GIRLS SECTIONAL DRAW PREVIEW

Class 4A at Southeastern ...

A Sectional with loaded teams

Lots of great story lines will be written this week, leading into the 4A girls basketball sectional at Hamilton Southeastern.

- *The pairings, as announced Sunday evening by the IHSAA.
- *The toughest sectional in the state?
- *Rematches from regular season games.
- *Rankings at the end of the regular season.
- *Win streaks; losing streaks.
- *Players; coaches.

Lots to write about. Lots to read about. Lots to debate between now and tourney time.

But, here's a story line which might surprise you a little. Powerhouse Noblesville, which by all the stats, all the records, all the rankings, is favored, maybe even heavily favored, to win the sectional. Noblesville has defeated the six other teams in the field, all by double digit scores.

However, Noblesville has won just one sectional game in the past six years. Five different times the Lady Millers have been one and done. Two years ago, Noblesville defeated Zionsville in a first-round game.

Noblesville hasn't won a sectional championship since 1996.

The Lady Millers, on the other side of side of the coin, put to rest a couple of demons of the past when last Saturday in The Mill Noblesville defeated Hamilton Southeastern to win its first Hoosier Conference championship since the second year of the HCC. Noblesville also ended a 17-game losing streak to Southeastern.

Noblesville will play Carmel in the opening game of the sectional. These two schools are the most decorated teams in Hamilton County. Noblesville has won nine sectionals, six regionals, four semi-states and one state championship. Carmel has won 14 sectionals, four regionals, two semi-states and one state crown.

Carmel's last sectional championship was in 2011.

Perhaps more importantly in all the numbers, Noblesville, back on Nov. 25, defeated Carmel in a 102-85 barnburner.

Noblesville has been a team this season which likes to play a pace keeping the scores in the 70s and 80s. New Carmel coach Tod Windlan gave the Millers that opportunity in a run-and-gun thriller played in the Eric Clark Activity Center in Carmel.

Windlan is the guy who back in 2013 led Hamilton Heights to the Class 3A state championship game. He spent last season at Warren Central before jumping the MIC Conference fence to return to Hamilton County at Carmel.

Noblesville will take a 19-1 record into a very tough closing week of the regular season. Beaten only by another powerhouse, Homestead, the Millers on Tuesday will travel to Heritage Christian, which likely is the best 2A team in the state. Thursday, Noblesville will close its regular season by hosting Lawrence North, which last weekend lost its first game of the season, falling to Heritage Christian.

Carmel, 16-7 on the year, will close on Thursday at Avon. The Lady Greyhounds have won their last six games.

Against sectional foes, Carmel has defeated Southeastern 44-39, Westfield 42-40, North Central 45-29 and Fishers 55-43 and lost only to Noblesville.

The Carmel-Noblesville opener will be one of three first-round rematches at the Southeastern Sectional. Zionsville and Fishers will play in Game 2 and Westfield and Southeastern in Game 3.

Fishers is the defending sectional champion and this season has an impressive 16-5 record and with two road games this week. The Lady Tigers will play at Lawrence Central on Tuesday and at Decatur Central on Friday.

Fishers is 3-3 against sectional foes, with wins over Westfield 45-42, Zionsville 56-28 and North Central 74-60 and losses to Noblesville 45-33, Southeastern 45-40 and Carmel 55-43.

Zionsville is 0-4 against the sectional field and only 3-15 overall.

In the final first round sectional game a hot Westfield team which has won eight straight will face Southeastern, a team beaten by Westfield, 38-37, in a Jan. 16 thriller at HSE.

Westfield, 15-6 overall, is 2-3 against sectional teams, with wins over Zionsville 58-34 and Southeastern and losses to Fishers 45-42, Carmel 42-40 and Noblesville 68-55.

Westfield will end its regular season on Thursday at Kokomo. Hamilton Southeastern will play its final pre-sectional game the same night at home against Ben Davis.

