The Boys & Girls Club of Noblesville is once again sponsoring the Kiddie Run. Taking place at 9:30 a.m. on May 28, the Kiddie Run is open to kids age 9 and younger and will take place on Hare Chevrolet Field.

All participants in the Kiddie Run will receive a Noblesville Mini Marathon football and a race bib number as part of their registration.

Multiple distances during the Noblesville Mini Marathon will be offered to appeal to runners and walkers of various abilities. Participants may choose between the half marathon (starting at 7:30 a.m.), the

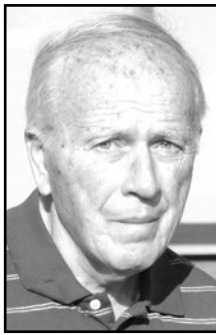

Is the County Meet on its last legs?

Most sports columns do not deserve being on page 1. Not in a newspaper such as the Hamilton County Reporter, which has loads of space in its sports section. This column is different.

An event which started in 1908, it's likely that there isn't a sporting event in which more Hamilton County athletes have competed than the Hamilton County Track & Field Meet.

Athletes like you, from all schools in Hamilton County. Even from schools which no longer exist in Hamilton County.

Tonight's Hamilton County Meet, boys and girls, will be held at Carmel. The field of teams is at an all-time low. Just six schools will show up ... Carmel, Fishers, Guerin Catholic, Hamilton Southeastern, Noblesville and Westfield.

For the first time ever, Hamilton Heights and Sheridan will not compete.

Will the county track and field meet survive losing two more teams?

Most nearly everyone who is involved say "no." They say the meet will continue. But, that's what most folks said a few years ago when another Hamilton County sporting tradition ended, following the small schools' withdraw from the competition.

This time it's a little different. Hamilton Heights and Sheridan have an excuse. A good excuse.

"Only issue we ran into is that our (new) conference meet is on the same date as the county meet," Sheridan athletic director Brian Jones told The Reporter.

Same thing happened to Hamilton Heights.

"As long as the date remains on the same date as our conference met, the conference meet will take precedence," said Hamilton Heights AD Kurt Ogden.

"I think it is unfortunate that not all of the schools are participating," offered host athletic director Jim Inskeep. "However, that is their choice.

"We will continue to have the county meet. It is one of the best in the state during the regular season and gets better each year with the individual talent."

While the little schools, Heights and Sheridan, are leaving because of conference conflicts, it has been several years since they've been able to compete as a team against the larger Hamilton County powerhouses.

Earlier this week, the IHSAA voted down a proposal to change its track and field program to a class enrollment sport.

That's too bad.

"I'm definitely in favor of class track and field or making some sort of concessions like they did with cross country," Ogden told The Reporter.

Reminder for Noblesville residents...

No opting out of city-provided trash removal fee

The City of Noblesville has heard about incidents involving outside businesses soliciting Noblesville residents with trash removal services in place of the city's trash fee of \$10.57 a month. City officials would like to remind residents that under the Noblesville Common Council approved ordinance, a residence cannot opt out of paying for city-provided trash removal.

As part of the city's contract with Republic Services, any property tax paying residence within city limits

receives trash removal. If a resident signs another contract they will be paying extra for trash removal.

The City of Noblesville trash fee will begin June 1, 2016 (payable after July 1). The trash fee will be included in sewer bills at the end of the month. Trash and sewer bills may be paid together in one payment.

Noblesville residents may be eligible for discounts on their property taxes, city utility bills and trash fee. Before a deduction takes place at the city level, a property tax deduction claim has to be filed and

approved by the Hamilton County Auditor's Office, in the southwest corner of the first floor of the Historic Courthouse, 33 N. Ninth Street in downtown Noblesville. Unless a resident has an approved deduction from the auditor's office they are not eligible for Noblesville Utilities or Trash Fee discounts.

“I want to thank my wife Brenda, for enduring this process, but also for support-

ing my decision to run in the first place. It all starts with Brenda, and she was my rock during the campaign, as she always is” said Smythe.

