# Budget-making process is important to the public

In Hamilton County, budgets for next year are in the works for the eight cities and towns, the six school corporations, the nine townships, the five library districts and the county's government. The largest budget in any community is usually its public school system.

# **Bison-tennial herd to Hamilton County 4-H Fair**

Hamilton County fairgoers will see a new addition to the 2016 Hamilton County 4-H Fair among the traditional sheep and cattle-a big, blue, polka-dotted bison! Visitors to Exhibition Hall A can see the painted fiberglass bison representing Hamilton County. It's part of a larger herd roaming the state with the Bison-tennial Public Art Project, celebrating Indiana's 200th Statehood Day. The bison statue is made possible by a grant from LINK Advisory Council, the youth council of Legacy Fund, an affiliate of Central Indiana Community Foundation.

Two Hamilton County artists from Caravan Classes, a mobile art studio and classroom, are painting the bison with 29 polka dots representing the official code used for Hamilton County on license plates and in other places, in addition to iconic symbols of Hamilton County, including the courthouse in Noblesville and high school mascots. Fingerprints from residents will complete the bison's transformation.

LINK Advisory Council is comprised of 15-20 Hamilton County high school students. Its grant making is supported by an annual \$10,000 grant from Legacy Fund. The bison project is the product of a LINK partnership with Indiana Association of United Ways and the Indiana Bicentennial Commission.

Hamilton County's bison statue will be on display at the Hamilton County Fairgrounds through Monday, July 25. It will briefly rejoin its herd at the Indiana State Fair Aug. 5- Aug. 21.

'Task Force members heard testimony on the status of road funding from a national level, the funding mechanisms Indiana has had and currently has in place, and an update on the status of state roads and bridges.

"In 2017, the General Assembly will made the following craft the state's next two-year budget. The meetings that the FIRSST Task Force conducts this summer and fall will ultimately culminate in a preliminary plan for the General Assembly to consider as budget discussions get underway.

"Funding Indiana's roads is a priority for lawmakers, and it is important that we have all of the information we need to make the fiscally responsible decisions as we deter-FIRSST Task Force mine the best path forward on this issue."

The FIRSST Task Force was established during the 2016 legislative session in order to plan for Indiana's long-term roadfunding needs. The Task Force is charged with developing a long-term road-funding proposal for Indiana, which shall be submitted to the General Assembly before Jan. 1, 2017.

The next meeting will be held Aug. 18 at 1 p.m. at the Statehouse and will be streamed live at www.in.gov/iga.

# Noblesville native participates in world's largest international maritime warfare exercise

PEARL HARBOR – A 2014 Waukesha South High School graduate and Noblesville, Indiana native is serving in the U.S.



Navy and is participating in the world's largest international maritime warfare exercise, the Rim of the Pacific Exercise (RIMPAC).

Corpsman Emily Curtis is a hospital corpsman aboard USS San Diego, currently operating out

rently operating out of Pearl Harbor, Hawaii.

A Navy hospital corpsman is responsible for the medical care of over 400 sailors aboard the ship.

"I'm looking forward to meeting all the people from foreign countries during RIM-PAC," said Curtis. "I'm also looking forward to practicing the wartime exercises."

According to Navy officials, RIMPAC provides a unique training opportunity that helps participants foster and sustain cooperative relationships that are critical to ensuring the safety of sea lanes and security on the world's oceans. RIMPAC 2016 is the 25th exercise in the series that began in 1971.

The theme of RIMPAC 2016 is "Capable, Adaptive, Partners," Navy officials explained. The participating nations and forces will exercise a wide range of capabilities and demonstrate the inherent flexibility of maritime forces. These capabilities range from disaster relief and maritime security operations to sea control and complex warfighting. The relevant, realistic training program includes amphibious operations, gunnery, missile, anti-submarine and air defense exercises, as well as counter-piracy, mine clearance operations, explosive ordnance disposal and diving and salvage operations.

The Department of the Navy's Great Green Fleet yearlong initiative will also play a major role in RIMPAC. The initiative highlights global operations using energy conservation measures and alternative fuel blends to demonstrate how optimizing energy use increases resiliency and operational readiness. During RIMPAC, almost all participating units will operate using an approved alternate-fuel blend. 26 nations, 45 surface ships, 5 submarines, more than 200 aircraft and 25,000 personnel will participate in the biennial Rim of the Pacific Exercise. This year's exercise includes forces from Australia, Brunei, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Denmark, France, Germany, India, Indonesia, Italy, Japan, Malaysia, Mexico, Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, People's Republic of China, Peru, the Republic of Korea, the Republic of the Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, Tonga, the United Kingdom and the United States.

be able to accomplish," said Capt. Carl Meuser, commanding officer aboard USS San Diego. "I enjoy leading young sailors and watching them develop, and not just as sailors, but as young men and women. RIMPAC has tremendous resources to support all of the platforms involved. Cruisers and destroyers will be shooting weapons, the air wing has evolutions going on and the Marines are out with us conducting amphibious operations."

"Everybody on the ship is super nice and friendly," said Curtis. "I felt right at home right away."

Challenging living conditions build strong fellowship among the crew, Curtis explained. The crew is highly motivated, and quickly adapt to changing conditions. It is a busy life of specialized work, watches, and drills.


"Since joining the Navy, I've learned that I can adapt more easily," said Curtis. "When I first got here I was very afraid and didn't want to go on a ship. Now I really like it, and have learned that I like adventure."
