## Tornado drills included in Severe Weather Preparedness Week

In conjunction with the March 19-25 Indiana Severe Weather Preparedness Week, Hamilton County Emergency Management plans to participate in two statewide tests of the emergency communication systems on Tuesday, March 21. The goals of Severe Weather Preparedness Week and the emergency tests are to better educate residents about the hazards of severe thunderstorms and tornadoes and to help citizens better prepare in the event severe weather occurs.

Hamilton County's outdoor warning sirens will be activated on Tuesday, March

21 at 10:15 a.m. and 7:35 p.m. as part of the statewide test, unless severe weather is forecasted. During the two tests, Hamilton County will be placed under a Tornado Warning for a short time. This will activate alarms on weather radios, cell phone apps, and other devices. Emergency Management officials encourage everyone to plan ahead for the tests and to participate in the drills so each person knows emergency procedures for work, school, home or travel in the event of severe weather.

Designed as an outdoor warning system, outdoor sirens should not be relied

upon to provide sufficient warning indoors or in noisy areas. Air conditioning, thunder, wind, rain, and other conditions can cause the sirens not to be heard indoors and may inhibit hearing the sirens outdoors. Sirens are also subject to lightning strikes and other equipment malfunctions. For these reasons, everyone is encouraged to have multiple ways to receive information about severe weather. Hamilton County officials encourage residents to have an NOAA weather radio at home and at work.





## Fishers Fire Department offers new program

Fishers Department of Fire and Emergency Services is offering Fishers residents a free and easy to use medical information form that can be kept on their refrigerator called the "File of Life."

Used in an estimated 18 million homes, "File of Life" is a national program that allows those with medical issues to fill out a form with history, medicines, insurance information and emergency contacts and then place it into a pouch with a magnet, and place it in a visible location on their refrigerator. It provides important medical information to emergency responders which may be vital, especially when the patient is unable speak for themselves.

Fisher's firefighters are trained to look



for these folders on the refrigerator when responding on medical emergencies. Each person staying in the house with medical information should have their own file.

## WGU Indiana presents City of Westfield scholarship

# Create a zip tie rain chain with Hamilton County Soil and Water

## The REPORTER

Join the Hamilton County Soil and Water Conservation District (HCSWCD) on Monday, March 27 at 7 p.m. in the Annex of the 4-H County Fair Grounds, 2003 Pleasant Street, Noblesville, to create your own rain chain.

Rain chains help to divert rainwater runoff and reduce soil erosion near your home. They're decorative, easy to install, and attach to gutters or directly to the eaves of a building.

# DRILLS

Residents should immediately tune into a local television or radio station for further information when hearing a siren or other notification.

Basic criteria to activate the sirens for tornadoes include the National Weather Service issuing a Tornado Warning for Hamilton County, a trained and certified weather spotter reporting a tornado, a tornado reported by a local public safety official, or a dangerous situation occurring which requires citizens to seek shelter immediately.

While Hamilton County Emergency Management officials test and activate the outdoor warning sirens, the sirens are owned and maintained by area cities and towns. There are 75 outdoor sirens around the county: 21 in Carmel and Clay Township, 20 in Fishers along with Delaware

and Fall Creek Townships, 20 in Noblesville and Noblesville Township, 7 in Westfield and Washington Township, 3 in Cicero, 1 in Arcadia, 1 in Atlanta, 1 in Sheridan, and 1 at White River Campground. Sirens in each area may be activated independently of other areas when severe weather or other emergencies are imminent in a specific portion of the county.

Weekly testing of the outdoor warning system is planned to resume in March once temperatures remain above freezing. Tests are performed each Friday at 11 a.m. unless severe weather is likely to occur.


researching the harmful health and financial effects of tobacco and then create artwork that delivers a powerful message to consumers.

# Sheridan's Dave Sanders to be inducted into Basketball Hall of Fame

A 1961 Sheridan High School graduate will be among the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame's 56th class of inductees when ceremonies take place Wednesday, March 22 at Primo Banquet Hall in Indianapolis.

Dave Sanders, who set Butler University's scoring record after his successful career with the Blackhawks, will be among the 14 men inducted into the Hall, recognized with the highest honor bestowed in Indiana high school basketball.

Sanders set scoring records in Central Indiana, first at Sheridan High School and later at Butler University. Playing under HOF coach Larry Hobbs, Sanders led the Blackhawks to a sectional championship his junior year and followed it up as the Hamilton County scoring champ his senior year, averaging 24.2 points and 13.9 rebounds per

game. Along the way, he set the school single-game scoring record of 36 points. At Butler, he averaged 15.4 points and 7.9 rebounds as a junior and capped his career with averages of 20.6 points and 8.9 rebounds as a senior, setting Butler records for single-season scoring (536) and single-season field goals made (228) and totaling 1,103 career points with the Bulldogs. In 2003, he was inducted into the Butler Athletics Hall of Fame. Receiving a PhD in Organic Chemistry from Ohio State University, he rose to become Associate Vice President of Research and Development at Great Lakes Chemical Corporation in a 35-year career there.

