Bryan Clauson 1989-2016

## "A true ambassador for all motor sports"

Bryan Clauson could race anything, at any track - from the dirt tracks where he became a champion to the Indianapolis Motor Speedway.

The Noblesville driver proved that last May, when he had his best Indianapolis 500 finish in the afternoon of May 29 and drove a sprint car to the feature victory at Kokomo Speedway that night.

Clauson, 27, died Sunday evening from injuries sustained in a crash the night before at the Belleville (Kansas) Nationals midget race on the half-mile dirt oval. Clauson was airlifted to Bryan Medical Center in Lincoln, Neb., but did not survive.

Clauson was born in Carmichael, Calif. on June 15, 1989 and got his start in Quarter Midgets at age 5. Even at that young of an age, his talent was evident - as an 8-year-old, he won 30 races. By the time he turned 10 in 1999, Bryan had won over 200 Quarter Midget races.

Clauson and his family moved to Noblesville in 1999, and he graduated from Noblesville High School in 2007. But he had already started on his path to stardom long before then. When he was 14, Clauson moved to the Sprint cars, and in 2004 won six events and was named Rookie of the Year at the Lawrenceburg and Bloomington speedways.

On June 9, 2004, six days before turning 15, Clauson won his first USAC feature race. He was victorious in the Kenyon Midget race that night at the Indianapolis Speedrome, the first of three wins at that track in 2004.

He would go on to win at least one USAC feature a year through 2016. Clauson's most prolific year was 2013, when he triumphed in 22 USAC races, from locations as varied as Perris, California to Ocala, Florida.

Clauson's final USAC feature win was on Aug. 3, at Beloit, Wisconsin. He totaled 112 career USAC wins, placing him fifth on the all-time list.

Clauson's sudden passing not only shocked and saddened the racing community, but Noblesville and the state of Indiana as well.

"Our thought and prayers are with the family and friends of Bryan Clauson," said Noblesville Mayor John Ditslear. "The world knew him as a talented driver, but off the track he was an even better person. Bryan lived and was raised in Noblesville and represented our city well whenever he was away. He brought so much joy to our

community as we watched him grow through the driving ranks and participates in some of the sport's biggest races. His presence and humble smile will be missed."

"Karen and I were deeply saddened to learn of the passing of Noblesville's Bryan Clauson," said Indiana Governor Mike Pence. "He was a tremendous competitor and his incredible talent was evident, from the Hoosier state's many short tracks to the famed Indianapolis Motor Speedway.

"He was deeply respected by his fellow competitors and beloved by his family. As we pause to honor the passing of a Hoosier racing champion, let us keep the Clauson family and his fiancée, Lauren, in our thoughts and prayers."

We would like to thank everybody who has shown their concern toward us and kept us in their prayers. We will never be able to truly thank you. We would also like to thank

the staff at Bryan Medical Center who stood and fought with our Bryan since he arrived here early yesterday morning.

We know that our Bryan is also your Bryan and that you would like to participate in honoring him. A service will be held at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway at a date and time to be announced soon. # Fall Creek Road fire injures firefighter, causes damage

Fishers Firefighters responded to a house fire just after noon Sunday in the Geist area. Approximately 40 firefighters made an aggressive attack into the residence at the 11500 block of Fall Creek Road, keeping the bulk of the fire contained to the three-car garage. Parts of the house did sustain water and smoke damage. Firefighters had the fire under control in about 55 minutes.

No civilians were injured in the blaze but one firefighter did sustain a minor injury and was transported to the hospital for evaluation and treatment.

The cause is under investigation but not considered suspicious at this time. No dollar loss amount available yet.

Assisting Agencies were the Carmel Fire Department, Indianapolis Fire Department, Noblesville Fire Department, Fishers Police Department, Fishers Fire Corps., and American Red Cross.

Clauson was considered the nation's top short-track dirt-car driver with four U.S. Auto Club national championships - two in sprint cars and two in midgets - as well as wins in prestigious events the likes of the Chili Bowl, Turkey Night Grand Prix and Belleville Nationals.

