

Merger agreement...

Community Bank & Muncie

First Merchants Corporation (NASDAQ: FRME) and Community Bancshares, Inc. today announced they have executed a definitive agreement whereby Community Bancshares will merge with and into First Merchants, and its wholly-owned bank subsidiary, Community Bank, will merge with and into First Merchants Bank, N.A.

The merger agreement provides that shareholders of Community Bancshares will have the right to exchange each Community Bancshares common share held for either or a combination of (i) 4.0926 shares of First Merchants' common stock, or (ii) \$85.94 in cash. In the event that the total amount of cash elections exceeds \$15 million, proration will occur to limit the cash paid to \$15 million. Based on the closing

price of First Merchants' common stock on July 21, 2014 of \$20.38, the transaction value is approximately \$46.3 million.

The transaction is expected to be completed in the first quarter of 2015, subject to the approval of Community Bancshares shareholders, regulatory approvals, and other customary closing conditions. The combined financial institutions, which will do business as First Merchants Bank, expect to complete the integration during the second quarter of 2015.

Based upon current financials, First Merchants and Community Bancshares will have combined assets of \$5.7 billion and will remain the second largest financial holding company headquartered in Indiana. The combined company will have 107 banking offices in twenty-six Indiana coun-

ties, as well as two counties in both Ohio and Illinois.

Lake Monon is a hot, controversial development site

Who would have guessed that an old borrow pit dug more than 40 years ago would be the proposed site for 43 expensive homes fiercely opposed by neighboring residents? Such is life in today's world of suburban development.

Now more attractively named Lake Monon, the pit was dug to supply dirt for an Interstate 465 overpass. The lake, on the west side of the Monon Trail immediately north of 465, sat all these years almost unknown to all but a few neighboring homeowners. Trees grew up on the land around the lake. Now the area is considered by some to be an environmental treasure.

Developers named M&I Homes, found the 34-acre site and want to develop it with \$300,000 to \$400,000 homes. Water draws buyers. But, the Carmel Plan Commission doesn't buy the plan for 43 lots around the pit, or lake. They think present zoning which would allow about 28 lots would be just fine, and that's what they are recommending to the Carmel City Council.

The council next month will consider whether to approve a PUD (Planned Unit Development) as the new owners, want or to accept the recommendation of the plan commission that the land remain zoned as R-1 residential.

Neighboring residents came out in force to the plan commission last week saying the trees around the lake are a valuable environmental asset that should be preserved, and that access to the property is not sufficient. At present only a narrow 101st Street runs into the area from College Ave., about a half-mile to the west.

Some have suggested the property would be better suited for a park.

The general area has become a hot spot for development plans in recent months. A golf course east of the Monon with frontage on Westfield Blvd., has been sold recently for development and across Westfield from it another development is also planned.

Meadows Glen shooter identified

A Noblesville man shot and injured a woman in the Meadows Glen subdivision Monday before turning the gun on himself.

Officers from the Noblesville Police Department were dispatched to the area of 10387 Cerulean Drive at approximately 2:31 p.m. in reference to a report of a person shot. Officers arrived on the scene and identified a female victim suffering from what appeared to be a gunshot wound.

The victim, Patricia E. Wagner, 52, of Noblesville, was immediately transported to Riverview Health Hospital (Noblesville)

and later to St. Vincent Hospital (Indianapolis) by ground ambulance. Wagner was treated for a single gunshot wound and released later in the evening.

Officers on the scene of the shooting were provided with information that suggested that the person responsible for firing the shot at Wagner was inside his residence located at 10395 Cerulean Drive. The subject was identified as Nicholas J. Proctor, 53, of Noblesville. Officers made repeated attempts to contact Proctor by using a loud speaker and telephone. Officers were suc-

cessful in making contact with Proctor and spoke with him intermittently for a period of approximately 45 minutes.

The Noblesville/Westfield Emergency Services Unit and Crisis Negotiations Unit were summons to the scene to take over communication efforts and tactical operations. Negotiators continued communication with Proctor until approximately 3:20 p.m. at which time Proctor refused to return any dialogue with negotiators. Negotiators

continued their efforts for the next several hours but with no response from Proctor. At approximately 6:30 p.m., tactical operators from the Emergency Services Unit made entry into the residence in order to locate Proctor. A few moments after entry was made, officers discovered Proctor inside the residence and unresponsive. Medical personnel on the scene pronounced Proctor deceased as a result of an apparent self-inflicted gunshot wound.

Neighbor Wayne Bradley, who had just moved into his home about a week ago, was working in his front yard at the time of the incident. He told the Reporter that he heard a woman yelling for help but never heard the actual gun shot. Bradley has lived in Hamilton County previously and said "this isn't normal, it's a very safe community, someplace to raise a family".

When asked if Noblesville was a safe place to live Lt. Barnes said "We don't live

in a bubble, it would be naïve to think that, but normally yes a safe place."

The Hamilton County Prosecutor's Office, Hamilton County Coroner and investigators from the Noblesville Police Department collected evidence, witness statements and other information relevant to the investigation of this incident. The case is still an ongoing investigation and no other information or details are available at this time.

Questions pertaining to the death investigation of Proctor should be referred to the Hamilton County Coroner's Office.

The Noblesville Police Department is not actively seeking any other person believed to be involved in this incident.

