## Benghazi hearings put Rep. Brooks in the spotlight

Hamilton County's congresswoman, Susan Brooks, got a lot of what political reporters call "face time" on national TV this week as a member of the U.S House committee investigating the Benghazi attack on the American diplomatic compound in Libya. In that terrorist attack Ambassador Chris Stevens and three other American foreign service officers were killed.

Rep. Brooks was a good choice to have on the committee questioning former Secretary of State Hillary



Clinton who knew or maybe didn't know or maybe should have known about the attack. In the first place having a woman asking tough questions does not make it look so much like the "old boys" beating up on poor Hillary.

More important is the fact that Brooks has a pleasant demeanor to go with her well-versed legal background. She was U.S. Attorney for Indiana's Southern District under President George W. Bush. She knows how to ask intelligent questions in order to get revealing answers.

The congresswoman offered a hint of new information in the current investigation when she said the committee has found evidence that gives "a bit clearer picture about what the secretary (Clinton) knew prior to the attack."

Brooks and her family live in the Carmel area, and is the first county resident to hold the 5th District Congressional seat since Richard Roudebush in the 1960s. In informal conversation she is a delight to talk with. This writer was fortunate to be able to visit with her in her Capitol Hill office two years ago.

Rep. Brooks should have a bright future in public life if she chooses to pursue higher office. There has already been speculation that she would make the best Republican candidate for U.S. Senate in 2018.

And, regardless of the outcome of the current hearings on the Benghazi tragedy, she will come to the attention of the all-important national news media and political party leaders.

## Allegient, Market District to add jobs

A Carmel-based information technology service company is growing again.

Inside Indiana Business reported on Friday that Allegient is looking to hire 70 people by the year 2018. The company's CEO Greg Gallant told IIB that it is experiencing an "explosion in demand for services" and plans to increase the size of its headquarters as well.

This is the third time in four years that Allegient has announced that it plans to add jobs. It made plans in the summer of 2011 to add 42 positions within five years, then revealed another expansion of jobs and its headquarters in 2013.

Allegient, which is located at 201 W. 103rd St., has "over 200 consultants," according to its Web site.

Meanwhile, the just-opened Market District at 11505 Illinois St. is looking for more employees.

The supermarket is conducting a Fall Hiring Event from 1 to 7 p.m. Tuesday at the Illinois St. location. This comes not too long after the company's summer hiring fair. Market District has a wide range of job openings, from servers and dishwashers, to bakers and cake decorators. The company has many benefits to offer as well, including a "\$400 sign-on bonus, and what it calls "generous wages" with three possible pay increases over the course of a year.

## Save-A-Life campaign

The Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) and the Road Construction Awareness Corporation (RCAC) are partnering to install new signs on interstate highways to raise awareness among motorists about safe driving in work zones.

The 8-foot by 15-foot orange panel signs remind motorists to "Slow Down, Save A Life" because "We Are All In This Together." Safety is the top priority of Indiana's highway workers, and they need all drivers' full cooperation to make work zones safe for everyone.

The signs are being installed beginning this month at entry points to the state and approaching major interstate construction projects. By next year, RCAC anticipates having 16 signs installed throughout Indiana. The group is also announcing plans to grow the "Save-A-Life" campaign by displaying smaller replicas of the signs on industry vehicles. The vehicle magnet signs will be placed on the tailgates of INDOT, contractor and supplier company vehicles throughout the state. All expenses associated with the "Save-A-Life" campaign are funded by donations to RCAC.

### About RCAC

The Road Construction Awareness Corporation is a non-profit organization dedicated to providing the transportation construction industry and the general public with information to improve motorist, worker and pedestrian safety in roadway work zones. The group was founded by highway workers mourning the loss of two co-workers killed by a work zone crash on I-69 last year.

RCAC is a coalition of contractors and other industry workers throughout Indiana. RCAC's motto is "We Are All In This Together" thus bringing together workers and their families, organizations, contractors and the motoring public. # Carmel holds on, advances to championship

While only one team can advance in an IHSAA football post-season game, both Carmel and Noblesville had reasons to leave the field with their heads held high after Friday's game between the two teams at Carmel Stadium.

