Groundbreaking ceremony on Monday for...

Beck's Aviation Hangar

Beck's Hybrids will host a groundbreaking ceremony for the first private aviation hangar to be built at the Indianapolis Executive Airport at 1 p.m. Monday.

The private hangar, which totals 19,000 square feet, is a major stepping stone in allowing the Atlanta-based Beck's to stay connected with their growing customer base and keep up with their rapid growth due to recent territory expansion. Beck's representatives at the event will include: Sonny Beck, CEO; Scott Beck, president; Tom Hooper, director of sales; and Dr. Kevin Cavanaugh, director of research. In addition, representatives from the Hamilton County Commissioners, Hamilton County Council, Hamilton County Airport Authority, and the Hamilton County Economic Development Corporation will be in attendance.

Beck's Aviation Hangar will serve as the first corporate hangar at Indianapolis Executive Airport, which is located at 11329 E. State Road 32 in Zionsville, but is owned by the Hamilton County Airport

Authority. The new hangar will provide 12,000 square feet of aircraft storage and 7,000 square feet of office space for pilots, aircraft mechanics, and other support staff. Beck's currently is the third largest corporate user of aviation fuel in the Indianapolis area and will benefit from having a fuel farm next to the hangar. In addition to the hangar itself, Beck's is constructing a new private parking lot, which will be a welcome addition to the Indianapolis Executive Airport.

Rooted in the belief that it is important for new and potential customers to see not just the product they are buying but the company behind it, the new hangar will make it possible for Beck's to continue showing prospective customers the Beck's experience at the Atlanta, Ind. headquarters. More than 90 percent of Beck's use of the aircrafts is for the benefit of their customers and prospective customers.

The long-awaited grand opening of Cabela's took place on Thursday. The outdoor superstore, located at 13725 Cabela Parkway in Hamilton Town Center, officially opened its doors to an eager public at 10 a.m. Some customers had been waiting in line since Wednesday to be among the first to check out the state's second Cabela's location (the first is in Hammond in Northwest Indiana). The first 500 customers in line received a Cabela's gift card valued up to \$500.

Westfield Police Detective Scott Clouse loses his battle with cancer

Detective Scott Clouse served the Westfield Police Department for 14 years. Clouse was hired as a patrolman, but quickly moved up the ranks until he was appointed detective. Scott Clouse passed away the early morning hours of August 17, 2015.

“Detective Clouse was committed to serving the citizens of Westfield,” says Joel Rush, Westfield Police Chief. “He was passionate about his job and he loved life. Detective Clouse will be remembered by our department as a hard worker, a dedicated officer and a friend.”

Through his work as a detective, Scott Clouse taught more than 100 parents and adults on how to prevent child sexual abuse. As detective he also presented the program Smart Steps, a body safety program, to nearly 5,000 children.

Detective Clouse battled lung cancer for more than three years. During that time he has been instrumental in raising money for Relay for Life of Westfield-Sheridan. Scott served as captain and co-captain of his team, Shamrockin’ for a Cure. In 2015, Shamrock-in’ for a Cure was able to raise nearly \$10,000.

“Detective Clouse brought people together,” explains Mayor Andy Cook. “He was able to raise thousands of dollars for Relay for Life just by engaging the community. Westfield lost a great detective, but also a great man who made a lasting impact on those he knew.”

Detective Clouse was a Hamilton County resident. He leaves behind a wife and a 13 year old daughter.

Detective Scott Clouse’s viewing and funeral will be held at Goodwin Funeral Home in Frankfort, Ind.



New Opponent: Mt. Vernon

Hamilton Heights and Mt. Vernon, down through the years, have slugged it out with some great games on the hardwood.

Now, Friday evening, the Huskies and the Marauders will meet on the gridiron in a season opener at Fortville.

It will be the first football meeting between two successful football programs.

Heights seems to always be successful. Coach Mitch Street's club is coming off a 9-3 season which ended in a 28-20 loss to Guerin Catholic in the championship game of the sectional.

Doug Armstrong turned around Mt. Vernon football when he became the head coach four years, going 5-5. Since that time the Marauders have gone 26-9 and three years ago won a sectional championship.

Heights lost a ton of talent from last year's team, led in scoring (120 points) by Grant Weatherford. Also gone is Jesse Kerfoot, who carried the football 100 times for a total of 688 yards.

