Gov. Mike Pence late last year announced state funds of \$100 million are being granted for the project. The local share is to be made up by Hamilton County, Fishers and Noblesville at approximately \$16 million each.

Last night's meeting was actually advertised as a joint meeting of the county commissioners and county council to consider the 37 project. The council will consider an appropriation for the project at its February meeting. The county has sufficient funds in reserve to provide its share of the project cost.

If all goes well construction will begin in 2018.

Trash fee approved

It wasn't without a debate, but the Noblesville trash fee has been approved.

The Noblesville Common Council adopted the city's first trash fee ordinance at its meeting Tuesday

Prior to the vote, the council held a public hearing and discussed the ordinance at its January 12 meeting and retreat on January 23.

The vote passed 6-3. Voting in favor were Common Council President Greg O'Connor, Wil Hampton, Chris Jensen, Roy Johnson, Rick Taylor and Megan Wiles. Opposed were Brian Ayer, Mark Boice and Mary Sue Rowland.

The trash fee ordinance includes a \$10.57 per residence monthly charge beginning June 1, 2016 (payable after July 1). The average trash fee for Hamilton County is around \$12.50 and one area requires citizens to contract their own removal. Officials said it is worth noting that

Two running to replace Emigh...

State committee drawn into county GOP leadership fight

The Republican State Committee has now been drawn into the fight for leadership of the Hamilton County GOP. Acting Republican chair County Laura Campbell maintains that the precinct organization membership has been stacked against her by former chairman Pete Emigh. She and Pete Peterson are running to re-

Emigh favors Peterson for chairman in this Saturday's caucus of county GOP committeemen. The caucus will choose the new chairman. To block the Peterson advantage Ms. Campbell disqualified the Emigh appointments.

> Ms. Campbell has been vice chairman of the party the past several years. She is a city council member in Carmel and wife of Hamilton Superior Court Judge Richard Campbell. Peterson is treasurer of the coun-GOP committee and a city ty council member in Fishers.

Whoever wins on Saturday will serve out Emigh's term which ends in March 2017 when the party is scheduled for a regular quadrennial election of officers. In the meantime comes the major presidential year election and not the best time for the GOP to be involved in an internal fight.

Internal political fights were common in Hamilton County in years past, but within both parties there has been relative peace for the last 15 years. Democrats with little to fight over locally, apparently will be choosing a new chairman next year when Keith Clock retires from the post.

NPD searching for CVS robbery suspect

The Noblesville Police Department is looking for a man who robbed a Noblesville store on Monday.

At approximately 5:02 p.m., police officers from the NPD responded to a report of a robbery at the CVS Pharmacy located at 111 Lakeview Drive (Noblesville). Officers arrived on the scene a short time later and began to investigate.

Initial information from the caller alleges that a subject came into the store and presented a note to employees in the pharmacy. As a result, employees provided the suspect with items from the pharmacy and the suspect then reportedly fled the scene. Officers established a perimeter in the area and utilized a K-9 unit during the search. Officers lifted the perimeter at approximately 5:28 p.m. and were unable to locate the suspect.

The suspect is described as a black male, approximately 5'8" and wearing dark clothing. (see photos below and at right.)

fee. But in the end, the council voted to approve the fee.

"This has been talked about for the last 20 years, and we, as a council, have talked about it hard for the last year," said Taylor. "Our budgets are tight. I've said all along, if it was spent in the right way I'd vote for it. I think it has been spent, or going to be appropriated in the right manner. It's time to move Noblesville forward, and I think this will start that process."

"I have many concerns," said Rowland. e timing is suspect, at least. The process has been flawed. I think the information that's been sent out to the community has been misleading. For those reasons alone, I would object to any movement forward. I truly don't believe that we have a true understanding, the council. My concerns are the future, what does this really mean in the end, how many more increases. I think we needed to study more and put more parameters into place before we made this decision."

The trash fee covers the actual per home cost of the city's contract with Republic Services. Beginning with the first wastewater bill in July 2017, 2018 and 2019 the bill will increase slightly to cover the increase in the city's contract with Republic Services, which runs through June 2020. The remaining contract prices per month are: \$10.57 (July 1, 2016 to June 2017); \$10.69 (July 1, 2017 to June 2018); \$10.82 (July 1, 2018 to June 2019); and \$10.94 (July 1, 2019 to June 2020). Reminders of the new trash fee will be included on monthly Noblesville Utilities bills.

Noblesville Utilities customers who receive a \$10 credit per month on their monthly sewer bill will automatically receive a 50 percent discount on their trash fee. To be eligible for the reduced rate, customers must have one of the following exemptions on their property taxes (filed with the Hamilton County Auditor's Office): over 65 age deduction, blind and disabled deduction, or disabled veteran or surviving spouse deduction.



