**Doctor not guilty**

In late breaking news from last night, Dr. Larry Ley has been found not guilty. ### NHS teacher accused of inappropriate conduct with student

A Noblesville High School teacher has been accused of inappropriate conduct with a student in 2012.

Marnie Cooke, Noblesville Schools' Director of Marketing and Communication, released the following statement:

"A Noblesville High School teacher has been accused of inappropriate conduct with a former student. The alleged incident took place in 2012, when the student attended Noblesville High School.

"Once this concern was raised, we immediately contacted the Noblesville Police Department and have worked jointly in cooperation with authorities. The employee in question was immediately removed from contact with students and is no longer employed with Noblesville Schools.

"Safety is our top priority and we take claims of this nature very seriously. We will provide further information to parents as available.

Lt. Bruce Barnes, Noblesville Police Department's Public Information Officer, said the "allegations were brought to our attention" on Aug. 2.

"It is still an ongoing investigation and we have no timetable as to when we might meet with the prosecutor's office," said Barnes.

# NPD swearing in and promotion ceremony

The Noblesville Police Department recently held a ceremony to officially swear in two of their newest police officers. The ceremony took place in the council chambers located at City Hall. In attendance for the event were Mayor John Ditslear, families, friends, members of the community, government officials and officers of the police department. Chief Kevin Jowitt officiated the ceremony.

The new officers are Christopher Burton and David Barnes. They were both hired on June 20 and have been receiving orientation training since that time. Both officers are graduates of the Indiana Law Enforcement Academy and were employed as police officers with other law enforcement agencies prior to being hired by Noblesville. The officers are currently assigned to the Field Training & Evaluation Program where they will spend a minimum of 16 weeks. At the completion of the program, the officers will then be certified to work in a solo-capacity and will be assigned to the patrol division for the balance of their probationary year.

## Embassy Suites Noblesville groundbreaking set for Thursday

A groundbreaking ceremony for the new \$30 million Embassy Suites by Hilton Hotel and Conference Center will take place from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. Thursday.

The Embassy Suites by Hilton Noblesville will be a 187,700-square-foot hotel with 198 suites, 20,000 square feet of conference space and 5,000 square feet of meeting space at the southwest intersection of Tegler Drive and Olio Road.

The development is 15.04 total acres and will be divided into seven lots, including a 1.5-acre retention pond. The seven-to eight-floor hotel, conference center and 367-space parking is on 6.26 acres. Of the five out lots, three are planned to be marketed and sold to restaurants. Total capital investment for the land, hotel and conference center will be approximately \$30 million. The project will create 70 full time and 15 to 25 part-time jobs.

Embassy Suites will become the largest hotel with conference space and one of the largest meeting venues in Hamilton County. Embassy’s high-end hotel and conference center is a perfect complement to the nearby high-tech business parks in and the vibrant retail village in and around Hamilton Town Center in Noblesville.





**ORDINANCE NO. 08-02-2016-2**  
**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CERTAIN SECTIONS OF CHAPTER 75 OF TITLE VIII OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE TOWN OF CICERO**  
WHEREAS, the Town Council of the town of Cicero, Indiana, finds it to be in the best interest, health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the town of Cicero to amend certain sections of Chapter 75 which is entitled Traffic Schedules of Title VIII of the Cicero Municipal Code of Ordinances.  
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of the town of Cicero, Indiana as follows:  
1. Schedule I, Speed Limits, under Chapter 75 of Title VIII is hereby amended to define the speed limit as 20 mph on a portion of Jackson St. to read as follows:  
Jackson St. (Catherine St. to a point 416ft. west from the center point of the intersection of Main St. and Jackson St.)  
2. The current listing defining the portion of Jackson St. From Catherine to Main St. as a 20 mph zone is hereby deleted.  
3. Except as amended in this Ordinance, all of the other terms, conditions and provisions set forth in Chapter 75 of Title VIII of the Cicero Municipal Code of Ordinances shall remain in full force and effect.  
4. This Ordinance shall become effective on the date of its passage and publication according to law.  
THIS ORDINANCE IS HEREBY PASSED by the Town Council of the town of Cicero on this 2nd day of August, 2016.

# Westfield Mayor's Yellow Tie Ball

Approximately 500 people attended the fifth annual Westfield Mayor's Yellow Tie Ball at the new Grand Park Events Center, raising approximately \$20,000 for the Hamilton County Youth Assistance Program (YAP).

