Summer tradition back on track...

FairTrain will likely be running next month

The pieces are gradually falling into place that will allow FairTrain to make its annual run next month. After a spring and summer of uncertainty the Indiana Transportation Museum appears to be meeting requirements to get back on track in time for the State Fair which starts August 5.

Museum President Jeff Kehler said this week that his non-profit organization "is gearing up" to run the popular FairTrain which has made daily runs to the fair for nearly 40 years. This year the train will be set to run August 5 to August 21. That's assuming final inspections prescribed by the Hoosier Heritage Port Authority are met which Kehler said he feels confident can be accomplished. The port authority owns the rail line.

The museum is the line's only customer on the former Nickel Plate Railroad which extends 37 miles from Indianapolis to Tip-

ton and runs just east of the state fairgrounds. Besides the FairTrain, the Transportation Museum operates other excursion trains during the year including a "train to dinner" and Polar Bear Express during the Christmas season.

Problems started in March when the port authority suspended permission to use the rails after getting complaints from seven former museum volunteers who questioned the safety of the museum's operation. The Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) also got involved and sent inspectors to look into the situation, but were apparently satisfied. The port authority then adopted a new policy of use which outlined safety requirements which Kehler said are being met.

Westfield's parks department has completed imaging of the city's extensive trails system using technology from Google.

Two employees from the department spent three days walking through Westfield's parks and along the trails with the Google Trekker - a 50-pound backpack equipped with multiple 3-D cameras.

"The Trekker allows us to capture 3-D images of our trails system so that people can get a realistic idea of what the trails look like from an online vantage point," parks employee Emily Clark said.

Clark, along with her coworker Brittany Goger, clocked an impressive 20 miles over the three-day period in 90 degree heat.

The images will be compiled by Google and loaded online, viewable in a fashion similar to Google's street view tool.

Sheridan Rotarians spent a productive evening this past Tuesday working hard to complete their project at the Community Park. The park's Shelter House is partially surrounded by juniper bushes which have overgrown their beds and covered over the walkways. The Rotarians are working to remove the junipers so the sidewalks can be become functional again. The project will also allow for easier cleaning and repair of the building exterior foundation.

According to club president Steve Martin, "Tuesday was a warm and relatively humid evening to be working outside but this part of the project was completed in about an hour so it was not too bad on us. We have more work to do to finish the project but that will have to wait for another evening. The town provides their dump truck for us to load the removed junipers on to, and an hour's worth of work just about fills the truck to overflowing. Our goal is to remove all these overgrown junipers from all around the building."






