Civilian employee with Noblesville Police Department...

## Atlanta woman charged with Official Misconduct, Theft

A longtime civilian employee of the Noblesville Police Department was arrested Thursday on charges of Official Misconduct and Theft.

On March 21, the Noblesville Police Department opened an investigation into concerns of official misconduct and theft by a civilian employee of the Police Department. The investigation was initiated as a result of a routine audit of records and the focus of the investigation was an employee responsible for taking receipt of parking ticket fines.

After an extensive investigation, investigators from the Criminal Investigations Division petitioned for and were subsequently granted two arrest warrants for the suspect in the case. At approximately 10 a.m. Thursday, the suspect surrendered to authorities at the Hamilton County Jail and was booked on the warrants.

The suspect is Brandon "Brandi" M. Marcum, 38, Atlanta. She was charged with one count each of Official Misconduct, a Level 6 Felony, and Theft, an A Misdemeanor. Marcum had been a civilian employee of the police department since 1997 and was terminated as a result of the investigation.

As a result of the Noblesville Police Department's investigation and arrest stemming from official misconduct, Noblesville Mayor John Ditslear issued the following statement:

"I was shocked to learn of the misconduct committed by a former civilian employee. I want to thank the Noblesville Police Department for their work. After discovering this misconduct through a routine internal audit, it was their quick action and investigation that led to the employee's termination and arrest. When Noblesville became designated as a Second Class City, the controller's office began the process of auditing all municipal finances and procedures involving cash transactions. As part of their findings, the city is reviewing and implementing new safeguards with regards to the handling of money to prevent such misconduct in the future."

### Noblesville Schools kindergarten enrollment starts Monday

Noblesville Schools will open 2016-2017 enrollment for kindergartners and other students new to the district beginning this Monday, April 18, 2016.

Students should be enrolled by May 13, 2016 to take advantage of enrolling at their specific school and to participate in kindergarten orientation. Additionally, new students who are enrolled by May 13, will be eligible to win a Miller spirit gift set.

Children must be at least five years of age on or before August 1, 2016 in order to enroll for kindergarten.

Students should enroll at the school they will attend and the process takes approximately 30 minutes. Evening enrollment hours and Spanish translation services will also be available.

# Carmel Marathon is Saturday

The Carmel Road Racing Group would like to remind residents in Carmel, Ind. to prepare for temporary lane restrictions and brief street closures in parts of the city due to the sixth annual Carmel Marathon Weekend on Saturday, April 16. Short delays can be expected. Motorists are advised to plan alternate routes, allow for extra driving time, and proceed with caution along the event course.

The Carmel Road Racing Group and City of Carmel Police Department have worked together to plan the event route in a way to lessen the impact on road closures while ensuring the safety of race participants and volunteers.

The marathon begins and finishes at Carmel's Palladium at the Center for Performing Arts (at 3rd Avenue and City Center Drive) with the course passing through many of the city's popular areas, including the Carmel Arts and Design District, Old Town Carmel and a variety of Carmel Clay Parks. All events begin at 7:30 a.m., with a maximum course time of 6.5 hours. The course and finish line will officially close at 2 p.m.

Both lanes of City Center Drive, eastbound and westbound, will close in front of Divvy on at 11 p.m. on April 15 and remain closed until 2:05 p.m. on April 16 for the start/finish area of the race. Traffic will be able to access City Center during those times. The 8K and 5K courses have been altered for 2016 to remove congestion around the Smokey Row/Rangeline Road roundabout, as runners will not circle the roundabout as in past events.

## Mitchell leads Fever Draft picks

The Indiana Fever selected 5-9 scoring guard Tiffany Mitchell with the ninth pick in the 2015 WNBA Draft presented by State Farm. Indiana chose Maryland point guard Brene Moseley in the second round (21st overall) and Belgian point guard Julie Allamand in the third round (33rd overall).

A shooting guard who helped South Carolina rise to national prominence in recent years, Mitchell was a two-time SEC Player of the Year and a three-time All-American while playing for former WNBA star Dawn Staley. In the eyes of Fever President and General Manager Kelly Krauskopf, she's pro ready.

"Everything about Tiffany Mitchell is pro-ready," said Krauskopf. "She's got a lot of attributes I have been looking for. She was very high on her list in terms of her work ethic and the way she approaches the game."

"For a team that went to Game 5 of the WNBA Finals," added Krauskopf of the Fever, "for us to add a player like Tiffany Mitchell, I'm thrilled."

Mitchell and the Gamecocks appeared destined for a return trip to the Final Four last month, but an upset loss to Syracuse in the NCAA Sweet Sixteen ended a 33-2 season. Mitchell averaged 14.9 points and

2.6 assists per game as a senior, shooting 41 percent overall and 33 percent from 3-point range. As a junior, she averaged 14.4 points and 2.8 assists while shooting 50 percent overall and 42 percent beyond the arc.

A native of Charlotte, N.C., who once hung Staley's Charlotte Sting jersey on her wall, Mitchell was named the most outstanding collegiate guard in the country as a junior, earning the award that bears Staley's name. She is the first South Carolina player ever to be drafted by the Fever.

Moseley helped Maryland to a 31-4 record, winning the Big Ten Conference Tournament at Bankers Life Fieldhouse, before the Terrapins fell in an NCAA second-round upset to Washington. The 5-8 guard averaged 11.6 points and 5.9 assists off the bench.

Said Krauskopf, "Maryland had a very deep team. She's a good distributor. She gets into the paint and pushes the tempo. We thought she was the best player for us at that point of the draft."

Allamand, just 19 years old, plays professionally in Belgium and is on the Belgian National Team. The Fever will retain her rights.

WNBA training camps begin Sunday, April 24.
