# Cline wins 3-point contest

Ryan Cline has been Carmel's hero for years. On Wednesday evening, he got to show off to the rest of the country.

Cline won the men's Marines 3-Point Championship, which took place at a packed Eric Clark Activity Center. The event was part of the 2015 American Family Insurance High School Slam Dunk & 3-Point Championships, which made its way up to Carmel as part of the NCAA Final Four festivities.

"It's a big honor, and I'm glad to be here, and I'm glad to win it," said Cline. He commented in between signing autographs and posing for pictures once the Slam Dunk contest was finished. Cline had a supporting role in that contest, helping those athletes out with their incredible dunks.

The crowd was loudly pro-Cline - not exactly breaking news, of course. Cline beat Brevin Pritzl of De Pere, Wis. 22-19. The final was a contest between two future Big Ten rivals as Cline is headed to Purdue, Pritzl has committed to play in Madison at Wisconsin.

The women's championship was next, with Kennedy Burke of Northridge, Calif. beating Dannie Williams of Clovis, N.M. 15-13. Cline and Burke faced off in the 3-Point Battle of the Champions, with Cline victorious by the score of 20-16.

"There was a little bit of home-court advantage," said Cline, although he admitted there was a little bit of pressure, too.

"I just really didn't want that pressure to get to me," said Cline. "Whenever I got, like, past the second or third rack, I really heard everybody behind me. So it was pretty big motivation."

After Cline won his championship, many stayed on hand to watch the Slam Dunk contest, which did not disappoint.

Derrick Jones of Marcus Hook, Pa., topped Rayjon Tucker of Kannapolis (Northside Christian), N.C. Jones, a UNLV recruit, made some spectacular dunks; he dunked over four of his fellow players for a show-stopping finale. Tucker, headed to Florida Gulf Coast, incorporated his mom into his final effort, falling just short.

If you didn't get a chance to see the contest live, you can watch it on TV: It will air at 3:30 p.m. Sunday on CBS (WTTV-4).

Westfield Detective earns civic engagement recognition

Westfield Police Detective Samuel Newlin-Haus has been awarded the William M. Plater Civic Engagement Medallion for his contribution to a neighborhood revitalization project.

Newlin-Haus, who will be completing a masters of public affairs from IUPUI this May, received the recognition after working with a team of five graduate students on the revitalization plan for the Riley Area Development Corporation (RADC) and the Old Southside Neighborhood Association (OSNA) to complete his capstone project.

Through meetings with residents, examining properties and collecting over 53,000 pieces of datum, the team was able to present a list of actionable recommendations to reduce blighted, vacant and abandoned homes in the area.

As a result, the RADC incorporated the recommendations in their master plan, with

the team’s work being used to guide future developmental decisions in the area.

“The experience was meaningful because it allowed our team to collaborate with the community in order to address an important, ‘real world’ social issue and see the true value of the project to those who lived in the neighborhood and desperately wanted the area revitalized,” Newlin-Haus said.

Newlin-Haus grew up in Kalamazoo, MI. He currently holds a bachelor’s degree in near Eastern languages and culture and criminal justice. He lives in Westfield.

The William M. Plater Civic Engagement Medallion was established to recognize students who demonstrate exemplary commitment to their communities during their years as an IUPUI student. The award is named in honor of Dr. William Plater, IUPUI’s former executive vice chancellor and dean of the faculties from 1988 to 2006.