The Greyhounds got off to a big half-time lead, then held on during a furious comeback by the Millers to win 45-29, and thus advance to next Friday's Class 6A Sectional 4 championship. Carmel will host Fishers in a re-match of last year's sectional final.

Noblesville, meanwhile, showed an immense amount of pride to lift itself up from being down 31-0 and cause a few nervous moments for the 'Hounds in the fourth quarter. The Millers got as close as 31-15, but two big fourth-quarter scores by Carmel allowed it enough breathing room to hang on.

"You're going against their best, and Noblesville's got a lot of pride," said Greyhounds coach John Hebert. "They do really good things. That proves it, I think, the way they were able to move the ball on us there at the end. For us, I think we just need to keep in mind that half the teams in 6A are now turning in their equipment on Monday and we're not one of them. We feel pretty fortunate about that."

Carmel cruised through the first half, leading 24-0 at the break. Nick Stacy started the scoring with a field goal, then Michael Viktrup hit Jalen Walker for a 33-yard touchdown late in the first period. Tobias Watkins scored a pair of touchdowns in the second quarter on nice runs.

Stephen Watts increased Carmel's lead to 31-0 early in the third quarter with a five-yard touchdown score. Noblesville got on the board midway through the period, when McGwire Plumer found JD Scheib, and the result was an 18-yard touchdown reception.

The Millers recovered a fumble to open the fourth quarter, and made the most of it. Jarel Youree eventually scored on a three-

yard run, then Plumer found Scheib again, this time for a two-point conversion.

Carmel quickly responded, as Jake McDonald threw a 49-yard passing touchdown to Jarrod Redifer. McDonald came in for Viktrup in the fourth period; Hebert said several of the Greyhound players were banged up after going through a tough regular season in the Metropolitan Conference.

Noblesville marched down the field, in a remarkable drive that featured eight consecutive pass completions by Plumer. Stretching the use of the hurry-up offense to the limit, Plumer moved the ball down to

the Carmel one-yard line, and Chandler Hurst took it in to score from there.

"It's what we expected," said Noblesville coach Lance Scheib. "It's what our parents have raised these kids to do, what coaches have done as far as coaching, and that is not to give up, and never, ever, ever quit."

The Millers then recovered an onside kick with 3:51 left, but had to absorb a pair of penalties before they could get going. They got to the Carmel 31, but the Greyhounds' Jack Van Remortel stepped in and

intercepted a pass. He wound up taking it 88 yards to score.

Noblesville went down fighting, though. Plumer again used the short quick passes to get the ball down to the Carmel 1, and then ran the ball in. In those two big scoring drives, the junior Plumer - who was thrust into the quarterback position after Luke Melloh suffered a season-ending injury - gave Miller fans a glimpse of the future, and loads of potential for next season. Plumer passed for 318 yards in the game.

"The biggest thing is we proved that when we play 48 minutes, we're a really good football team," said Scheib. "And we proved when we don't, we're very amateur. And if you look at all of our games, when we play 48 minutes, we're in the game or won the game. And when we didn't, it didn't go well. And so that's the one thing that I think our kids will take from this year, is that when we play for 48 minutes, we can play at a very high level."

Viktrup was 11-of-19 for 150 yards, while Tobias Watkins rushed 12 times for 80 yards, including his two touchdowns. Now Carmel prepares for Fishers.

"By now, we know who we are, and we know it's not going to be easy," said Hebert.

# Tigers win, 38-22

In a regular season battle on Sept. 11, Fishers lost a big first half lead and eventually fell to city-rival Hamilton Southeastern, 39-33.

Last evening at Reynolds Tiger Stadium, Coach Rick Wimmer's Tigers turned the table on HSE, again leading at halftime and this time rumbling on to a 38-22 victory.

Fishers now will face Carmel at Carmel next week in the championship game of Class 6A, Sectional 4

"We executed better in the second half tonight," Wimmer said. "In the second half of our first game with Southeastern we didn't execute in the second half and we didn't tackle in the second half."

Fishers broke out to a 24-7 first half advantage and then fought Southeastern on even terms the rest of the way.

