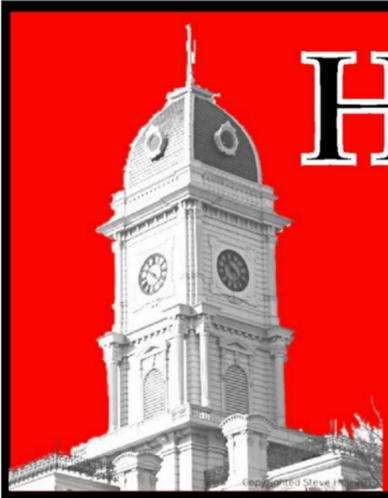

Nickel Plate "powwow" set for March 1

Is consensus and a plan forward for the Nickel Plate Railroad possible in the near future? It seems possible, but by no means certain.

The Hamilton County Council now has a "work session" scheduled for March 1 in advance of their regular monthly meeting. The idea is to bring together the parties who have a stake in the future of the railroad.

Since earlier in this column I called the Nickel Plate situation a case of having too many Indians and perhaps no chief to

Internet of Things Lab coming to Fishers

Get used to seeing the acronym "IoT" around Fishers. It stands for "Internet of Things" in the tech world. Fishers will soon house the new 22,000 square foot Indiana IoT Lab-Fishers, housed in a building located at 9059 Technology Drive, within the state-designated tech park.

The lab is touted as a place where "innovation and collaboration" happen among those working in the IoT field. The facility is expected to be up and running this summer.

Fishers Mayor Scott Fadness described the Internet of Things as bringing technology to devices we use every day. He grew up on a North Dakota farm and used a tractor traveling at 4 miles-per-hour, pulling a farm implement 17-feet wide. 7 years later the tractor speed went to 7 miles per hour, pulling a 54-foot wide farm implement with an auto-steer feature. A new tractor is about to be put into the farm fields without a farmer on the tractor. He pointed to that and other technological developments found in manufacturing facilities throughout Indiana.

"Within the next 5-10 years, we are going to see self driving vehicles," Fadness said.

Fadness said the Internet of Things concept will lead to economic progress in Fishers and the State of Indiana.

"Fishers has, I think, built a reputation of taking steps forward, taking risks and trying new things," according to Mayor Fadness. "This is a natural progression for our community, to create an Internet of Things Lab."

Westfield pothole patrol begins new season

Now that pothole season has arrived crews are using an asphalt recycler to create material to fill the potholes.

"The asphalt recycler is an investment that will save the city money over time," explains Mayor Andy Cook. "The administration is always looking for new ways to perform excellent customer service for our citizens, but at the same time saving citizen's money."

The asphalt recycler repurposes asphalt millings and creates new pavement to use in the repair of a pothole. The machine is capable of making 500 pounds of material in less than 20 minutes. The process is approximately an 80 percent savings for residents.

The city also encourages residents to use the customer service management tool WeConnect to report potholes. The online service can be found on the city's website and the City of Westfield app, which can be downloaded from Google Play or the App Store.

Hoosiers celebrate Disability Awareness Month throughout March

Governor Eric Holcomb, together with the Indiana Governor's Council for People with Disabilities, has proclaimed the month of March as Disability Awareness Month.

Disability Awareness Month aims to bring attention to the positive impact people with disabilities make in our communities and promotes a message of inclusion and acceptance for everyone in our communities. The 2017 campaign theme emphasizes that people with disabilities want to be treated just like anyone else.

"Too often, people with disabilities are called inspirational for simply living their daily lives, like going to work, playing sports, or taking care of their yard," said Christine Dalhberg, executive director of the Governor's Council. "People with disabilities don't want to be objectified, like when the undefeated high school wrestler lets a competitor with Down Syndrome win or when classmates elect two students with severe Autism as Homecoming King and

Queen. They don't want to be the subject of someone's college application essay or featured in an inspirational Facebook meme. They are people with complex lives, hopes and dreams, and want to be treated just like anyone else."

