Redistricting reform forum scheduled for Oct. 14

A public forum on a topic of particular interest to Hamilton County is set for October 14. The topic is redistricting reform, something in which the general public usually shows very little interest, but should. The political people show a lot of interest in redistricting because it can determine their party's future in office.

The County League of Women Voters and Common Cause are co-sponsoring the forum at the Noblesville Public Library at 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday the 14th. The event may help focus some

interest on the subject which is so often overlooked by voters who realize its consequences only when they find they have a new state representative or state senator.

Hamilton County has been a victim of gerrymandering for years. The county is divided among 10 state legislative districts which were drawn in 2011. Several of these districts were drawn to help Republican candidates in neighboring counties. Democrats do the same thing, only in reverse, when they are in charge of redistricting.

Since Hamilton County produces an overwhelming plurality of Republican votes, the GOP always wants to maximize this advantage while Democrats want to minimize it. So, areas of Democrat votes are added in one place or Republican votes subtracted from another'

In either case the outcome is not necessarily good for the citizen who may find himself in a district with, for example, a Marion County senator or a Boone County representative. That legislator may or may not have the best interests of this county at the top of his priority list.

So, some groups and a few legislators are pushing for redistricting reform. A legislative interim study committee is currently at work seeking to suggest a remedy for the current situation which oddly enough became the norm after the U.S. Supreme Court rendered its 'One Man, One Vote' ruling decades ago. Previous to that, districts were largely drawn along county lines, not often changed and often varied greatly in population.

Westfield man dies due to crash injuries

A Westfield man has succumbed to injuries he received in a motor vehicle crash in Noblesville last week.

Jack J. Spears Jr., 31, Westfield passed away on Wednesday at IU Health Methodist in Indianapolis. Spears was involved in an accident during the evening of Sept. 26 at 156th Street and Boden Road.

Based on witness statements and evidence at the scene, it appears that a 2012 Honda Civic was traveling west-bound on 156th Street when it pulled out into the path of a 2003 Kawasaki motorcycle that was traveling south-bound on Boden Road. At this particular intersection, 156th Street is regulated by stop signs and Boden Road traffic has none.

The driver of the Honda was identified as Andy C. Coy, 18, from Fishers, IN. The driver was transported by ground ambulance to St. Vincent (Fishers). The front seat passenger, 17-year-old from Noblesville, was also transported by ground ambulance to St. Vincent (Fishers). Both front seat occupants appeared to suffer minor injuries. A third passenger, a 16-year-old from Fishers, was treated and released at the scene.

There were no additional occupants on the motorcycle. The crash remains an ongoing investigation.

Noblesville unveils Riverwalk Depot Pocket Park

Noblesville officials unveiled the creation of Riverwalk Depot, the city's first pocket park, on Friday, Oct. 2. Using an irregular piece of vacant land, the Depot is a placemaking and beautification initiative in Downtown Noblesville.

Previously a gravel lot and a turnaround zone for utility trucks near the Duke Energy substation and Bolden's Dry Cleaners, this 0.15-acre parcel now serves as a trailhead for the intersection of the White River Greenway and the Riverwalk.

"This pocket park will create another unique Downtown Noblesville spot and continues the overall growth of quality of life amenities to the downtown area," Noblesville Mayor John Ditslear said.

Now census figures are used every 10 years to carefully and politically create districts with equal populations even if the dividing lines run along a city street or

creek bank. This runs contrary to guidelines which call for legislative districts to represent a "community of interest" which generally means not gerrymandering.

The design of the park is to integrate art with function. Riverwalk Depot will include a walking pathway, a covered bench and two specific components to increase the functionality for cyclists, including a bicycle repair station. The centerpiece of the area is a one of a kind 9-foot tall and 12-feet long metal sculpture of a large train engine that also serves as a bicycle rack. The locomotive was designed and fabricated by lifelong resident Rick Heflin, owner of RC Metalworks in downtown Noblesville.

"I was proud to do it for Noblesville," said Heflin. "My dream for that is for families to be able to come up to it every year and have age photos taken (annually). I'd love to see that become a tradition because the train is photogenic."