# 2016 FOOTBALL PREVIEW

*Noblesville Millers...*

## New coach; lots of seniors

A new coach, moving up in the ranks, and a different quarterback, a transfer from Kansas, will the center stage spotlight when Noblesville opens its 2016 season this Friday at Lawrence North.

The new coach is well known. Jason Simmons has served as a Miller assistant under former head coach Lance Scheib. He also coached Hamilton Heights to a sectional championship six years ago before spending some time in the front office at Ben Davis.

Simmons will try to succeed not only on the gridiron but also in an attempt to restore confidence in a once-proud Noblesville program which hasn't won a sectional since 2000 and last had a winning season in 2001.

There will be a new quarterback, for certain. Gone is Luke Meloh, who not only passed for over 900 yards last season. The new signal caller could be, likely will be, 6-3, 210-pound junior Ryan Barnes, a move-in from Kansas City. Or, it could be senior McGwire Plummer, the backup to Meloh last season. Plummer, a senior, is targeted to start at defensive corner.

"Barnes is a good looking player," said Simmons.

Saying he "feels good" about the defense, Simmons says the offense has been "like a roller coaster ride. Good thing," said the coach, "what is wrong with the offense is fixable."

The starting offensive line is big with 278-pound Ben Collins at left tackle, 264-pound Josh Garcia at left guard, 250-pound Drew Hartmann at center, 220-pound Daric Gordon at right guard and 243-pound Seth Pope at right tackle. Nolan Ginther, a 186-pounder, will start at tight end. Pope, a junior, is the only non-senior in the group. Simmons says Collins, Hartmann and Gordon are playing very well.

"Gordon is solid," said the coach. "He's old-school; a tough kid."

Rounding out the offense will be senior Ben Gruver and senior Jackson Thurman at wide-receivers, senior Ben Herron at the

slot, senior Andrew Scheib at fullback and senior Chandler Hurst at running back. Also expected to see a lot of action lugging the football are senior Tyler Gonzalez, and Plummer. Herron, Thurman and Gruver can catch the football.

Simmons seems most comfortable with the defense.

"I feel good about the defense," said the coach. "I think we can develop depth."

Look for lots of good things from senior linebacker Grant Bullard and strong safety Gruver, a two-way starter on the depth chart.

Noblesville has good linebackers in Bullard, senior Marcus Emmert, and senior Will Schultze. With Plummer and senior

Brett Bell at the corners, the secondary is strong led by senior Harris Camp, Gruver and sophomore Zac Tuinei.

Up front on defense are the Big 3 of Garcia, senior Clay Weise and 250-pound sophomore Dalton Davis.

# Plenty of skilled people

With experienced and talented skilled people and a promising but inexperienced offensive line, if Coach Mitch Street can stir the mix then expect Hamilton Heights to put points on the board this fall.

Lots of points.

“We have lots returning with our skilled group,” said the coach. “Zach Stevens (right guard) is the only lineman with varsity experience.”

That’s not to suggest that the line will not be a factor. There is talent up front with 245-pound junior Troy Bergesen at left tackle, 280-pound junior Noah Souder at left guard, 210-pound senior Jarrod Flanders at center, 210-pound Stevens at right guard and 245-pound junior Hunter Wiles at right tackle.

“We’ve got some talent in the line,” Street agreed. “We have some room to grow. How deep are we? It will take a while. The line is a work in progress.”

The skilled players are experienced, and very talented.

Quarterback Josh Feltz, taking advantage of an injury opportunity, threw for over 530 yards in five games last season. He will be backed up by a junior, Drayden Thomas.

“Feltz has good ability,” Street said.

Feltz has an explosive tight end, senior Sterling Weatherford, who can score from anywhere in a variety of ways. He’s a great pass receiver and a great runner who when he handles the pigskin is off to the races.

Weatherford caught two TD passes from Feltz last Friday in a scrimmage against Anderson.

Feltz has a ton of options when throwing the pigskin. Jesse Brown, Caymn Lutz and Riley White all three are seniors, and all three are capable of heading for pay dirt when they grab the pigskin.

The running attack will be keyed by senior fullback Clayton Cowan.

“We have some good sophomores for support,” Street said. “We have a ton of guys in our offensive attack.”

Souder, at the nose, and Wiles, at the anchor position, will double up from the offense and start in the defensive line. They will be joined by 270-pound junior Dylan Bannon at tackle and 235-pound senior Nick Burk at end.

The linebackers also will double up. Stevens will be in the middle and Cowan and White on the outside.

