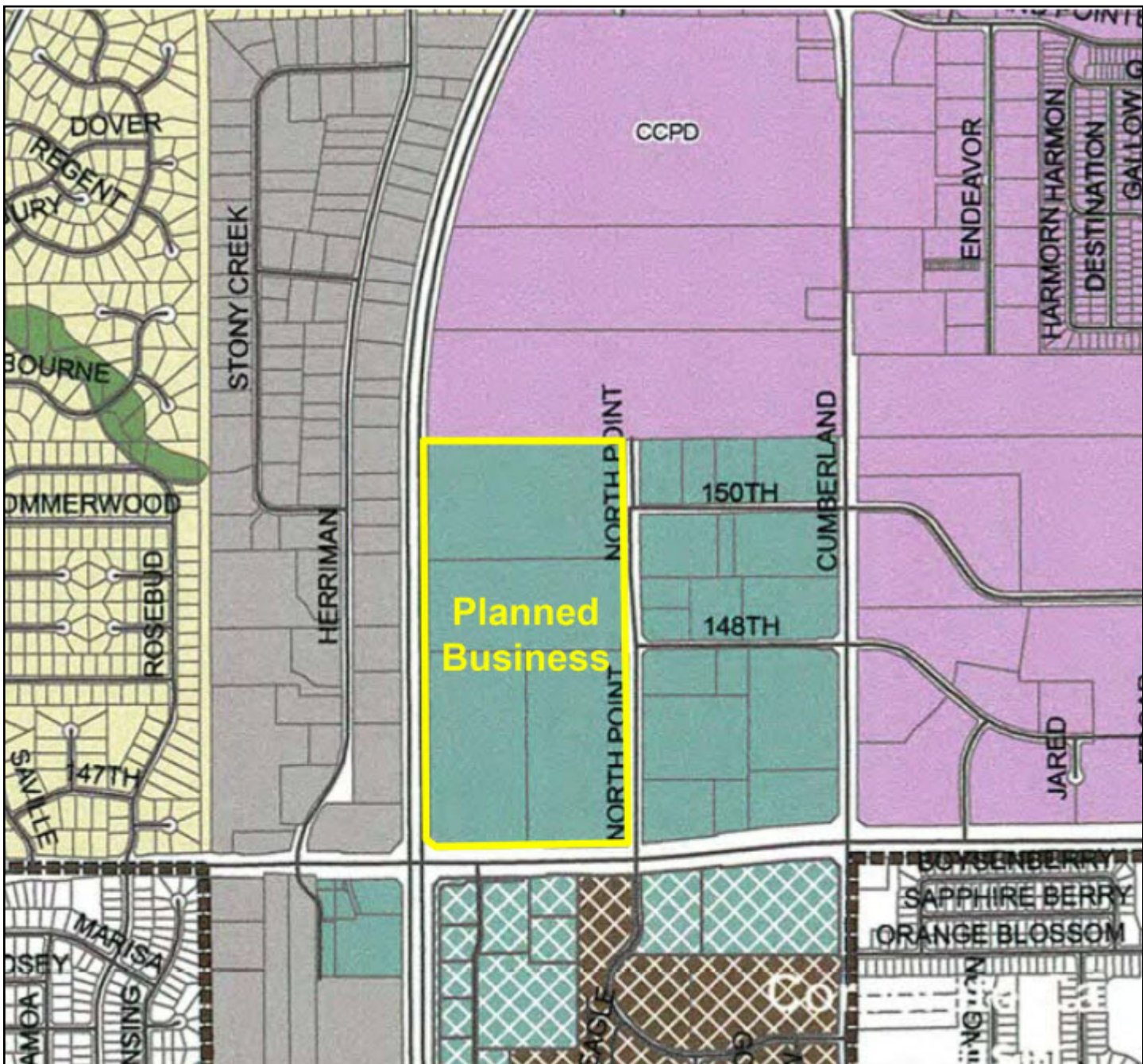

Seven scoreless from Sadler helps Tribe gain split with 7-2 win over Bulls

Starter Casey Sadler tossed 7.0 scoreless innings of work, while outfielders Chris Dickerson and Jaff Decker each posted four-hit efforts to help the Indianapolis Indians (47-34) split their season series with the Durham Bulls (45-38) with a dominating 7-2 victory at Durham Bulls Athletic Park on Friday night.

Indianapolis once again started strong, with Michael Martinez scoring Robert Andino for the first time on the evening with an RBI single in the second inning. Indy's lead continued to expand in the fourth and fifth frames thanks to a pair of doubles from Andino and Decker respectively that gave the Tribe a commanding 3-0 lead.

Indy continued to pour it on just an inning later, as a three-run sixth inning put Durham permanently out of reach. Andino got on base once again with a leadoff single, and after a walk and Martinez sacrifice, came plateward on one of Dickerson's four hits. Hurting their own cause, Durham's intentional walk of Jaff Decker backfired after Jose Tabata was the victim of a hit-by-pitch and Matt Hague coaxed an RBI walk. When the sixth was all said and done Indy had burst out to an insurmountable 6-0 lead.

While Indy's offensive outburst gave Sadler plenty of offensive support, he would end up not needing it. The right hander turned in his eighth quality start of the season with seven dominant frames that lowered his ERA to the third best in the International League this season at 2.10.

Following Sadler, reliever Jhonathan Ramos worked two strong innings of relief to seal the Tribe victory.

After the dominant performance, the Indians will now head to Louisville for a two-game series beginning tomorrow at 6:05 P.M.