Continuing, Smythe credited his team, “The support of my team was incredible. I especially want to recognize Campaign Manager Dan Rieke, who kept us moving forward at every turn, and Mike Colby, who brought valuable practical ideas and a constant presence to the team. This wasn’t a one-man show. It was gratifying to have so many like-minded people come together around our message. I was at once proud and humbled to drive around the County and see our signs in so many front yards, and in the windows of businesses,” said Smythe.

Smythe’s is looking forward to a little rest. “In politics, there are battles that are won and lost, but I’m still the same person. I was fighting against higher taxes before this election, and I will be out there fighting for what I believe in afterwards.”

Overnight restrictions continue at I-69 and 106th Street

Walsh Construction Company plans to close multiple traffic lanes on Interstate 69 during overnight hours this week to continue demolition of the 106th Street overpass bridge.

Removing the structure will also require multiple rolling slowdowns of traffic on I-69 to create gaps in interstate traffic that will allow for safe removal.

Weather permitting, lane closures and rolling slowdowns of traffic will begin after 9 p.m. on the dates below, and all traffic restrictions are expected to end before 6 a.m. the next day. Construction schedules and traffic restrictions are subject to change.

The speed limit near the construction zone at mile marker 204 is reduced to 55 mph and may be reduced further to 45 mph when workers are present. 






Lindstrand hits, Simac scores...

Millers take Game 1 over Royals

Thursday's opener of the Hoosier Crossroads Conference series between Noblesville and Hamilton Southeastern turned out to be almost a game and a half.

That's because 10 innings were needed to decided the first of three games for the Millers and the host Royals. Noblesville finally won 5-4, and will host HSE tonight as the series shifts to Don Dunker Field.

"Every time HSE and Noblesville get together, it's going to be a war," said Millers coach Justin Keever

The Millers got the go-ahead run in the top of the 10th, when a Ty Lindstrand hit batted in Julian Simac. It was Lindstrand's second hit of the night, and Simac got himself in position to score after he stole second base.

"Ty was having good swings all day long," said Keever. "He had real good at-bats."

Keever also gave credit to Tyler Owens, who came in to pitch in the fifth inning and was credited with the win.

"He just kind of held them down, just found ways to keep them off the plate," said Keever, who also noted that the Noblesville defense "made some good plays behind him."

Owens went five and two thirds innings for the win. Both he and starter Reese Sharp (who pitched four innings) had two strikeouts on the night. Michael Carmosino pitched the last out for Noblesville.

The Millers started the game with three runs in the first inning and another one in the third, but the Royals tied the game by scoring all four of their runs in the bottom of the fourth. Spencer Irick was 2-for-2, with Matt Gorski and Jon McGee both hitting a double.

Carter Poiry started and lasted eight innings. He struck out four and allowed four hits and just one earned run. Gorski threw two innings, walked one, struck out four, and allowed one run.

Records tough to challenge

The Hamilton County (boys and girls) Track and Field Meet has its flavor on two different fronts.

Which team will win? There have been some battles down through the years. This year's meet may be as wide-open as any ever held.

Will records be broken? To break a County Meet record is quite a feat.

Here's a look at records which appear to have the best opportunity of falling.

In the girls competition:
Hamilton Southeastern's Camille Christopher has recorded a 12.26 in the 100 dash. The meet record is 12.50, set by Hamilton Heights' Alicia Bundy in 1993.

Fishers has run a 48.71 in the 4x100 relay. Meet record there is 48.57, set by Fishers in 2015.

The meet record in the 400 dash is a 57.13 clocking by Carmel's Ariel Hune in 2013. Noblesville's Maria Anderson has a 57.20. Anderson also has a 25.20 in the 200, not far off the meet record of 25.57 set by Westfield's Hilary McEowen in 2004.

Carmel's Sarah Leinheiser has turned a 10:34.40 in the 3200 run. That's better than the meet record of 10:44.18 by Carmel's Renee Wellman in 2012.