Among the other individuals to be inducted are 1991 USA Today 1st team high school All-Americans, Alan Henderson and Glenn Robinson. The duo, who faced each other in the 1991 IHSAA state championship game, in their

respective careers at Indiana University and Purdue University and throughout 10+ year NBA careers, are each inducted in their first year eligible (26 years after high school graduation). Only nine men all-time have previously been inducted as first-year eligible players, a list that includes Steve Alford, Damon Bailey, Kent Benson, Larry Bird, Dave Colescott, Kyle Macy, George McGinnis, Rick Mount and Oscar Robertson.

Including Henderson, four former Indiana Hoosiers are among this year's class. Henderson (Brebeuf 1991) was a 1995 All-American for IU and graduated in the Top 5 in school history in scoring, rebounds, blocks and steals, Phil Isenbarger (Muncie North 1977) and Steve Risley

The 6-6 senior, who graduated as the Royals' all-time leading scorer and rebounder, made the decision Thursday and confirmed it to Muncie Star Press reporter Dakota Crawford. Gunn was also

being looked at by other schools, including Indiana; Crawford mentioned that Gunn was waiting to see how the Hoosiers' coaching situation played out. Indiana let coach Tom Crean go after nine seasons Thursday.

Gunn was a top-level player from the moment he stepped on to the Royals' court. He averaged 11.7 points and 5.3 rebounds per game as a freshman, helping HSE to a sectional championship.

Gunn averaged a double-double (18.0 points, 10.2 rebounds) in his sophomore year, then poured in 17.2 points per game for his junior season. He finished his senior year with a 21.2 scoring average and 1657 career points; topping the mark set by current Denver Nuggets star Gary Harris. Gunn also pulled 791 career rebounds, breaking a record that had stood for 40 years.

Gunn's career scoring high was 34 points, achieved in the first game of his sophomore season in a 75-71 win over Lake Central.

(Lawrence Central 1977) were classmates and senior members of the Hoosiers' 1981 NCAA National Championship team, while Bob Reinhart (Dale H.S. 1957) played basketball and baseball for the Hoosiers before a noted coaching career in high school, college and the NBA in Indiana and Georgia.

Joining Robinson (Gary Roosevelt 1991), the 1994 NCAA National Player of

the Year, in the class is his Purdue teammate Matt Waddell (Tipton 1990). Robinson and Waddell were both starters on the Boilermakers' 1994 Big Ten Champion and NCAA Elite Eight squad.

Bill Hampton (Crispus Attucks 1955), a senior starter for the Tigers' 1955 state championship team, gains induction this year. That squad made history as the first African-American high school team in any

sport anywhere in the United States to win a state championship open to schools of all colors.

Herb McPherson (Mississinewa 1962) set the Grant County career field goal record, Jim Lyttle (North Dearborn 1964) set his school's scoring record and Al Tucker (Patrickburg 1957) coached Cloverdale to over 250 wins and seven sectional titles.

The late Edward "Jingles" Engelhart (Washington H.S. 1930) was the leading scorer for the Hatchets' 1930 state championship team before a lengthy career as coach and AD at Merrillville High School, where they named Engelhart Gymnasium in his honor.

The recipient of this year's Centennial Award to recognize contributions to Indiana high school basketball from 100 or more years ago is Edwin Hubble. The coach of New Albany's 1913-14 team, they were undefeated in the regular season, reaching deep into that season's state tournament and regularly trouncing their opponents. Later an immense success as an astronomer, he is the namesake of the Hubble Telescope.

Indiana Pacers 2017 Silver Medal Award recipient Ron Newlin is inducted for his contributions to the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame. The executive director of the organization from 1987-1995 during their planning, building and opening of the New Castle museum, his leadership produced an award-winning facility that has become the crown jewel of showcasing Indiana high school basketball history.

Three men - Bob Beeson of Connersville, Larry Maxwell of Martinsville and the late Bob Carr of Muncie - will be recognized with the Center Circle Officials Award.

Eighteen men will be recognized as members of the 2017 Silver Anniversary Team - acknowledging their spot as one of the top senior basketball players in Indiana 25 years ago in the Class of 1992.

The 1967 Evansville North team will be recognized for the 50th anniversary of their state championship, the 1992 Richmond Red Devils team will be honored on the 25th anniversary of their state championship and the 1917 Lebanon Tigers will be remembered 100 years after their state championship win.

A limited number of seats remain for the event, which will draw a crowd of over 1,000. Cost for the event, including a 6:00 PM dinner, is \$50 for adults. Reservations may be made by calling (765) 529-1891.

A reception - open to the public and free of charge - will take place at the Hall of Fame museum in New Castle between 11 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Wednesday.
