## **Noblesville Street Dance is Saturday**

One of Noblesville's favorite summer events is this weekend. Noblesville Main Street will hold the 24th annual Noblesville Street Dance on the historic courthouse square on Saturday, July 11, from 4 p.m. – 11 p.m. Admission is free and the event is open to the public. Riverview Health and the City of Noblesville will serve as the title sponsors of this year's event.

At 5 p.m. the dancing begins. Noblesville DJ Gene Ott will start the evening on the main stage to get the crowd moving. Back by popular demand will be The Bishops who will take the stage at 7:30 p.m. and perform until 11 p.m., playing dance hits from the '70s up to today's number one hits.

A favorite in downtown Noblesville, Copper Still will once again host a beer garden for patrons 21 and older on 9th Street during the event. Identification will be required for admittance.

This year's event will feature karaoke with The Bishops starting around 8:15 pm on the main stage. Two preliminary competitions were held and local singers Josh Rodkey and Kristen Moore will face off for a cash prize to be awarded at the Street Dance based on crowd response to each performance.

## **Noblesville** boy injured in traffic accident

A 13-year-old boy was injured in a traffic accident Wednesday afternoon in Noblesville.

At approximately 2:11 p.m., police officers and firefighters from the Noblesville Police & Fire Departments responded to the intersection of 14th and Hannibal streets in reference to a report of a motor vehicle crash involving a USPS vehicle and bicyclist. Officers and firefighters arrived on the scene a short time later and began to investigate.

Based on witness statements and evidence at the scene, it appears that a juvenile riding a bicycle was traveling northbound on 14th Street when he pulled out into the path of a 1993 GM, USPS mail delivery vehicle that was traveling eastbound on Hannibal Street. At this particular intersection, 14th Street is regulated by stop signs and Hannibal Street traffic has none. The posted speed limit on Hannibal Street is 25 mph.

The bicyclist is identified as a male juvenile, 13, of Noblesville. He was transported by ground ambulance to

## Forum to become "Fuel Tank in Fishers"

Hockey fans who live in Hamilton County soon won't have to travel far if they want to see a pro team in their favorite sport.

The Indy Fuel will be making its new home base in Fishers. The Forum in Fishers has been acquired by Indiana Ice Arenas, which is an affiliate company of the Fuel. The deal closed on July 1. The Forum will now be known as the "Fuel Tank in Fishers."

The Fuel had been playing their games at the Indiana Farmers Coliseum (formerly the Pepsi Coliseum) at the Indiana State Fairgrounds. In a news release on the Fuel's Web site, the team's CEO/COO Sean Hallett said it is "thrilled to announce our ownership" of what is now the Fuel Tank.

"We believe this investment in youth and adult hockey underscores the Fuel's commitment to growing the game at a grassroots level and aids in our ability to achieve our stated goal of doubling the participation in youth hockey in Central Indiana," Hallett said on the Web site.

The Fuel is a member of the East Coast Hockey League (ECHL), and is a AA affiliate of the Stanley Cup champion Chicago Blackhawks. The Fuel is one of seven teams that plays in the north division of the office space, the addition of a pro shop, and ECHL's Eastern Conference.

With the change of ownership, the new Fuel Tank will also see renovations. Plans include increasing parking, building more

Riley Hospital for Children in Indianapolis. The identity of the bicyclist is being withheld at this time pending family notification(s). The condition of the juvenile was characterized as "critical" at the time of this release. There were no additional occupants on the bicycle.

The driver of the USPS vehicle is identified as Hope M. Buchanan, 38, of Noblesville. The driver did not report injuries as a result of the accident. There were no additional occupants in the vehicle.

Investigators from the NPD Accident Reconstruction Unit were summons to the scene to collect evidence and gather information. As a result of the lengthy investigation, traffic was still being diverted around the intersection of 14th & Hannibal Street at the time of this release.

This remains an ongoing investigation and further details will be released as they become available.

## U.S. 31 update... Traffic shift between 103rd & Old Meridian streets


On or after Friday, July 10, crews plan to shift traffic on US 31 to the new pave- to traffic across US 31, and the Main Street ment (outside lanes) between 103rd and roundabout interchange at US 31 is expect-Old Meridian streets. Once traffic on US 31 is shifted, construction will begin on the new inside lanes.

Traffic will also be shifted on 106th and 116th streets. Both streets will be reduced to one lane in each direction across US 31 with additional turn lanes. Motorists will notice extended left-turning distances to and from US 31 and should pay extra attention when driving in the area. Signage and pavement markings will indicate new travel paths and lane designations for the temporary configuration. While lane configurations will be different in this area, all turning movements will remain open.

Carmel Drive/126th Street is now open ed to open to its permanent configuration with two lanes in each direction before the US 31 traffic shift.

#### **Old Meridian Street Ramp Closure**

Beginning on or after Monday, July 13, crews plan to close the slip ramp from northbound US 31 to Old Meridian Street to allow for storm sewer installation and pavement work. This closure is expected to last approximately 30 days. Access to all businesses will remain open. See the map below for a view of the detour route, which directs motorists to 116th Street and Pennsylvania Street.



### A new football season...

# Change is the new buzz word

Are you ready for some football? Some Hamilton County high school football?

The start of the 2015 season is just a little more than three weeks away. Noncontact practice will begin on Aug 3, with contact workout set for Aug 6. Opening games will be played on Aug. 21.

One word (change) will describe the Hamilton County season.

Hamilton Heights will play in the Hoosier Conference. Sheridan will play in the Hoosier Heartland Conference, which will end its season with a playoff game.

There is a new man pulling the strings at one of the state's top football programs. John Hebert will move from assistant to head coach of the Greyhounds.

Westfield will begin its season in the Shamrocks' new football stadium, one of the finest in the state.

Nearly every school will have a change on their schedules. Among the eight schools, only Noblesville will play exactly the nine opponents the Millers faced in 2014.

Sheridan, playing in the new Heartland Conference, has replaced Shenandoah, Clinton Prairie, North Knox and Linton-Stockton with North White, Eastern and Taylor. The playoff game in Week 9 is new to Sheridan's schedule.

Hamilton Heights, playing in the new Hoosier Conference, has replaced Maconaquah, Eastern, Taylor and Peru, all from the old Mid-Indiana Conference, with Mt. Vernon, West Lafayette, Culver Academy and Twin Lakes.

Three of the county teams will face out-of-state opponents.

Hamilton Southeastern has replaced Cathedral with Columbus Hartley (Ohio).

Carmel, instead of facing Louisville Trinity, will take on LaSalle (Ohio) in a game to be played at the University of Cincinnati. That's the only change on Carmel's schedule.

Guerin Catholic will play Marmion Academy out of Illinois instead of meeting Terre Haute South. The Golden Eagles also have replaced Culver Academy with Bowman Academy in the final regular season game of the year.

Westfield will meet Brebeuf instead of Indianapolis Washington and Fishers will play Cathedral, replacing Indianapolis Tech.

In a head-to-head county and Hoosier Crossroads Conference showdown, Westfield will meet Hamilton Southeastern at Lucas Oil Stadium on Sept. 18.

Verizon IndyCar Series drivers will practice, qualify and race on the same day in the ABC Supply Co. Inc. Wisconsin 250 at Milwaukee IndyFest presented by the Metro Milwaukee Honda Dealers.

"It means you have to get it right quickly," said defending race winner and reigning Verizon IndyCar Series champion Will Power of the non-stop action July 11-12 at The Milwaukee Mile.
