## Pelley was Noblesville’s most controversial resident

Fifty years ago, in June of 1965, Noblesville made national news when the city's most controversial resident, William Dudley Pelley, died. Controversy followed him virtually to the grave as a cross was burned the night before his funeral in front of the Evans, Godby and Trout Mortuary.

Although his name is not widely recognized today, Pelley was nationally known in the years leading up to World War II. He headed an organization known as the Silver Legion, a group accused of being pro-Nazi and anti-Semitic. Pelley organized chapters of his Legion in nearly every state and held mass rallies attacking the national administration, with the principal theme being isolationism.

Earlier in his career Pelley, a man of many interests, was a Hollywood screenwriter, the founder of Galahad College in North Carolina and publisher of the Galahad Press. He came to Noblesville in 1940 and through his publication named 'Roll Call' continued his attacks on federal government policies and President Franklin Roosevelt in particular calling FDR a warmonger.

In 1936 Pelley ran for U.S. President as the candidate of the Christian Party of America. He got on the ballot in only one state (Washington) and received 3,300 votes. It was his only attempt at running for public office.

After Pearl Harbor was attacked Roosevelt sent J. Edgar Hoover to investigate Pelley. In April 1942 federal agents arrested Pelley in Noblesville. He was spirited away to serve eight years in prison after being charged with treason and sedition.

Upon release in 1950 Pelley, always undeterred, was back in Noblesville organizing a new publication this time dealing with spiritualism and the occult. His Soulcraft

publishing business was located in an old brick structure at 2nd and Washington Streets.

A few months after his death in 1965, an auction sale was held at the Soulcraft building. It attracted hundreds of curious residents wanting to see what mysterious or unusual belongings of the controversial former owner might be for sale. They were disappointed to find mostly just stacks of unsold magazines and pamphlets and some old printing equipment.

Newspapers around the country ran stories of Pelley's demise and the cross burning. Later the burning cross was found to be merely the work of local teenagers with no connection to Pelley's past affiliations.

Within a few weeks Noblesville was back in the national news with the story of a challenge to freedom of the press in which Judge Ed New cited Ledger editor Jim Neal with contempt for opinions expressed in Neal's daily column. (That case was the subject of a story printed here two weeks ago.)

## Training center is long overdue

That was a comment from Judge Steve Nation when talking to the most powerful group of county and city leaders I’ve ever seen in one Hamilton County room. The Judge was urging the building of an emergency training

center in Hamilton County.

“We’ve been trying to do this for 40 years,” said Nation. “We never had the land, and now we do.”

That comment hit me like a ton of bricks. Forty years? Nothing in Hamilton County takes 40 years to accomplishment.

Okay, maybe solving the parking problem in Noblesville. Or a bypass around the city. I’ll give you that.

But, I’m talking Hamilton County. What has been important to Hamilton County residents that has taken 40 years to achieve?

We’ve built major roads in less time. We’ve paved every road in the county.

We’ve built parks. We’ve built schools and we’ve built more schools. We’ve built a jail which looks more like a prison and we’ve built a county government building which saved the old courthouse. We’ve rebuilt Fishers. We’ve rebuilt Carmel. We’ve even built a Grand Park in Westfield. We’ve built a beautiful city building in Noblesville and we’re about to build a new park. We’ve built one of the biggest and finest hospitals in the land. We’ve built huge basketball gyms and football fields where grass isn’t needed. Now, think about it. How much is

the new Westfield High football stadium costing?

We’re not Boone County or Madison County, or Tipton County, or Grant County or even Marion County. This is Hamilton County, the biggest and the best. When we want something, we don’t mind shelling out a few extra tax bucks.

This is why I’ve chosen to live in Hamilton County all of my adult life. I bet you’re the same way. We expect the best. We demand the finest.

When we really want something, we go after it.

I guess that’s how I feel about the funding, by cities and county, of an emergency training center. Do we really want this?

Do we want the best trained paramedics knocking on our door when someone living here is having a heart attack?

Do we want the best trained firemen answering the call when our home is burning?

How about police protection? Don’t we want the best trained policemen?

And, God forbid, we should have a natural disaster in Hamilton County. Back in my day the National Guard would be here to help. We no longer have a National Guard in Noblesville. They sold out to the schools and left town with a million bucks so that the schools could maintain the highest-priced storage area you’ll find. (Don’t get me started).

Who is going to protect us if a disaster hits?

So, do we need an emergency training center – the best training center around – in Hamilton County? If we really believe we

need that and want that, then we should step up and say so.