Coach Scott May's Royals had won eight straight games and had captured the Hoosier Crossroads Conference championship since falling to Carmel in a season opener.

But on this night, as the playoffs opened, Southeastern couldn't slow Fishers' running attack, aided by a good aerial show.

Keyed by a terrific night from Jeremy Chinn, Fishers ran the pigskin for 328 yards. Chinn had 18 carries for 168 yards and Trevor Newman carried 83 times for 92 yards. Jermaine Huddleston added 66 yards and scored a touchdown and also scoring on the ground for Fishers was quarterback Zach Eaton.

"Our offensive line was outstanding, simply outstanding," said Wimmer. "And our backs ran well.

Eaton also hit on 11-of-21 passes for 177 yards and a touchdown. Keyshawn Burrell, back from an injury, caught seven passes for 94 yards and two touchdowns and Kade Orris also caught a TD pass.

"Our passing game allowed us to run the football," Wimmer said. "That's the kind of team we are. That's what we have to do to be effective."

Southeastern ran for 132 yards and Carter Poiry completed 16-of-23 passes for 202 yards on a good offensive night by the Royals. On the ground, Aaron Matio carried 12 times for 80 yards. Through the air, Poiry connected seven times with Greg Miller for 67 yards.

But, the Fishers defense kept HSE's fearful passing game out of the end zone. Poiry scored a pair of touchdowns rushing the ball and David Tsetse also ran for a TD.

Wimmer praised his defense.

"Chinn, (R.J.) Potts and (Jalen) Moss did a great job defending," Wimmer said. "Shawn Taylor played well and someone told me that (Jake) Winkle had three sacks."

A fumble recovery by Moss got Fishers going. Chinn had a 40-yard run and with 8:27 left in the opening quarter Huddleston ran 20 yards for the TD. Ben Norton kicked the extra point and then before the quarter ended Norton booted a 23-yard field goal.

A key fourth down pass from Eaton to DeVonte Adams to the one-yard line enabled Fishers to score first in the second quarter. Eaton finished the drive with a quarterback keeper.

Trailing 17-0, Southeastern got into the scoring column. Poiry hit Matio on a 51-yard gain and then finished the drive with a two-yard quarterback keeper.

Fishers came right back. Chinn ran for 30 yards and then the Tigers executed a trick play. Chinn took a handoff and flipped to Potts on what looked like a reverse. Potts then flipped the ball back to Eaton who found Kade Orris wide open for 23 yards and a touchdown.

That enabled Fishers to go to halftime with a 24-7 lead.

Southeastern, just as the Royals did in the regular season game, came out hot to open the second half. Poiry found Greg Miller on a third down to keep a drive open and then David Tsetse found the end zone from 15 yards out.

Again, Fishers bounced right back. Chinn ran for 39 yards and Eaton converted on fourth down. The Royals had two big stops inside the five, but Eaton found Burrell for eight yards and the TD

The Tigers stopped a Royal drive late in the quarter with a sack from Steven Chakiry.

Fishers' last touchdown came with 8:16 left in the game. Eaton found Burrell for his second touchdown of the evening.

The Royals tried to come back, but didn't score in the period until Poiry went 13 yards into the end zone with just 1:41 remaining.

On the onside kick, Brenden Toungeate covered the ball for the Tigers and Huddleston ran for a first down that finished the game.

As for the Golden Eagles' first-round game, they were in control the entire time against the Tiger Cubs. Guerin Catholic led 34-0 at halftime and scored at least two touchdowns in every quarter. Thomas Kaser reached the end zone the most, with three touchdowns in the second half.

Carter McGinnis scored a pair of TDs in the first half, including a 56-yard run in the first quarter that put GC on the board. Brennan Thieneman, Dawson McMahon, Sam McDaniel and Charles Bock all scored once. All but one of Guerin's touchdowns were rushing scores. The only exception was Arion Shinaver's 57-yard punt return in the second period. Caleb Quick made all seven of his extra point attempts.

McGinnis led the rushing list, with 173 yards in just 10 carries. Elliott Charlebois had an efficient night, too: The quarterback was 6-of-8 for 86 yards. Shinaver caught the most receptions, with four for 66 yards.


