

Dollard files lawsuit after drug raid arrest

Andrew Dollard, local attorney and Sheridan native, along with seven other individuals has filed a federal lawsuit seeking damages they claim to have suffered from arrests in a 2014 drug raid on a Carmel addiction recovery clinic. The criminal case against the claimants fell apart in court when a judge threw out the charges.

The lawsuit, filed June 29 in federal district court at Indianapolis, alleges false arrest. Dollard says his Noblesville law practice was ruined. As a result he moved to Florida last year to work in a firm there, but has recently returned to Hamilton County.

The suit seeks unspecified damages, but asks for "all relief allowable by law, including compensatory and punitive damages, costs and attorney fees." The court action stems from a raid on the DORN clinic in downtown Carmel. A drug task force involved in the raid called the clinic a "pill mill," but it was advertised as a facility to assist addicts to recover from drug addiction.

Dr. Larry Ley operated the clinic where the lawsuit says "physicians required patients to comply with a signed treatment contract by actively participating in counseling, seeking employment and submitting to random urinary drug screens" in order to be certain they were staying off addictive drugs and using medically prescribed Suboxone which is a drug specifically designed to end dependency.

Joining Dollard in the lawsuit are Cassy Bratcher, Felicia Reid, Derek Tislow, Yvonne Morgan, Joseph Mackey, Jessica Callahan, and Eric Ley. Bratcher and Reid are Hamilton County residents. They were all employed or in some manner associated with the clinic. Charges against all have been dismissed.

Named as defendants in the suit are the City of Carmel, City of Kokomo, Howard County, Hendricks County, Johnson County and the Town of Cumberland. All the jurisdictions had authorities involved in either the Carmel raid, or simultaneous raids in other locations

Boys summer basketball....

Different summer for coach

His second summer, the coach agrees, has been different than his first summer as Westfield boys basketball coach a year ago.

"Last year was a situation of getting my feet wet," said Shane Sumpter, who a year ago moved as the school's head girls basketball coach to the school's head boys basketball coach.

"Being in the athletic program, last year I knew the kids when becoming the boys coach. But, I didn't know them as their boys coach. It was a situation of getting to know each other," Sumpter said while in the process of wrapping up the summer

Westfield began the summer by hosting a 16-team tourney. Then, the Shamrocks played in the Charlie Hughes Tourney at Carmel and then also played in the Best Choice Fieldhouse tourney in Fishers.

"We've played at a high level," said Sumpter.

The coach didn't want to name names, while looking at the summer play. "We've tried to build experience and

leadership," he said. Sumpter is very excited about the num-

ber of Shamrocks who have competed this "We've had 40-plus kids out," he said. "We're moving in the right direction. We

varsity experience.' The leading scorer is gone. Charlie Warner led Sumpter's first Westfield team with a 16.4 scoring average. He pulled 4.6

rebounds a game. Two other Shamrocks who graduated last spring were Kyle Nicole and Robbie Lynch. Nicole averaged 2.7 points a game

and Lynch scored at a 5.3 clip. The top scorer returning is senior-to-be Ian Kristensen, the second leading scorer last season with a 9.9 mark and the top rebounder with 4.7 grabs a game. Next in scoring and returning is senior-to-be Jonah Welch at 7.1 points a game.

Sumpter's first Westfield team finished with an 11-12 record and the Shamrocks were 3-3 in the Hoosier Crossroads Conference.

"We have lots of young players. We're excited with the numbers," concluded Sumpter.