The secondary is filled with two-way players. Brown will be at one corner and Michael Cross, a junior, will be at the other. Weatherford will be the strong safety and Lutz will be the free safety.

“The defense is solid,” Street believes. “Lots of two-way guys. We have depth up front. We’ll come after people.”

Sheridan this season is a very young football team. That’s challenging news for Coach Bud Wright. He has had a few challenges down through the years. This is Wright’s 52 year as a coach, 51 at Sheridan. He has won more games than any coach in Indiana high school football history. Wright is five victories away from reaching 400 victories.

On the other side of that coin, Sheridan is experienced. There are seven sophomore/junior Blackhawks ticketed to start on offense. All have varsity experience. Same picture with the defense. Seven starters are sophomores or juniors. All with experience.

“We’re veteran, but young,” said Wright. “We have a way to go.”

Sheridan’s young and inexperienced factor shows at the quarterback position where sophomore Drake Delph takes the controls. His backs are a pair of juniors, Gunner Williams and Cole Cummings.

“Delph doesn’t have lots of experience,” said Wright. “He is doing a decent job.”

Wright will put his famed running game into the hands of junior Joe Callahan, senior Kenny Burnell and junior Gunner Williams. Most of the attack last year was handled by now-departed quarterback Jake Chesney. Callahan is a three-year starter who last season was Wright’s second-leading rusher with nearly 700 yards. Kenny Burnell gained over 500 yards.

Sheridan will go as its running attack goes. Are the Blackhawks up to it?  
“I hope so,” answered Wright.

Brody Perry, a junior, will be the wide-receiver and the No. 1 target when Delph throws the football.

Keying the running game will be a big and talented offensive line.

Avery Bundy, a 280-pound, senior starting guard, last year was named to The Reporter’s second team. He will be joined at guard by Alex Gipson, a 252-pound senior, who was named second team to the defensive unit. The center will be 252-pound senior Karl Whaley. At tackles will be 270-pound sophomore Ian Pence and 258-pound junior Tanner Swindle. The tight end is big, too, 200-pound, 6-6 sophomore Rhett Williams.

Wright is counting on that size and talent.

“We’re going to be big up front on defense, too,” said the coach.

Avery will be at nose and Gipson and 230-pound junior Hunter Pflugh will play tackle.

# Rocks ready for big guys

One thing that jumps off the page when looking at Westfield’s offensive attack this season is the throwing prospect of senior quarterback Andy Sweet firing to senior wide-receiver Evan Manley.

Kind of like last season when Westfield’s Ryan Pepiot led Hamilton County in passing by tossing for 2,072 yards. That’s when Sweet was spending his time with the junior varsity. Manley led the county in receptions with 47 and threw for 692 yards.

“It’s a really good combination,” said Westfield coach Jake Gilbert. “Sweet threw a pair of touchdown passes to Manley last week against Anderson in the scrimmage.”

Gilbert says he is happy with the offense, saying that it has a chance to be “powerful.”

Who will QB the Tigers?

Lots of folks might be guessing who will quarterback the Fishers Tigers when they open the season Friday at North Central. Like, Fishers fans. Like, North Central.

Keep guessing. Coach Rick Wimmer isn't telling. It could be senior Joe Smyth. Or, it could be junior Matt Wolff.

"They both will play," Wimmer said. "There isn't lots of difference in the two. Both are good throwers, with strong arms. Both can move the football."

It's a big decision, replacing graduated Zach Eaton, who last season tossed for over 1,400 yards.

Wimmer will give his quarterbacks lots to options to throw to. Such as, senior DeVonte Adams. Such as senior Luke Reiter. They are a pair of speedsters who likely will start at split end. There also are senior Jaren Tunstill and sophomore Colin Statz. Also, there's those big guys at tight end, 6-0, 195-pound senior Kaleb Clark and 6-5, 220 senior Michael Johnson.

And, just where does R.J. Potts figure into this picture? One of the best football players in the state, the 6-3, 202-pound senior could be at wide receiver or on defense at a safety.

Or, likely, both spots.

"Potts is a great football player," Wimmer stresses.

Ready at the running back positions are 175-pound Trevor Newman at tailback and 191-pound junior Isaiah Dunnuck at fullback.

Wimmer likes a balanced offense, so expect the Tigers to strike through the air and also on the ground.

A big and talented front line should make both, running and passing, a threat. Wimmer likely will open with Charlie Bernhardt, 6-6, 248 senior, and Seth Rogers, 6-4, 228 senior, at tackles; Eric Fahrnkopf, 6-5, 365 senior, and Luke Martin, 6-4, 302 junior, at guards, and Adam Hochstedler, 5-10, 225 senior, at center.

