Kenley talks about community college....

Senator eyes Ivy Tech

Kenley

Ivy Tech Community College, which has a campus in Noblesville, has been turned down on a request for building funds.

Ivy Tech, in July, was the only Indiana public college that didn't receive money for any major building projects in the state's two year bud-

State officials are reviewing Ivy Tech because of low graduation rates.

"One of the best ways to get the attention of colleges is to turn down building requests," State Senator Luke Kenley told the Hamilton County Reporter in a Saturday tele-

phone interview from his Noblesville home. Kenley is the chairman of the Senate Appropriations

Committee and the leading state budget writer.

What Kenley and other state officials are concerned with is the drop in enrollment and the low graduation rate

Kenley's thoughts on 37

Senator Luke Kenley, in an interview with the Hamilton County Reporter, said, "There is no such thing as 'phase II' in the \$100 million the state has given to the proposed Indiana 37 Corridor.

"There is no guarantee that the money will be available for Noblesville at a later date," Kenley said.

for Ivy Tech. Enrollment has dropped 25 percent while graduation rates within the two years has fallen to about 5 percent. About 26 percent have graduated within the sixyear program.

"There originally was a big push for the middle type students wanting to learn a skill or even get a degree," Kenley said. "Ivy Tech was there for those needs."

Kenley said the state is stepping back and asking that a the position. study be done.

"Their growth has been so rapid that they haven't been able to all focus in the right direction," Kenley added.

Kenley was the key person for Noblesville's getting an Ivy Tech campus, housed now in the old Noblesville High School Building on the east side of the city.

"What I told them was Hamilton County was twice as large as the next largest county with an Ivy Tech campus," Kenley said. "I couldn't tell them where the exact location should be, but it should be in Hamilton County."

Kenley said he believes the Noblesville campus is doing well.

"They have a great guy in Dan Clark running the Noblesville campus," Kenley said. "It may be going a little slow, but there is lots of space to fill in that old high school building. Like all Ivy Tech campuses, Noblesville Ivy Tech is working with the community to fill that space.

"There is lot of room to grow at Noblesville," the Senator added.

The review of Ivy Tech is coming just as the school makes a big move. Thomas Snyder has retired as president. Lt. Governor Sue Ellspermann has expressed an interest in

White River will rise quickly today...

Be aware of flash flooding

While it was too warm for a White Christmas in Central Indiana this year, it's proving to be a wet ending to the year 2015.

Central Indiana, including Hamilton County, is under a flash flood watch from now until 7 p.m. Monday. This after steady rain began Saturday afternoon and continued into the evening. More rain is expected today, with as much of three-quarters of an inch possible. The rain chances drop from 90 to 60 percent tonight, but that still means rain is likely, with another quarter-inch pos-

Rain is forecast to continue on Monday, with the potential for another inch to fall when all is said and done. This will leave the ground saturated and increase the risk of flash flooding.

As of 9:10 p.m. Saturday night, 1.02 inches of rain had fallen at the Weatherbug site at Noblesville High School. Other county schools had seen significant rainfall at their Weatherbug stations, with 0.65 inches falling at Maple Glen Elementary in Westfield, and 0.61 inches at Hoosier Road Elementary in Fishers.

Also, never try to walk, swim or play in flood waters. If water is flowing quickly, again, it can only take six inches to knock a person down. There are other dangers around flood waters as well, such as being exposed to hazardous materials, or coming into contact with downed power lines.

The prospect of steady rain also leads to the possibility of flooding along the White River. While having an inch of rain in Noblesville increases the flood chances, heavy rains in Anderson and Muncie can also exacerbate flooding in Hamilton County. The Weatherbug station at Delaware County Johnson Field in Muncie had reported 0.63 inches of rain Saturday night, and any rain that falls into the river in Muncie will flow south into Noblesville.

The National Weather Service's gage at the White River on Logan Street in Noblesville measured 5.35 feet at 8:45 p.m. Saturday night - well below the action stage of 11 feet. However, the river is forecast to rise rapidly throughout Sunday to a crest of 13.9 feet early Monday morning, just below the flood stage of 14 feet. Any additional rain could change that forecast. While the river will rise quickly, the forecast is for it to recede slowly. The White River is scheduled to drop below the 11 foot action state on Wednesday.
