Man, 22, drowns in Morse Reservoir

After a two hour search Thursday evening dive team members representing Cicero, Noblesville and Fishers removed the body of a 22 year old man that had drowned in Morse Reservoir.

Emergency personnel were dispatched to the area of the lake near the 1300 block of Lighthouse Point in Cicero just before 4 p.m.

A spokesman at the scene representing the Department of Natural Resources said four people were riding in a pontoon boat and two of the boaters went into the water, but the victim did not surface.

Authorities were investigating if alcohol was a factor in the incident.

The victim's identity had not been released as of press time. He is believed to be from out of state.

Organizations partner for 5th Annual Bed Race on June 5

“It’s family-friendly and fun for a good cause,” said Abigail Rinehart, bed race organizer and unit director at the Noblesville Boys & Girls Club. “Each year families feel a pinch from summer costs. Every child should be able to participate in a summer activity regardless of finances.”

The annual bed race involves racing custom designed beds on wheels on Ninth Street. It provides an enjoyable experience for onlookers and participants alike while raising money for local children. Participants will help provide youth summer camp scholarships for the Boys & Girls Club of Noblesville and Noblesville Parks and Recreation. All of the proceeds are split evenly for financial need scholarships for each program.

“The bed race is one of my favorite Noblesville traditions,” said Noblesville Parks Assistant Director Mike Hoffmeister. “While it’s fun, entertaining and competitive, it’s also a valuable event for our local summer camps. It is necessary and important to provide an avenue for those in the community that can’t always afford the services that we offer.”

Adults and families, businesses or organizations, and schools or clubs are invited to “Put School to Bed and Race into Summer” by participating in this unique foot race. Teams consist of four to five racers ages 16 or older. Teams may bring their own custom bed or can borrow a bed from the hosts. Fees are \$50 for teams who bring a bed. and \$100 for teams who borrow a bed. Viewing of the race is free of charge.

Sheridan Schools receive reading grant from Duke Energy

On Wednesday Mark LaBarr, North Central Area Manager for Duke Energy, presented Sheridan Community Schools with a \$25,000 reading grant to be used for Sheridan's 2015 Summer Reading Safari program.

Hall of Fame induction is June 14

Four of Hamilton County's all time great players and a man who has devoted a lifetime to promoting Indiana high school basketball will on June 14 be inducted into the Hamilton County Basketball Hall of Fame.

The stars of past years include Jenny Horn Claypool, Noblesville; Ron Ackles, Jackson Central; Chris Rodgers, Sheridan and Jess McKinney, Hamilton Heights.

Selected as this year's contributor is long-time Voice of the Greyhounds, Carmel's Scott Gregg.

Jenny Horn Claypool was a dominating player while performing for Noblesville's Lady Miller. She was All-Hamilton County four years and Hamilton County Player of the Year three different seasons. Jenny also was All-Conference four years.

She led Hamilton County in scoring and rebounding three years; held the school single game records of 34 points and 30 rebounds, and she started 70 straight games in high school. Her team won the first girls sectional in the history of NHS. Along with her basketball career she was All-County in volleyball three years and the school record holder in shot put in track and field.

Jenny was the first Lady Miller to receive a college scholarship. She attended Wright State University from 1982-86 and was All-America third team; All-District team; team MVP twice and she set school record for victories.

Horn Claypool currently is Superintendent of Schools in Cincinnati, Ohio. She is married to Rick Claypool and they have two children Brooke and Dylan.

Ron Ackles graduated from Jackson Central in 1962.

He played for Coach Roland Inskeep at Jackson Central and was All-Hamilton County in 1960, 1961 and 1962. Ackles was First Team on the Indianapolis Star's All-State Team. He was All-Sectional in 1960 and 1961; Hamilton County assist leader in 1960 and 1961 and he held all scoring records for Jackson Central when he graduated, scoring 1,052 career points. He had a season high of 430 points and a game high of 45 points.

Ackles served in the U.S. Marines after graduation. He worked at Delco Remy in Anderson and also worked with Coach Scott Griffey in the girls basketball program at Hamilton Heights during a period his niece, Debbie Ackles, played.

Chris Rodgers graduated from Sheridan High School in 1980.

Rodgers played for basketball coaches Bill Collier and Dan Dawson at Sheridan.

