The County Line

Telling the story of county's most bizarre double murder

June 28 marked the anniversary of one of the most bizarre double murders in Hamilton County history. On that date in 1900 a policeman and a preacher were gunned down at a Carmel livery stable in a shootout reminiscent of the old west.



William F. Carey, technically a

deputy constable, was a 32 year old husband and father-to-be when his brother-in-law, the Carmel constable, deputized him for the purpose of bringing an eccentric street preacher to a Justice of the Peace hearing.

Rev. T.J. "Cyclone" Johnson was in town for a tent revival. It was a time in history when such preachers traveled the country much like the fictional Elmer Gantry. The fiery preacher apparently insulted a significant segment of the community with his oratory. He became controversial to say the least.

Some reports said young men who verbally criticized or taunted the preacher felt the sting of Johnson's buggy whip. There may also have been a shot fired. In any event, the itinerant preacher known in the Midwest as the Kentucky Cyclone, was cited into JP court. Carey escorted Johnson to the Jeffries Livery Stable on Main Street near the Monon Railroad for his hearing.

The preacher was apparently carrying a concealed revolver. Seeing a crowd of possibly unfriendly spectators gathering for the hearing, Cyclone pulled the gun and shot Carey who died at the scene. Some of the spectators were also armed and several

shots were fired in Cyclone Johnson's direction. He died of his multiple wounds.

The usually quiet community was stunned and the killings made big news. The county sheriff and coroner were called to investigate, but witnesses were apparently not talking and authorities were never able to identify a gunman who shot Cyclone.


Carey, well liked in the community, was buried with honors after the largest funeral Carmel had witnessed until that time. The deputy continues to be honored even now. His picture hangs in police headquarters and one of Carmel's street statues, a police officer, has a name badge reading W. Carey.

In just a few days I got my card with my new name. I thought the hard part was over. Boy was I wrong!


I cannot find my birth certificate.

On Friday, I took my marriage license and my social security card to the BMV and within minutes I was ready to leave with my new license coming in the mail. As I signed the last form when I saw that they still had my middle initial as K. I said "but I have taken my maiden name as my middle name." A manager was called and I was told that they had to have my birth certificate to change my middle initial on my license. They needed a paper trail of who I am. Seriously?

I had to go to the county where I was born to get my birth certificate since I could not find the original. I stopped at the Hamilton County Health Department to make sure I took what was

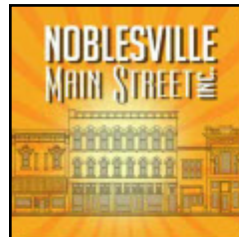

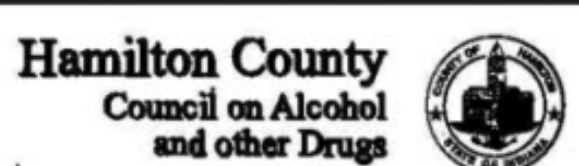

Uncle Sam celebrates 40 years of ministry

Former Noblesville resident Terry Horn on Friday celebrated 40 years of full-time children’s ministry.

Horn, a 1973 graduate of Noblesville High School, was accompanied by his wife Reverend Cynthia Horn during the celebration.

The celebration was held at River of Praise Church located in Yulee, Florida. Horns ministry, Children’s Ministry International is based out of the Jacksonville Florida area.

Various nationally known ministers, which included CBN’s President of the Board Pat Robertson, Bishop Paul Zink and Kenneth Copeland, sent congratulatory letters to Horn. Jacksonville’s Mayor Alvin Brown issued a proclamation declaring June 29th as Children’s Ministry International Day.

Terry met his wife Cynthia at a church where he was ministering. Terry’s long time friend and pioneer in children’s ministry, kids evangelist "Captain Hook" introduced the couple to each other. The two were married on July 4, 1986 in Dallas Texas.

Terry is a licensed, ordained minister, with an honorary degree in Theology from Logos Bible College in Jacksonville, Florida. He conducts children’s crusades and puppet workshops throughout the United States. Terry was mentored in ministry by Dr. Lester Sumrall.

Horn’s ministry focuses on inner-city children. In 1995 Terry and his wife Cynthia founded the DC Dream Center, an inner-city ministry in Washington DC. The Horns then moved to the Jacksonville, Florida area to begin their current ministry.

Currently the Horn’s operate "Mobile Studio7" a powerful inner-city fast paced multimedia sidewalk kids church conduct-

Noblesville has new assistant...