Yes, two 300-pounders in that front line.

"Our offense has good depth in the skilled positions," Wimmer said. "The depth is good in numbers. We're a little thin to start with on the offensive and defensive lines."

In that defensive line will be 6-1, 205-pound senior Eli Kipp at end, 6-0, 225-pound junior Nick Douglas at nose, 6-0, 230-pound senior Logan Weaver at tackle and 6-2, 202-pound senior Jake Winkle at the other end.

The linebackers will be led by Potts, and joining him will be Brendan Toungate, a 6-1, 192-pound senior, and Michael Nettleton, a 6-0, 194-pound junior.

Hamilton Southeastern Royals...

May has some spots to fill

In nearly all areas of the state last season, Hamilton Southeastern would have produced a dominating season. Coach Scott May's Royals went 8-2.

Problem was, the Royals played in Hamilton County. The two losses soured, a little, HSE's season. Southeastern lost to backyard rival Carmel, 28-7, in its opener and then fell, 38-22, to city neighbor Fishers in the opening round of the sectional, a Fishers team the Royals defeated 39-33 earlier in the season.

Lots of talented players are gone from that Southeastern team. Lots of new names are in the lineup. As usual, Southeastern has simply reloaded.

The biggest example of reloading perhaps is at quarterback. Last year Carter Poiry set a school record by throwing for 1,928 yards. This year's quarterback is 6-5, 195-pound senior Adam Mullett, who a year ago spent much of the season with the junior varsity and threw only seven varsity passes. Mullett will be backed up by a sophomore, Garrett Myren.

"We're getting better with our offense," May said. "We'll continue to run the run/pass option, taking what the opponent gives us."

Poiry was first-team Hamilton County Reporter quarterback. A second-teamer on the offensive side of the ball was running

back Aaron Matio, who also is gone after rushing for nearly 600 yards.

May will fill the holes in the running back spots with Jackson Sweeney, a junior, at tailback and Will Michaels, a senior, at H back.

"Sweeney is running the ball well," said May.

Starters at the receiver positions will be 6-4 senior Max Brooks and 6-1 junior Carter Lohman. The tight end will be 6-3, 215-pound senior Max Klink.

The Royals lost an outstanding receiver from last year, Reporter All-County first-team selection Greg Miller, who led Hamilton County with 47 catches for 713 yards last season.

Up front the Royals are inexperienced, but talented and big. The leader appears to be 6-5, 210-pound senior left tackle Zach Mutchner. He will be joined at tackle by 195-pound sophomore Zach Dechow, at guards by 250-pound senior Joe Myren and 300-pound senior Caleb Rutan and at center by 275-pound senior Sam Garvin.

"Our defense has a good mix," May added. "Alec Jessop (200-pound senior inside linebacker) was our leading tackler last season."

Zach Randall, a 210-pound senior, will be the other inside linebacker. Starting at

# Expect aerial fireworks

When talking with Carmel coach John Hebert about the upcoming season for his Greyhounds, names which pop front and center are seniors Jalen Walker and Ethan Merriweather, two of the best receivers in Indiana high school football.

Walker last season caught 27 balls for 425 yards and Merriweather had 21 catches for 267 yards.

“They have been looking good all summer,” said Hebert, who is about to begin his second season as the team’s head coach. “Walker is our go-to guy, our big play guy. Merriweather had several big catches last season.”

So, with two of the best receivers, who will be slinging the football for Carmel? Last year it was the now-graduated Mike Vikirup, who threw for nearly 1,000 yards in an offense equally mixed between passing and running.

This year it will be 6-2, 195-pound senior Elliot Charlebois, with strong backup support from 6-0, 175-pound Jake McDonald.

“It’s a week by week decision right now,” Hebert talked about the quarterback situation. “Both are playing well, making good decisions. McDonald threw a touch-down pass to Merriweather in the scrimmage last week and got us out of some 3/20 situations. Charlebois throws a good ball; got us some first downs.”

A third wide-receiver will be Bennett Kiley. Kurt Rafdal, a big 6-7, 235-pound senior, is the tight end.

The running game will be keyed by 173-pound sophomore Camari Hunt at tail-back and 190-pound senior Bryce Sharp at fullback.

“Hunt ran well in the scrimmage,” Hebert said.

Also expected to see playing time at the tailback position are senior Jerome Halsell and junior Will Schmidt.

