Steve still running

Hamilton County Commissioner Steve Dillinger announced yesterday that he will seek re-election in the May 3rd Republican primary. The 27-year officeholder will be running for an eighth term, a record in modern Indiana political history.

Dillinger formally revealed his decision at a fundraising luncheon at the Oak Hill Mansion in Carmel. The announcement had been anticipated, but unofficial until yesterday.

The candidate is a lifelong county resident, living in Noblesville with

his wife, Renee. Dillinger has two adult daughters. He has spent his working career in the field of insurance sales and financial consulting.

The incumbent commissioner said a principal part of his decision to run again is his desire to see pending county projects through to completion. Those projects include the recently announced rebuilding of State Road 37, construction of a police and fire training center and building a bypass of Noblesville's congested downtown area.

During Dillinger's years in office the county administration has updated most county infrastructure and facilities including construction of the Government and Judicial Center, the current county jail, juvenile center and work release center, provided a Emergency 911 Communications Center, built three major bridges over White River, upgraded the county 4-H Grounds, expanded the park

system, expanded Riverview Hospital and enacted zoning for unincorporated areas.

Dillinger is proud of the fact that the county has been named by Forbes magazine as a best place to live and raise a family in the entire country.

"I have been encouraged to run by many citizens and community leaders. I greatly appreciate the confidence that citizens have placed in me. It has been an honor serve," Dillinger said. Thus far there has been no opponent announce plans to challenge the seven-term commissioner who represents District 2 on the three member Board of Commissioners.

Fellow commissioner Mark Heirbrandt will also be up for election in May and is expected to seek a second term from District 3.

Senior Citizens, County sign year to year building lease

The Noblesville Senior Citizens recycling center, now closed due to decreasing revenue, will be turned over to the County Sheriff's Department for storage or other needs. On a year to year lease the Senior Citizens will retain the meeting and office portion of the building at 18336 Cumberland Road that has been home to the organization for nearly 40 years.

The property, composed of just over two acres, is owned by Hamilton County and may become needed for expansion of the Sheriff's Department jail and corrections complex located south of the Senior Citizens facility. In a meeting of Senior Citizens and county commissioners Monday agreement was reached that the organization will keep their main meeting facility on an annual lease basis.

If needed in the future by the county, commissioners agreed to assist in finding a new location for the social organization which offers a gathering place for area seniors. It is open Monday through Friday to any county resident 55 and over, and has been regarded as a success for many years. The seniors' recycling service however was not showing a profit and was closed yesterday.

Convenience stores also allow victims a discreet way to get help as other customers will likely assume they are there to shop."

As construction nears completion...

US 31 traffic shifts, delays in Carmel

US 31 traffic should be alert and anticipate added delays between I-465 and 131st Street as crews implement traffic pattern changes and pavement marking adjustments today, Dec. 15, through Thursday, Dec. 17.

- Northbound and southbound US 31 may be restricted to one lane in each direction while pavement markings are adjusted during daytime/evening hours.
- Northbound US 31 traffic will shift onto new bridges over 106th and 116th streets tomorrow, Dec. 16. Southbound traffic is anticipated to make a similar shift on Thursday, Dec. 17. These traffic shifts will open the freeway to three lanes in each direction and effectively remove the final two traffic signals from US 31 through Carmel.
- After the traffic shift on Dec. 16, motorists wishing to access 106th Street from northbound US 31 must do so via the new exit ramp just north of I-465.
- Drivers headed to I-465 from southbound US 31 will use the new ramp over 106th Street.

Both the eastbound and westbound I-465 exit ramps to northbound US 31 and southbound Meridian Street are anticipated to be widened to two lanes at the end of this week.

All ramps at the I-465/US 31 interchange, including two new free-flowing ramps from I-465 to northbound US 31, are anticipated to be open to traffic and in their final configurations by the end of the year.

