Hamilton County's newly elected and re-elected public officials will be sworn into office on Tuesday, December 20. All Republicans, the officials will take their oaths in 5 p.m. ceremonies at the historic courtroom in the Courthouse. Actual new terms begin January 1.

Newly elected on November 8 are Superior Court Judge Jon Brown who succeeds Judge Dan Pfleging, County Auditor Robin Mills who follows Dawn Coverdale and County Councilor Jeffrey Hern taking over from Dr. James Dillon.

Those re-elected are County Commissioners Steve Dillinger and Mark Heirbrandt, Councilors Brad Beaver and Rick McKinney, County Treasurer Jennifer Templeton and County Surveyor Kenton Ward.

The public is welcome to the event following which there will be refreshments provided by the Republican Women's Club.

County Prosecutor recognized as Prevail's Hero of the Month

Prevail, Inc., an organization founded to serve victims of crime and abuse, has recognized Hamilton County Deputy Prosecuting Attorney David McPherson for his service to the community and victims and hails him as Prevail's Hero of the Month for October.

Deputy Prosecutor McPherson serves the Hamilton County community through his assignment to the domestic violence and battery docket. He has held this position in Hamilton Superior Court No. 3 since January 1, 2015, and has made great strides in developing a team atmosphere centered on the victim's involvement in his cases. Deputy Prosecutor McPherson works closely with his legal secretary, Lynn Bauer, and Prevail's Victim Notification Program Advocate, Leah Wills.

"Dave took the lead to implement changes in how he approached his new cases. He saw the need and benefit for bringing a unified approach to working with victims to facilitate communication, support the victim, and see the case through to its conclusion. By including [legal secretary] Lynn and [Prevail's] Leah in on initial meetings, victims have felt more comfortable with the criminal justice system and with seeking out the services available within the community," says Chief Deputy Prosecuting Attorney Andre Miksha. Deputy Prosecutor McPherson explains that his role in this process is to hold the defendant accountable. Dave's

Noblesville Mayor John Ditslear announced that after all the change was calculated Noblesville Schools' students collected a record amount of \$6,357. The annual Coin Harvest was held November 7 through 11 at Noblesville's seven elementary schools.

"We cannot thank our elementary students enough for their continued support of Noblesville nonprofits," said Noblesville Mayor John Ditslear. "This year they surpassed our expectations and raised more than \$2,600 above last year's amount. I also want to thank The Farmers Bank employees for tallying up all of the change and assisting with the program."

Money raised from the Coin Harvest will be donated to the 2017 Mayor's Charity Jubilee beneficiaries – Noblesville Youth Assistance Program, Noblesville Firefighters Christmas Food and Toy Drive and the Cherish Center.

Students were asked to bring loose change or complete chores for money, which they dropped into a classroom bucket. The classroom that collected the most money at each school will win a pizza party with Mayor Ditslear.






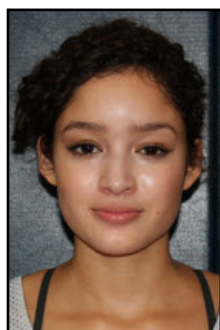
