## New portion of Monon Trail opens today

By the time you read this, a new portion of the Monon Trail may be open.

Officials were to open a new three-mile section of the trail in the northern part of the county this morning. The section will connect a part of the trail from 216th Street to Lamong Road in Sheridan.

The newly opened part of the Monon will extend a portion of the trail southeast towards Westfield. The already-opened portion in Sheridan extends southeast from the intersection of State Road 38 and Open Street down to Lamong Road about a third-mile south of the highway.

#### **BREAKING NEWS**

Westfield's portions of the trail are slowly but surely coming together. The trail is already open from 146th Street to State Road 32, then another part is open from

streets; once that is finished, the trail will be connected from Westfield to Sheridan. Construction is anticipated to be complete by 2017.

The second phase yet to be finished is construction of the Monon Bridge over State Road 32 and Tournament Court. That should being next year as well.

In all, the Monon Trail begins in downtown Indianapolis and heads up into Carmel, across a strip of land that once accommodated the Monon Railway. Carmel's portion of the trail opened in 2002.

### **Additional parking** available for **Farmers Market**

### **Jake Laird Community** Day is Tuesday at **Quaker Park**



## SAFETY

- ¬ Stress the importance of how to safely cross streets where a crossing guard is not present. Teach children to look carefully to the left, right and then left again if you have to cross the street.
- ¬ Have your children put everything they carry in a backpack or school bag so that they don't drop things on their way to school.

#### IF YOUR CHILDREN RIDE A BIKE result of teenagers driving to school. TO SCHOOL

- ¬ If your child rides a bike to school, ensure that they are wearing the proper safety equipment to include a helmet, light-colored clothing and proper reflective or lighting devices for their bike.
- ¬ Review with them the rules of the road and the proper use of hand signals.

### THE SCHOOL BUS

- ¬ Make sure your child stands at least 10 feet (5 giant steps) from the road while waiting for the school bus. The child will then be out of the way of traffic. Have younger children practice taking 5 giant steps to become familiar with 10 feet.
- ¬ Ensure that children are not engaging in horseplay or other activities that may subject them to unnecessary hazards associated with vehicular traffic while waiting at bus stops.
- ¬ Make sure that children know to wait for the bus to come to a complete stop before school. Motorists cited for either of these
- ¬ Be sure that your children can visually see the bus driver at all times before moving to board the bus.
- ¬ Encourage your children to wear a lap/shoulder seat belt if one is provided on the bus.
- ¬ Reinforce the rule that the school bus driver is in-charge when they are on the school bus. School bus drivers have a tremendous responsibility to ensure that their undivided attention is focused on delivering our children to and from school in the safest way possible. Unruly, noisy or children moving about on the bus only stands to create a distraction for the bus driver that ultimately takes away from their ability to safely and effectively focus on driving.
- ¬ Warn children that if they drop something when getting on or off a bus that they should never pick it up. Instead, they should tell the bus driver and follow the driver's

instructions. If they bend over to pick up a dropped object, they might not be seen by the driver and could be hurt if the driver pulls away from the stop.

#### REMINDERS FOR MORNING AND LATE-AFTERNOON COMMUTERS

- ¬ Be prepared for a longer commute due to the addition of school buses being out and about and increased vehicular traffic as a
- ¬ Expect the unexpected...watch for the possibility of children darting out into the street or children riding their bicycles especially during the dark hours of the morning.
- ¬ Be patient and observe the law when approaching or following a school bus that activates its stop arm for loading and unloading of children.
- ¬ Be very mindful of intersections where WHEN WAITING FOR AND RIDING children are prone to gather for the bus or at designated bus stops.
  - $\neg$  Be mindful when traveling in or around areas where schools are located and the reduced speed limit. The typical speed in a school zone in Noblesville is 20 mph.
  - ¬ The Noblesville Police Department takes a very proactive and committed stance to enforcing school bus arm violations and speeding in school zones. Officers are actively observing for potential violators each school morning and afternoon in order to provide the children of our community with the safest possible means to and from violations are required to make a mandatory appearance in court and if found guilty, can be fined up to \$10,000.00 for the offense.


The parks department reported four completed projects during the second quarter. Eagle Scout Nick Svendsen planted



## Golden Eagles keep focus on themselves

With the start of the IHSAA football season now being counted in hours - 72 hours as of Friday morning - Guerin Catholic's program is using this week for a little bit of down time.


But for most of the summer, GC kept the focus on itself. The Golden Eagles practiced on Mondays and Wednesdays, then would lift on the remaining days, with some conditioning built into the lifting. The Golden Eagles begin their season the same as last year, taking on Martinsville and Lafayette Central Catholic in the first two weeks. Guerin Catholic will also be a charter member of the Circle City Conference, taking on Brebeuf Jesuit, Bishop Chatard, Roncalli and Heritage Christian.

All Sports Pass prices are listed as follows:




