# Canceled

The Hamilton County Commissioners early Wednesday morning cancelled a Thursday executive session concerning the State Road '37 Corridor.'

The cancellation followed concerns by the Hamilton County Reporter that the meeting did not meet the executive session guidelines established under Indiana Open Door Rule.

Mark Heirbrandt, president of the Commissioners, when earlier in the week questioned by The Reporter said,

"We have been advised by (county attorney) Mike Howard that the meeting should be an executive session."

"Anytime land acquisition is discussed, it is necessary to go into executive session," Howard said.

"We didn't believe that the group meeting, which was to include mayors from Noblesville and Fishers, had anything to do with discussing the acquisition of any one parcel of land, which is how we understand the open door law to read," said Reporter editor Don Jellison.

Jellison again confronted the Commissions and Howard following a regularly scheduled Monday session and was given the same answer.

"We have great respect for attorney Mike Howard and the role he has played in representing Hamilton County for many years. But, in this situation we believe Howard is wrong. The meeting should have been open not only to the

# 'Mac' signs at Shenandoah

Dave McCollough, the all-time basketball victory leader with a 308-138 record at Noblesville High School, has signed as the head coach at Shenandoah High School.

"It all happened so quickly," McCollough told the Hamilton County Reporter. "A week ago I saw the opening at Shenandoah and Monday evening the school board approved my hiring."

"I'm excited and thrilled to be back in coaching and able to add what I can to an excellent athletic and academic program at Shenandoah."

McCollough sat out of coaching last season after being fired by the Noblesville School Board.

"It was a tough year," said McCollough, "sitting on the sidelines and not doing what you really love to do."

McCollough was fired by Noblesville for an alleged incident of throwing a ball at a player in practice. He later sued Noblesville Schools and principal Jeff Bryant.

The lawsuit has been set in Hamilton County Circuit Court for early January, 2016.

"I can't really talk about that lawsuit," McCollough told The Reporter. "It is still pending in court and we're trying to move forward."

McCollough, who spent 20 years coaching the Millers, had been suspended for two games during the 2013-14 season and then fired following the season on a decision by Bryant.

He has been replaced by Brian McCauley, who had been coaching at Kokomo High School.

McCollough has been a head varsity coach for 31 years. He came to Noblesville after 11 years as a head coach at North Judson.

With a total of 465 coaching victories during his career, at Noblesville McCollough led the Millers to three sectionals and one regional championship.

McCollough is the father of a Noblesville seventh grader who is said to me one of the brighter prospects in the Noblesville program.

## Work begins on Riverwalk Depot Pocket Park in downtown Noblesville

The City of Noblesville, with assistance from Duke Energy Foundation and Sagamore Ready Mix, is creating the first pocket park, Riverwalk Depot, on 0.15 acres in Downtown Noblesville.

"A pocket park is a small park accessible to the general public that is typically created on a single vacant lot or on a small, irregular piece of land," said Noblesville

Economic Development Specialist Alaina Shonkwiler.

For the past year and a half the Noblesville economic development, parks, streets, wastewater and engineering departments have planned the park as a place making and beautification initiative.

"Alaina's vision for this area is perfect for the underutilized, forgotten space this could truly become. The partnership between several departments working together to make this a reality will benefit residents and guests. This is truly a space created out of teamwork," Noblesville Parks Director Brandon Bennett said.

Currently a gravel lot and a turnaround zone for utility trucks near the Duke Energy substation and Bolden's Dry Cleaners, this small parcel will serve as a trailhead for the intersection of the White River Greenway

and the Riverwalk. It also will integrate art with function.

"Riverwalk Depot is designed to beautify and revitalize a blighted trailhead adjacent to the Nickel Plate Railroad and a major intersection of the Noblesville Trail System. This pocket park will create another unique Downtown Noblesville spot and

continues the overall growth of quality of life amenities to the downtown area,” Noblesville Mayor John Ditslear said.

Shonkwiler said Riverwalk Depot will include a walking pathway, a covered bench and two specific components to increase the functionality for cyclists – a bicycle repair station and a sculptural bicycle rack.

“This one of a kind 9-foot tall and 12-feet long metal sculpture of a large train engine will serve as a bicycle rack and was designed and fabricated by Rick Heflin, owner of RC Metalworks in downtown Noblesville,” she said.

The City of Noblesville and Nickel Plate Arts also are integrating art on the fence panels that will act as a visual barrier to the Duke Energy substation.

“The fence panel will feature a system to allow for a constant flow of public art to be installed and viewed in the pocket park,” Shonkwiler said. “The initial installation of art will likely be the community mural project created at the 2015 Noblesville Street Dance by Nickel Plate Arts.”

Grand opening for Riverwalk Depot will be held Friday, Oct. 2.

press but to the citizens of Hamilton County, especially to those residents and businesses who will be directly affected when the '37 Corridor' is built,” said Jellison.

“We realize that executive sessions must be held when land acquisition is discussed,” Jellison continued. “But, The Reporter wasn’t convinced that Hamilton County had reached that stage.”

“We cancelled the meeting,” Heirbrandt late yesterday afternoon told The Reporter, “because we think it is important to get it right. We’ll get together when we best can.”

The Reporter received an email from Commissioner Steve Dillinger who represents both the Noblesville and Fishers areas. “As you know, I am a very transparent person,” Dillinger wrote, “so if this shouldn’t be an executive meeting it makes no difference to me. I am going to say the same thing if the press is there or if they are not.”

