Welcome to the Hall of Fame....

Courtney

More than any other player who played the game, Courtney Cox Cole has been the face of Noblesville, and Hamilton County, basketball the last 25 years.

She still is today.

Arguably, because there has been lots of great women basketball players in Hamilton County, no one ever played the game of basketball better than the lady we all simply call "Courtney."

Saturday, Courtney was inducted into the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame, a class of 11 remarkable stars.

First, there was a reception held Saturday afternoon at the Hall of Fame in New Castle. Then, Saturday evening at Primo in Indianapolis, the 14th Women's Induction class was honored.

Courtney holds what I believe is the greatest record in Hamilton County girls sports. She scored 1,869 points in her basketball career. No Hamilton County basketball player has ever scored more.

What's so impressive about that record is that it has stood the test of time. Twenty-five years ago Courtney's scoring feats went into the record book. Few have even challenged that career mark.

And, of course, Courtney scored 1,869 points without benefit of the 3-point shot.

As I watched Courtney being honored at New Castle Saturday afternoon, several memories rolled through my mind. How great she was, of course. But, maybe even more, how hard she worked on the hardwood. She was a leader. She was a role model to hundreds of Noblesville kids who wanted to play the game the way Courtney was playing it.

'I think I was in the sixth grade at that golfer. time," Courtney said to me Saturday.

I do remember that during the early years of girls basketball, we didn't cover the sport all that much. It was the new sport in town. Boys basketball, the established game, was the game in town.

But, in a few years Courtney started to play the game at the high school level and we all became fans.

At Noblesville High, Courtney led the Lady Millers to three straight IHSAA State championship in 1987 and a state runner-up

Courtney scored 17 points and grabbed 11 rebounds in the 1987 state finals victory and she netted 29 points in the 1988 finale.

She won the Dial Award for the American high school athlete/scholar of the same year that the Lady Millers will play in year in 1988 and in 1989, her senior season the Hall of Fame Classic next December in at Noblesville, Courtney was named to USA

Courtney's mother, Jackie Cox, Today's All-USA high school girls basketball team and to Parade Magazine's All-American team.







Noblesville named a Tree City USA 2014

The City of Noblesville was named a 2014 Tree City USA by the Arbor Day Foundation in honor of its commitment to effective urban forest management. This is the 25th consecutive year Noblesville has earned this national distinction.

Noblesville also received a Tree City USA Growth Award for demonstrating environmental improvement and higher level of tree care.

"Trees increase property values, reduce energy use and add beauty to our homes and neighborhoods," said Noblesville Mayor John Ditslear. "The environment and its sustainability are important aspects of the quality of life our citizens expect in Noblesville."

The city received Tree City USA recognition by meeting the program's four requirements: a tree board or department; a tree-care ordinance; an annual community forestry budget of at least \$2 per capita; and an Arbor Day observance and proclamation

Cleaner air, improved storm water management, energy savings and increased property values and commercial activity are among the benefits enjoyed by Tree City USA communities.





So, what do you do on a rain-soaked Saturday when trying to fill sports space in favorite your newspaper?

> Richie and I are seldom faced with that problem. Not here in Hamilton County. Yesterday was kind of like a Christmas vacation, except at the Hamilton County

Reporter we seldom get a Christmas vacation.

With extra time on my hand and with space to fill, I jumped around looking on sports web-sites. I found a great feature on Indianarunner.com., a list of all-time track

performances in each track and field event, 10 on the list and another former Carmel boys and girls. The list was compiled by Mike Slaubaugh of RoadRunner.

What I enjoyed best was seeing the trend recorded over the years.

Let's take a look first at girls track.

Hamilton County never has been known for producing great sprint people in girls track. Good ones but not great.

You won't find anyone from Hamilton County on the top 25 list of 100 and 200 Werling (1993) and Barb Zahorsky (1981) dash people. Same goes for the 400. No one are tied with nine others at 5-9 on the list. on the list of hurdlers.

But, get into the distance events and things are different.

Remember Bre'Anna Smith from Westfield? In 2010 she ran a 2:22.84 time in the 800. Currently, that ranks 16th all-time.

