February 10, 1915 - March 19, 2015





Durrough; sister-in-law, Jeanne Duckworth; and brother-in-law, Clarence Rogers.



Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame welcomes 54th class Wednesday

The Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame honors other Indiana boys high school basketball legends on Wednesday in ceremonies to be held at Primo Banquet Hall in Indianapolis.

Highlighting the evening's ceremony, 14 men and one team will be inducted into the Hall, recognized with the highest honor bestowed in Indiana high school basketball.

Among individuals to be inducted are 1941 Indiana Mr. Basketball John Bass (deceased), along with four Indiana All-Stars: Harold "Buster" Briley (1960, Madison), Danny Brown (1973, Jennings County), Rick Goins (1976, Rushville), and Mary Pruett (1959, Springs Valley).

Roger Schroder was a member of the 1954 Milan state champion squad and Harry Flournoy (Gary Emerson 1962) captained the 1966 NCAA champion Texas Western Miners, while Bill Depp cago Washington 1952), and Dean Weirich (Northridge 1972) followed up outstanding high school careers with college all-conference and/or All-American honors.

Dan Sparks (Bloomington 1963) enwelcomes their 54th class of inductees and joyed success as a player at Vincennes University and Weber State and in the ABA before becoming Indiana's all-time winningest college coach in his 33-year stint at Vincennes University.

Jerry Lewis (Reelsville 1958) will be inducted after graduating as Reelsville's all-time leading scorer, earning national NAIA records at Indiana Central College, and winning 354 games as an Indiana high school coach, most notably at Norwell High

The 1985 Marion Giants team will be inducted on the 30th anniversary year of their 29-0 undefeated state championship team. The 1985 Giants were the 6th undefeated state champion team in the history of the Indiana boys basketball state tournament and become the 8th boys team inducted in the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame.





Stingrays, Jakaitis extend historic streaks with 4-0 win over Fuel

In the second of three head-to-head their lead to 3-0 with the second period's meetings between the two teams this sea-South Carolina Stingrays on Friday at North Charleston Coliseum in Charleston, South Carolina by a final score of 4-0. With the loss, the Fuel fell to 25-28-4-5 overall this season and with 59 points, remain alone in sixth place in the ECHL's North Division standings, just one point shy of playoff position. The Stingrays got out to a quick start on Friday, as a Wayne Simpson transition score at 6:22 made it 1-0 South Carolina before an opportunistic Brett Cameron tally pushed the 'Rays lead to 2-0 at 11:05 with Patrick Gaul and Caleb Herbert registering assists on the play. South Carolina extended

lone goal, a Tim Spencer tally less than one son, the Indy Fuel were defeated by the minute into middle frame action. Cameron added a second score at 5:36 of the third to cap the Stingrays' scoring at 4-0. Mac Carruth took the loss in net for the Fuel despite 18 saves as Jakaitis claimed his 11th straight win, tied for the second-longest such streak in ECHL history, and his 22nd career shutout, three shy of the all-time league record.

Pacers fall to Cavaliers

The Pacers (30-38) battled hard on Friday night in Cleveland, but LeBron James and the Cavaliers (45-26) held on for a 95-92 victory. Indiana has now dropped four straight games after winning seven straight earlier this month.

With the win, the Cavaliers clinched a playoff berth. They have now won 15 straight games within the friendly confines of Quicken Loans Arena.

The Blue & Gold gave it their all in a wild fourth quarter that featured four ties and eight lead changes. The Pacers repeatedly surged in front, but each time James seemed to make a play on the other end. The four-time MVP scored 11 straight points for Cleveland down the stretch.

"I liked the way we played," Pacers head coach Frank Vogel said after the loss. "I liked the way we guarded, I liked the way we shared the basketball, I liked our competitive spirit. We just got undone by a great performance by the best player in the game."

After James' layup broke an 89-89 tie, C.J. Miles buried a 3-pointer from the right wing to give the Pacers a 92-91 lead with 2:22 to play. But James responded with a one-handed floater on the ensuing possession to put the Cavs back in front.

The Pacers had three possessions in the final two minutes and had six shots that could have given them the lead, but couldn't get any of them to fall.

After James missed a long 3-pointer at the end of the shot clock, Cavaliers guard Iman Shumpert corralled the offensive rebound and found teammate J.R. Smith, who was fouled with one second left. Smith hit both free throws to extend the Cavs' lead to three points.

After a timeout, C.J. Miles got off a long 3-pointer before the buzzer, but it came up well short.

"We were so close," Pacers forward Luis Scola said after the game. "This was going to be a great win for us. But it's encouraging. If we play this way, we're going to win a lot of games and we're going to be in the playoffs."

George Hill scored 14 of his team-high 24 points in the third quarter. The Pacers' point guard made 9-of-15 shots on the night, including 4-of-8 from 3-point range.
