# Click it or Ticket

The Hamilton County Traffic Safety Partnership announced today its participation in the national and state-wide 2015 Click It or Ticket enforcement mobilization occurring May 15-31, 2015. Officers will be joining more than 250 state and local law enforcement agencies, along with thousands of agencies across the country, to conduct high-visibility patrols encouraging drivers to buckle up.


“Wearing your seat belt can increase your chance of surviving a crash by more than 50 percent,” said Hamilton County Sheriff Mark Bowen. “This campaign provides us the opportunity to increase the conversation and focus patrols toward unrestrained driving. We want to remind drivers and their occupants that if we see you unbelted, we will pull you over.”

Click It or Ticket is an annual enforcement effort supported by federal funding allocated to the Hamilton County Traffic Safety Partnership from the Traffic Safety Division of the Indiana Criminal Justice Institute (ICJI). Officers from the Hamilton County Sheriff’s Office, Carmel Police, Cicero Police, Fishers Police, Noblesville, Police, Westfield Police, and Indiana State Police Departments will work overtime to conduct seat belt patrols at all hours of the day and night. According to ICJI, in 2014 there were 748 fatalities on Indiana roadways and many of those fatalities involved unrestrained drivers and passengers. Among adults ages 18-34 killed in Indiana crashes, 67 percent were not buckled up. Worn correctly, seat belts reduce the risk of fatal injury by 45 percent for front seat


passenger car occupants and by 60 percent for pickup truck, SUV, and van occupants.

“While seat belt usage in Indiana passenger vehicles is over 91 percent, there’s still room for improvement,” said ICJI Director Mary Allen. “We know seat belt usage saves lives, and we are grateful for the participating agencies that are focusing efforts on increased education and enforcement to drive home this message.”

# Carmel No. 1 in voters turnout

Carmel sent more voters to the polls on Tuesday than any other Hamilton County city or town.

No surprise, since Carmel is the largest city in Hamilton County.

Of its 63,335 registered voters, 14,333 Carmelites voted. That’s a total turnout of 24.2 percent.

Compare those numbers to Fishers, which unlike Carmel didn’t have a race for a mayor. At Fishers, Scott Fadness ran unchallenged. Fishers registered 56,889 voters and just 3,141 voted. That’s a total of 5.5 per cent.

Westfield was second behind Carmel. Westfield, like Carmel, did elect a mayor. A total of 22,680 registered in Westfield. A total of 4,785 actually went to the polls. That’s 16.1 percent.

Noblesville elected a mayor. Not counting Fishers, Noblesville was last in Hamilton County. A total of 49,175 registered and 5,853 voted. That’s 14.9 percent.

Three Noblesville precincts drew as high as 27 percent of its registered voters. Leading the way of drawing registered voters to the polls was precincts 21 where 27.7 percent of the registered voters actually voted. Precinct 21 is in District 5 where Greg O’Connor ran unchallenged for Councilman. Second highest precinct turning out Nobles-

ville voters was precincts 24 with 27.6 voters. Precinct 24 is in District 1, where the battle for the Council position was won the incumbent Roy Johnson over newcomer Henry Cole.

Although very small precincts, none of the five registered voters in Precinct 2 and neither of the two registered in Precinct 3 voted. In Precinct 4, where nine folks were registered, one showed up at the poll.

If you want to know how voters in your district voted, all of the results appear elsewhere in today’s Reporter. Don’t know your district, or your precinct or who ran in that race, the Reporter had **all** the facts, with maps, on Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday of last week.

NPD hosts Car Seat Clinic on Saturday

The proper use of car seats is one of the simplest and most effective methods available for protecting the lives of young children in the event of a motor vehicle crash.

Taking the time to have your child's car seat checked may save their life. Noblesville Police Department will be hosting a Child Restraint Clinic as part of the 2015 Children's Bureau Spring Fling, "Passport to Prevention". The clinic will be held Saturday May 9th, 2015 at the Hamilton County Fairgrounds, from 12:00 - 3:00 pm. During the free car seat clinic, a certified car

seat technician will teach you how to install and use a car seat correctly.

There are limited car seats available for parents/caregivers who cannot otherwise afford to purchase one for their child. The child must be present to receive a free car seat, unless the child is unborn. You will need to provide verification of financial need for each car seat distributed (such as membership cards for any public assistance program, or a statement from the parent stating the need and lack of financial means to purchase a car seat).

Parents/caregivers are encouraged to make donations to the program.

Fishers man arrested for stealing tires, rims

Fishers police officers arrested a man as he was attempting to steal tires and rims from a neighbor's vehicle.

During the early morning hours of Tuesday, a resident of the Brooks Chase

Neighborhood (131st Street and Brooks School Road) heard a suspicious noise outside of his home. He looked out his window and observed two men removing tires and rims off of his vehicle. He immediately

called 911 and reported the theft in progress. The victim was able to provided physical descriptions of the two suspects and their vehicle.

Officers from the Fishers Police Department quickly responded to the area and set a perimeter. One of the suspects was observed running between houses in the 12600 block of Justice Crossing and was taken into custody without incident. An extensive search was conducted, using a K-9 from the Carmel Police Department, however the second suspect was not located and remains at large.

Arrested was Daniel L. Davis, 25, of Fishers. He is charged with Theft, a Level 6 Felony, and is being held at the Hamilton County Jail.

"This is a great example of a resident recognizing suspicious activity and immediately calling 911", stated Fishers Chief of Police George Kehl. "Immediate notification gives the police officers the best chance to make these types of in-progress arrests", Chief Kehl continued.

# Everyone votes for all in Sheridan

Elections in Sheridan differ slightly than some of the larger communities throughout Hamilton County. In Sheridan registered voters cast ballots for all candidates. Voters are not limited to voting only for the candidate in their district.

Hamilton County Elections Clerk Kathy Richardson explained, “In Sheridan it

doesn’t matter what district you live in and it doesn’t matter what district the candidate represents. Everyone votes for all.”

Of Sheridan’s 1,763 registered only 20.4% turned out for Tuesday’s election. A total of 360 ballots were submitted.

In Sheridan’s race for a Republican District 1 Town Council representative, Darryl Waters defeated current Sheridan Town

Council member Brenda Bush. Waters received 232 votes. Bush received the fewest votes of any Sheridan candidate with 119. The voter turnout was low in District 1 with only 54 of a possible 225 votes submitted by residents of Waters and Bush’s home district.

Former council member Glen Bougher defeated incumbent Silas DeVaney in the

race for the Republican District 2 council representative. Bougher received 203 total votes and DeVaney received 144.

Current Sheridan Clerk Treasurer Elizabeth Walden defeated Regan Kercheval 239 to 115.

David Kinkead representing District 3 ran unopposed.