In the 1600, Carmel's Katie Harrington's 4:49.38 currently is 4th best all-time. That was back in 2003 .Carmel's Marie Grabinski

runner, Diane Bussa, had a 4:5453 in 1979, which currently stands No. 19.

There are four Carmel runners in the top 25 of 3200 runners, Harringon No 4 at 10:22.91; Grabinski No. 9 at 10:30.18; Kelcy Welch (2013) No. 21 at 10:42.04, and Renee Wellman (2012) No 24 at 10:44.18.

See what I mean by trends? Two Carmel high jumpers, Cory

Southeastern's Molly Meyer, who threw the discus 159-4, ranks No No.6. Another HSE discus thrower, Paige Smith, in 2009 got off a 150-3 toss. That currently ranks No. 21 all-time best.

Noblesville's Rachel Mather in 2014 had a 12-9 performance in the pole vault. That's

There are no Hamilton County athletes on the Top 25 list in long jump or shot put.

You see the same kinds of trends in Hamilton County boys track and field.

No sprinters on the lists.

Carmel's Cortland Eten, in 2011, ran a 47.62 clocking in the 400, now 18th all-time.

No one on the list in the 110 hurdlers, but two Hamilton Southeastern Royals on he 300 hurdles. Zach Reitzug in 2013 was clocked at 37.02. That's fourth-best. In 2013 Jacob Wright recorded a 37.40. That's 11th all-time.

Carmel's Todd Beyerlein cleared 7-1.50 in the high jump in 1997. He's No. 8.

Nobody in pole vault or long jump. In 2012 Carmel's Langston Newton threw the shot 63-6.75. Newton ranks No.

Newton ranks fifth in the discus with a 203-8 toss.

Kind of interesting. Especially on a rainy Saturday.





Castroneves earns second consecutive Verizon P1 Award

Helio Castroneves earned the Verizon P1 Award for the second consecutive race and extended a Team Penske streak of seven straight pole awards, a run that spans the last two Verizon IndyCar Series seasons. Castroneves, driving the No. 3 AAA Insurance Team Penske Chevrolet, recorded a quick lap of 1 minute, 7.1925 seconds on the 2.3-mile, 17-turn Barber Motorsports Park road course to claim the \$10,000 pole award for the Honda Indy Grand Prix of Alabama. The pole was the 43rd of Castroneves' career, which is fourth all time in Indy car history, and inches the three-time Indianapolis 500 winner one step closer to Bobby Unser, who is third on the all-time list with 49 poles.

The Firestone Fast Six was called with 1:40 left in the 10-minute segment because of lightning in the area. The three rounds of knockout qualifications set the 23-car starting grid for the 90-lap race April 26 (3 p.m. ET, NBCSN). The weather forecast is for sun and temperatures in the mid-70s.

Castroneves set a track record at Long Beach a week ago and has three of Team Penske's seven consecutive Verizon P1 Awards bridging the 2014 and '15 seasons. Reigning Verizon IndyCar Series champion Will Power also has three and Juan Pablo Montoya started on the pole for the Indy Grand Prix of Louisiana on April 12 based on entrant points as rain canceled the final segment of qualifying.

"It's all about team effort," said Castroneves, who entered the race weekend three points behind front-runner Montoya in the championship standings. "For us, every practice is qualifying. That helped us to push ourselves to be in this position. It's not about because we have success here. I think it's part of it, but it's in the equipment. At the end of the day, it's a team effort. Everyone is working hard.

Castroneves won the inaugural Verizon IndyCar Series race at Barber Motorsports Park in 2010. The Verizon P1 Award winner has gone on to win the race twice in its five previous years (Ryan Hunter-Reay in 2013 and Power in 2011).

Power was second quick in the Firestone Fast Six (1:07.3833) and posted the quickest lap in qualifying at 1:06.8050 in the second 10-minute segment in the No. 1 Verizon Team Penske Chevrolet. Scott Dixon set the lap record of 1:06.7750 (123.999 mph) in the first round of knockout qualifications in

Power has started from the pole three times (2014, 2011, 2010) in the five races at Barber Motorsports Park and won in 2011 and 2012. He earned the Verizon P1 Award in 2014 with a lap of 1:08.3120 in the Firestone Fast Six.


