Ray Adler joins Reporter team

Adler has also served as attorney for various county offices including as attorney for the Carmel BZA, attorney for the Plan Commission, attorney for Noblesville City Council, Jackson Township attorney, White River Township attorney, and Kirklin Town attorney. Adler also served as a Deputy Attorney General for the State of Indiana.

Adler was admitted to the Indiana bar in 1975, and has practiced law for nearly 40 years. A graduate of Indiana University School of Law – Indianapolis, and holds a Bachelor of Science in Mathematics and Chemistry from Purdue University. Adler is a veteran of armed services, and attended Fort Knox Armor School in 1975, prior to entering private practice.

Adler is the current President and senior attorney of Adler Tesnar & Whalin. Adler has worked out of the historic Adler Building since 1990. The Adler Building was the previous home of the First Christian Church in Noblesville, and was originally built in 1896, but renovated in the late 1980's by Adler into office space.

Bulk trash day for Westfield residents on May 14

Westfield residents will have some assistance for heavy duty spring cleaning as the city hosts its bulk trash day from 8 a.m. to noon on Saturday, May 14.

“This is part of a larger cleanup initiative that we began earlier in the spring,” Mayor Andy Cook said. “Our departments have been working hard to keep our community as clean as possible, and we think this is one way to help residents as they do the same around their homes.”

Residents can get rid of e-waste, have documents shredded and drop off bulk items such as mattresses and televisions.

Mattresses must be wrapped in plastic. Large items may require a small cost to drop off.

The location for the bulk trash day is the Westfield City Services Center, located at 2706 E 171st St. Participants are encouraged to pull into the west entrance, where they will be directed where to go by signage. Gates will open at 8 a.m. and the last car will enter at noon.



Matio-led victory ...

HSE boys win Mudsock

Capturing victories in the three relay events went a long way to secure the victory against Fishers as Hamilton Southeastern’s boys won the Mudsock track and field trophy over the Tigers, 82-50.

The relays were just the beginning as the Royals put together a complete team effort that included victories in nine individual events and a sweep of the 110 high hurdles.

Spearheading those victories was senior Aaron Matio who took home wins in the 100, 200 and as a member of the 4x400 relay.

“The meet was much closer than it looked on paper,” said Southeastern coach Chris Swisher. “Any time you can win the three relays, that goes a long way in a dual meet like this. Even though it only adds up to 15 points it really a 30-point swing.

“Going into the meet I thought we had a shot at one or two of these relays, but I was surprised that we were able to win all three. Fishers has a great 4x400 team and we tried a new lineup just to see what would happen. We had wanted to try Matio in a 400 all year and tonight was the night. He ran great (splitting a 49.2) for already running two races earlier in the night,” Swisher said.
