# IHSAA announces sectional pairings

One of the most anticipated days of the high school football season finally arrived as pairings for 317 teams were announced Sunday evening for the 42nd Annual IHSAA Football State Tournament *presented by the Indianapolis Colts*.

For the second year, Class 6A will be used for the 32 largest schools in the state. With all eight of those sectionals including four teams each, sectional semifinal games will be played on Oct. 24, sectional championship games on Oct. 31 followed by regionals on Nov. 7 and semi-states on Nov. 14. The two teams competing in the state championship game will have a week off before playing for the title.

In 5A, with the next 34 largest teams competing, two first round games must be played in sectionals 9 and 13 on Oct. 24 that contain five teams each. All other 5A teams will have a week off until sectional semifinals are played on Oct. 31 followed by sectional championship games on Nov. 7.

Teams in classes 4A, 3A, 2A and 1A will begin with first round sectional games on Oct. 24 and will play on consecutive weeks all the way to the state championship games.

The 12 teams that earn a berth in the state finals will play on Thanksgiving weekend in Lucas Oil Stadium, home of the NFL's Indianapolis Colts, the state tournament's presenting sponsor. The state championship games will alternate from last year as the Class 2A, 4A and 6A games will be played on Friday, Nov. 28 while the 1A, 3A and 5A contests are set for Saturday, Nov. 29.

# Finally: Millers, 'Hounds meet

With four Hamilton County teams in the field, any draw the IHSAA could have come up with would have the potential of plenty of fireworks in Class 6A, Sectional 4.

But, could it be any better than this combination?

Carmel at Noblesville.

Hamilton Southeastern at Fishers.

Once annual rivals on the gridiron, Noblesville and Carmel have not met since the sectional of 2008. Carmel won going away, 41-0.

The last regular season contest between the two schools was 2004. Carmel won going away, 38-7.

Noblesville's last victory over Carmel was in 2000. The Greyhounds defeated the Millers 23-20 during the regular season but

Noblesville easily handled Carmel 27-12 in the sectional. That Noblesville team went on to defeat Ft. Wayne Snider in the regional before falling to Penn in the semi-state, ending the season with a 12-2 record.

Fourteen years later, Carmel, in first-round action, will travel to Hare Chevrolet Field to face the Millers.

Carmel is 8-0, ranked No. 1 in Class 6A heading into a regular season finale with Lawrence Central.

Noblesville is 5-3. The Millers will close the regular season in a game against Avon.

The other first round contest in Sectional 4 will have Hamilton Southeastern playing cross-town rival Fishers at Reynolds Tigers Stadium.

Unlike the Noblesville-Carmel series, Hamilton Southeastern-Fishers is a series with lots of recent history. The two teams play in the same conference, the Hoosier

Crossroads Conference. When Fishers and HSE meet during the regular season, the coveted Mudsock Trophy is on the line.

Fishers has beaten Southeastern three consecutive times, soundly. The Tigers won 41-10 earlier this season. The Tigers won 51-31 last year. After losing to Southeastern 28-21 in the regular season three years ago,

Fishers drilled the Royals 42-7 in the sectional.

Currently, Fishers is 6-2 and tied with Avon for first place in the Hoosier Crossroads Conference. The Tigers will close at Zionsville on Friday. Southeastern is 3-5 and Friday will host Brownsburg.

This will be the second season for Class 6A football. In last year's sectional, Carmel had its way with the field, beating Southeastern 40-7 and then knocking off Fishers 35-20 in the championship game, after Fishers had eliminated Noblesville in a 17-13 first-round thriller.

Only four head-to-head battles between Sectional 4 teams were played during the regular season. Carmel started the year with a 14-7 win over Southeastern. Fishers has defeated Noblesville 16-13 and Southeastern. Southeastern has defeated Noblesville 16-7.

# McCutcheon is 8-0; ranked No. 2

When McCutcheon left the Hoosier Crossroads Conference this season and joined the North Central Conference, Westfield may have thought it had seen the last of the Mavs.

