Council and the support of numerous residents, Noblesville's fifth park will soon rise up out of an underdeveloped flood plain to become a cultural and community amenity unlike anything in Hamilton County.

As a driver of economic development, the Commons will serve as an attractive gateway to our wonderful and historic downtown. In fact, the park effectively extends the downtown area west of the White River. The City anticipates the Commons will lead to greater private development in the area while current properties surrounding the park should see a 12-to-15 percent increase in property value.

Before any ribbons are cut to open the Commons, exciting redevelopment is already happening. The expansion of Riverview Health and the new headquarters of BlueSky Technology Partners only add to the ensured success of Federal Hill. Even Wendy's got a much needed facelift.

Are you still asking the question – *What*

For music and theatre lovers, the First Merchants Pavilion amphitheater will showcase live music and stage productions, and serve as a new home for Shakespeare in the Park. Imagine all the potential concerts, plays and festivals we can attract to the Commons – and with ample parking – at least 1,100 spaces total within a five minute walk, including 181 spaces onsite.

If you'd rather join in on the fun, visitors are invited on stage to take part. Musical instruments will be built into the back wall that anyone can play thanks to a generous donation by the Noblesville Park Foundation.

The Rotary Club provided another generous donation to help fund the Noblesville Rotary Club Shelter.

Noblesville Main Street will relocate its Farmers Market from the Riverview Health lot to the Market Plaza on the west side of the Commons. This new home for the oldest market in Hamilton County will offer space for its 80 local vendors and a permanent building for restrooms.

In the City's initial design, a splash pad was planned – but was removed as a costsaving measure. The park's underground infrastructure could allow the addition of a splash pad in the future, but in the meantime, residents can enjoy the splash pads at Forest Park Aquatic Center and at Dillon

Construction is expected to be completed this fall, but the park's grassy areas will need time to grow for a grand opening in April 2017. The City's plans also allow for a future ice skating rink that could be assembled and operated at the Commons during the winter months beginning in November 2017. This temporary amenity would help create additional opportunities for year-round activation.

As a community gathering space for all generations to be enjoyed for generations to come, the Commons will enable the kind of culture-building that reflects Noblesville's own identity. None of this would be possible without the vision of Mayor Ditslear, the hard work of City employees and the commitment of dedicated community part-

*Carmel became the first school to win four state football championships with a dramatic 20-17 come-from-behind win over Fort Wayne Snider in the battle of two unbeaten teams in Class 5A. The game was played at the Hoosier Dome.

A 50-yard pass to tight end Geoff Lord by quarterback Bill Padgett with only 30 seconds left in the fourth quarter and a point-after kick by John Dillon deadlocked the game at 14-14.

WHEELCHAIR RAMP RENOVATION

LSS is raising funds for preservation and renovations, like replacing the decrepit and dangerous wheelchair ramp that was originally on the building.

The building is an historic renovated church that started life as a World War I Army barracks in Ohio. It was donated to a church in Noblesville after the war, and it was disassembled and transported it to Noblesville. It was dedicated here in April of 1938, and the Sanctuary's president bought it 75 years later, in April 2013, and started renovations. In November 2015, LSS became a 501(3)(c) not-for-profit organization, and is raising funds to continue preserving and renovating this unique performance space.

Logan Street Sanctuary needs help with taking care of this special building and with replacing the unsafe broken-down wheelchair ramp that came with the building. For the replacement wheelchair ramp, the Sanctuary is raising funds for materials only. A donation will help Logan Street Sanctuary build the ramp and therefore be accessible to everyone.