# Carmel police officer teaches Zumba Gold

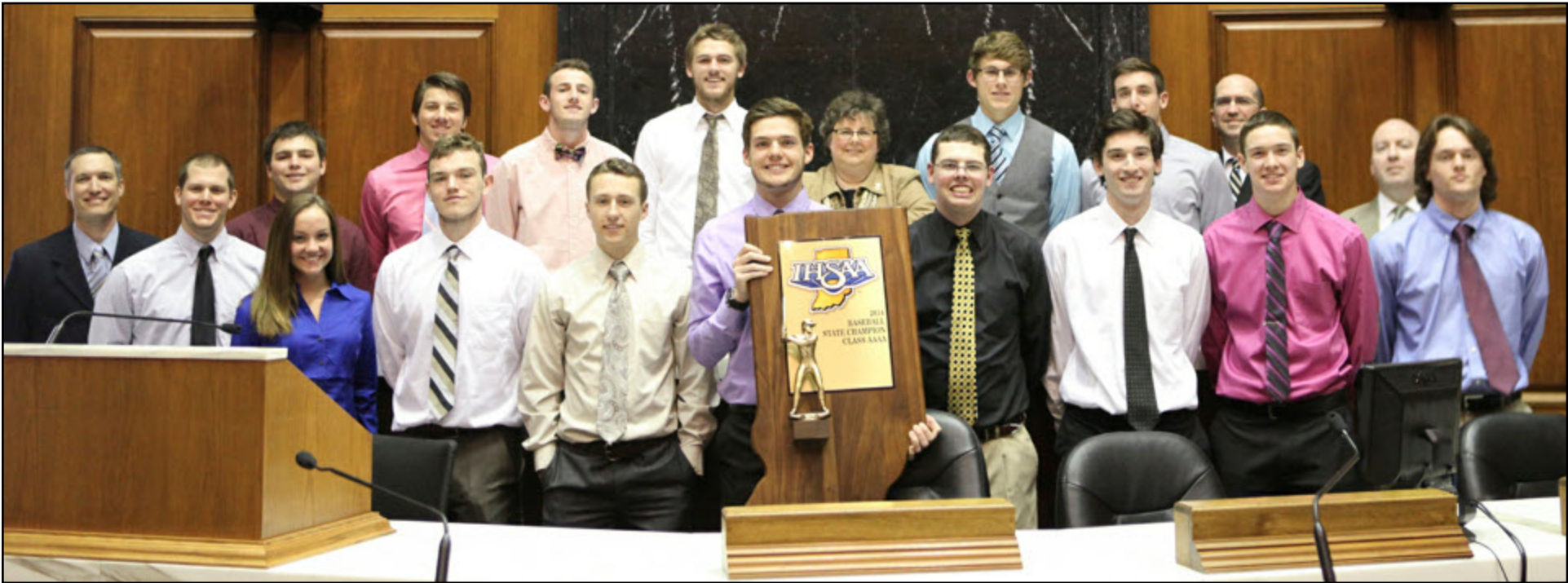

## Rep. Richardson recognizes the Noblesville Millers at the Statehouse

State Representative Kathy Kreag Richardson (R-Noblesville) recognized the Noblesville High School Millers baseball team with a resolution on the House floor. As the Class 4A champions, the Millers became the first team in Hamilton County to win a state baseball championship.

“We are so proud of the Noblesville Millers for bringing home our first baseball

state championship,” said Rep. Richardson. “My husband Perry and I are huge baseball fans, and it was truly amazing to witness the effort put forth and watch these young athletes come together to become state champions. I’m just very honored to recognize this team at the Statehouse.”

At Victory Field, the Millers defeated the Terre Haute North Patriots by a score of

2-1 to win the school's first Class 4A state baseball championship. With 4,961 people in the stands, they also set a new record for having the highest, single game attendance in state history.

The Millers also won the Hoosier Crossroads Conference, which was their second time winning this championship with a 14-4 record. In recognition of an

outstanding season, head coach Justin Keever, who has been coaching the Millers for the past 10 years, was named Indiana High School Baseball Coaches Association Coach of the Year.

“Justin has done a great job not only as a coach, but also as a mentor for these athletes. Along with Coach Keever, I would like to congratulate each player on this outstanding accomplishment, and on behalf of our community, we could not be more proud,” said Rep. Richardson.