Guess what? McCutcheon is back. And, McCutcheon is back looking much, much stronger than the teams Westfield faced in the HCC.

Westfield, again, will make the long trip to Lafayette, this time facing McCutcheon in the opening round of Class 5A, Sectional 11.

The Shamrocks advanced to the 5A state championship game last season, losing to Cathedral.

In the other first-round matchup of this four-class sectional, Kokomo will play at Harrison.

This time, McCutcheon will bring an 8-0 record to the sectionals. The Mavericks are ranked No. 2 in the state in both the AP and coaches poll, behind Fort Wayne Snider. Westfield in last week’s poll and before a 38-7 loss to Fishers last weekend, was ranked No. 10 by the AP and No. 11 by the coaches. The Shamrocks are 4-4 and have lost two straight.

Before departing ways this season, Westfield had defeated McCutcheon six

straight times, including a 42-28 regular season matchup and a 45-21 sectional contest last season. McCutcheon’s last victory over Westfield came in 2008, 14-9.

Westfield and McCutcheon played two common opponents this year. The Mavs defeated Zionsville 21-13 and Harrison 33-7, while Westfield won over Zionsville 44-34 and defeated Harrison 35-14.

The Shamrocks only test against a Sectional 11 team this season came in the season-opening win over Harrison. McCutcheon holds wins over the other two teams in the tournament, beating Kokomo 42-21 and Harrison 33-7.

Kokomo and Harrison will meet in the other Sectional 11 first-round game. Harrison has defeated Kokomo, 42-14.

Harrison and Kokomo have identical 5-3 records. Kokomo has not defeated a Class 5A team this season, going 0-3.

**About the Draw**

To conduct the random drawing for the football state tournament, the IHSAA places ping-pong balls representing each school in a given sectional into a lottery-style air mix machine. A fan in the bottom of the machine blows the balls around the inside of the transparent container and air then forces each ball up through a tube in random order.

For example, the first ball retrieved from the machine will be the visiting team in game one with the second ball representing the home team in game one. The third ball to come out is the visitor in game two and the fourth ball the home team in game two. That same method is followed through all 48 sectionals.

In the case of five-team sectionals in Class 5A, the first two teams drawn will play the opening weekend of the tournament with the fifth team drawn receiving the bye and an automatic road game in the semifinal round against the opening game winner. The third and fourth teams drawn will play in the other semifinal game.

In seven-team sectionals, the seventh team drawn receives the bye and an automatic road game in the semifinal round.

# Guerin hosts Lawrenceburg

You might say, Hamilton Heights has its work cut out in Class 3A, Sectional 30. You might say that!

Likely, the Huskies will have to defeat the sectional's two ranked teams, Indian Creek and Guerin Catholic, in order to win the championship. Indian Creek, for sure.

Heights will open the sectional playing at Indian Creek. The winner of that game will face the winner of the Marshall-Rushville opener.

Guerin Catholic will begin at home against Lawrenceburg.

Guerin, the defending sectional champion, and Hamilton Heights can not meet until the championship game.

After Hamilton Heights defeated Lawrenceburg, 56-7, in the first round of last year's sectional, Indian Creek eliminated the Huskies, 34-27.

This season, Indian Creek currently is 8-0 and is ranked No. 4 in the AP poll and No. 9 in the coaches poll.

Unranked Hamilton Heights is 6-2 on the year. Heights has not played any of the other Sectional 30 teams, but the Huskies are 3-0 against other Class 3A teams.

Guerin Catholic won the sectional last year with a 24-20 victory over Indian Creek. That Guerin team then lost to Brebeuf in the regional.

This season, the Eagles are 5-3 overall and are ranked No. 9 by the AP and No. 10

by the coaches. Guerin has not played any of the other Sectional 30 teams.

Guerin's first round foe, Lawrenceburg, is 6-2 overall and 3-0 against other Sectional 30 teams, beating Greensburg 47-46, Batesville 14-7 and Rushville 61-22.