Southeastern lost the 68-57 battle at Noblesville on Saturday and also has lost to Carmel 44-39 and Westfield in the 38-37 thriller. The Lady Royals have beaten Fishers 45-40 and Zionsville 56-31.

North Central has drawn the bye in this seven-team sectional. The Panthers are 8-12 overall and 0-3 against sectional foes. They loss to Noblesville by 17 points after leading with just five minutes to play. They also have lost to Carmel 45-29 and to Fishers 74-60.

Every team in this sectional has won before. Along with the success of Carmel and Noblesville noted earlier in this story, Fishers is the defending champ; Zionsville, Westfield and Hamilton Southeastern are four-time winners and North Central has won 16 times, six of which came while facing the Hamilton County field.

Westfield last won in 2013; North Central in 2012; Southeastern in 2007, and Zionsville in 1996.

Heights, Guerin could surprise

Want to ride a dark horse or two into next week’s girls sectional competition? If so, you might saddle up with Hamilton Heights in the 3A sectional at Blackford or with Guerin Catholic in the 3A sectional at Brebeuf.

Neither has a winning record. Neither is favored to win a championship.

But, that’s why games are played.

Hamilton Heights will take an 8-13 record into the final week of the regular season. The Lady Huskies have won two straight and have lost only to Tipton in their last seven games. They will close their regular season Thursday at home against Yorktown.

Heights “knows” no one in the field. Heights is the only team in the Blackford Sectional which hasn’t faced at least one sectional foe during the regular season.

Last year the Lady Huskies were eliminated in the first round in a 40-39 barnburner with Muncie Central, after beating the Bearcats 61-42 the previous year on the Huskies’ way to the 3A state championship game.

The Huskies have a good draw in this year’s tourney. They’ll face Blackford in the bye round and the winner will go straight to the sectional championship game.

This is Heights’ third year playing in this sectional. They have never faced Blackford.

The Bruins are 13-8, but have lost two straight and four of their last five games. Blackford will close the regular season Tuesday at Wabash.

Muncie Central is the pre-sectional favorite. The Lady Bearcats are 14-5 overall and have lost only to Greenfield-Central in their last 10 games. They are 3-0 against sectional foes with wins over Delta 61-29, Blackford 55-38 and Yorktown 55-44.

Muncie Central will face 5-13 Delta in the opening round and that winner will take on a 12-8 Yorktown team.

Guerin Catholic will face Brebeuf in the opening round of the Brebeuf Sectional. Unlike Hamilton Heights at Blackford, the Golden Eagles aren’t strangers in their sectional.

Guerin has faced all of the teams which will play at Brebeuf. They own a 38-28 victory over Brebeuf and a 62-31 licking of Marshall, while losing to Chatard 92-42 and to Herron 37-36.

If Guerin Catholic defeats Brebeuf the Golden Eagles will play Herron, which drew the bye in this sectional.

Guerin Catholic is 8-15 while playing a tough schedule.

Brebeuf is just 2-16 overall. Herron has only a 6-13 mark.

Chatard is the pre-sectional favorite. The Trojans are 14-6 overall and are 4-0 against sectional foes. Chatard has beaten Guerin, Herron 90-16, Marshall 85-16 and Brebeuf 78-18.

Hamilton Heights has won three sectionals, one regional and one semi-state. Guerin Catholic is one of two Hamilton County schools which haven’t won a girls sectional.

University to host 1A sectional....