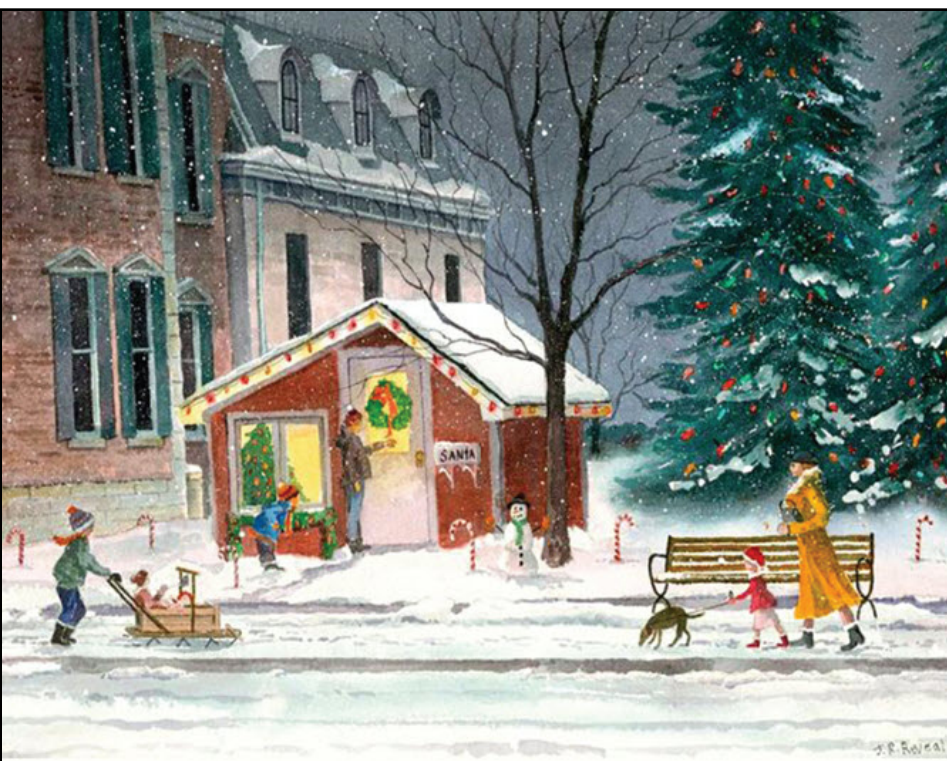

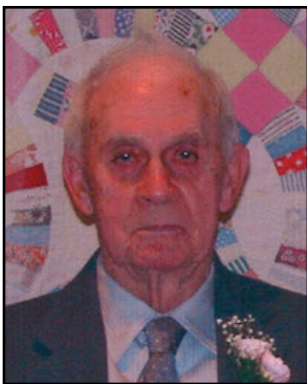

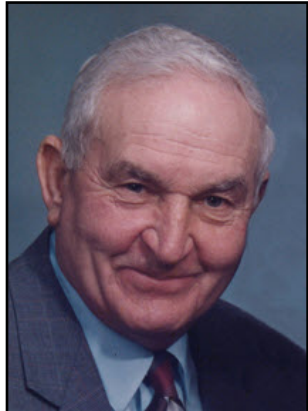

Donna gets 200th win....

Millers await Westfield

Noblesville's Lady Millers, playing in The Mill Tuesday evening against a not-too-good Anderson squad, did what good teams, what great teams do.

They went on and beat the feathers off the Indians, 79-50.

It could have been worse. Coach Donna Buckley, with Noblesville leading 59-34 after three quarters, cleared her bench. Even then the Millers outscored Anderson 20-16, in the final period.

Buckley came away with some honors. Earlier in the season she gained her 100th win as a Noblesville coach. Last night she gained career win No. 200.

Her basketball team, now 11-2, could have been looking ahead. On Saturday, at The Rock in Westfield, the Millers will face Westfield, a team that has only lost once this season.

But, if Noblesville was looking ahead, the Lady Millers didn't show it.

Sparked by a pair of 3-pointers and eight points from Brooke Herron and nine points from Alexis Shannon, Noblesville rolled to a 22-12 first quarter lead and never looked back.

Shannon led Noblesville with 25 points; Herron finished with 17, and Katelyn O'Reilly added 13 points.

Noblesville hit 26-of-49 shots.

O'Reilly led Noblesville with seven rebounds.

"We had a good third quarter, at both ends of the court," said Buckley. "That's when we put them away."

With Shannon and O'Reilly each exploding for 10 points, Noblesville outscored Anderson 27-13 in the period.

So, now comes Westfield, which is ranked No. 11 in the state. Noblesville is ranked No. 12.

