Charges dismissed against 6 drug raid cases

Criminal charges against six of the nine individuals arrested seven months ago in an alleged drug-related raid on a Carmel doctor's office have been dismissed. Hamilton Superior Court Judge Steven Nation entered his decision to dismiss last week. The decision does not affect individuals charged in other counties as a result of raids conducted at the same time.

The six cleared of charges of conspiracy to commit dealing in a Schedule 3 controlled substance, dealing a

controlled substance and corrupt business practices are Eric Ley, Andrew Dollard, Derek Tislow, Cassy Bratcher, Yvonne Morgan and Jessica Callahan. The court found no evidence of criminal participation in the activities charged.


The three physicians still facing charges are Dr. Larry Ley, Dr. George Agapios and Dr. Ronald Vierk. Judge Nation denied their motions to dismiss. Cases against the doctors will apparently proceed to trial later this year.

In the cases dismissed by Nation last week, the judge did give the prosecutor's office 30 days to consider amend-

ing their charges, but legal observers see little likelihood of the state bringing new information to the court's attention.

The local raid was conducted by the Hamilton-Boone County Drug Task Force at Dr. Ley's East Main Street offices in Carmel during the night of July 25, 2014 and created headlines around the state. The publicity resulted in a civil damage suit being filed by Dollard, a Noblesville attorney against a local news publication. That suit remains pending in court.

Trooper Perrine struck while investigating accident

Indiana State Trooper John Perrine on Monday morning while investigating a property damage crash at the I-65 north-bound on ramp to 38th Street was struck by a passing motorist.

Indiana State Police indicated Trooper Perrine was in the right lane of the I-65 north-bound ramp to 38th street and traffic was passing slowly on the left. Crystal Ruiz, 27, of Indianapolis moved to the right lane, lost control and struck the right rear of Perrine's police car.

Trooper Perrine, a Sheridan resident and assistant girls basketball coach for Sheridan, stated he was "extremely sore" but he finished the crash he was working and completed his shift.

Ruiz was driving on a suspended license and was found to be wanted on an outstanding Marion County warrant for driving while suspended. She was arrested and transported to the Marion County Arrestee Processing Center.

Motorists are reminded that motorists are required to "move over" and proceed safely when emergency workers are on the side of the road. This is especially true when dangerous travel conditions exist such as snow covered roadways. Slow down and give them room to work.

Fishers police officers investigated an armed robbery at a local pharmacy.

Shortly after 8:30 p.m. Fishers police officers were dispatched to an armed robbery at the Kroger Pharmacy located at 9799 E. 116th Street (116th Street and Cumberland Road). Upon their arrival officers met with two employees. They reported a male approached the drop-off counter and presented a note. The note indicated the suspect had a gun and demanded various narcotics. The employee complied with the demand and the suspect fled the store. Neither of the employees was injured during this robbery.

New Fire Chief appointed for Carmel Fire Department

Mayor Jim Brainard today announced the appointment of David Haboush as Chief of the Carmel Fire Department. The action came after the resignation of Matt Hoffman, who stepped down as Chief for personal reasons. Haboush, a 24-year-veteran of the department, will begin his duties immediately.

"I am excited to have David as our next fire chief. Throughout his 24 years in the department, he has served in many capacities providing fire safety for our city, including as a firefighter, sergeant, lieutenant, captain, interim Battalion chief and for seven years was an Assistant Chief of Administration and Finance," said Mayor Brainard. "His perseverance, dedication and leadership, along with

his passion for fire safety and institutional knowledge in working with city officials and other city departments make him the best choice for this role."

Haboush, 48, is a Carmel resident who began his career with the Carmel Fire Department in 1992. He was promoted to the rank of sergeant in April of 1997, lieutenant in March of 2002 and captain in July of 2002. He served as an Assistant Chief from June 2007 to March 2014 and has currently been serving as a House Captain. A graduate of Thomas Carr Howe High School in 1984, he went on to obtain a Bachelor's Degree in political science from IUPUI in 1989.

Haboush has been accredited by the Center for Public Safety Excellence as a Chief Fire Officer. He played an integral role in the Carmel Fire Department's international accreditation, achieved in 2013. He is married to his wife, Marcy, and has three children.

Watching the IHSAA tourney pairings show on television last Sunday afternoon, Fishers basketball coach Joe Leonard became more than a little upset when one of the TV folks talked about how great a match-up would be between North Central and Carmel in the Friday session of the Carmel Sectional.

“I plastered that comment all over our dressing room walls,” said the coach after his Tigers pulled the upset of the season by stunning No. 8 ranked North Central, 70-64, in the sectional’s opening game Tuesday evening.

The Tigers put on a show.

“This is one of those games fans will be talking about 20 years from now,” said Leonard. “The story will get a little better each year.”

It was a game dominated by two Fishers seniors.

Keegan Kollmeyer was uncanny while leading the Tigers in scoring with 27 points. He canned four 3-pointers in Fishers’ attack.

Cameron Wolter, the 6-8 center, was overpowering, pouring in 23 points and pulling eight rebounds.

