part in propelling the city’s growth and opportunities.”  
Assisting BlueSky with the project is local architectural firm, American Structurepoint + Interiors Group, and contracting firm, Meyer Najem, to conceptualize and execute the new 42,000-square-foot headquarters with the top three levels used for collaborative office use. The main level at grade is intended for a restaurant tenant space and outdoor dining. An outdoor terrace off their common break-room area on the fourth floor provides BlueSky with scenic views of historic downtown Noblesville and the new Federal Hills Commons area.  
“We are excited to see BlueSky’s continued success and growth,” said Mayor Ditslear. “Their new headquarters is the first major development since the Federal Hill Commons project began. Our partnership will spur economic development and extend downtown Noblesville to the west side of the White River.”  
When designing the building, BlueSky officials said it was important to listen to their employees’ vision of their new office space.  
“At BlueSky, our people matter,” said Irwin. “We care passionately about our

work culture, and wanted to be sure our vision resonated with our employees’ vision. American Structurepoint led a collaborative visioning session that provided great feedback from 25 of our employees, and based on that session the architects were able to program and design a building that promotes our company culture and brand.”  
The project is expected to be completed by the summer of 2017.



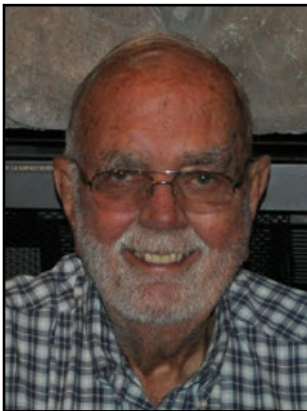

# County Sheriff's deputy injured in Tuesday crash

A Hamilton County Sheriff's deputy was injured in a multiple vehicle crash in Noblesville on Tuesday.

Deputies responded to the area of State Road 37 and Pleasant Street shortly before 6:30 p.m. on the report of a crash involving four vehicles.

According to the crash report, Sgt. Ryan Horine of the Sheriff's Office was on duty driving a marked patrol car northbound on SR 37 approaching Pleasant Street. Also northbound on SR 37 was a gray Honda ULX driven by Li Xiaohong, age 46 of Carmel. Investigators believe the Honda's driver made a late decision to change lanes as she approached Pleasant Street. As the Honda slowed or stopped in the travel lane to change lanes, the Sheriff's Office car collided with the rear of the Honda pushing it into two other vehicles, a silver Saturn driven by Violeta Watt of Pendleton and a gray Chevrolet driven by Lulu Laubecher of McCordsville.

Horine was taken by ambulance to Riverview Hospital with leg and ankle injuries. None of the drivers or passengers in the other vehicles was reported injured.

In accordance with Hamilton County policy requiring an employee involved in a vehicle crash that causes injury or requires a vehicle to be towed, toxicology tests were performed and results are pending. Investigators do not believe there were any signs of impairment.

# Lots of Huskies at Heights

Chad Ballenger has been around the block a time or two as a high school basketball coach.

Ballenger knows. Ballenger knows it's next to impossible replacing a Hunter Crist. He led the Huskies in scoring last season, averaging 19.8 points a game.

**Sauerteig** “You don't replace a Hunter Crist with just one player,” said Ballenger, flat in the middle of the summer basketball season.

But, don't shed any tears for Ballenger and the Huskies. Hamilton Heights will return nearly all of the players from last season's team.

“This could be a real good group,” said the coach.

“We've had real good number this summer,” said the coach. “About 36 kids in all.”

Heights is playing without Caymn Lutz, out for summer with an injury. He averaged 10.6 points a game last season.

A couple of players with size who played junior varsity last season, 6-4 Drayden Thomas and 6-5 Caleb Bean, both juniors-to-be, have been playing well.

“Austin Sauerteig, coming back for his senior year, is doing a good job of scoring,” Ballenger continued. “Also back is our point guard, Max Wahl.

Sauerteig averaged 5.6 points a game and Wahl 5.4 last season.

“We've had lots of open gyms and workouts this summer,” said Ballenger.

Hamilton Heights will close out summer play by hosting Delta and playing at Knightstown.

The showcase events have been set for July 12 and July 13 at Ben Davis High School in Indianapolis.













Staged by the Indiana Basketball Coaches Association with support from the Indiana High School Athletic Association, the Underclass Showcase events are designed to give exposure to approximately 200 of the top basketball prospects (about 100 boys and about 100 girls) from across the state to colleges across the state and nation.

The 2016 Girls' Showcase will be on Tuesday, July 12. Activity will begin at 2 p.m. and will last until about 8 p.m. Five county girls basketball players are scheduled to be there: Amy Dilk, Carmel; Kayla Kirtley, Hamilton Heights; Emily Kiser, Noblesville; Audrey Reed, Sheridan and Blake Smith, Carmel.

The 2016 Boys' Showcase will be on Wednesday, July 13. Action will begin at 3 p.m. and last until about 9 p.m. Four county players are set to attend: Sterling Brown, Carmel; Max Flinchum, Noblesville; Matthew Godfrey, Guerin Catholic and Brennan Schofield of Hamilton Southeastern. In addition, four county coaches will be on the coaching staff: Pete Smith, Guerin Catholic; Brian Satterfield, HSE; Chad Ballenger, Heights and Tommy Mascari, a Guerin assistant.