"Westfield is very good," Buckley said. "They are an experienced team. We'll have to box out and not give up second chance points."


Both tallied double-doubles. Reed pulled in a dozen rebounds and Welch collected 10.

Dean Treanor returns as Indianapolis Indians manager

The Indianapolis Indians announced today the return of Dean Treanor as manager for the 2016 season. It will be his sixth campaign leading the Tribe. Also returning on Treanor's staff will be Pitching Coach Stan Kyles and Hitting Coach Butch Wynegar.

In the Indians' 113-year history Treanor is just the fifth skipper to pilot the club through at least five campaigns – the only one with five straight winning seasons. He ranks fourth in wins (405), and owns the best winning percentage among the Tribe's 400-win club (.557). Next season will be Treanor's 29th as a minor league instructor. He owns a lifetime managerial record of 906-872 through 13 seasons (regular season), including finishing first or second in the standings in nine of the last 10 years.

Last season was the start of Kyles' second stint with Indianapolis. He was also the Indians pitching coach in 2004, and last season marked his 25th of overall professional instruction. The Tribe staff posted an International League-best 3.09 ERA in 2015.

Last season was Wynegar's first on the Indianapolis coaching staff, and he helped the offense to the league's third-best team batting average and most stolen bases. The

upcoming season will be Wynegar's 22nd of professional instruction.

"It will be great to have Dean Treanor back for his sixth year as our manager in 2016," said Cal Bureson, Indianapolis Indians vice president of baseball and administrative affairs. "Dean's leadership is a big reason behind the fact that the Indianapolis Indians are the only team in the International League to finish over .500 each of the last five seasons."

Indianapolis posted an 83-61 record in 2015, which was tied for the best in the IL. The Indians swept Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, three-games-to-none, in the first round of the playoffs before losing the fifth and deciding game of the league's Governors' Cup championship series against Columbus.

Indianapolis has been the Pittsburgh Pirate's Triple-A affiliate since 2005. The Indians have qualified for the postseason and won at least 80 games in three of the last four years, and is the only IL team to post a winning record in each of the past five years – seven times in 11 seasons since joining with Pittsburgh. On October 27, the Indians and Pirates announced a joint four-year player development contract extension that runs through the 2020 season.

"In 2016, as we celebrate the historic 100th Running of the Indianapolis 500 Mile Race, it's fitting that the world's best pilots will gather at IMS for a breathtaking display of competition and innovation that will honor the legacies of IMS founder Carl Fisher, the Wright brothers and their fellow aviation pioneers."

"Red Bull Air Race is looking forward to partnering with the Indianapolis Motor Speedway in 2016 and bringing the race to the fans," said Erich Wolf, General Manager at Red Bull Air Race GmbH. "IMS is a perfect location for the Red Bull Air Race due to its motorsport and aviation history and presence and we cannot wait to bring our sport to the skies above the track."

The Red Bull Air Race World Championships is the ultimate motorsports competition in the sky and takes place with eight races across four continents. The objective is to navigate an aerial racetrack featuring air-filled pylons in the fastest possible time while incurring as few penalties as possible.

The race at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway will be the seventh race of the season, in between stops at Lausitzring, Germany, and Las Vegas, Nev. It will award 12 world championship points to the winner.

Each Red Bull Air Race consists of the following flying sessions: Training, Qualifying, Round of 14, Round of 8 and Final 4. In all sessions, only one pilot races in the track at a time. Training at IMS will take place on Sept. 29-30, followed by a single day dedicated to two qualifying competitions on Oct 1. Race Day on Oct. 2 will consist of Round of 14, Round of 8 and Final 4 competitions. Competitors regularly reach speeds of nearly 230 mph.

Today's announcement adds an impressive new chapter to the IMS aviation legacy. The first race held at IMS was also the first national balloon race, in 1909, the same year the world's first air race took place in Reims, France. In 1910, IMS hosted the nation's first licensed aviation meet, with pilot Walter Brookins breaking the world altitude record. The Speedway also served as a military aviation and refueling depot during World War I.

"Aviation has always been an influential and fascinating piece of our track's history," said Donald Davidson, IMS historian. "Today's announcement pays tribute to this piece of our legacy and brings an exciting new event to our schedule."
