## So far, 2016 has been an exceptional election year

With 2016 being an election year we can expect a lot of political activity, but the year so far has been exceptional to say the least. From Hamilton County to the national scene the year has brought surprises, controversies and emerging leaders and candidates not imagined a year ago. And, the year is far from over.

Among the biggest surprises was Gov. Mike Pence being chosen as Donald Trump's vice presidential running mate.



The local result of that came when Congresswoman Susan Brooks made a determined but unsuccessful bid to get the Republican nomination for governor. She was one of four candidates seeking to take Pence's place on the ticket for governor. But, that honor goes to Eric Holcomb, Pence's lieutenant governor.

Coming up in August will be a caucus to fill Holcomb's place on the ballot for the state's number two position. And, another caucus will be held to likely reinstate Brooks as the GOP candidate for Congress in the 5th District. She had to withdraw in order to be a candidate for the gubernatorial nomination.

County Republicans go into this fall's local election with a new party chairwoman, Laura Campbell. She was seated by the GOP State Committee after a tough and indecisive battle for the chairmanship when Pete Emigh resigned the post.

For Democrats, the big story has been the fact that the party has filled the ticket in Hamilton County for the first time in years. This will mean a county November campaign, something that is very unusual. The county chairman Keith Clock, like Emigh, is stepping down, but until the end of the year.

In the Democratic presidential primary, Bernie Sanders carried the county as well as the state. But, due to the party's unusual and controversial method of seating national convention delegates, Sanders got less than

half of the state's delegate votes in the party convention this week.

For the first time, Emails are playing a part in this year's politics. From a local GOP primary race for county commissioner to the national Democratic high command, folks have learned what they should have known, that sending emails into cyberspace can be dangerous. As we know the Democrats' national chairwoman lost her job over hacked emails designed to derail Sanders' candidacy.

So, its been a volatile political year with the general election campaign yet to come. The national scene is certain to get the spotlight, but we will have important elec-

Of major interest for local schools are the school board elections where members will be chosen at the time of the general election on a non-partisan ballot. Filing for school boards in the county's six school corporations began July 26 and runs until noon on August 26.

As of yesterday three candidates have been certified. For Noblesville School Board incumbent Gary Duvall and first timer Carl Johnson, IV have filed for at-large seats. In the Hamilton Southeastern district incumbent Howard Stevenson has filed for re-election from Fall Creek Township.

Every six minutes an underground utility is damaged because someone failed to call 811. August 11 serves as a reminder to always call 811 prior to any digging project to have utility lines located and marked.

Several underground utility stakeholders have joined forces to host a free 811 Day Block Party event Thurs. Aug. 11 at 221 W. Main St. in Carmel, Ind. next to the Monon Trail.

The 811 Day Block Party is open to the public, and includes interactive and educational activities. Guests will have chances to win free prizes, participate in giveaways, and enjoy desserts and refreshments.

There are millions of miles of utilities buried throughout the U.S. providing vital energy like water, electricity and natural gas. The block party event will serve as a fun and valuable reminder to always call before digging.

811 is the federally designated call before you dig number that helps homeowners and professionals avoid serious injury or utility damage.

The depth of utility lines can vary for a number of reasons, such as erosion, previous digging projects and uneven surfaces. Utility lines need to be properly marked because even when digging only a few inches, the risk of striking an underground utility line still exists.