The showcase events are NCAA certified for 2016. That means college coaches from all levels (NCAA Division I, NCAA Division II, NCAA Division III, NAIA and NJCAA) may attend to evaluate the participants.

The showcase events are open to the public. Admission is \$5 per person per day. IBCA-member coaches will be admitted at no charge by showing their IBCA membership card.

# Champions crowned at the 2016 US Youth Soccer Region II Championships

Champions were crowned at the 2016 US Youth Soccer Region II (Midwest) Championships at Grand Park in Westfield.

Winners in the Under-13 through Under-19 Boys and Girls matches earned a Regional title and a berth to the 2016 US Youth Soccer National Championships held July 26-31, at the Toyota Soccer Center in Frisco, Texas.

Two defending champions – Under-14 Girls PSG Gators 02 Orange (MI) and Under-16 Girls Pink Panthers Elite (MO) – attained a second consecutive Regional title and will get another shot at the National Championships. PSG Gators will also look to defend their 2015 National Championship title.

Of the 14 total champions, Illinois Youth Soccer had four teams, Ohio South and Wisconsin were each represented by three champion teams, Ohio North had two and Nebraska as well as Missouri each had one team.

**Highlights from the finals matches:**

**Under-13 Girls: Cincinnati United Premier Gold (OH-S) 3-0 Chicago Fire Juniors South Premier (IL)**

Cincinnati United Premier Gold (OH-S) secured a Regional title with three goals against Chicago Fire Juniors South Premier (IL). With all of the goals taking place in the first half, Lauren Donovan earned the first in the fourth minute, while Kailyn Dudukovich contributed two of her own. Out of five total games for Cincinnati United Premier, the team posted 15 goals and did not allow any goals.

**Under-14 Girls: PSG MI Gators 02 Orange (MI) 1-0 Waza FC East 02 Black (MI)**

PSG MI Gators 02 Orange (MI) snuck away with one early goal against Waza FC East 02 Black (MI) to become back-to-back Region II Champions. The goal came in the sixth minute of the match from Taylor Stanley. In five games, PSG totaled 11 goals and only allowed one into their own net.

**Under-15 Girls: Midwest United FC 01 Royal (MI) 2-1 Campton United Navy (IL)**

Midwest United FC 01 Royal (MI) came back from a one-goal deficit against Campton United Navy (IL) to win the match, 2-1. Saydie Holland gave Campton United the early lead as she scored in the seventh minute of the match. The equalizer came from Midwest United's Campbell George in the second half as she dribbled through the Campton United defense and slotted the ball into the net. A goal from Cassidy Pettinger then put Midwest United ahead and ultimately earned the team a Regional title.

**Under-16 Girls: FCKC Pink Panthers Elite (MO) 2-0 CUP Gold 99/00 (OH-S)**

FCKC Pink Panthers Elite (MO) earned two goals in each half against CUP Gold 99/00 (OH-S) to take home their second consecutive Regional Championship. While both teams battled in an even match, FCKC Pink Panthers' Kassidy Newsom earned a goal in the 12th minute. In the second half, CUP Gold gained more offensive chances through free kicks and corner kicks, forcing FCKC Pink Panthers to stay on defense. However, Newsom secured the win and netted her second goal of the game in the 80th minute.

**Under-17 Girls: LSC EGA Maroon 98/99 (NE) 3-1 FC United (IL)**

LSC EGA Maroon 98/99 (NE) went on a comeback rally against FC United (IL) to win the match, 3-1 in double overtime. FC United took a 1-0 lead when Natalie Laser scored in the first half. LSC EGA showed determination to attain the equalizer as they constantly pressured FC United's defense. FC United held on, but in the 87th minute,

# Bilquist comes close at Olympic Trials

Only 0.08 seconds separated Carmel graduate Amy Bilquist from Rio on Tuesday.

Bilquist, an eight-time state champion for the Greyhounds, was one of several swimmers with Carmel ties that has been competing in the U.S. Olympic Trials, which are taking place this week in Omaha, Neb. Bilquist swam in the 100 backstroke, and came oh-so-close to securing a spot for the 2016 Summer Games, which start in August in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.

Bilquist finished the preliminary round in the 100 back in second place with a time of 59.67, moving her on to the Tuesday semi-finals. The top eight advance from the semis to the finals, and Bilquist easily made it through, winning her semi-final heat and placing third overall with a 59.85.

That sent Bilquist to the Tuesday final, and she swam a personal best 59.37, an outstanding time - but not enough. The top two finishers in each event make it on to the Olympic team, and Bilquist was third, placing behind Olivia Smoliga's 59.02 and Kathleen Baker's 59.29.

Bilquist just completed her freshman year at the University of California, where she helped Cal to a third-place finish at the NCAA Championships at Georgia Tech University in March. Bilquist was part of the national champion 200 freestyle relay, which won that race in a new Georgia Tech pool record of 1:26.80. She also swam on Cal's third-place 800 freestyle relay team (6:55.18) and its 10th place 400 medley relay (3:30.36).

Individually, Bilquist placed fourth in the 100 backstroke (51.01) and fifth in the 200 back (1:50.88). She also finished tied for 26th in the 50 free preliminaries (22.39).
