County sees record-breaking election turnout

Republicans swept Hamilton County again yesterday, not unusual, but it came with record-breaking margins coming from a record-shattering voter turnout of 158,000.

The GOP victory was part of a statewide sweep that confounded pollsters who had predicted Democrats would do well, probably winning the governor's office and perhaps the open Senate seat.

Donald Trump's coat tails were viewed as responsible for the landslide Republican win in the state. But, ironically, in Hamilton County Trump did not do as well as some other GOP candidates trailing most other candidates by about 5,000.

Of the county's 230,000 registered voters, 68.5 percent went to the polls either

yesterday or during early voting in the past two weeks. Actually the percentage turnout was about the same as in 2012, but the actual number was a record because of the increase in the number of eligible voters this year.

The election process went smoothly considering the large number of voters. Political people took the results in stride with few candidates even appearing at the Judicial Center to see the results. Democrats who had hoped to make a good showing if not a breakthrough in the county were disappointed, but apparently not surprised.

The complete vote count appears elsewhere in today's Reporter including school board elections in the six county school districts, and the results of the constitutional amendment referendum.

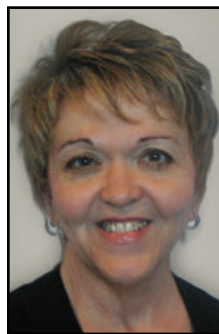

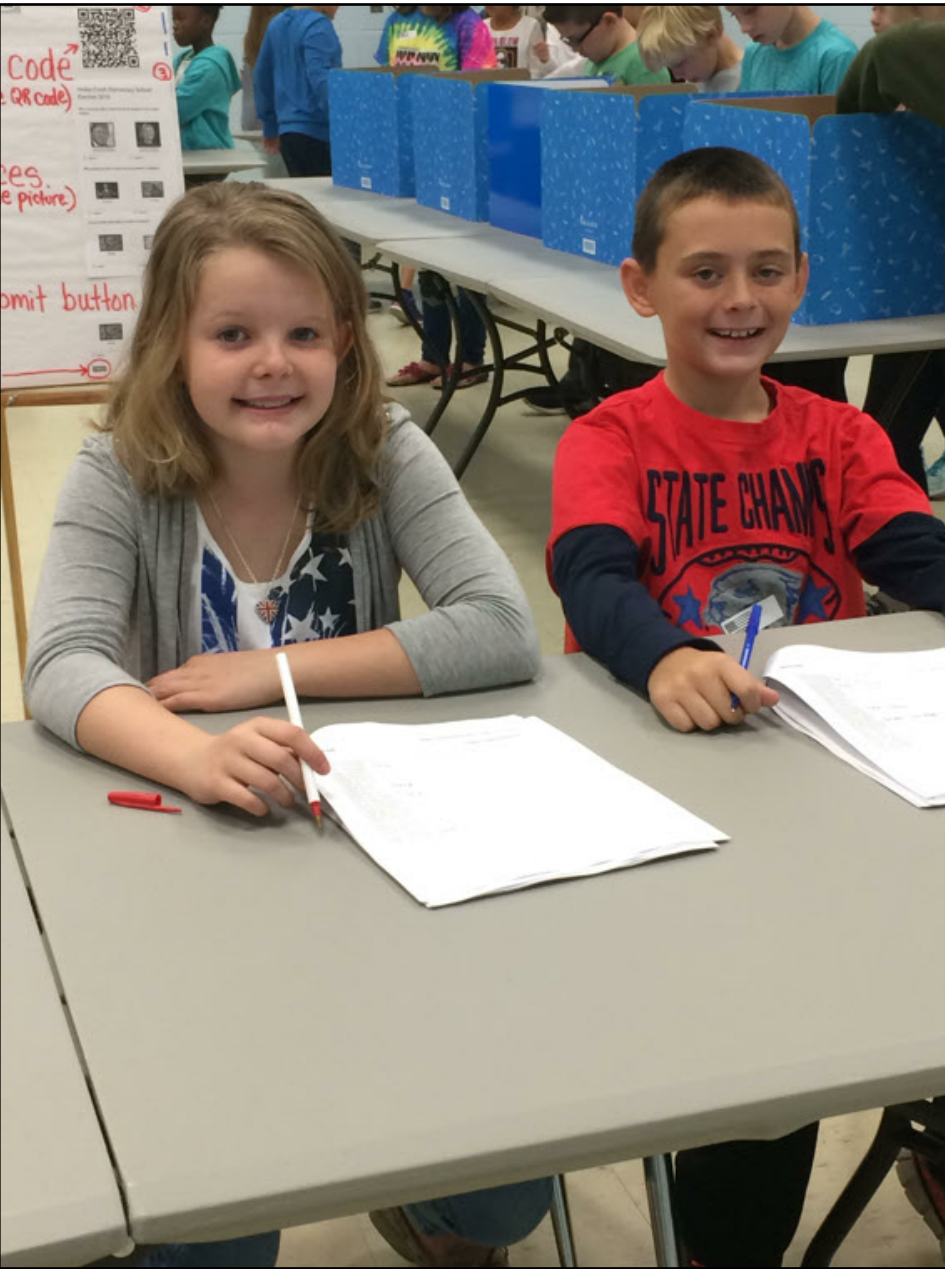
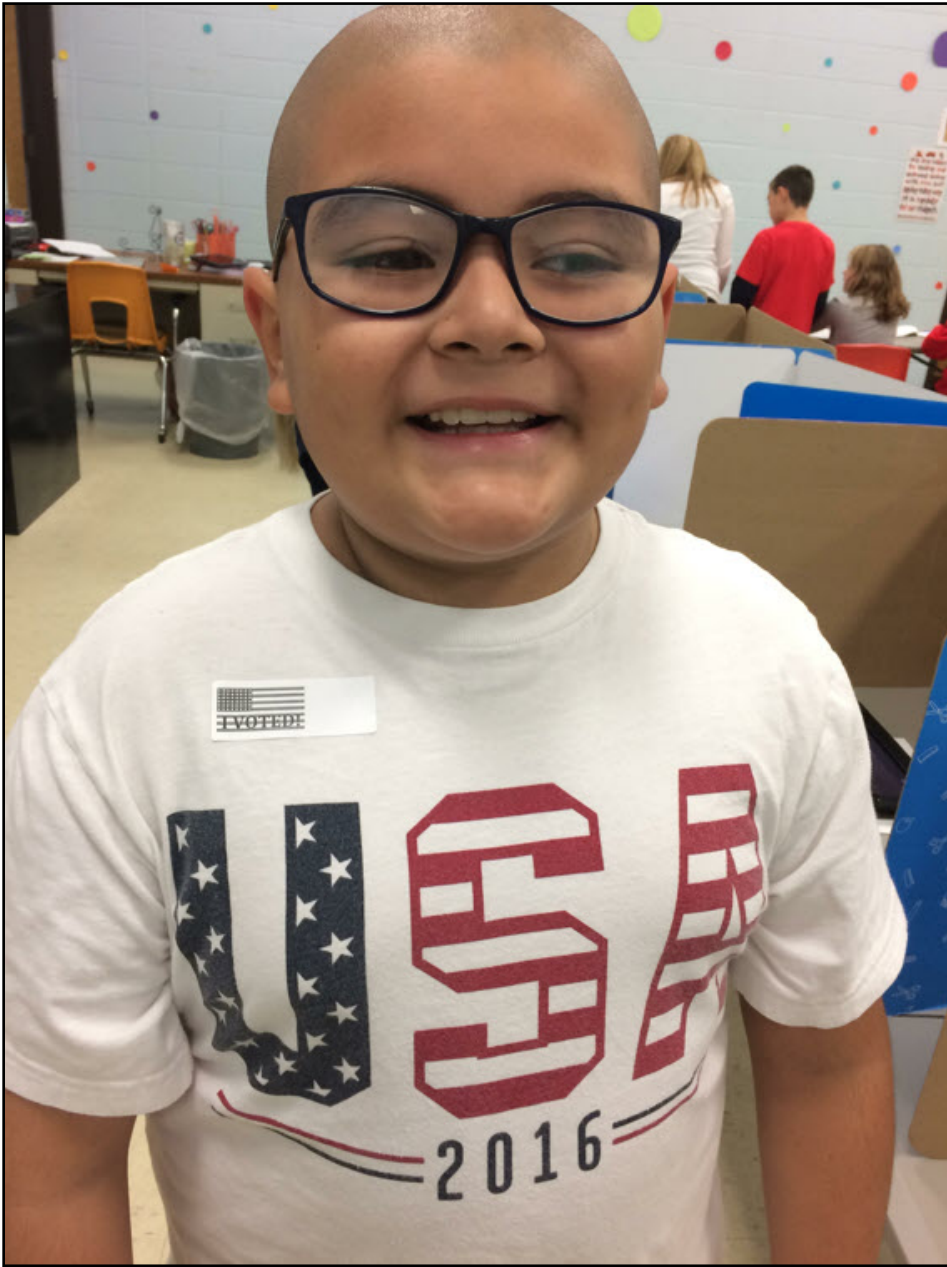