He was preceded in death by his parents; and two sisters, Jane Fustini and Joan Morrison.





Rankings mean little at Westfield

Usually, regular season results lead to post-season honors, such as rankings in the

Not so this season with the Class 4A sectional to be played at Westfield. It's one of three sectionals being hosted by Hamilton County teams.

field The Westfield includes Carmel, Westfield, Noblesville, Hamilton Southeastern Fishers and new foe Anderson.

Hamilton Heights will host a Class 3A Sectional which also includes Guerin Catholic, plus Delta, Chris Huppenthal Yorktown, Marion, Heritage Christian and

Among those four sectionals, there isn't a soft spot on the way to a championship.

In fact, even the experts seem to be confused. Let's get back to the Westfield Sectional,

example.

The Indiana High school Coaches Association, whose poll include teams from all classes, has Noblesville ranked No. 10. During the regular season, Noblesville was beaten by Carmel 56-48 and Westfield 55-44. Carmel, ranked No. 11, has defeated Westfield, ranked No. 14, 51-48.

So, Carmel is 5-0 against the sectional field and 17-4 overall including a 52-32 win over first round, first game foe Hamilton Southeastern, which has been battered by injuries throughout the season.

"I think the draw is very balanced and we're looking forward to a very tough and exciting tournament," said Carmel coach Tod Windlan.

We are excited about the opportunity to play Carmel again," said Southeastern coach Chris Huppenthal. "We have been fighting through the injury bug, but our kids will keep battling and they will be ready for whatever challenges await them."

Noblesville gets the new face on the block, Anderson. The Lady Millers enter the final week of the regular season with a 21-4 record, which include a 79-50, Dec. 15 victory over Anderson.

"This should be a great sectional," said Noblesville coach Donna Buckley, who won this tourney a year ago. "There are lots of good teams and a tremendous amount of talent. For us, Anderson will be a tough opponent. They have a very good inside game and a point guard with great handles. We will need to come out and play well."

Fishers and Westfield avoided the Tuesday round by drawing a bye. Fishers







Stage set for 2016 IHSAA Girls Basketball State Tournament

Fieldhouse in Indianapolis, the opening 25: Fort Wayne Canterbury, 2008-11. week's pairings were made Monday evening for the 41st Annual IHSAA Girls Basketball State Tournament presented by the Indiana Fever and Indiana Pacers.

A total of 395 schools and 5,318 studentathletes are set to participate in the tourney which begins next week.

This is the third year that both of the state's professional basketball franchises have been presenting sponsors of the girls and boys high school state tournaments.

Sectional games are scheduled to begin Tuesday, Feb. 2, and run through Saturday, Feb. 6, with the regional round slated for Feb. 13 and semi-states on Feb. 20. The four state championship games that make up the state finals will be played at the Bankers Life Fieldhouse on Saturday, Feb. 27.

Top-ranked Columbus North (20-1), the defending Class 4A state champion, drew a first round bye and will begin its quest to repeat when it meets the Columbus East-Shelbyville winner in Sectional 14 at Bloomington North.

Defending Class 3A state champion Princeton sits atop both the Class 3A poll from the Indiana Coaches of Girls Sports Association as well as the single class poll from the Indiana Basketball Coaches Association. The 24-0 Tigers, winners of 50 straight games and led by the state's career scoring leader Jackie Young, will host Washington in the Sectional 31 opener.

Heritage Christian, which won the last two Class 2A state championships, has moved up to Class 3A. The second-ranked Eagles (17-3) will begin their drive toward a third consecutive title with Guerin Catholic in Sectional 24 at Hamilton Heights. Oregon-Davis (19-2), the topranked team in Class 2A, drew North Judson-San Pierre in Sectional 34 at Hebron. Class A No. 1 Jac-Cen-Del (19-1), the host of Sectional 60, drew a bye into the semifinals and await the winner of the Waldron- Hauser game.

Lafayette Central Catholic, last year's Class A state champion, is now playing in Active Sectional Championship Streaks Class 2A. The fifth-ranked Knights (15-5) will begin their 2A test with Rossville in Sectional 38 at Seeger.

Fort Wayne Canterbury, the Class 2A runner-up the last two seasons and Class A state champion two season prior, leads the state Fort Wayne Canterbury, the Class 2A runner-up the last two seasons and Class A state champion two season prior, leads the state with 12 consecutive sectional championships. The Cavaliers will look to continue that streak in Class 3A beginning with a first round matchup against Leo in Sectional 22 at Garrett.