The Noblesville Police Department would like to thank the Noblesville Fire Department and Fishers Police Department's Emergency Services Unit for their assistance during the incident.



Hamilton County road construction update

Milling & paving begins on State Roads 32 & 37

Contractors for the Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) plan to begin this week milling existing pavement before paving new asphalt surfaces on sections of State Roads 32 and 37.

Beginning today, crews plan to begin removing the existing pavement surface on more than four miles of State Road 37 between Allisonville Road and State Road 213. Crews will work daytime hours and use flaggers to direct traffic around the work site.

Crews will begin Tuesday night removing the existing pavement surface on more than two miles of State Road 32 between Hague Road and State Road 37. Crews will work overnight (8 p.m. to 6 a.m.) to minimize disruption to business and traffic. Some flagging will be required to regulate traffic at intersections and on two-lane sections of roadway.

Once the existing asphalt surface is milled away, crews will begin paving a new asphalt surface. Both projects, totaling \$1.6 million in pavement improvements, are expected to be complete before September. Motorists in these areas are advised to drive cautiously and be alert for work zones and stopped or slowed traffic at flagging locations. Always follow speed limits, maintain a safe distance from other vehicles and avoid all distractions—including cell phones—especially while driving through highway work zones.

Construction continues along State Road 19

This week you may begin to see equipment being placed on the south end of town; in front of the McDonald's and Speedway. Beginning Monday, July 28th, work will begin in the turn lane on the east side of State Road 19. The North and South lanes of traffic will not be effected but please keep this in mind as you drive through the area. Both businesses will remain open during the construction.

116th Street center lane restricted

The center turn lane of 116th St. will be restricted between Hazel Dell Parkway and River Road to construct a concrete median for the Bickford of Carmel. This work will begin July 28 and be completed by Aug. 8, weather permitting.

"I love the idea that people are benefitting from this free book exchange in most states and dozens of countries, and I hope people from throughout this area will take advantage of it being in Noblesville."

Todd Bol and Rick Brooks started the movement in 2009 in Wisconsin. They hope to launch more Little Free Libraries than the 2,509 brick-and-mortar ones built with funding from Andrew Carnegie.

Pavement repair contract begins on Interstate 69

Contractors for the Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) plan to begin a pavement repair contract on Interstate 69 this weekend. The \$715,000 contract will require various weeknight and weekend restrictions to make repairs to sections of concrete and asphalt pavement between State Road 37 and State Road 26.

This weekend, E & B Paving plans to remove and replace damaged concrete pavement in the right lane of northbound I-69 between **State Road 9/109 (Anderson Exit 226)** and **State Road 32 (Daleville Exit 234)** beginning at 9 p.m. Friday, July 25. This lane will remain closed until Monday, July 28 at 5 a.m. to allow new concrete ample time to cure.

Additional weeknight and weekend restrictions should be expected as contractors make progress on repairs. Work on the contract is expected to be complete by November. For information on INDOT work zones and highway restrictions, go to trafficwise.in.gov or call toll-free 800-261-ROAD (7623).

Motorists are urged to practice safe driving habits, especially in and around work zones. Follow speed limits, maintain safe distances from other vehicles and avoid all distractions—including cell phones. The Indiana Work Zone Safety Law sets steep penalties for driving infractions within highway work zones. Senior State swim Meet...

Edelman wins twice, Carmel sets national record

Lauren Edelman emerged as the heroine of the Fishers Area Swimming Tigers last weekend at the Senior State Meet, which took place at the IUPUI Natatorium.

Edelman, a sophomore-to-be at Fishers, won both of the women's individual medley events. She clocked in at 4:52.13 in the 400-meter IM, then finished the 200 medley in 2:19.24.

Joining Edelman in the winner's circle was her teammate Abbey Schneider. The senior-to-be proved herself to be the best long-distance swimmer of the meet, finishing the 1500-meter freestyle in 17:03.89. She later finished fourth in the 800 free.

Carmel Swim Club's sensational relay teams dominated the race. The 200 medley team of Claire Adams, Taite Kitchel, Veronica Burchill, Amy Bilquist won that event in 1:55.60. Burchill, Adams and Bilquist later joined Rachel Hayden to finish first in the 200 free relay. Their time of 1:42.29 set a new national record in the 15-18 age group.

Finally, Carmel's 400 free relay team of Hayden, Peyton Mosbaugh, Kendall Smith

and Bilquist won that race in 3:51.06. In case you're counting, that makes Bilquist 3-for-3 in relays. She made headlines earlier this summer by going toe-to-toe with Olympic champion Missy Franklin in national meets.

In the men's meet, a former Westfield star was a winner for Boilermaker Aquatics. Nathan Hopkins, a state champion for the Shamrocks, won the 1500 free event in a time of 15:57.44, then later won the 800 free (8:17.56).

Another Boilermaker, Rhiannon Sheets, was the women's 100 free champion, clocking in at 57.07. Sheets was a star swimmer for Carmel. She was also part of the Boilermakers' winning 400 medley relay.

People with CF suffer from chronic lung problems and digestive disorders. The lungs of people with CF become covered with sticky mucus, which is hard to remove and promotes infection by bacteria. Many people with CF require frequent hospitalizations and continuous use of antibiotics, enzyme supplements, and other medications. The life expectancy of people with CF used to be very short; 30 years ago the median life expectancy was about 8 years. Today, thanks to medical advances, the median life expectancy is in the mid-30s and increasing.