But, typically of Heights football, Street's seems to have reloaded the guns.

In the running game, sophomore Jesse Brown returns after carrying the ball 43 times for 161 yards; junior Clayton Cowan with 156 yards in 41 carries, and senior Nathan Roth 52 carries for 256 yards.

The slinger at quarterback, senior Ethan Jones, last year passed for 1,208 yards and 14 touchdowns.

There's another Weatherford in the picture, junior Sterling Weatherford, a tight end and defensive back.

Brown caught 25 passes for 315 yards. Also returning is Riley White, who as a freshman had 12 receptions for 139 yards.

The Heights offensive line is huge and experienced with 265-pound senior Tyler Anderson, 255-pound senior Corbin Cook, 270-pound senior Clay Smith, 210-pound junior Zach Stevens and 235-pound senior Troy Bergesen.

The defense is big up front, too, with Anderson, Kinnaman, Cooke and 160-pound Nathan Roth.

Not so with Larry “Bud” Wright as the Sheridan coach enter the 2015 season seemly with as much energy and fire as he did his first season with the Blackhawks 50 years ago.

The Hall of Fame mentor, who is just eight wins away from reaching his announced goal of 400 victories, doesn’t appear to have any retirement plans.

On defense, sophomore Joe Callahan will start at inside linebacker, sophomore Hunter Pflugh at end, freshman Nick Burnell at safety and sophomores Gunner Williams and Brody Perry at corner. On offense, Perry will start at wide receiver, freshman Karl Whaley at center and Callahan at running back.

Can the Royals finally win?

Is it a jinx? Or, is it one outstanding football program game-after-game knocking off another outstanding football program?

Those questions will be on the table again tonight when Carmel comes to Hamilton Southeastern in one of the state’s most exciting high school football season openers.

In 1997, the Greyhounds and Royals met for the first time ever. HSE won a 15-7 thriller. Southeastern hasn’t defeated Carmel in a regular season football game since. In 2005, Southeastern beat Carmel, 17-7, in a sectional game.

Carmel, on its way to playing in the state title game (losing to Ben Davis), edged Southeastern 14-7 in a season opener last year. That Carmel team finished 13-1. That Southeastern team finished 4-6, the Royals’ first losing season since 1993.

Carmel has a new coach, former 11-year assistant John Hebert.

Hebert, unlike most Indiana coaches, has yet to see his Greyhounds take on another opponent.

“We scrimmaged ourselves,” Hebert explained. “We had a good night; highlights on both sides of the football.

“The offense was good,” Hebert continued. “Mike Viktrup threw a 40-yard pass to Ethan Merriweather and a TD pass to Jalen Walker.

“Sam Hipple and Nick Mazza were very good on defense.”

Viktrup, a senior, returns from last season during which he shared the QB with now-graduated Isaac James. As a junior,

Viktrup threw for 633 yards and six touchdowns and ran for 571 yards and seven touchdowns.

Walker was the second-leading receiver with 22 catches for 311 yards and Merriweather was third with 17 catches for 229 yards.

The big change in Carmel’s offense will be the running game were Tobias Watkins and Tony Vittrito, a pair of seniors, will move into starting spots at tailback and halfback. Watkins has experience, having carried 33 times for 198 yards and four touchdowns.

On the defensive side of the ball, Hebert has an outstanding linebacker in Noah Burks and an outstanding safety in Alex Akins. Those two led the Greyhounds in total defensive points last season.

Southeastern coach Scott May said he saw lots of good things in the Royals’ scrimmage.

“On offense,” said May, “we had a lot of guys get 10-yards-plus gains and we moved the ball well.

“Curtis Goss, Aaron Matio, Will Coudret, Greg Miller, Will Michalis and Alec Jessop all had big gains. Carter Poiry did a good job running the show at quarterback. I think we have enough guys making plays on offense it will be hard to key on any one guy,” May added.

“The defense looked fast to the ball,” May continued. “Collin Miller stands out with a great first step. Just Volskuhl looked good at inside linebacker. I was pleased with the play of Grant Skelton, Justin Nadh and Johnny May at outside linebacker. May had two hurries and a sack. Brock Burns led the secondary; Michalis had a pick and

Chinn didn't have a varsity carry last year. Huddleston had 10.