For more than two decades, the Governor's Council has spearheaded Disability Awareness Month through a unique statewide grassroots campaign that includes creating theme-specific educational materials, distributed free of charge. The Council asks all people to participate in the side-by-side social media campaign by using the hashtags #SideBySide and #NotYourInspiration.

"Fishers is on the cutting edge and on the move, as is the State of Indiana," Governor Holcomb told the packed crowd at Launch Fishers.

"The Internet of Things is where all these industries come together. It is the hub, not just the future, it is right now," Governor Holcomb said. "To deny that is denying your full potential."

The governor emphasized the state will partner and support initiatives such as the IoT Lab in Fishers.

Lab members will pay a fee as low as \$1,000 per year to become a part of it.

John McDonald, CEO of ClearObject (formerly known as CloudOne), announced his firm will grow its staffing on Fishers by 15% and become an anchor tenant of the IoT Lab.

lead them, we'll call the March 1 meeting a powwow.

A full powwow would involve representatives of the Port Authority which owns the railroad, the county council, county commissioners, cities of Noblesville and Fishers, the County Tourism Bureau, Transportation Museum, businessmen or officials from Cicero, Arcadia and Atlanta, and perhaps even Tipton County economic interests.

The transportation museum operated excursion trains on the Nickel Plate for a quarter century. But, that came to an end last year when safety concerns were raised and resulted in the port authority suspending the museum's operation. The museum has been unable to meet the cost of making safety improvements, so the port authority is considering issuing a request for proposals from organizations interested in operating the 165

year old track.

Hopefully, the powwow might reach agreement on a plan to get trains back on the tracks after a year of having no trains allowed. Or, agreement might be reached on a plan, favored by some, to tear up the tracks and convert the rail bed to a pedestrian trail similar to the Monon. Or, a combination of both in which a trail would run alongside the railroad.

There is no doubt any of these options would cost money, but there is also no doubt that there is lots of money in Hamilton County. A big question might be which group wants to put up the needed money or shares of it.

There is, of course, one other option. That is to do nothing. Let's hope that's not the one chosen.

Miller girls set state bests at UK Invitational

Several members of the Noblesville girls track and field team participated in the University of Kentucky High School Invitational, which took place Saturday at UK's Nutter Fieldhouse.

The Millers had solid finishes in two events, the distance medley and the 4x800. Noblesville ran two separate teams in each event.

In the distance medley, the Millers "A" team of Kat Dombroski, Maria Anderson, Abbie Klinker and Abi Little finished second in a time of 12:39.03, still breaking the Kentucky track record. Noblesville's "B" team of Aubrie Deal, Lily Walter, Anna Hazelrigg and Sophie Reichard finished third in a time of 12:48.36. Both are best times for Indiana athletes. The distance medley consists of four separate distances, in order: A 1200 meter run, 400, 800 and 1600.

The Millers also had two teams finish well in the 4x800 relay. Little, Dombroski,

Anderson and Deal took second with a time of 10:27.34. Meanwhile, Shelby Tyler placed second in the high jump with a new personal best of 5 feet, 7.75 inches. That is a best perfor-

mance of the season for an Indiana athlete, by two inches.

Lloyd, Welch to participate in Top 60 Senior Girls Workout

Two Hamilton County girls basketball players - Hamilton Southeastern's Bre Lloyd and Sheridan's Brittany Welch - have been invited to participate in Hoosier Basketball Magazine's Top 60 Senior Girls Workout, which takes place Sunday, March 5 at Heritage Christian.

Lloyd was a four-year varsity player for the Royals. During her senior season, she averaged 14.4 points per game and joined the career 1000 point club. Also, Lloyd handed out 3.6 assists, pulled 3.3 rebounds and made 2.4 steals per game. Lloyd has committed to play at Wright State University in Dayton next season.

Welch also played varsity all four years for the Blackhawks, and led the team to their first-ever sectional championship in 2015, her sophomore season. Welch, also a 1000-point club member, averaged 21 points and 7.7 rebounds per game in her senior campaign. She has committed to play at IUPUI next season.

Once again in 2017, Bankers Life Fieldhouse is set to become the epicenter of the basketball and entertainment universe.
