She’ll also assist with managing daily operations and fill in for the mayor when needed.

“This opportunity allows me to continue to help others by assisting staff in finding creative solutions to not only make Noblesville better but to also enhance what is already great about it. I have a desire to assist others – whether that be staff, administration and council or the general citizenry – and I am excited as to how I can be of value to these individuals,” Langley said.

Before taking over the planning department, Langley served as the assistant director of economic development from 2007-2011. Before coming to Noblesville Langley

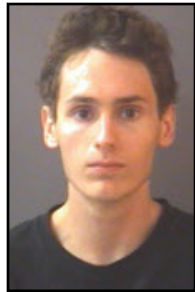

## Fishers murder suspect requests guilty plea hearing

Noblesville attorney Bruce Boje has filed a request for a guilty plea hearing for a Hamilton Southeastern student Maxwell Winkler.

Winkler was arrested and charged with murder in 2014 after police say he slashed the throat and shot 73 year old Henry Kim in Fishers’ Windermere Park.

During the investigation police found handwritten notes in Winkler’s wallet outlining his plan to kill.

The notes outlined a seven step plan that included “selecting prey, enjoy the kill, shoot twice and slit throat.”

Boje serves as local counsel for Winkler’s high profile defense team led by Indianapolis attorney James Voyles.

The Hamilton County Prosecutor’s office issued a statement on December 22 that stated, “Through his counsel, Maxwell Hunt Winkler has requested that his case be set for a hearing to change his plea. The cause had been set for a jury trial to begin on January 19, 2016. The Defendant

has requested the hearing be held on January 7, 2016 at 3:00 p.m. Further details will be neither provided nor discussed until the hearing has been held.”

Shortly after Winkler’s arrest prosecutors filed a sentencing enhancement asking for life in prison without the possibility of parole if found guilty.

Winkler’s attorneys planned to use an insanity defense; however, Hamilton County Superior Court Judge William Hughes ruled Winkler was competent to stand trial after

## Plans in the works to reconfigure I-465/69 interchange

Governor Mike Pence announced that the State of Indiana will invest an estimated \$50 million to reconfigure the busy I-465/I-69 interchange on the northeast side of Indianapolis. The project will ease congestion, improve safety, and reduce travel time in the heavily traveled corridor used by more than 165,000 drivers each day.

“Significant growth in Noblesville, Fishers and the northeast side of Indianapolis has created the need to update our highway infrastructure in the area,” Governor Mike Pence said. “Building this interchange will increase capacity and improve traffic flow. This project, along with recent and planned projects to widen I-69, a scheduled interchange at 106th Street, and the modernization of State Road 37 in Fishers, will dramatically improve the ability of people and commerce to move efficiently in Central Indiana.”

The project will include:

- Building a high-speed, two-lane ramp for traffic exiting I-465 eastbound onto I-69 northbound. The new ramp would bridge over Binford Boulevard and I-465, while the existing low-speed loop ramp would remain for I-465 eastbound traffic exiting I-69 onto 82nd Street in Castleton.
- Widening I-465 to four travel lanes in each direction between the White River bridge and I-69. In addition, two ramp lanes in each direction would run continuously between the I-69, Allisonville Road and Keystone Avenue interchanges for traffic entering and exiting the interstate.

The Indiana Department of Transportation this week will publish a formal request for proposals seeking engineering companies interested in designing the project. INDOT expects to begin preliminary design of the project in 2016 with construction anticipated to begin in 2020.