The mayors who represent 88 percent of our citizens in our four largest cities have said we do. Three county commissioners who represent all of the county have said we do.

Our County Council have said, I think, that they want a training center, but instead of paying \$3 million they want to pay \$1.5 million and have the county commissioners go back to the cities begging for the other half of the pot.

As a taxpayer, as a voter, that’s an embarrassment.

I say this because the same County Council is sitting on a \$50 million dollar plus rainy day fund.

Some members of the Council are concerned about goals which are in front of us. Such as State Road 37 improvements; the extension of the Judicial Center; the expansion of the county jail, etc. I applaud them for that.

But remember, this is Hamilton County and we always find ways to be the best of the best.

And, quite honestly, no governmental unit should be sitting on a \$50 million rainy day fund.

We have the land now. I would question if Hamilton County land will be available for such a project 40 years from now.

Plus, guess what, I don’t have 40 years to wait.

If the Hamilton County Council favors building a training center, then get moving by going to the bank. If not, then say so, and we’ll wait another 40 years.



## Indiana building permits decrease in May

Single-family building permits in Indiana decreased two percent in May over the previous month while numbers decreased 10 percent in May compared to the same time last year according to the latest data from the U.S. Census Bureau and the Department of Housing and Urban Development.

In May 2015, there were 1,184 single-family building permits issued compared to 1,312 in 2014. Single-family permits for the first five months of 2015 are up one percent compared to the first five months of 2014.

"The housing market in Indiana continues to show signs of a slow, steady recovery," said Indiana Builders Association Chief Executive Officer Rick Wajda. "It has been a tough eight years for many of our builders and we are just now seeing signs of consistent optimism amongst our members."

According to the latest National Association of Home Builders (NAHB)/Wells Fargo Housing Opportunity Index, 66.5 percent of new and existing homes sold between January and the end of March were affordable to families earning the U.S. median income of \$65,800.

In addition, a recent survey from NAHB reports confidence among U.S. home builders jumped to its highest level in nine months to a reading of 59 in June. A reading above 50 means most builders generally hold a favorable view of the market for newly built, single-family homes.

"Although the numbers in May were slightly lower than the previous month, it is encouraging to know that 2015 is off to a better start than 2014," said Wajda. "Historically low interest rates and low housing inventory across the state are both factors that will contribute to the continued growth of the housing industry."

