Fishers murder suspect requests guilty plea hearing

filed a request for a guilty plea hearing for a Hamilton Southeastern student Maxwell Winkler.

The notes outlined a seven step plan that included "selecting prey, enjoy the kill, shoot twice and slit throat."

The Hamilton County Prosecutor's office issued a statement on December 22 that stated, "Through his counsel, Maxwell Hunt Winkler has requested that his case be set for a hearing to change his plea. The cause had been set for a jury trial to begin on January 19, 2016. The Defendant

During the investigation police found handwritten has requested the hearing be held on January 7, 2016 at 3:00 p.m. Further details will be neither provided nor discussed until the hearing has been held."

> Shortly after Winkler's arrest prosecutors filed a sentencing enhancement asking for life in prison without the possibility of parole if found guilty.

> Winkler's attorneys planned to use an insanity defense; however, Hamilton County Superior Court Judge William Hughes ruled Winkler was competent to stand trial after

Plans in the works to reconfigure I-465/69 interchange

Governor Mike Pence announced that the State of Indiana will invest an estimated \$50 million to reconfigure the busy I-465/I-69 interchange on the northeast side of Indianapolis. The project will ease congestion, improve safety, and reduce travel time in the heavily traveled corridor used by more than 165,000 drivers each day.

'Significant growth in Noblesville, Fishers and the northeast side of Indianapolis has created the need to update our highway infrastructure in the area," Governor Mike Pence said. "Building this interchange will increase capacity and improve traffic flow. This project, along with recent and planned projects to widen I-69, a scheduled interchange at 106th Street, and the modernization of State Road 37 in Fishers, will dramatically improve the ability of people and commerce to move efficiently in Central Indiana."

The project will include:

• Building a high-speed, two-lane ramp for traffic exiting I-465 eastbound onto I-69 northbound. The new ramp would bridge over Binford Boulevard and I-465, while the existing low-speed loop ramp would remain for I-465 eastbound traffic exiting I-69 onto 82nd Street in Castleton. • Widening I-465 to four travel lanes in each direction between the White River bridge and I-69. In addition, two ramp lanes in each direction would run continuously between the I-69, Allisonville Road and Keystone Avenue interchanges for traffic entering and exiting the interstate.

The Indiana Department of Transportation this week will publish a formal request for proposals seeking engineering companies interested in designing the project. INDOT expects to begin preliminary design of the project in 2016 with construction anticipated to begin in 2020.







Playing at the City Securities Hall of Fame Classic is always an honor, and at the same time can be an eye-opening experience.



Next up for the 'Rocks is a Jan. 8 trip to McCutcheon, followed by a Jan. 9 home game against Carmel.