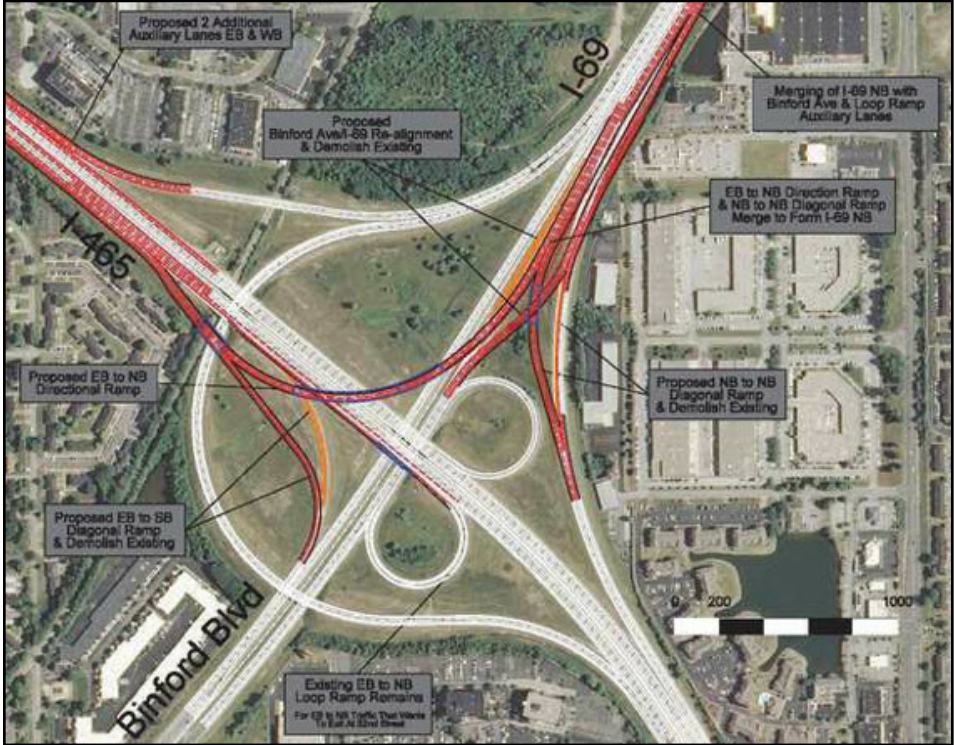

# Millers blast BC, fall to Princeton

Playing at the City Securities Hall of Fame Classic is always an honor, and at the same time can be an eye-opening experience.

That was the case for the Noblesville girls Tuesday at the famed New Castle Fieldhouse. The Millers easily took care of Benton Central - the third ranked team in Class 3A, 72-40 in the first semi-final of the Hall of Fame. That set up a clash with Princeton, 3A's No. 1 team, and Noblesville fought the Tigers to the end.

But Princeton, along with its superstar senior Jackie Young, won the championship 63-56. The Tigers are last year's 3A state champions and are riding a 43-game win streak. The Millers, meanwhile, dropped to 16-4.

"I think it was great for our kids," said NHS coach Donna Buckley. The coach said it was good for the Millers' younger players to be able to see what it was like to experience playing in such a big-time, prestigious tournament, saying it was "great for us to be able to come over and see: 'What does it take to be one of the elites in the state?'"

"I think our kids really stepped up and answered that today," said Buckley.

Noblesville hung with Princeton the entire game, but it seemed like the Tigers were able to go on a run of six or seven points whenever they fell behind. The first example of this was in the first quarter.

The Millers led for a significant part of the period, with 3-pointers by Rachel Shipman and Katelyn O'Reilly giving Noblesville the lead. Brooke Herron threw in a '3' to extend a Miller lead to 15-11.

Noblesville still led 17-14 with less than a minute to go in the first, but six unanswered Princeton points - all from the free throw line - got the Tigers ahead 20-17 just 19 seconds into the second period.

The Tigers led 30-25 at one point during the quarter, but the Millers held them scoreless for the final four-and-a-half minutes of the half. Noblesville then took its turn at the foul line, going 5-of-6 to tie the game at 30-all.

The Millers led 36-33 in the third before Princeton went on another 6-0 run, with all the points scored by Young. A jumper by Alexis Shannon and a putback from O'Reilly got Noblesville back in front 40-39 with three minutes to go in the quarter.

