There are many places to see in Hamilton County

With the arrival of spring, it seems that most folks like to get outdoors more. There are so many things to do and see here in Hamilton County, things we take for granted yet never actually visit to enjoy. It's kind of like that old saying 'we can't see the forest for the trees' or is it the trees for the forest? I always forget. Anyway I have some suggestions. We have some beautiful parks and interesting historic sites that many of our own people are not aware of.

Among the baker's dozen county operated parks is Cool Creek Park between Westfield and Carmel just east of U.S. 31. Mostly wooded with trails and the creek for which it is named, the park is also home to the Nature Center and the site of summer outdoor concerts on Friday nights.

Further north just off State Road 37 is the largest county park: Strawtown Kotawii which includes nearly 300 acres in a bend of White River. Hiking trails, horse



trails, canoeing, fishing, a history center and prehistoric Indian excavations are among the attractions. And the county campgrounds is just across the river.

Morse Beach on the north side of Noblesville has a great view of Morse Reservoir and as the name indicates a beach for swimming. The park also has an enclosed shelter house overlooking the lake suitable for catered dinners or parties.

Another gem in the park system is Coxhall Gardens west of Carmel on 116th Street, and it has more than just the gardens. The property, left to the county by Mr. and Mrs. Jesse Cox, has their former home, copied after the historic governor's mansion in Williamsburg, Va. There is also an amphitheater and impressive carillon towers.

Of course, there is Forest Park in Noblesville offering swimming and diving, golf, playgrounds and the longtime favorite Forest Park Inn overlooking the city. And, another city facility at Carmel, named Central Park, includes the Monon Center with a huge indoor workout center and gymnasium along with banquet rooms and indoor and outdoor swimming pools.

It would be hard to find a greater range of public park opportunities. Admission to all the parks is free for hiking, picnicking and use of the playgrounds. There are rental fees for the various indoor facilities.

For those who like history, Hamilton County has it, but how many of us are familiar with the sites right in our backyard? Of course most folks at least know where Conner Prairie is located. It does not have free admission, but its worth the fee if you have never visited there. The centerpiece is the William Conner home, a 193-year old federal style brick house overlooking the prairie for which the historic farm is named.

It was in a log cabin on the Conner Prairie grounds that state officials met in 1820 to consider a site for a new state capital which would become Indianapolis. Also on the property is the Chinese House, a summer retreat for Eli Lilly where he housed his collection of Chinese artwork, but special arrangements must be made for visiting it.

Just a few miles south along White River is the Ambassador House in Heritage Gardens Park which belongs to the

Arrest made in Girl Scouts theft case...

Noblesville Police searching for CVS robbery suspect

The Noblesville Police Department is looking for a man who allegedly robbed the CVS near 146th Street and Hazel Dell Road on Friday morning.

At approximately 11:56 a.m., police officers from the Noblesville Police Department responded to a report of a robbery at the CVS Pharmacy located at 14835 Sunny Dell Lane. Officers arrived on the scene a short time later and began to investigate.

Upon arriving on the scene, officers quickly established a perimeter around the area. NPDP officers were assisted by police officers from the Westfield Police Department and Indiana State Police. A K-9 unit from the Carmel Police Department also assisted with a search of the area but the suspect(s) was not located.

Initial information from the caller alleges that a subject came into the store and presented a note to employees in the pharmacy. As a result, employees provided the suspect with items from the pharmacy and the suspect then reportedly fled the scene. Witnesses identified the suspect as a black male, 20's, wearing a grey hoodie, baggy jeans and sun-

If you don't mind slow trips, you can go around the world in 80 days. But it takes almost no time to become a global investor. So, should you look abroad for good investments? glasses. Witnesses also stated that a late model, light-colored passenger vehicle may have been involved. This remains an ongoing investigation. Meanwhile, the Noblesville Police Department has made an arrest in an incident

involving allegations of theft from Girl Scouts of Central Indiana. After an extensive investigation, investigators from the Criminal Investigations Division petitioned and were subsequently granted four felony arrest warrants for the suspect in the case. At approximately 9:57 p.m. Thursday, police officers from the Fishers Police Department located the suspect, Heather Rebecca VanVoorhis, 45, of

Fishers, at her residence and took her into custody without incident. The suspect was transported to the Hamilton County Jail and booked on the warrants. VanVoorhis was charged with four counts of Theft, a Level 6 Felony. The investigation began on Nov. 20, 2015. The initial allegation suggested that several thousands of dollars had been unlawfully taken by a single person responsible for

overseeing several accounts belonging to Girl Scouts of Central Indiana. Anyone with information regarding this investigation is encouraged to contact the Criminal Investigations Division at (317) 776-6371 or tips@noblesville.in.us. *A charge is merely an accusation and the defendant(s) is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.

city of Fishers. The house which began as a log cabin in 1825, was enlarged through the years and after 1880 was the home of Addison Harris and his wife. Mr. Harris was American ambassador to the Austrian-Hungarian Empire in pre-World War I days. The house, moved in 1996 to avoid demolition, was carefully restored by the Fishers Preservation Commission. Black history resides at Roberts Chapel in rural Jackson Township. There in the 1830s free black citizens from North Carolina established a settlement which produced a number of accomplished professionals in the fields of medicine, religion and education. The church they built is still standing and maintained by the Roberts Settlement Society.

A few miles west in Sheridan is Pioneer Hill, now a Sheridan public park. The restored cabin built by George Boxley in 1828 is there along with a veterans memorial. Boxley was a militant abolitionist who found sanctuary in the area after being accused of trying to incite a slave revolt in pre-Civil War Virginia. Of interest in near-downtown Noblesville is Riverside Cemetery where some of the city's earliest settlers are buried in a park-like setting along the riverbank. In recent years an impressive veterans memorial was added, and in the southeast corner of the graveyard is a small frame former church now housing the Hamilton County Artists Association gallery. And only four blocks away is the county courthouse, and on the public square with it is the County

Historical Society museum. The courthouse, built in 1878-79, had its day in the national spotlight in 1925 when the Indiana Ku Klux Klan met its demise at the hands of a county Circuit Court jury. Klan leader D.C. Stephenson was convicted of murder, and the Klan crumbled soon after. The adjacent museum, the former county jail, houses historic displays and artifacts of county history and includes a reference library. Unfortunately, probably only a fraction of our quarter-million county residents are familiar with all these locations of historic interest, outdoor recreation, entertainment and natural beauty. So the coming spring and summer season offers the opportunity to get out and see what interesting places we have right here in Hamilton County.