In the mold of old-school racers like A.J. Foyt, Gary Bettenhausen and Tony Stewart, eager and willing to race anything anywhere, Clauson set a goal in 2016 of competing in 200 races, including the 100th Running of the Indianapolis 500 presented by PennGrade Motor Oil. Driving the No. 88 Cancer Treatment Centers of America Honda for Dale Coyne/Jonathan Byrd's Racing, Clauson finished a career-best 23rd in this year's Indy 500 and led his first laps in the historic race.

Saturday's race at the Belleville Nationals, where Clauson was the defending champion, was the 116th on his trek toward 200. He picked up his 27th feature win this season in the midget race Wednesday night at Beloit, Kan.

Many drivers sent messages of support and condolence through social media on Monday after Clauson's passing was announced. Conor Daly, a fellow Noblesville resident and three-time Indianapolis 500 qualifier, posted a series of messages and pictures on Twitter. "Our sport has lost an incredible person," Daly began. "A winner more times than most of us will ever be. It was a true honor to be your teammate, Bryan."

Pippa Mann, who was a teammate of Clauson during this year's 500, said on Twitter, "The world has lost more than a great racer, it has lost a great man. Rest in Peace, Bryan Clauson." She also posted several messages of support, and changed her avatar to say a green and white circle with "BC" inside - Clauson was known as "BC" to friends and family.

Clauson earned a USAC-INDYCAR scholarship for winning the 2010 USAC national driver's title. The scholarship earned Clauson six Indy Lights starts in 2011 in a car shared with current Verizon IndyCar Series rookie Conor Daly at Sam Schmidt Motorsports while Clauson continued to race in USAC's national series. His best finish in eight career Indy Lights was third at Iowa Speedway in 2011.

Clauson won the scholarship award again in 2012, allowing him to make his Indianapolis 500 debut in 2012 with Sarah Fisher Hartman Racing, qualifying 31st and finishing 30th. Clauson returned to Indianapolis Motor Speedway in 2015, finishing

31st in the Indy 500 for KVSH/Jonathan Byrd's Racing.

Clauson also served as a development driver for Chip Ganassi Racing in 2007-08, winning an ARCA race in 2007. He made 21 NASCAR Xfinity Series starts in 2008, finishing second in rookie points where he teamed occasionally with three-time Indianapolis 500 winner Dario Franchitti.

Clauson is survived by his parents, Tim and Di, his sister Taylor and fiancée Lauren Stewart. Funeral arrangements are pending. A memorial service in his honor will take place at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway at a date soon to be announced.



# "Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over"

The Hamilton County Traffic Safety Partnership announced today its participation in the national and state-wide 2016 Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over enforcement mobilization occurring August 12 through September 5, 2016. The Traffic Safety Partnership is a consortium of law enforcement agencies in Hamilton County, including Carmel Police, Cicero Police, Fishers Police, Noblesville Police, Westfield Police and Indiana State Police Departments along with the Sheriff's Office, working to increase the usage of seatbelts, to combat aggressive driving, and to decrease impaired driving with the overall goal of creating a safer Hamilton County. Officers will join more than 250 state and local law enforcement agencies, and thousands more across the country, to conduct high-visibility patrols encouraging drivers against drinking and driving.

"Ensuring drivers and their passengers are safe on the road is one of our key priorities," stressed Hamilton County Sheriff Mark Bowen. "This campaign allows us the opportunity to remind everyone behind the wheel that driving intoxicated is against the law. We will be out in full patrol and chances are if you drive impaired, we will pull you over."

Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over is an annual enforcement effort supported by federal funding allocated to the Hamilton County Traffic Safety Partnership from the Traffic Safety division of the Indiana Criminal Justice Institute (ICJI). Officers from agencies across the county will work overtime to conduct sobriety patrols and checkpoints around the clock. According to ICJI, in 2015, there were 4,828 alcohol-impaired collisions in Indiana, resulting in 92 fatalities. This is a 26.5 percent decrease in the number

of alcohol-impaired collisions, and a 9 percent decrease in resulting fatalities, from 2014.

"While this decrease in alcohol-impaired collisions and fatalities means we're on the right track, there's still room for improvement" said ICJI Director Dave Murtaugh. "In an effort to ensure our roads are safe at every turn, we will continue increase Indiana's education and enforcement on impaired driving."