He graduated as Sheridan's all-time leading scorer with 1,426 points, at that time 11th on the all-time Hamilton County list. He was All-County in 1979 and 1980 and Hamilton County Player of the Year in 1979 and 1980. Chris was Academic All-State in 1980 and was All-Sectional in 1979 and 1980.

He was a four-year player at Butler University.

He and his wife Sheryl have three sons.

Jess McKinney graduated from Hamilton Heights in 1995.

He played for Coach Bill Bowen. A four-year varsity player, McKinney scored 1,444 points. He was County Player of the Year his junior and senior years. Jess was included in the Top 40 workout in 1995.

McKinney was All-Conference as a junior and senior and a member of the Indianapolis Metro honor team. When McKinney graduated he was the third all-time leading scorer at Hamilton Heights.

Jess attended DePauw University. He and his wife Courtney have three sons, six-year-old twins and one two-year old.

McKinney currently is vice-president of David Weekly Homes.

Scott Gregg was communications instructor for Carmel High School from 1970-78 and general manager for WHJE, PBP and color for Carmel boys basketball and several other teams.

He coached girls junior varsity basketball at Carmel and had a 27-4 record including a record 14-1 season.

Greg served as sports information director from 1996-2011 of the Metropolitan Interscholastic Conference and published weekly MIC notes, kept stats and published an annual league record book and yearbook.

Scott has served as public address announcer for several IHSAA state sports championship events. He became the Colts' press box in-house PA person in 2009.

In 2003-04, Gregg was presented the IHSAA District 2 Distinguished Media Service Award.



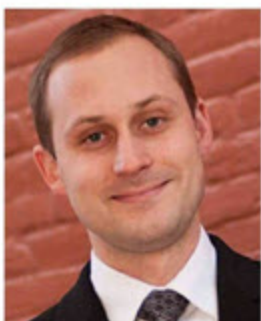

Greyhounds win regional

Just as in the girls regional earlier in the week, non-Hamilton County athletes played a big part in the boys regional at Lafayette Jeff last evening.

Not enough, however, to stop Carmel from winning the championship.

The Greyhounds finished with 91 points, while Avon was a close second with 85.3 and Hamilton Southeastern placed third with 54 points.

Carmel won two individual events and two relay races. In the process the Greyhounds shattered two regional records. Ben Veatch easily broke the meet record with a time of 9:03.41 in the 3200 run. Carmel's 3200 relay team of Teddy Browning, James Pescio, Andrew Rigbee and Veatch cracked the old record with a 7:44.21 clocking in an event in which second place West Lafayette and third place Westfield also broke the old record. Running for Westfield were Aaron Bennett, Johnny Crawford, Alec Hartman and Sam Henthorn.

Carmel's other two wins came from Jalen Walker in the 300 hurdles and from the 400 relay foursome of Isaac James, Collin Pearson, Ryan Stoebeck and Walker.

Noblesville's Jake Owens had an outstanding night, winning the 400 dash after placing second in the 200 dash.

Hamilton Heights' Michael Defoe won the 110 hurdles in 14.58.

Hamilton Southeastern and Fishers each captured one event championship in the field events. Fishers' Res Carver had a record jump of 23-7.75 in the long jump, pushed by second-place Tigers Guillory of Southeastern. HSE's Francis Ehigbai won the high jump with a 6-6 performance.

The biggest upset of the night came when Frankfort freshman Colton Crum cleared 16-7 in the pole vault to defeat HSE's Ethan Bray, who cleared 16-1.

The non-Hamilton County athletes had their say. Three won two events.

Plainfield's Andrew Smoke smoked a talented field in the 100 and 200 dashes.

Brownsburg's Hari Sathyamurthy won both the 800 and 1600 runs.

Avon's David Schall won the shot put and then set a meet record of 195-0 to capture the discus.

In addition to crowning champions, the top three in each event advanced to next Friday's state meet at Indiana University in Bloomington. Due to the strength of the regional, several other athletes from outside the top three in their events qualified after they bettered the state standard in their respective race. Two Hamilton County athletes did just that: Westfield's Martell Fletcher in the 110 hurdles and Carmel's Mitch Lipe in the pole vault.

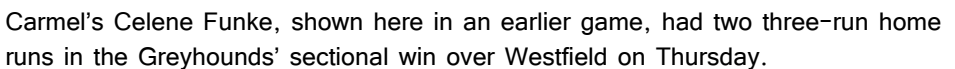
