## 14 hospitalized after Carmel building evacuated

The Carmel Fire Department investigated an odor in a Carmel office building that led to the evacuation of a multi-story building, and sent 14 people to the hospital for medical treatment.

Officials with the fire department indicated at 10:52 a.m. emergency personnel and five ambulances were dispatched to 10401 N. Meridian St. to aid numerous workers that became ill with flu like symptoms. In addition to the 14 people hospitalized eight others were treated on the scene.

Carmel Fire Department reported their hazmat team was unable to determine the source of the odor and reopened the building at 1 p.m.

## Fishers Mayor talks tax rate, Yard announcements

With bond debt coming on board the Fishers debt load, Mayor Scott Fadness attended the Fishers City Council Finance Committee meeting Wednesday night and commented on that, as well as progress on The Yard culinary project.

Bond issuance procedures are beginning for new plans, such as the proposed new city park on Geist Lake and major improvements to the Nickel Plate Amphitheater behind City Hall. The mayor told the Finance Committee this new debt will require only "minor adjustments" to the 2018 tax rate. The mayor's staff is currently working on a fiscal plan for 2018 which will provide a clearer projection of the 2018 city tax rate and city budget.

"It's hard to take one bond issue and say, this is what it means to your tax rate," Fadness said. "In reality, you've got to

look at the whole thing, plus your net assessed value."

The mayor also talked about the status of The Yard culinary development planned near IKEA. Fadness expects news soon on eating establishments planning to locate there.

"There should be a series of announcements here in the next 60 or 90 days that will make a lot of Fishers people very happy," Fadness said about The Yard.

The mayor said a ground-breaking for the yard may not come until spring of 2018. Fadness added that as residents of the 22 homes in Spring Dale Estates continue to leave their homes, there is a possibility that empty neighborhood could be used for police and fire training before the structures are torn down.



Radka Caviness, 78, completed her journey of life peacefully at home on July 8, 2017. Radka was born January 2, 1939 in war-torn Macedonia to Dusan and Luba Dimitrovich, who preceded her in death.



# Fishers student has a goal: Cure kidney cancer

Fishers student Khunsha Ahmed has a goal – she wants to cure kidney cancer. Khunsha will start her senior year at Fishers High School next month.

Ahmed is the only Indiana representative from the 100 recipients of the Emperor Science Award, a PBS LearningMedia and Stand Up To Cancer initiative designed to encourage high school students to explore careers in science, focusing on cancer research and care.

The Emperor Science Award program received nearly 800 applications from eligible 10th and 11th grade students in 44 states throughout the U.S. Prominent scientists served as judges and evaluated the students' applications: written essays submitted online January 10 through March 17, addressing why scientific research is so important in finding a cure for cancer, what scientific field they would study and why. She was honored recently for her essay

about renal cell carcinoma, the most common type of kidney cancer.

Ahmed is now in the midst of a summer mentorship with IU Health Simon Cancer Center oncologist Costantine Albany.

The mentorship is just one reward for Ahmed's winning entry. She also received a new Google Chromebook and a \$1,500 stipend from PBS LearningMedia.



# Leah Wooldridge: 'Back to my roots'

On July 1, Leah Wooldridge was back in a familiar place - in more ways than one. Wooldridge made a return to Noblesville High School, beginning her duties as the Millers' new athletic director. Longtime Noblesville fans know, of course, that Wooldridge coached the Millers girls basketball

team from 1997 to 2004. Wooldridge came back to NHS after 10 years at Franklin Community High School, where she was the assistant principal for eight years, and then principal for two years. While she enjoyed her time as an administrator, Wooldridge was ready to get back into the athletic world full-time. "When I became an administrator, I

looked at things from a different lens, and I'm like, 'Gosh, if I could go back and do that again, I think I could really help people and do a better job,'" said Wooldridge. "I just felt like it was time for a career change for me, and go back to my roots, which is athletics."

While Wooldridge's first official day was July 1, she had been working for a couple weeks prior to that date. So far she has gotten off to a fast start, meeting with all of the coaches and working with Tony Oilar, the assistant athletic director who served as the interim AD over the past few months, and athletic secretary Bobbi Davis. "It's been great," said Wooldridge. "Obviously Tony and Bobbi have been a great help, and everybody has been great as far as helping me get up to speed. I've met with all of our coaches, and those conversations have been great. Just sitting down, trying to get to know one another a little better and talk about their programs and expectations they have for their teams."

Wooldridge knows quite a bit about coaching herself. In her first year of coaching, she took the Anderson girls basketball team to the state championship game. She coached the Indians for three years, and also spent some time in the collegiate ranks, assisting at Ball State for a year and the University of Detroit Mercy for three years. After that, she headed to Noblesville for the first time, then moved up to the administration ranks by serving as the Taylor High School athletic director for three years, followed by a decade at Franklin. "I think without that administrative experience I gained, I don't think I could sit here and say 'Yeah, I'd be a better athletic director,'" said Wooldridge. "It's because of that administrative experience that I gained,

along with my coaching and my teaching and my playing, I think that has made me more well-rounded."

Since she still lived in the area, Wooldridge is aware of the continued growth of the Noblesville community and school system. As the population grew, the athletic expectations have grown as well.

"What we want for our programs is for the student athletes to be the best they can be," said Wooldridge. "We do have some students that have aspirations of playing collegiately, and some of them even professionally."

Of course, Wooldridge is quick to point out that success doesn't happen overnight - it comes at an expense. "Kids got to come in and coaches have to come in and put the work in," she said.

Wooldridge has already gotten the chance to see that work with her own eyes. She's attended a couple of Noblesville's Championship Wednesdays, where many Millers get up very early - during summer vacation, mind you - and put themselves through a rigorous program supervised by Brian Clarke, Noblesville's strength and conditioning coach.

Wooldridge told Clarke, "Gosh, if I could go back and have all these resources, I think I would've been a much better player than what I was." Wooldridge believes it's important for these Miller student-athletes to understand all the opportunities and resources that are available to them to help make them the best athletes they can be.

Wooldridge also talked about qualities that she believes must be instilled in Noblesville students that will help them be successful in life after they graduate high school. Those qualities include "sportsmanship, character, hard work, how to handle success and defeat in a first-class manner."

"The big thing is, we're always making decisions based on what's best for our students, regardless of whether I was principal or athletic director or coach," said Wooldridge. She also said that communication is important. That includes "always keeping one another informed and from that communication you build trust and that we have a trusting atmosphere, relying on each other and that we're all in this together to help our kids and our student-athletes and our students."

One thing you won't be seeing Wooldridge do is sit behind her desk for endless periods of time. A self-proclaimed "athletics junkie," Wooldridge is aiming to make herself visible at not just competitions, but also during practices as well.

"You won't just see me on game days," said Wooldridge. "I'll be out watching practices. Just being visible, so the student-athletes can see me out there supporting them and cheering for them and know that myself and the athletic department, we're in their corner and we're here to serve them."