Indiana law enforcement agencies have been actively involved in the Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over campaign for over 20 years.

## Community Health Network to acquire Alpha Home Physical Therapy

Community Home Health Services, a wholly-owned subsidiary of Community Health Network, will acquire Indianapolis-based Alpha Home Physical Therapy, effective Sept. 30.

At that time, the two entities will become one under the Community banner and Alpha's employees will join Community Home Health as part of the network's ambulatory care services division.

"The union between Community and Alpha will prove to be very beneficial to home health patients throughout central Indiana," said Tony Javorka, president of ambulatory care for Community. "This strengthens and expands the impact of Community's home care team at a time when home care is increasingly in-demand while also allowing us to help Alpha's patients connect more easily to our full continuum of care."

Becoming part of a larger care network will help Alpha coordinate and streamline services for its current patients, while ensuring the most-effective communication between caregivers.

"More patients are being encouraged to recover at home following a hospital stay," said Doug Klink, who is currently the president of Alpha Home Physical Therapy. "These patients benefit greatly when their home care is delivered as part of a large, integrated network that also includes hospital care as well as primary and specialty physician care."

After the transition, Klink will become vice president of Community's post-acute services, and Lisa Collins will continue on in her network role as executive director of Home Health Services.

No reductions in staff are expected as a result of the transaction for either Community or Alpha, and there will be no disruption to patient care during the transition. Community Home Health will continue to serve Alpha's current patients, who are located across 21 counties of central Indiana.

## Sobriety checkpoint scheduled for this weekend

The Hamilton County Traffic Safety Partnership will conduct a sobriety checkpoint on the night of Saturday, Aug. 13 and the early hours of Sunday, Aug. 14.

At a sobriety checkpoint, law enforcement officers evaluate drivers for signs of alcohol or drug impairment at a specified point along the roadway, often depending upon the support of local property owners for the use of appropriate land. Checkpoint sites are selected based upon analysis of available crash and impaired driving arrest data and a consideration of officer safety.

Vehicles are stopped in a specific sequence, such as every other vehicle, every third vehicle, every fourth vehicle or by stopping three, four, or five cars in succession and allowing other traffic to proceed while checking the stopped vehicles. The planned sequence in which vehicles are stopped depends on the

number of officers available to staff the checkpoint, traffic congestion, and other safety concerns.

Upon making contact with the driver, the officer advises them that they've been stopped at an HCTSP sobriety checkpoint and asks for the driver's license and the vehicle's registration. If, in the course of the contact, the officer detects that alcohol may be involved and that the driver may be impaired or if some other issue arises, then the vehicle is directed into a pull-off area for further investigation. Further investigation may involve the Standardized Field Sobriety Tests (SFSTs). On the other hand, if all looks right during the initial contact, the driver is often on his or her way in less than two minutes.

Officers staffing the sobriety checkpoints work on an overtime basis paid by grant funds from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration through the Indiana Governor's Council on Impaired and Dangerous Driving.





Another diving event, another Olympic medal for David Boudia.

The Noblesville native and his partner, Carmel's Steele Johnson, earned the silver medal in the Men's Synchro Platform event Monday evening at the Rio De Janeiro games. Boudia and Johnson scored 457.11 points, behind only the Chinese team of Chen Aisen and Lin Yue, who won the gold medal with by scoring 496.98 points, an Olympic record.

This is the third medal for Boudia in the Olympics. He got the bronze in the synchronized at the 2012 games in London, and then won the gold medal in the Men's 10-meter Platform. Johnson, an Olympic rookie, earned a medal on his first try at the games.

Both men will compete for the U.S. in the 10-meter platform, which takes place late next week.

upset the fourth seeded French team of Gael Monfils and Jo-Wilfried Tsonga 6-1, 6-4 in the first round, but lost to Austrians Oliver Marach and Alexander Peya 6-4, 6-7 (2), 6-3 in the second round.

Ram isn't done yet, however. It was announced on Tuesday that he will team up with Venus Williams to play in the Olympics mixed doubles. Play in mixed doubles begins today. The Americans will take on the Dutch team of Jean-Julien Rojer and Kiki Bertens at 10 a.m.
