The Hamilton County Traffic Safety Partnership announced today its participation in the national and statewide 2015 Click It or Ticket enforcement mobilization occurring May 15-31, 2015. Officers will be joining more than 250 state and local law enforcement agencies, along with thousands of agencies across the country, to conduct high-visibility patrols encouraging drivers to buckle up.



Carmel sent more voters to the polls on Tuesday than any other Hamilton County city or town.

No surprise, since Carmel is the largest city in Hamilton County.

Of its 63,335 registered voters, 14,333 Carmelites voted. That's a total turnout of 24.2 percent.

Compare those numbers to Fishers, which unlike Carmel didn't have a race for a mayor. At Fishers, Scott Fadness ran unchallenged. Fishers registered 56,889 voters and just 3,141 voted. That's a total of 5.5 per cent.

Carmel, did elect a mayor. A total of 22,680 registered in is in District 1, where the battle for the Council position Westfield. A total of 4,785 actually went to the polls. That's 16.1 percent.

Noblesville elected a mayor. Not counting Fishers, registered and 5,853 voted. That's 14.9 percent.

Three Noblesville precincts drew as high as 27 percent of its registered voters. Leading the way of drawing registered voters to the polls was precincts 21 where 27.7 percent of the registered voters actually voted. Precinct 21 Don't know your district, or your precinct or who ran in is in District 5 where Greg O'Connor ran unchallenged for Councilman. Second highest precinct turning out Nobles- Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday of last week.

Westfield was second behind Carmel. Westfield, like ville voters was precincts 24 with 27.6 voters. Precinct 24 was won the incumbent Roy Johnson over newcomer Henry Cole.

Although very small precincts, none of the five regis-Noblesville was last in Hamilton County. A total of 49,175 tered voters in Precinct 2 and neither of the two registered in Precinct 3 voted. In Precinct 4, where nine folks were registered, one showed up at the poll.





Officers from the Fishers Police Department quickly responded to the area and set a perimeter. One of the suspects was observed running between houses in the 12600 block of Justice Crossing and was taken into custody without incident. An extensive search was conducted, using a K-9 from the Carmel Police Department, however the second suspect was not located and remains at large.