Sheridan plays 2A at Taylor

University, Hamilton County’s smallest high school, has done lots of Class 1A post-season damage in a short period of time. Sheridan, the county’s second smallest high school, hopes to start doing the same in Class 2A.
Hosting its own sectional, University will be searching for its fifth sectional crown. The Trailblazers have won two regionals and one semi-sate. Their last sectional crown came in 2012.
University, 5-12 on the year, will hold a min-sectional of its own this last week of the regular season, playing at Elwood on Tuesday, hosting Clinton Prairie on Thursday and then in a very big game playing at International on Friday.
International is the pre-sectional favorite at University, having gone 15-4 and defeating five sectional foes this season. Wins have been over Indiana Deaf 53-50, Bethesda Christian 50-39, Indiana Math & Science 73-23, Metropolitan 77-16 and Fall Creek Academy 80-9.
University’s first foe will be Indiana Deaf, a team with a 13-7 record and 2-2 mark against sectional foes. One of those

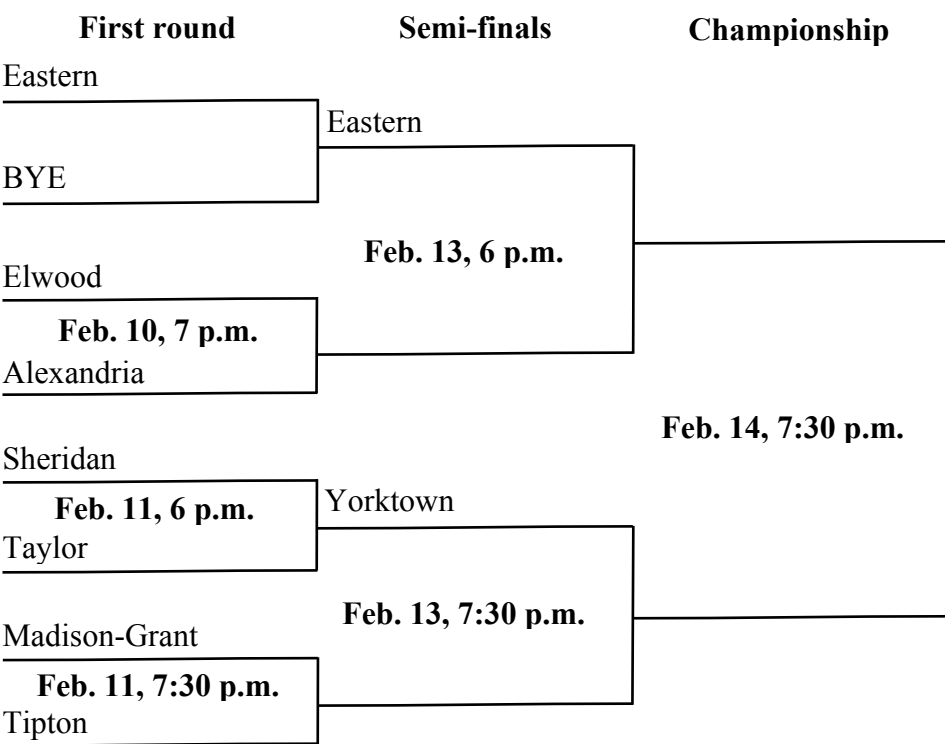
victories was a 76-42 win over University. Indiana Deaf also has beaten Fall Creek Academy 94-9 and lost to International and Bethesda Christian 47-39.
University has defeated Fall Creek Academy 56-4 and Metropolitan 42-13 while losing to Bethesda Christian 55-37 and to Indiana Deaf.
Sheridan will play at the Taylor 2A Sectional and will meet Taylor in the first round.
Taylor is 2-2 playing teams in this sectional.
Sheridan is 16-6 overall and 2-1 against sectional foes. The Lady Blackhawks have defeated Elwood 59-41 and Eastern 58-51 and have lost to Tipton 54-53.
Entering the last week of the regular season, Sheridan is the only team in the Taylor Sectional with a winning record. Tipton is 10-11 and Taylor is 10-10.
Tipton with the one-point win over Sheridan, is a slight sectional favorite. The Blue Devils also have defeated Madison-Grant 58-47, Eastern 39-30 Taylor 45-41 and Elwood 57-34.
Sheridan as yet hasn’t won a sectional championship.



