Nevitt to retire from Historical Society

The Hamilton County Historical Society's museum director Diane Nevitt received well-deserved recognition Sunday as she prepares to retire at the end of December. The historical society honored her at their annual meeting. She has served more than 16 years as director. Susan Lucas has been named to take over the position on an interim basis until a fulltime director is named.
The museum at 810 Conner Street, Noblesville, is the former



county jail and sheriff's residence which served the county for more than a century and remains county property. It is leased to the historical society which maintains a large collection of historical furnishings, artifacts and printed materials.
During her years as director Mrs. Nevitt has accepted, categorized and arranged displays for hundreds of items. The museum's resource library has an estimated 600 to 800 items of county historical interest. As director Nevitt has also led hundreds of school students on tours of the museum.
She says she will continue to assist as a volunteer after the first of the year. The restoration of the building is still not complete. The cellblock area is planned for

restoration with a part of it set aside for a meeting room in the society's long-term development plan.
The building, located on the Courthouse Square, is actually slightly older than the courthouse. It has housed such notorious figures as Charles Manson, D.C. Stephenson and William Dudley Pelley. For most of its life the structure included comfortable living quarters for the county sheriff and his family.
The last inmates left the jail in 1977 when a new facility was completed on Cumberland Road.
The museum is open to the public at no charge on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays. Special tours can be arranged by appointment.

Noblesville man injured in Wednesday afternoon crash

A Noblesville man was injured following a personal injury crash north of Noblesville Wednesday afternoon. The crash occurred shortly around 4:15 p.m. near the intersection of State Road 27 and 211th Street, north of Noblesville. Deputies were dispatched to the area on the report of a vehicle in a ditch against a tree. Upon arriving, deputies found a gray Chevrolet Silverado against a tree. The driver of the vehicle, identified as Robert C. Reed, 47, Noblesville, was transported by air ambulance to Methodist Hospital after being extricated from the truck. According to an initial report, Mr. Reed sustained

what were reported as incapacitating injuries including bleeding. No further information on Mr. Reed's injuries or condition was available at the time of this release.
Witnesses at the crash scene stated they observed the Silverado northbound on State Road 37 at what they believed was a high rate of speed and moving into oncoming traffic. It was reported that prior to the crash the vehicle had been involved in four other property damage crashes including striking two vehicles near State Road 37 and 191st Street (reports taken by Noblesville Police) and hitting two more vehicles at State Road 37 and Promise Road. The Silverado then continued northbound before crossing the centerline, going off the road, and hitting a tree south of 211th Street on State Road 37.
Mr. Reed, the driver of the Silverado, was the only person injured in the series of crashes and all other vehicles were driven away from the scene. Deputies are investigating possible medical issues or an illness that may have led to the crash. Anyone with information on the crash may contact the Sheriff's Office at 317-773-1282.