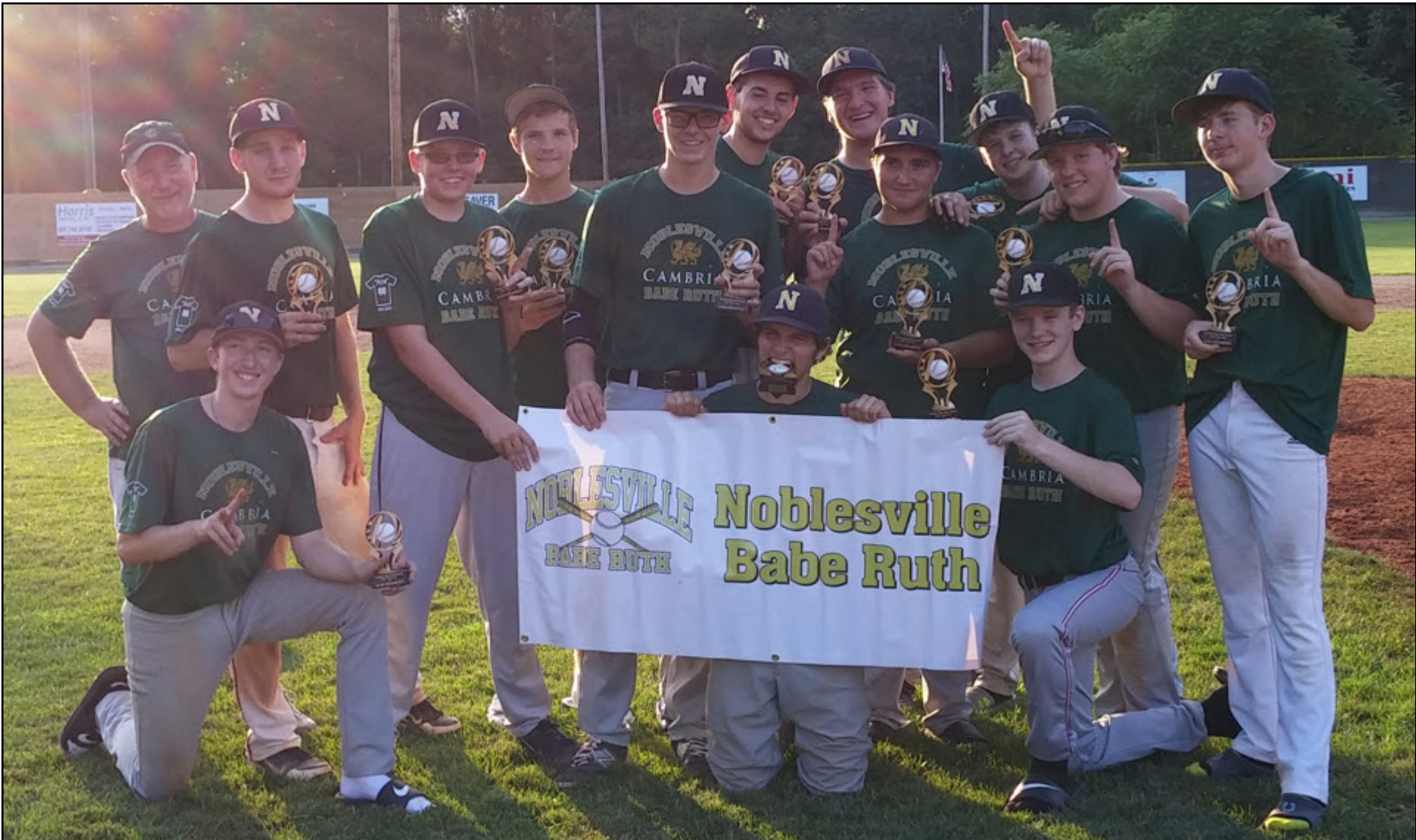

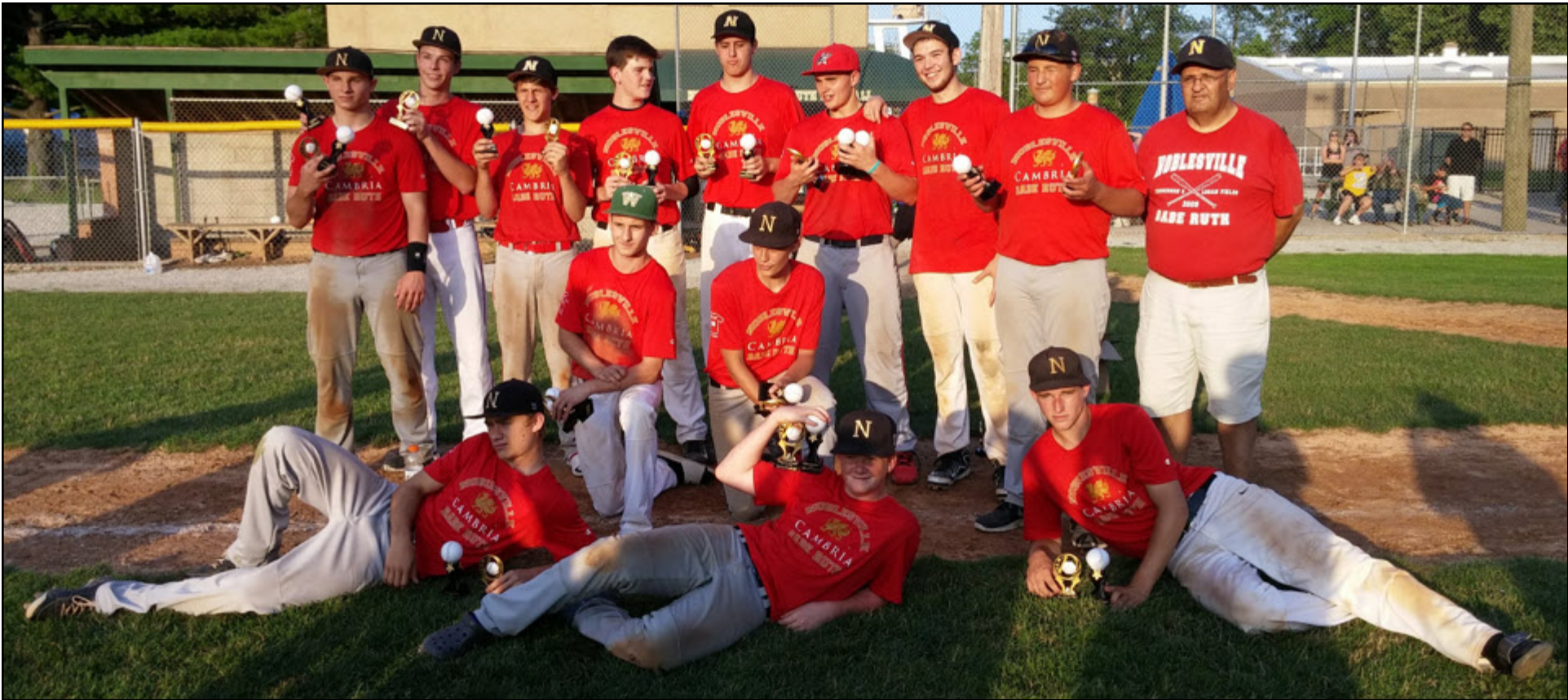