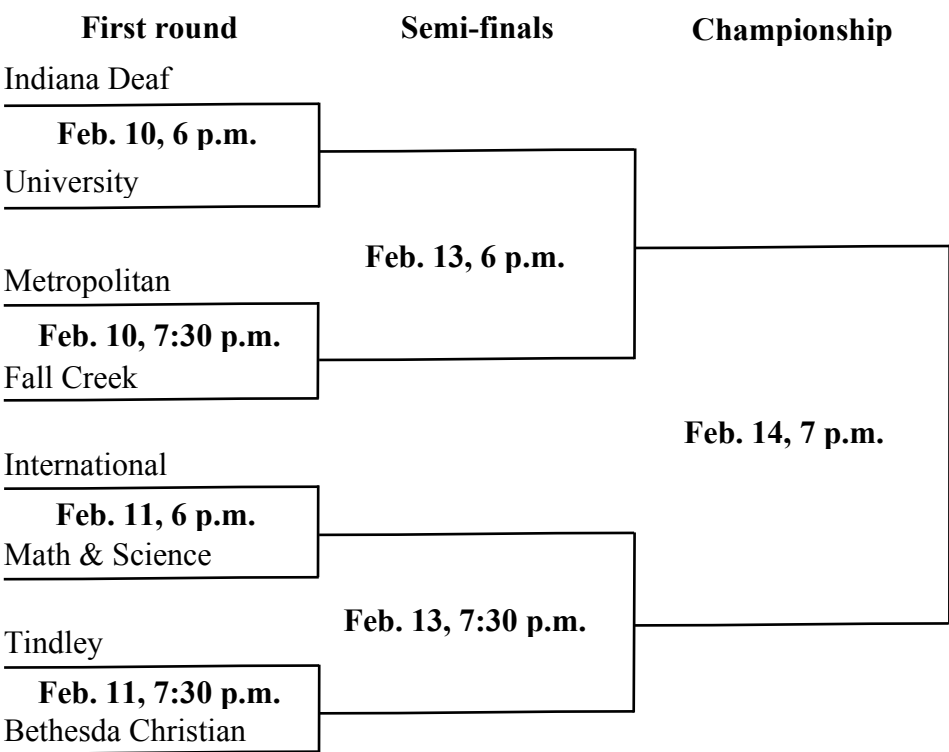

The 40th annual girls basketball tournament: Facts and numbers

Two-time defending Class 4A state champion Bedford North Lawrence is the top-ranked team in a poll from the Indiana Coaches of Girls Sports Association as well as the single class poll from the Indiana Basketball Coaches Association. The Stars have won 14 straight tournament games over the last two years and will put that streak on the line against New Albany in the Sectional 15 opener at Jeffersonville.

In Class 3A, No. 1 Benton Central will play Twin Lakes in Sectional 20 at West Lafayette.

Class 2A No. 1 Heritage Christian, the defending state champion, drew a bye into the semifinal round in Sectional 42 and will await the Indianapolis Scecina-Indianapolis Shortridge winner.

Barr-Reeve, the top-ranked team in Class A, begins its quest when it meets Shoals in Sectional 63 at North Daviess.

Among the other defending state champions, Western, unranked in 3A, drew a bye into the semifinals in Sectional 20 at West Lafayette and will meet Peru-Maconaquah winner.

Oregon-Davis, last year’s Class A champion and ranked No. 4 this week, will host Argos in Sectional 51.

Fort Wayne Canterbury, last year’s Class 2A runner-up squad, leads the state with 11 consecutive sectional championships. The Cavaliers will look to extend that streak beginning with a first round matchup against Eastside in Sectional 36 at Woodlan.

About the Draw
To conduct the random drawing for the girls basketball state tournament, the IHSAA places ping-pong balls representing each school in a given sectional into a lottery-style air mix machine. A motorized fan in the bottom of the machine blows the balls around the inside of the transparent container and air then forces each ball up through a tube in random order. For example, the first ball retrieved from the machine will be the visiting team in game one with the second ball representing the home team in game one. The third ball to come out is the visitor in game two and the fourth ball the home team in game two. That same method is followed through all 64 sectionals and 16 regionals.