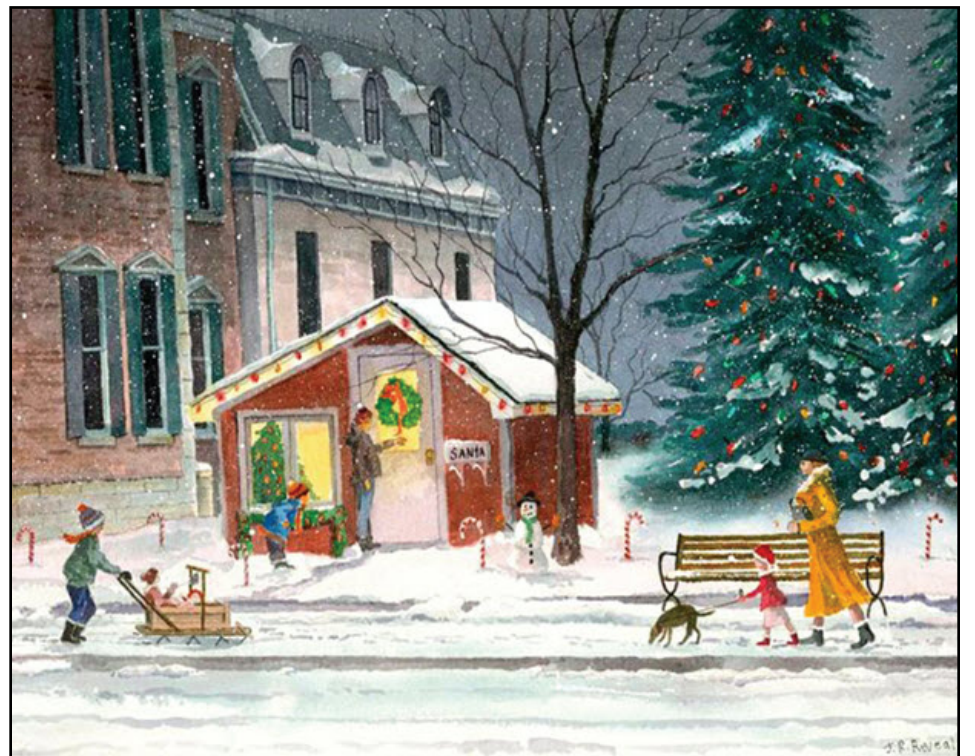

Millers, Indians to resume rivalry....

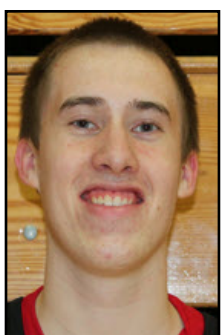
No Wigwam, this time

When Noblesville basketball fans think about rivalries their thoughts usually stay here in Hamilton County. Maybe Carmel. Maybe Hamilton Southeastern or Fishers. Maybe Westfield.

Just in time for the Noblesville-Anderson regular season rivalry to resume. That

But, one of the hottest rivals for the Millers the last 20 years or so has been Anderson. The Indians. The Tribe. Remember all the great stars and great teams from Anderson which have taken on the Millers?

The last time was in 2011-12 when Anderson defeated Noblesville 58-51. Before that, the Millers had licked the Tribe in three consecutive close contests.

It has been four years since Noblesville and Anderson met.

The rivalry has died, a little. No more Wigwam to visit. The once great home of the Indians is no more.

Noblesville and Anderson no longer play in the same regional. Now, they play in the same sectional.

For the first time, Anderson (and Guerin Catholic) will replace North Central and Zionsville in the sectional which will be played at Noblesville.

will happen Saturday at Anderson. Not at the old Wigwam. Those days are gone forever. This game will be played at what once was known as Madison Heights High School, now Anderson High School.

Noblesville is idle Friday evening. Anderson will play Tech.

"Anderson will be another challenging opponent for us," said Miller coach Brian

McCauley, who battled the Indians while coaching at Kokomo in North Central Conference play.

"Anderson had a very good win over Pendleton Heights at home and played Lapel and New Castle very tough on the road. Anderson has outstanding athleticism and skill."

Anderson has Dione Raines and Kobe Clay. A 6-2 senior Raomes is averaging 18 points a game. Clay, a 6-5 senior, is scoring at a 12 point clip.

In Anderson's first three games the Tribe has beaten Pendleton Heights 60-51 while losing close fights against Lapel 49-48 and New Castle 64-54.

A record kind of like Noblesville. The Millers have defeated Northwest 71-49 and lost close fights with Fishers 58-54 and Carmel 49-45.

Noblesville's most feared weapon is John Kiser, who is averaging 23.5 points a

game. Also in double figures, at 11.5, is junior Corby Mertens. Junior Max Flinchum is scoring at an 8.5 clip

"We'll need to continue to improve from our first three games," McCauley continued. "We need to continue to improve defensively, in rebounding, and our overall consistency,


