# Westfield Police investigating death

The Westfield Police Department is investigating the death of a man found Wednesday afternoon.

At approximately 2:30 p.m., Westfield police officers responded to the area of 17200 block of Gunther Blvd. on a report of a subject down in the parking lot, who was possibly the victim of a battery. Upon arrival, officers discovered an injured male subject who was being treated by Westfield Fire Department personnel. The injured subject, Corey A. Zimmer, 24, of Westfield was pronounced deceased a short time later and a death investigation was initiated.

This case remains an ongoing investigation. Additionally, from information gathered during the initial investigation it is believed that this was not a random act of violence. The Hamilton County Prosecutors Office, Hamilton County Sheriff's Office and the Hamilton County Coroner's Office are all assisting in this investigation. Updates will be given as information becomes available.

# Ball State, Launch Fishers, HSE Schools team up for entrepreneurship course

Budding entrepreneurs at Hamilton Southeastern Schools will soon get a chance to learn all about how to start their own businesses - and get some college credit at the same time.

Inside Indiana Business reported that the district has teamed with Ball State University's Miller College of Business and Launch Fishers to offer a course next summer at Launch Fishers. The course is seven weeks and is designed to "give students a high-level introduction into what entrepreneurship is," Dean Jennifer Bott told IIB.

Launch Fishers and Ball State have struck up a partnership over the past couple years. The university opened its Ball State Center for Academic and Economic Innovation last September at the Launch Fishers site,

which is located at 12175 Visionary Way, near the intersection of 116th Street and Interstate 69.

Students that enroll in the course will get a taste of what Ball State's own website calls "one of the most intense majors on campus." A Bachelor's Degree in Entrepreneurial Management includes 21 hours of required courses, plus two electives. The final semester concludes with E-day, or "Evaluation day," where students, having put together a business plan, head to downtown Indianapolis and present that plan to a group of "alumni and executives," the E-day website says. The group contains people who know something about success - real estate moguls and CEOs could be among the list.

"If your plan receives the stamp of approval, you receive an "A" for the class and continue to graduation

two weeks later," according to the website. "If your plan is rejected, you fail the class, and you do not graduate."

The Ball State program also offers a Minor in Entrepreneurship, and an MBA Concentration in Entrepreneurship, which consists of three required graduate courses, in addition to core MBA courses.

Hamilton Southeastern and Fishers high schools both offer a one-semester course this school year called "Entrepreneurship and New Ventures," which is open to students in grades 10-12. The course is "designed to enable students to acquire the knowledge and develop the skills needed to effectively create, organize, and start their own business," according to the schools' curriculum guides.

## Community Health Network Foundation receives \$1 million gift

Community Health Network Foundation has received a \$1 million cash donation from Rama Drive Realty, a group of managing partners and investors that own and operate several properties in Indianapolis, to provide financial assistance to both oncology and eastside patients of Community Health Network.

Of the \$1 million gift, \$500,000 will support Community's existing Oncology Patient Assistance Fund, which provides Community cancer patients facing financial challenges with \$250 vouchers to help them access healthy food, life-saving medication and gas to get to and from treatment. The remaining \$500,000 will be dedicated to establishing and endowing the East Region Patient Assistance Fund to provide financial assistance for patients receiving care in Community's east region.

The group made the gift in memory of lead managing partner Lewis Norry's parents Sharon and Neil Norry and Rama's former employee William "Bill" Spurlock, who helped to manage maintenance operations at several properties on the east side of Indianapolis. Spurlock lived a life dedicated to helping others and also overcame alcoholism, maintaining sobriety for the last 13 years of his life thanks to hard work and perseverance, before passing away in 2012 from cancer.

"My parents, through the example of the lives they led, instilled in our family the values of community, hard work, caring and giving back. And, our associate and my friend, Bill Spurlock epitomized these qualities everyday through his life and service to others," said Norry. "With their legacies in mind, this gift will help Community support patients facing a difficult health diagnosis, compounded by financial challenges. My hope is that our support will allow more patients to focus on healing— rather than on the financial stress that health challenges can cause."

Community President and CEO Bryan Mills emphasized that the group's gift will have a tremendous impact on patients across Central Indiana.

"Rama Drive Realty's philanthropy will help to ensure the kind of exceptional care that Community strives to provide for our patients," said Mills. "I am grateful for their tremendous support which will go far in supporting Community's mission to improve health and access to care for people in our communities."

Foundation President and CEO Joyce Irwin reiterated the need for financial assistance programs for patients across Central Indiana. In fact, since its inception in mid-2014, the Oncology Patient Assistance Fund has distributed more than 650 vouchers and helped more than 525 unique patients across Community's six regions of care.

"Far too often, patients must juggle battling a disease with a desperate need for financial help," said Irwin. "With Rama Drive Realty's donation, Community can offer support to more patients facing this kind of challenge. We are profoundly grateful for both their donation and trust in the Foundation, and we are pleased to steward their generosity in a way that will honor the memory of Lewis' parents and close friend."

Rama Drive Realty's gift is the second totaling \$1 million or more that Community Health Network Foundation has announced in recent months. In October, local philanthropist Tony Alderson gifted \$1.5 million to the Foundation to support integrative oncology programs—including holistic services like art therapy, yoga and massage—for Community's patients.