But, once again, the Tigers made a 7-0 run - another run that bridged into the fourth period and got them ahead 46-40. From there, Princeton maintained a lead of four to eight points until the final minute. Shipman and Shannon each hit 3s to cut the Princeton lead to three points on two different occasions, but the Tigers held the Millers off.

O'Reilly finished with a double-double of 18 points and 16 rebounds, while Shannon had 13 points. Both were named to the All-Tournament Team. Shipman drained four 3-pointers, totaling 12 points. Emily Kiser grabbed 11 rebounds to go along with her eight points. Young, not surprisingly named the Tournament MVP, scored 34 points.

In the morning semi-final, the Millers had no problem with the previously under-

feated Bison. Noblesville skipped off to a 13-2 lead, with Kiser scoring six of those points. The Millers led 18-8 after the first quarter, and 38-16 at halftime. Kiser already had a double-double by then, with 12 points and 12 rebounds.

"She played really well," said Buckley of Kiser. "They obviously have two very

good post players. We knew that our bigs were going to have to play really well. She was fantastic."

Shannon took over the game in the second half, scoring 16 of her 26 points, 10 in the third quarter alone. Kiser wound up

## Walker headlines IBCA/Subway Player of the Week honorees

C.J. Walker poured in 32 points to lead Indianapolis Tech to a thrilling overtime victory, and that performance has earned the Titans' senior honors in the IBCA/Subway Player of the Week program for the week of Dec. 21-26.

Walker is joined Prairie Heights senior Austin Penick, Pike Central senior Tyler Toopes, Westview senior Grace Hales, Roncalli senior Lindsey Corsaro and Rising Sun senior Tiffany Vinup as weekly winners in the recognition program coordinated by the Indiana Basketball Coaches Association.

Penick and Hales are respective boys' and girls' winners for District 1, Walker and Corsaro are recipients in District 2, and Toopes and Vinup collected accolades for District 3.

The 6-0 Walker scored 32 points with four rebounds, six assists and three steals as Tech edged Southport 80-77 in overtime in its only game of the week. The Florida State recruit made 9-of-16 shots, 3-of-7 3-pointers and 11-of-11 free throws as the Titans improved to 6-1 for the season.

Penick and Toopes also produced 30-plus points en route to receiving their awards.

Penick, a 6-0 guard, dropped in 31 points with four rebounds, three assists and three steals in leading Prairie Heights to a 64-53 victory over West Noble. Penick sank 9-of-17 shots, 3-of-7 3-pointers and 10-of-12 free throws as the Panthers moved to 4-4.

The 6-3 Toopes tossed in 32 points with six rebounds, four assists and one steal as Pike Central moved to 6-0 with a 77-60 triumph over Boonville. The senior forward converted 12-of-16 shots from the field, 5-of-8 3-pointers and 3-of-5 free throws for his big game.

The three girls' honorees also scored 30 or more points in at least one game last week.

Hales, a 6-0 guard, scored 31 points with eight assists, one rebound and one steal as Westview defeated Lakeland 86-49 in its only game of the week. A Valparaiso University recruit, Hales sank 13-of-18 shots, 2-of-5 3-pointers and 3-of-5 free throws as the Warriors moved to 10-4 for the season and gave coach Randy Yoder his 300<sup>th</sup> career victory. Yoder is now 300-186 in his 22<sup>nd</sup> season with the Warriors.

The 6-0 Corsaro averaged 30.0 points, 11.0 rebounds and 6.0 assists over two games for Roncalli (13-1). The University of Kentucky signee opened with 25 points, 15 rebounds, eight assists and one steal as the Rebels knocked off Oregon-Davis 88-75. Vinup made 16-of-25 shots plus 2-of-3 free throws for her scoring output.

District 2 players nominated from Hamilton County were Hamilton Southeastern's Zach Gunn for the boys, and Noblesville's Katelyn O'Reilly and University's Lily Snyder for the girls.