“In questioning the right for an executive session, in no way is The Reporter attempting to slow the process of perhaps the greatest highway project ever attempted in Hamilton County,” said Jellison.

“Anyone reading our reports and opinions concerning the project should recognize our support for the '37 Corridor.’ But we also believe the project needs the support of the community and, therefore, all should be up front and out in the open concerning what may happen.

“We have no young gun reporters at The Reporter trying to make a name for themselves,” Jellison added, “and in a short couple of years The Reporter already has established itself as the voice and ears of the community.”

The multi-million dollar corridor project involves upgrading State Road 37 from Noblesville to I-69 at Fishers with elevated roundabouts replacing grade level intersection to eliminate stoplights.

The cost is estimated at more than \$170 million with the State of Indiana apparently willing to bear the majority of the expenses. Some local money will apparently be required to meet the total cost.

Last year McCollough continued to teach at Noblesville and the family still resides in Noblesville. He says he is unsure whether or not the family will move

“It all has happened so quickly; I just haven’t had time to think,” he said.

McCollough will teach at Shenandoah, in the science department.

“That’s important to me, teaching and coaching in the same school,” he said.

At Shenandoah, McCollough will replace Mike King, who in his only season coaching the Raiders was 12-11 last year, losing to Winchester in the first game of a Class 2A sectional.

Shenandoah has gone through four consecutive seasons without a winning record and without a sectional victory. The Raiders were 15-9 in 20-10-11 and went 1-1 in the sectional.

Shenandoah is the school current Carmel basketball coach Scott Heady played his high school basketball. Coached by his father, Bob Heady, Shenandoah advanced to the state finals in Scott’s senior year. The Headys then moved to Carmel, with Bob Heady as the head coach of the Greyhounds.

McCollough will start his coaching career in a game against Hagerstown. Shenandoah and Noblesville do not play each other in basketball.

## Free child car safety seat inspection and installation event on Aug. 10

The Hamilton County Sheriff's Office will be hosting a free child car seat installation and inspection community event on Monday, August 10 from 8:30 a.m. until 3:30 p.m. At the event, certified car seat technicians will be conducting car seat installations and inspections for all types of seats. According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), a child under the age of 13 is involved in a crash every 34 seconds in the United States. Correct car seat usage reduces the risk for death to infants by 71% and for toddlers by 54%. However, one study by NHTSA shows that 72% of car seats are not used correctly. As times have changed, so have car seats and the evolution of child safety seats is not always easy to keep up.

Anyone interested in having a car seat inspection at the event should call to set up an appointment prior to August 10. To set up an appointment, call the Hamilton County Sheriff's Office at [317-773-1872](tel:317-773-1872) and ask for Shasta or Allison. When you call, be ready to provide the following information:

- The make, model, and year of your vehicle
- The make and model of the child safety seat
- The height and weight of the child

In order to make sure seats are correctly fitted to the child and the vehicle, the child should be present during the inspection. (If there is an unborn child, technicians will review installation methods and proper usage of the seat.) Inspections take about 45 minutes and will be conducted at the Hamilton County Sheriff's Office Services Building.

During the inspection, the following will be reviewed with caregivers:

- Selection—is the car seat right for the child's height, weight, and development? Does it fit in the car? Is it easy to use correctly each and every time it is installed?
- Direction—should the child be forward or rear facing?
- Location—is the seat in the correct location in the car?
- Installation—is the seat secured correctly?
- Harnessing—is the child strapped in the seat securely?

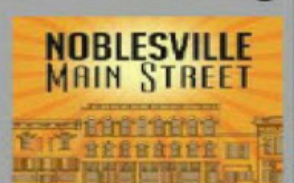

# Gigante to lead experienced group of Millers

There's never really a rebuilding year when it comes to the Noblesville girls golf team.

While the Millers have had some fantastic players come through their program over the years, the roster always seems to flow from one year to the next. No matter who graduates, a handful of other players always seem have enough to varsity experience to step into a leadership role when it's their turn.

This year, there are six returning varsity players for Noblesville. Leading the way will be Peyton Gigante, a senior. Miller coach Mike Abbott said that Gigante "will be our most experienced player" that is back from last season. Abbott said that Gigante has been one of their top players over the last couple of seasons; she was part of Noblesville's state qualifying team as a sophomore in 2013.

Gigante is an All-Hoosier Crossroads Conference player, and tied for third individually at sectionals last season. Another Noblesville sectional player returning is Sarah Hayes, who will be a sophomore. She is one of the returning varsity sophomores that Abbott listed, along with Brooke Gigante and Taylor Keating. Senior Melissa Baker also returns, along with junior Kayla Packard.

"I look for Sarah Hayes and Melissa Baker to also carry a big load this year," said Abbott.

Since Noblesville goes back to school on Monday, the Millers won't play their first tournament until Saturday, Aug. 8. That will be at the State Preview meet, which takes place at Carmel's Prairie View Golf Course. Prairie View is in its second year of a five-year deal to host the IHSAA state finals in both girls and boys golf.

"There's a lot of talent around the state and especially in the Hamilton County area," said Abbott.

Noblesville will see several of the other county teams more than once this season. The Millers take on Carmel Aug. 10 and Sept. 2, with Hamilton Southeastern also scheduled to be at the later meet. Noblesville will face the Royals again in an Aug. 25 meet at The Hawthornes, and of course at the Hoosier Crossroads Conference meet, set for Aug. 31 at Bear Slide.

"We're looking forward to competing this season and hopefully we can get back to the state finals in October," said Abbott.