For nearly three quarters, Fishers blew away the Panthers. After that, Fishers fought off run-after-run by Coach Doug Mitchell’s club.

Fishers jumped to a 12-0 lead. North Central didn’t score until Mateo Rivera drilled a 3-pointer with 4:20 left in the first quarter.

“Getting the early lead was important,” Leonard said.

Fishers led 16-10 after one quarter and 32-21 at halftime.

The Tigers once led by 18 points, 46-28 with three minutes remaining in the third quarter.

North Central made a run late in the third period, closing the gap to just nine points, 50-41.

“I knew they would make a run,” Leonard said.

North Central closed the Fishers margin to six, 52-46, and with 2:50 left in the game the Panthers were within five, 60-55.

Each time NC charged, Fishers had an answer.

Kollmeyer scored 14 points in the third quarter. Wolter had a nine-point fourth period.

Just as important in fending off North Central was a huge 3-pointer by another Fishers senior, Lukas Wehner, just when the Panthers were putting on the heat. Also, a two-point shot by still-another senior, Brady Fleming, late in the game.

Kris Wilkes, a 6-7 sophomore, led North Central with 22 points., 16 coming in the second half.

“Wehner did a nice job on Wilkes,” Leonard said. “I asked him to bump and shove, and that’s what he did.”

Fishers hit 22-of-41 shots and went to the charity line 30 times and made 19.

So, the anticipated MIC battle between Carmel and North Central on Friday now has become a match-up of Hoosier Crossroads Conference champion Fishers and Carmel’s MIC champion Greyhounds.

Asked if it will be difficult to get his Tigers back up after the win over North Central, Leonard said, “Not at all. We have two days to get ready for Carmel.”

During the regular season, on Jan. 3 at Fishers, Carmel defeated the Tigers 59-46. That Fishers loss came just four days after North Central had defeated Fishers, 69-47.

The sectional will continue tonight with Hamilton Southeastern and Westfield playing at 6 p.m. and Noblesville and Zionsville in the nightcap game.

Cline, Holba, Kiser nominated...

Carmel’s Cline among Player of the Week honorees

Gary 21st Century Charter junior Eugene German averaged 40.0 points and 9.5 rebounds over two games to headline this week's honorees in the IBCA/Subway Player of the Week program.

German is joined by Southport senior Malik Bennett, Lanesville senior Matthew Husband, Oregon-Davis junior Taylor Kranenburg, Heritage Christian junior Tyasha Harris and Columbus North senior Ali Patberg in the awards program overseen by the Indiana Basketball Coaches Association.

German was cited for boys' District 1, while Bennett is the boys' District 2 winner and Husband received accolades for boys' District 3 for the week of Feb. 23-28. The respective girls' district winners for the same span are Kranenburg, Harris and Patberg.

The 6-1 German poured in 41 points with 12 rebounds, four assists and two steals as Gary 21st Century dropped an 80-76 decision to Hammond Gavit. German then followed with 39 points, seven rebounds, two assists and four steals as the Cougars lost 76-75 to Lake Station to fall to 9-13. Of note, German produced a 55-point outburst on Feb. 21 in a 101-67 win over Fall Creek Academy.

Bennett, meanwhile, was instrumental in propelling Southport (22-2) to a pair of big wins. First, the 5-10 senior guard tallied 23 points as the Cardinals defeated Mooresville 77-49. Bennett then followed with 31 points to help Southport knock off previously undefeated and No. 1-ranked Evansville Reitz 88-80. He converted 9-of-20 shots from the floor, three 3-pointers and 10-of-11 free throws in the latter contest.

Husband averaged 25.0 points over two games for Lanesville (9-13). The 6-0 forward scored 17 points in a 64-57 setback to Austin. He followed with 33 points, eight rebounds, five assists and three steals in a 74-56 triumph over Crothersville.

The 6-0 Kranenburg scored a game-high 28 points, including 17-of-18 free throws, but it was not enough as Oregon-Davis fell to Lafayette Central Catholic 47-44 in a Class A semistate game Crown Point. The Bobcats completed their season with a 19-9 record.

Harris paced Heritage Christian to a return trip to the Class 2A State Finals with a 61-41 victory over Providence in the Jeffersonville Semistate. The 5-10 guard netted 23 points with nine rebounds and eight assists as the Eagles moved to 27-2 with a second consecutive semistate crown.

The 5-10 Patberg averaged 30.7 points, 9.0 rebounds and 5.3 assists over three games in leading Columbus North (27-1) to both regional and semistate titles. The Notre Dame recruit opened with 32 points, 11 rebounds and six assists in a 76-66 win over Evansville Central, then followed with 21 points, 10 rebounds and four assists in a 48-40 decision over previously undefeated and two-time defending Class 4A state champion Bedford North Lawrence. Patberg capped her week with 39 points, six rebounds and six assists in a 69-60 victory over Lawrence North in the Richmond Semistate.

This is the seventh season for the Indiana Basketball Coaches Association Player of the Week program and the third season it is presented by Subway Restaurants of Indiana, a banner sponsor of the IBCA. Subway, in its fifth season as an IBCA sponsor, encourages athletes to "train hard and eat fresh."