# Wolf Run wins Noblesville City Tournament



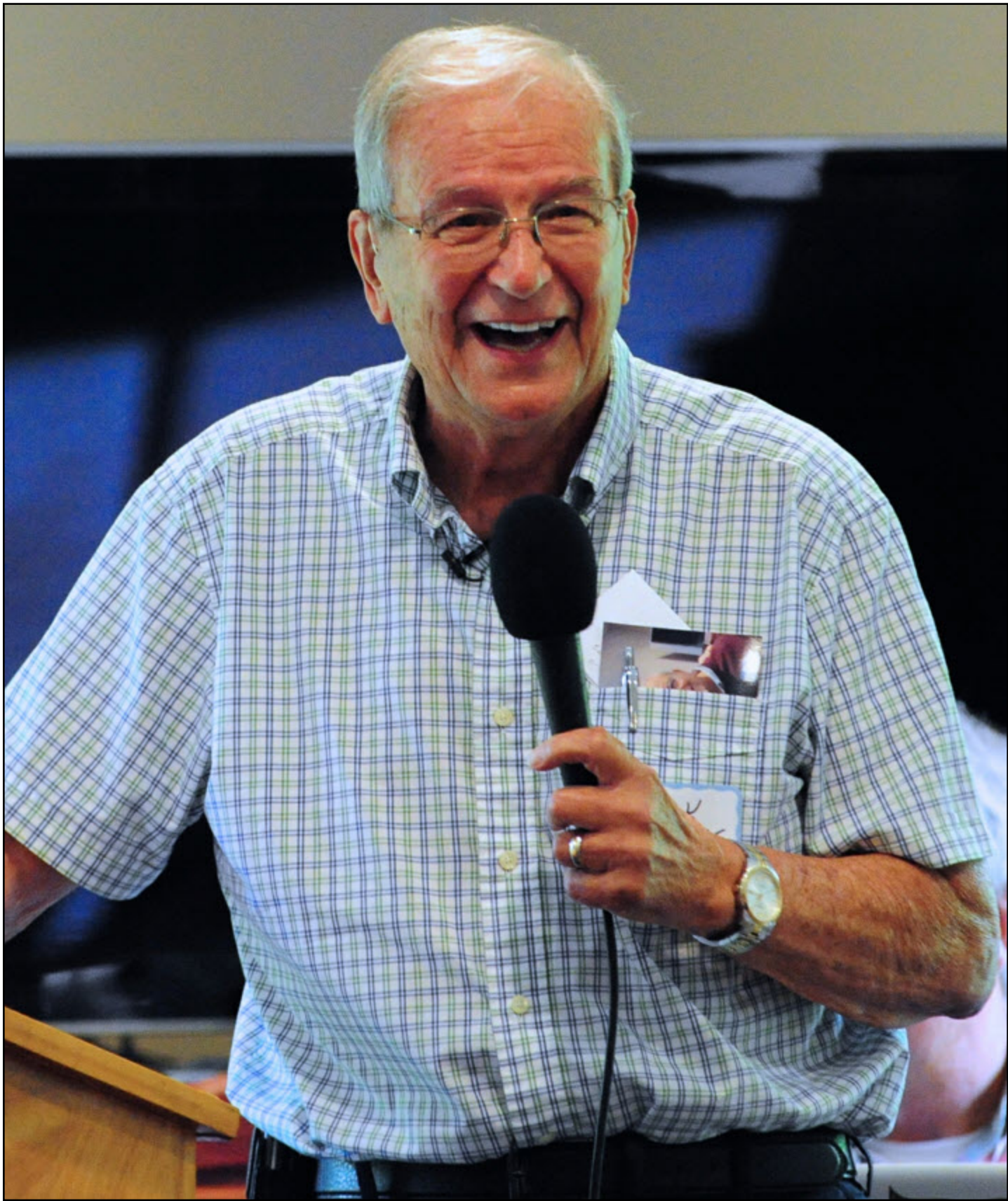