Carmel, as usual, is big and talented up front. The guards will be 264-pound senior Jakob Ford and 288-pound senior Justin Williams. Starting at tackle will be 257-pound senior Mark Stickford and at center will be 273-pound senior Trevor Scott.

That’s a powerful load.

Hebert likes the defense.

“We’re coming along,” said the coach.

“Three or four players are turning it on.”

Hebert says defensive lineman Britt Beery is coming off an outstanding summer.

“An unbelievable summer,” Hebert said of his 6-6, 262 pound senior. “He really is a tough matchup for anyone.”

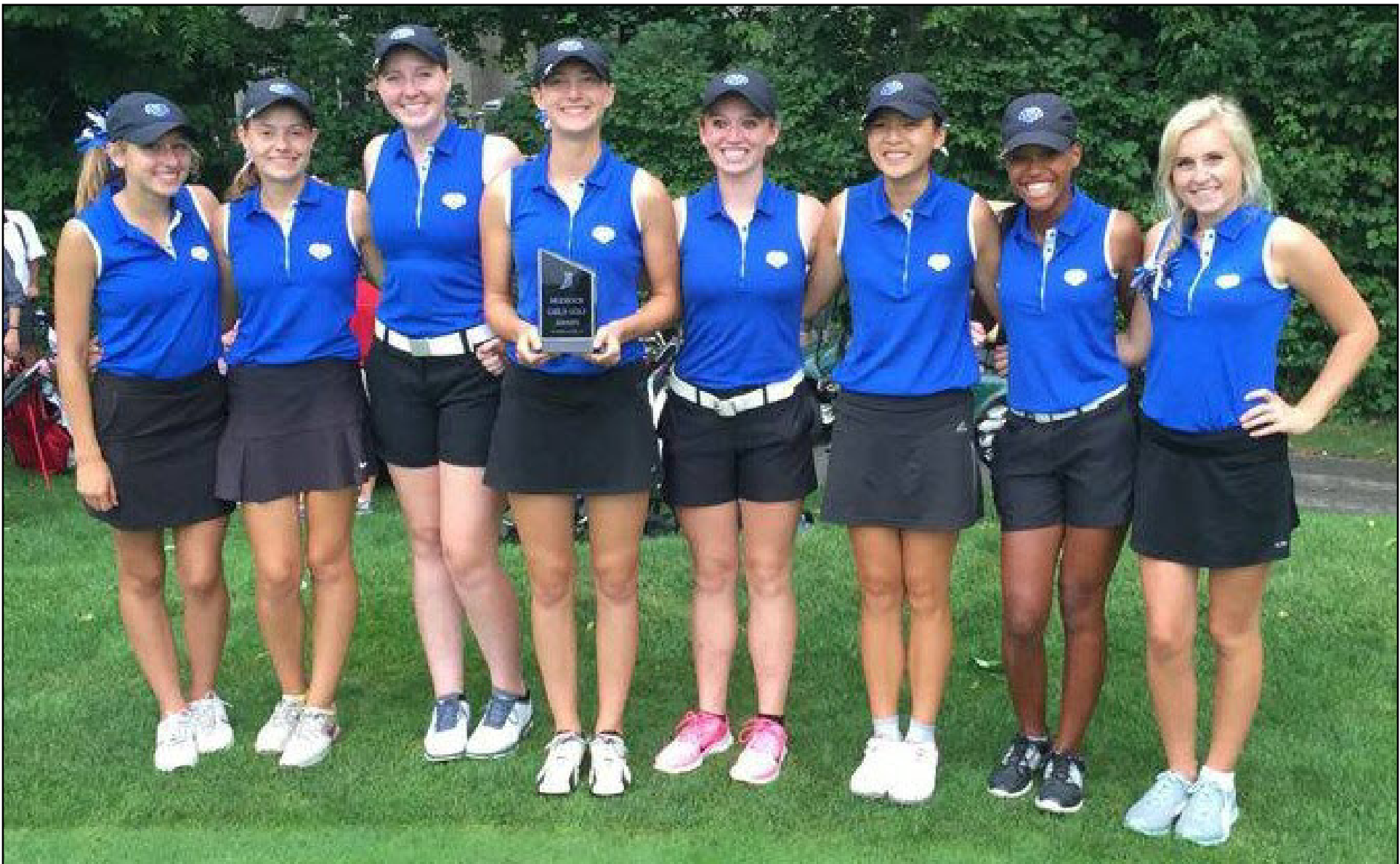