The amenity comes at no additional cost to taxpayers. Riverwalk Depot was made possible through the generous in-kind donations from area businesses including: Sagamore Ready Mix, Duke Energy, The Duke Energy Foundation, Beaver Materi-

als, Green Vista Landscaping, Ameri-Turf Indiana, GreenCycle of Noblesville, Lowe's of Noblesville, CSI Signs, RC Metalworks, Hamilton County Master Gardeners and Noblesville Main Street.

The project was a collaboration of several city departments – including 319 man hours by street department employees – and led by Economic Development Specialist Alaina Shonkwiler.

"Riverwalk Depot was designed to beautify and revitalize a blighted trailhead adjacent to the Nickel Plate Railroad and a major intersection of the Noblesville Trail System," said Shonkwiler. "The collaboration has been amazing. It was a true design and build."

Shonkwiler said Riverwalk Depot will have two additional benches and a picnic table installed by the spring.

"This is more than I ever envisioned it to be," she said. "I love that the public can use this space now. We can get people in here and enjoy it."

May: "It was just a weird game"

# Royals hold off Millers, 20-12

Hamilton Southeastern's 2015 Homecoming football game will not be forgotten any time soon.

In a rainy, strange and at times scary Friday evening, the Royals held off a spirited Noblesville team 20-12. The Millers, despite losing quarterback Luke Melloh to an injury in the third quarter, played determined against Hoosier Crossroads Conference leading Southeastern, but a late touchdown by HSE's star running back Aaron Matio sealed the win.

"It was just a weird game," said Royals coach Scott May. "We never really got going. I thought they did a good job defensively, and they struggled a little bit offensively, but so did we. It was just kind of a defensive battle."

Southeastern clinched at least a share of the HCC title with its win. The Royals are now 5-0 in league play.

After a scoreless first quarter, HSE got on the board with David Tsetse making a seven-yard run into the end zone. That was followed by several trades of possession, but Noblesville made its move with 1:16 left in the half. Melloh and Jarel Youree took turns running the ball from the Royals' 42 to the 3, and that's where Youree scored from. His score came with 14 seconds left in the half.

Southeastern pulled back ahead in the third quarter, when a resolute drive ended with a five-yard touchdown run by Matio. The Millers were hoping to respond, but that became secondary after Melloh was injured in the third quarter.

"He's good," said NHS coach Lance Scheib. "Our hearts and thoughts and prayers go out to him."

McGwire Plumer stepped into the quarterback position after Melloh's injury.

"I thought for a young man that's not ever been a quarterback on a Friday night, I thought he played fantastic," said Scheib.

Noblesville closed the gap in the early stages of the fourth quarter, with Youree running in from 23 yards to score. That cut HSE's lead to 14-12. The Millers then held the Royals to a three-and-out, but HSE got the ball back on an interception.

Southeastern started its next possession from its own 3, and made its way down to midfield. Once at the Royals 49, Matio zoomed into score from there, a 51-yard touchdown with 2:25 left. Noblesville's last possession resulted in a turnover on downs, and Matio got one more first down to ensure HSE's win.

Matio totaled 143 yards in 21 carries, including the two touchdowns. While those are good numbers, May was unhappy about his team's nine penalties, which totaled 83 yards.

"It seemed like every time we did something good, we were going backwards," said May. Like I told the kids afterwards, we got to look at the film and we got to clean some things up."

But in the end?

"It's a win, and that's what we're looking for right now, is to keep winning," said May.

Youree led Noblesville with his two touchdowns, part of a 159-yard rushing night. The Millers dropped to 3-4 after the loss, but Scheib thinks his team is better than that record says.

"It's the story of our year," said Scheib. "We're there, we can't find a way to get over the hump. We're a really good football team, and to be 3-4 right now is something that's disappointing, because we're better than 3-4. But we're playing great football. We've got to find a way to get over the hump and make plays, and that starts as we move forward with Brownsburg."

The Royals host Columbus Hartley next week, while Noblesville, which is now 1-3 in conference play, hosts Brownsburg.