The Pacers headed into Boston on Wednesday knowing that it wasn't a must-win game in a literal sense, but also fully aware that a loss could be very damaging to their playoff hopes. After losses on Tuesday night in Brooklyn and Wednesday at TD Garden, the Nets and Celtics both now own the head-to-head tiebreaker over the Pacers.  
Tyler Zeller and Kelly Olynyk each scored 19 points for the Celtics on Wednesday, while Evan Turner recorded a triple-double against his former team. Turner,

Indiana's big trade-deadline acquisition last season, finished with 13 points, 11 rebounds, and 12 assists for Boston, his third triple-double this season.  
The Pacers got off to a slow start offensively. Indiana scored just 16 points in the first quarter as Boston seized control of the game early. The home team stretched its lead to as many as 11 points before Indiana rallied, cutting the deficit to just four on C.J. Miles' 3-pointer with 2:23 remaining in the second quarter.

From there, however, the Celtics reeled off a 9-0 run to stretch their lead back to double digits heading into the break.  
The Pacers managed to climb within six points on three occasions in the second half, the last occurring when a pair of free throws from Rodney Stuckey made it a 77-71 game with 8:23 to play. But Boston responded with another 10-3 spurt and never let the visitors back within single digits the rest of the way.  
"We scrapped and clawed and tried our best to make it a game," Pacers head coach Frank Vogel said after the loss. "But they made more shots, they made more plays, they were quicker to the ball...Their style of play won out."  
George Hill led Indiana with 21 points, six rebounds, and six assists in the loss. Hill was very efficient, making 9-of-11 shots overall and 3-of-4 from beyond the 3-point arc.

In the most important game of the season-to-date, both starting shooting guard C.J. Miles and sixth man Rodney Stuckey played in the first half despite dealing with injuries. Stuckey, hampered by a sore right wrist, scored 16 points on 6-of-9 shooting in 19:45 off the bench. Miles, who sprained his ankle in Tuesday's loss in Brooklyn, scored 12 points on 5-of-11 shooting.  
But beyond Hill, Miles, and Stuckey, Indiana struggled mightily from the field. The rest of the Pacers' roster made just 14-of-50 shots (28 percent).  
Washington, Ind. native Zeller dominated the first half, scoring 17 points on 7-of-8 shooting. Olynyk, Zeller's backup, played despite dealing with a nasty bruise on his left eye from being elbowed in the face by teammate Shavlik Randolph during a pre-game game of one-on-one. It didn't seem to hamper the big man's vision, as he made 7-of-10 shots and scored 10 of his 19 points in the fourth quarter.  
"It's kind of like if you're wearing sunglasses, I can see out of the bottom third maybe," Olynyk said of the injury. "There's a lot of things that if you put your mind to, you can do, that you don't think you can."  
Turner made just 6-of-17 shots, but did a good job creating for his teammates, dishing out 12 assists while only committing one turnover.  
With seven games left on the regular season schedule, the Pacers will look to start a winning streak on Friday night, when they welcome the Charlotte Hornets to Bankers Life Fieldhouse.  
"It's certainly disappointing (to lose in Brooklyn and Boston)," Vogel said. "They're big games, but we've just got to focus on the seven that we have left and try to make a run at it."  
**Inside the Numbers**  
Boston scored 32 points in the fourth quarter to put Wednesday's game away. Jae Crowder scored 11 of his 13 points in the period for Boston. Olynyk added 10, connecting on two 3-pointers.  
The Celtics won the battle of the boards, 46-39. The Pacers are now just 8-22 on the season when outrebounded by their opponents.  
Roy Hibbert had a rough night for the Blue & Gold, getting into early foul trouble and having trouble covering Boston's big men on the perimeter. Hibbert also missed his first three free throw attempts, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive makes from the charity stripe.  
Hibbert's partner in the post, David West, had 10 points and eight boards but went just 4-for-12 from the field and 2-for-6 from the free throw line.  
Boston won despite making just 6-of-27 attempts from 3-point range (22 percent). The Pacers were 6-for-15 from long range (40 percent).