Huskies handle Millers on court

Lots of times, down through the years, Noblesville and Hamilton Heights have squared off on a basketball court. Some games at the Husky Dome in Arcadia. Some games at The Mill in Noblesville.

But, never had the game started at 8 a.m. Never until Saturday when the Huskies and Millers began what would eventually be a five-game day in the Super Hoops Tourney at Marion. The game was played in Gym 1 at IWU.

The game, which followed three games for each team on Friday, was, like they say, only a summer game. Heights treated it more like a county backyard battle in December.

“Our guys were looking forward to playing them,” said Heights coach Chad Ballenger.

Jesse McClung looked like he had just been hit by a gravel truck.

McClung is a new coach on the Noblesville staff, and a good one, too. He’s the first African-American coach at Noblesville High School.

The new coach has quite an impressive background. A graduate of the Jack Keefer program at Lawrence North High School and a graduate of Ball State, McClung has coached the last three seasons at Wabash College. Before Wabash, he spent four seasons at Marian University in Indianapolis and two seasons at the University of Indianapolis. He began his playing career at Barton Community College in Great Bend, Kansas, helping the team to a 50-13 record and the No. 1 ranking in the NJCAA as team captain. He played two seasons at Ball Sate, earning the team’s Spark Award and Defensive Award. McClung played a season at the University of Indianapolis, where he earned his master’s degree.

“Heights came out really ready to play,” said McClung, who was coaching the varsity team while new head coach Brian McCauley was working with another group of Millers at nearby McCulloch Middle School.

The Huskies had Noblesville down 30-17 at halftime. Junior-to-be Hunter Crist hit three 3-pointers and scored 13 points and Grant Weatherford added nine.

Noblesville couldn’t stop Crist from the outside, and Weatherford was a power-driving force through the Millers’ defense. Flat out, Weatherford was too strong and two quick for the Millers.

Noblesville made a game out of it in the second half, once chopping Heights’ lead to three points, 40-37. Sean Wilson hit a couple of 3’s and scored 11 points and John Kiser tossed in a couple of baskets.

Weatherford finished with 21 points and Crist with 17.

After Ian Nicholson opened the game with a deuce and a 3-pointer, the only other points not scored by Weatherford or Crist was a 3-pointer by sophomore-to-be Sterling Weatherford.

Wilson led Noblesville with 17 points and Kiser netted 10.

After Noblesville chipped Heights’ lead to 40-37, the Millers made the mistake of twice fouling Crist, one of the best free throw shooters in the state. Crist made four free throws and Weatherford stole the basketball and scored on a lay-in as Hamilton Heights powered away to what ended in a 46-37 victory.

“They couldn’t handle (Grant) Weatherford,” Ballenger said. “We moved him from inside to outside. Their guards weren’t big or strong enough to handle him and their inside people weren’t fast enough.”

“We really came out slow,” said McClung. “We turned over the basketball nine of our first 15 possessions.”

It could be an interesting period of time for the overall Hamilton Heights-Noblesville rivalry.

Last spring the Huskies, in the Noblesville Invitational, upset the Miller baseball team which went on to win a state championship.

The two schools will meet in football this season.

And, come December this Heights team which was pretty darn impressive against the Millers in summer ball, might be capable of a repeat in winter ball.

Bats weather Tribe’s scattered storms to strike in seventh

Engaged in an immediate neck-and-neck struggle with the hometown Bats, Indy and its utility arm Jay Jackson kept their opposition off-balance through a 5.2-IP dance featuring just three base knocks and two walks with six strikeouts over Jackson’s scoreless “spot” start. The Tribe’s righty was, by all intents and purposes, in the driver’s seat after fanning four consecutive batters and being spotted a 1-0 edge on Matt Hague’s sixth-inning solo blast, but the starter was outlasted by an equally strong outing from his Bats counterpart.

Louisville righty Jair Jurrjens recovered from Hague’s big fly and limited the remaining Indians’ bats to five hits and two walks through his otherwise scoreless, 7.0-IP start. Once Jurrjens secured a shutout frame in the seventh, his offense rallied with three one-base knocks, including RBI singles from Kris Negron and Hernan Iribarren, to notch a game-winning, 2-1 advantage.

Indy kept applying pressure to the very end, but after putting the tying run on base in the ninth, a Bats running stab in LF began a wild, 7-6-3 double play that halted the Tribe’s late rally in its tracks.