Five of the eight teams in this sectional have winning records. Heights, Batesville and Lawrenceburg are 6-2; Guerin 5-3 and Indian Creek 8-0.

This is an eight-team sectional with an odd mixed of characters. Lawrenceburg, Batesville, Rushville and Greensburg all are from the south. Hamilton Heights is in the northern half of the state. Marshall is an IPS school. Indian Creek is just south of Indianapolis. Guerin is a Catholic school from Central Indiana.

## 'Hawks, TC can't meet until finals

Last year in Class 1A, Sectional 44, the top two football programs in the sectional, Tri-Central and Sheridan, squared off in the first round, just one week after Tri-Central ended the regular season with a 33-27 victory over the Blackhawks.

In the first round of the sectional, Tri-Central pounded Sheridan, 35-7, and the Trojans then went on to claim the Class 1A state championship.

That won't happen this season. Sheridan will visit Tri-Central this Friday in a regular season finale, but the two long-time rivals can't meet again until the championship game of the sectional.

In a seven-team sectional, Sheridan will begin with Indianapolis Tindley at Larry Wright Stadium in Sheridan. Tri-Central will also begin at home, playing Clinton Prairie.

A Sheridan victory over Tindley will send the Blackhawks to a second-round matchup with bye team Clinton Central. A victory over Clinton Prairie will send Tri-Central to a second-round matchup between Deaf School or Indianapolis Shortridge.

Sheridan did not face Tindley during the regular season. The Blackhawks do own a 42-12 victory over Clinton Central.

Tri-Central is 7-1 on the year and will take that record into the Sheridan game this Friday. Sheridan is 4-4.

Tri-Central is ranked No. 6 in both the AP and coaches poll. Sheridan is not ranked.

During the regular season, Tri-Central hammered Clinton Prairie 50-6. TC also holds a 37-6 victory over Clinton Central.

Deaf School comes into the sectional matching Tri-Central's 7-1 record, but has not faced a tough schedule. Such is also the case with Indianapolis Shortridge at 6-2.

Sheridan has never faced Tindley, a small Indianapolis private school which has been playing football only two years. Sheridan and Clinton Central are long-time rivals.

## Tournament tidbits

Carmel is one of 17 teams which will enter the final week of the season with undefeated records.

The 8-0 Greyhounds are one of three 6A teams which are unbeaten. The others are Ft. Wayne Carroll and Penn. Both are teams that the Greyhounds could face in the northern half of the state tourney route.

Other undefeated teams are Andrean, Brownstown Central, Columbus East, Evansville Mater Dei, Evansville Reitz, Indian Creek, McCutcheon, New Palestine North Vermillion, Northeastern, Plymouth, Rensselaer Central, Whiting and Winamac.

McCutcheon plays in the same Class 5A sectional as Westfield. Indian Creek plays in the same 3A sectional as Hamilton Heights and Guerin Catholic.

Carmel has won more sectionals than any Hamilton County team. The Greyhounds have captured 25 sectional titles.

Sheridan has won 19; Hamilton Southeastern 10; Hamilton Heights seven; Westfield six; Guerin Catholic three; Noblesville 3; Fishers two.

Sheridan Hall of Fame coach Bud Wright is Indiana's all-time winningest coach and leads all current coaches.

In 50 years (49 at Sheridan) Wright has a 389-176 record.

Second on the current list of coaches is Russ Radtke of New Prairie with a 318-124 mark.

Fishers' Rick Wimmer is sixth on the list with a 233-116 record. Wimmer is in his 32<sup>nd</sup> season of coaching and is averaging just under eight wins a season. Should Wimmer, like Wright, coach 50 years and maintain his average, he would have 377 victories.

Carmel's Kevin Wright is 24<sup>th</sup> on the list with a 183-63 record. Wright is in his 21<sup>st</sup> season and is averaging nine wins a season. Should he maintain his current average and coach into his 50th season, Kevin Wright would have more wins than his Hall of Fame father, a total of 444 victories.
